

The Thirty First ARGYLL BIRD REPORT With Systematic List for the year 2019





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Introduction

Welcome to the 2019 Argyll bird report which is now the 31^{st} published by the Argyll Bird Club.

Last year we produced the first report as a simplified PDF to enable quicker completion and allow it to be made more widely available online. This change has generally been seen as a positive and logical step by most, although not by all folk, and we of course appreciate that change is not always universally accepted. The positives from a production and editorial viewpoint far outweigh the negatives and we hope you will agree that, in having a more-timely report with a lot more colour photos taken during the year is worth it.

The report is essentially a highlighted systematic list of species that occurred during 2019 and no attempt is made to present papers or articles *etc*, and these are better placed in the Argyll Bird Club's quarterly 'Eider' magazine or journals such as Scottish / British Birds or BTO publications for a more in-depth analysis.

Once again, records within the systematic list are presented for each season, and their occurrence in each of the ten Argyll regions. It should be noted that for many species there may be no note of occurrence in relatively under watched areas such as Cowal, Jura or North Argyll. This is usually a reflection of no reports having been submitted rather than indicating that such species do not occur there. For all the species with twenty or less reports during the year all the submitted sightings are listed. Some rarities have video footage that can be accessed by clicking the links provided.

We hope you will enjoy the report and in turn use it to add to further appreciation of bird life in Argyll and to send in your records if not doing so already. The bird club also runs a facebook group and a website.

For individuals, researchers, and planning bodies *etc* who require more detailed species accounts for specific sites or regions, it should be noted that this data is still available from the Argyll bird database. We therefore advise anyone requiring such information to contact the bird recorders.

Bird Recording in Argyll

Submitting your bird records

The Argyll bird recorders maintain the Argyll bird database on behalf of the Scottish Ornithologists' Club and the Argyll Bird Club and in recent years have been receiving more than 30,000 records per year. We welcome all bird records however please look at the guidance sheet on the Argyll Bird Club website under Bird Recording which gives threshold guidelines on what to report. The recorders are happy to input casual reports, however when larger volumes of records are submitted, we recommend that these are sent in *Excel* spread sheet format compatible with the Argyll bird database. We can send you a template or for regular record providers we can send an automated input form. Please email abcrecorder@outlook.com for more details. Records sent to the BTO's BirdTrack and WeBS can be accessed by the recorders as well as records sent to Birdguides.

Rare birds

Details and photographs of all rare bird sightings should be sent in (preferably emailed) as soon as possible after the sighting to **Jim Dickson**, 11 Pipers Road, Cairnbaan, Lochgilphead, Argyll PA31 8UF. These will be judged locally by the Argyll Bird Records Committee (ABRC) whose members are listed on p. 4, sent on to the *Scottish Birds* Records Committee (SBRC), or passed to the *British Birds* Rarities Committee (BBRC), depending on the species/level of rarity.

The list below is made up of the ABRC list of Argyll rarities and the SBRC list of Scottish rarities (those marked #) details rare species whose occurrence in Argyll needs to be fully documented i.e. details of the circumstances surrounding the sighting and a detailed description of the bird and if possible, photographs and field notes.

Records of rarities in the systematic list are accompanied by the names of the observers, starting with the finder(s)/identifier(s), (or, in the absence of this information, the person who first reported the bird to the recorder), followed by the observer(s) who submitted details of the record, if different.

<u>Birds of Conservation Concern.</u> (BoCC 4) was published in British Birds (December 2015 Vol.108) and the updated species status has been applied to this report.

RED LIST is the highest conservation priority with species needing urgent action. AMBER LIST is the next most critical group followed by Green (not given here) species that don't fall into the Red or Amber category.

Systematic List for 2019

The following systematic list includes entries for 237 Category A and C species recorded in Argyll during 2019 (*cf.* average 222 species during the years 1993- 2018). This is eleven more than last year but just short of the record 240 species in 2014. Five new species were added to the list in 2019.

All records are listed where 20 reports or fewer and marked with *. Observers names are given for description rarities accepted by rare bird committees.

BRENT GOOSE Branta bernicla

AMBER LIST A passage migrant, in varying numbers: few in winter. Most birds seen in Argyll are of the Pale-bellied race B. b. hrota. Birds of the Dark-bellied race B. b. bernicla have occurred, mainly on Islay and Tiree, with less than 20 records. There has been one record of the Black Brant B. b. nigricans on Islay in winter 1989/90.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Jura/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts of 91 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 20 Apr, 16 at Glas Eilean *Jura* on 1 Mar and 5 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 24 Apr. Last report was 1 at Loch Bhasapol *Tiree* on 3-6 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (Islay/Jura/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree). First arrivals were 9 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 4 Sep then 40 at RSPB Loch

the max count of this period. At least 30 birds remained at Loch Indaal Islay until the year end.

Winter/spring An adult was at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 4 May.

Autumn/winter Four were reported at Coull Farm *Islay* on 3 Nov.

GREATER CANADA GOOSE Branta canadensis

The resident population on Colonsay was introduced in 1934. Regular breeding has taken place since 1992 in Mid-Argyll in increasing numbers, with increasingly frequent breeding attempts elsewhere. A transatlantic origin seems probable for at least some of the medium-sized and small individuals seen in winter goose flocks on Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 236 at Eilean Traighe, Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Jan, 178 on Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Mar and 148 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Apr.

Breeding Breeding reports from all areas except (*Coll/Tiree*). First successful breeding on *Islay* (attempted in 1984) with 10 ads & 10 goslings at Proaig, SW *Islay* on 4 Jun. Also, at Sound of Islay *Jura* 39 were seen on islets from the ferry on 10 Jun. First young noted at Loch Laich North Argyll on 8 May. Numbers increasing in *Mid-Argyll* and range expansion on *Mull*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 462 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Nov and 248 at Loch Laich *North Argyll* on 15 Nov. Remains scarce on *Islay* where a max of 7 at Loch Gruinart on 7 Oct.

LESSER CANADA and TODD'S CANADA GOOSE* Branta c. parvipes/interior

Lesser Canada B. c. parvipes and Todd's Canada B. c. interior are races considered by the BBRC. The race parvipes breeds W Alaska, E to Yukon Territory and most winter Washington and Oregon. The race interior breeds NE Canada from Hudson Bay to Baffin Island and NW Greenland wintering in SE USA. There is however some ovelap in breeding ranges and variability in size and plumage of races, therefore separation is not always possible.

Winter/spring One at Caoles *Tiree* from Oct 2018 to 20 Jan, and one at Loerin *Islay* on 5-27 Feb are subject to acceptance by the BBRC.

Autumn/winter Four nr Machrihanish airport *Kintyre* on 30 Nov-1 Dec, and one at Balephetrish and Vaul *Tiree* on 14 Oct-31 Dec are subject to acceptance by the BBRC.

AMBER LIST Approximately two thirds of the Greenland population winter in Argyll, mostly on Islay with smaller numbers elsewhere. Coll, Colonsay, Islay, and Tiree are sites of

international importance for wintering birds of the Greenland population of this species. A few birds occasionally summer and a few introduced birds have bred on the Rinns of Islay.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Most on *Islay* with max count of 35,251 on 15-16 Jan and *Tiree* with 5,009 on 4-5 Mar. An all Argyll total of 36,571 in Mar (Int. Goose counts per SNH). Large nos departed on 6-7 Apr and most birds had left *Islay* by 12 Apr.

Breeding/summer One was paired with a Greylag on Tiree on 23 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/North Argyll*). First arrivals in small nos from 30 Sep and first big arrivals on 10 Oct with 1,000 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* and 260 at Treshnish NW *Mull*, also 3,300 on Oronsay *Colonsay* by 14 Oct. Most were on *Islay* with max count 32,017 on 17-18 Dec, also 5,648 across *Tiree* on 17-18 Dec.

CACKLING GOOSE* Branta hutchinsii/minima

This species group has recently been accepted by the BOURC as a split from other 'Lesser Canada Goose' types. A transatlantic origin seems probable for most of these hutchinsii birds being from the Canadian High Arctic. The first accepted Argyll record was in 1984 and many subsequent records are still under consideration by the BBRC.

Winter/spring One at Bridgend merse *Islay* on 4 Feb is subject to acceptance by the BBRC. *Autumn/winter* A returning bird from autumn 2018 again on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 17 Oct to 31 Dec.

SNOW GOOSE Anser caerulescens

The small introduced population on Coll breeds on a small off-shore island and is now very sedentary and decreasing. Stragglers among wintering goose flocks of other species are probably often genuine vagrants.

All year The resident flock present on *Coll* continues to decrease with now only 10 birds. At least 3 prs were noted as likely breeding on Soa Island *Coll* on 11 May however no reports of young later in the year.

Autumn On Islay 2 were at Bridgend Merse on 10-14 Oct, then at Sanaigmore and Sunderland on 15-18 Oct.

GREYLAG GOOSE Anser anser

AMBER LIST A resident: with an increasing breeding population. Some may be native birds that have colonised from the Outer Hebrides, while birds of introduced origin breed in Mid-Argyll. Now that it is no longer possible to distinguish between them, WeBS refers to them as 'British/Irish' and identifies Tiree as a site of national importance. Migratory flocks are also reported from most areas.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 1,870 on *Tiree* on 4-5 Mar and 775 on *Islay* on 12-13 Mar. An Argyll total in Mar of 4,350 (Int. Goose counts per SNH).

Breeding Reported breeding in all areas. On *Colonsay* (excluding Oronsay) 62 broods found. Mean brood size in Jun = 3.36 (sample of 22 broods). *Tiree* all-island count on 26-28 Aug – of the 1,384 birds aged, 570 (41.2%) were juvs, with mean brood size of 2.47 (N = 247 broods). First juvs noted on *Colonsay* on 28 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts on 17-18 Dec with 2,253 on *Tiree* (all island) and 1,056 on *Islay*.

TAIGA BEAN GOOSE* Anser fabalis

AMBER LIST A scare winter visitor and less than annual. Split from Tundra race Bean Goose in 2018 and now treated as a separate species.

No reports, however in 2018: Five at Kilmichael floods, N of Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 11 Nov have now been accepted of which one was assigned to 'Taiga' [Pete Nash *et al*]. Accepted by the ABRC.

PINK-FOOTED GOOSE Anser brachyrhynchus

AMBER LIST There are variable numbers on passage, with occasional large flocks but relatively few overwinter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Small nos of 1-6 birds wintered in (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Return passage flocks noted heading NW from 28 Mar. Max counts of 332 at Craignure *Mull* on 10 Apr, 200 at Eorabus *Mull* on 9 Apr and 160 at Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Apr.

Summer In May 1-5 birds noted at six sites, singles at three sites in Jun-Jul and 1 at Balure, Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Return passage from 12 Sep when a noisy flock of 40>S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre*, then 10 flew over Balephetrish *Tiree* on 27 Sep. A remarkable period of heavy passage started on 29 Sep with 338 over Lower Ardtun *Mull* and 388 over *Tiree*, then during 30 Sep-1 Oct, numerous flocks of 50-300+ birds were noted passing over most Argyll regions. At least 1,300 flew over *Tiree* on 30 Sep and 1,750 on 1 Oct and many birds also landed. Flocks of up to 200 birds remained on *Islay* and *Tiree* for most of Oct and smaller nos across Argyll until the year end, with most noted; 90 at Drumlemble *Kintyre* on 9 Dec.

GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE Anser albifrons

RED LIST Both the nominate European and the Greenland races have occurred in Argyll. The Greenland race A. a. flavirostris winters in a small number of traditional haunts and is also a passage migrant. Argyll holds about 50% of the world population of this race in winter and all the locations where they occur regularly are sites of international importance in the UK.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura*). Max counts of 6,771 on *Islay* on 12-13 Mar (all island count), 2,518 in *Kintyre* in Mar, 237 in *Mid-Argyll* in Mar and 1,026 on *Coll/Tiree* in Mar. Argyll total counts in Mar of 10,682 (8,412 in Mar 2018) per Int. Goose counts (SNH).

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura/Cowal*). First arrivals noted were 6 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 11 Oct then 140>S over Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 12 Oct. Max counts of 6,335 on *Islay* on 17-18 Mar (all island count), 750 on *Tiree* on 17-18 Dec and 630 at the Laggan *Kintyre* on 5 Nov. No SNH counts received for *Kintyre*.

'EUROPEAN' WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE* A. a. albifrons

The European race A. a. albifrons is a scarce visitor in small numbers.

Winter One report – an adult at Cuddypool Bay, Gigha *Kintyre* on 19 Jan [David Jardine]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

MUTE SWAN Cygnus olor

AMBER LIST A widespread and fairly common breeding species on the mainland and Tiree: scarcer on the other large islands. Not recorded recently on Colonsay until 1999. Flocks gather at favoured localities throughout the year, especially during moult but in decreasing numbers in autumn and winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay*). Max counts of 48 on *Tiree* on 19 Feb then 7 at Ulva Lagoon *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Jan. Elsewhere, counts of up to 6 birds, with most counts of 1-2 birds.

Breeding Breeding reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay*). On *Tiree* 11 nests at 8 sites and max count of 42 birds on 5 Aug – noted to be a poor breeding season there. First broods noted on *Tiree* on 3 Jun and Portavadie *Cowal* on 14 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay*). Max counts of 50 on *Tiree* on 13 Dec, 41 at Ulva Lagoon *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Oct and 25 at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 28 Oct.



WHOOPER SWANS Islay Oct Jim Dickson

WHOOPER SWAN Cygnus cygnus

AMBER LIST A common passage migrant: smaller numbers wintering. Loch a' Phuill (Tiree) is a site of national importance for wintering birds. A few birds summer in most years and breeding has been recorded.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 182 on *Tiree* on 15 Jan, 72 at Kiloran Bay *Colonsay* on 31 Mar and 56 over the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 30 Mar. Most passage N noted mid-Mar to early Apr and flocks counted were of 18-72 birds.

Summer/breeding Up to 9 on *Tiree* and 2 on *Islay* during the summer. A pr bred at a site in *Kintyre* however the eggs were predated by 13 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. First arrivals were 8>S past Hynish *Tiree* and 22>S over Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 30 Sep, also 23 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 30 Sep. Most passage and arrivals noted during 1-24 Oct with max counts of 342 (in total) over *Islay* on 24 Oct, 200 at West Parkfergus *Kintyre* on 12 Oct and 166 on *Tiree* on 24 Oct.



COMMON SHELDUCK Kintyre Mar Eddie Maguire

COMMON SHELDUCK Tadorna tadorna **AMBER LIST** A widespread, but not very numerous, breeding species around sandy coasts. The majority are absent from mid-Aug to late Oct when they migrate to moulting grounds.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 208 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Feb, 35 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 2 Feb, 27 at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 5 Mar, 20 at Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Apr and 17 at Loch Spelve *Mull* on 5 Apr.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports received from (*Islay/Jura/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). First ducklings at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 21 May and at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 23 May where mean brood size 6.3 (3 broods). At the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* a pr with creche of 22 young on 30 Jun. Breeding population appears to have crashed on *Tiree* in recent years.

Autumn/winter Most reports from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll*). Max counts of 31 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Nov and 13 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Dec. Nos generally 1-8 birds elsewhere.

MANDARIN DUCK Aix galericulata

An introduced species which has bred regularly, at Loch Eck (Cowal), in recent years. The present size of the Argyll population (whose origin is unknown) suggests that it may well now be self-sustaining.

Winter/spring Several reports from Loch Awe with a max of 8 at Braevallich *Mid-Argyll* at the end of Jan. No reports were received from the usual strongholds in *Cowal*. A female seen and photographed in a ditch at Cornaigmore *Tiree* on 20 Apr was a new species for the island. *Autumn/winter* There was no further monitoring of this species at Braevallich *Mid-Argyll* during

this period. No reports from *Cowal*, a usual stronghold. Two at Dalmally *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Oct was the only report.



MANDARIN DUCK Tiree Apr John Bowler

GARGANEY* Spatula querquedula AMBER LIST A regular spring visitor to Islay and Tiree and has bred in Kintyre in 1994, on Islay in 1997, and on Coll in 2004.



Spring A pair were at Craignure Bay *Mull* on 1 May, a male was on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 2-7 May and again on 15 May, a male was at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 13 May and a male was at Kilmoluaig *Tiree* on 16 May with presumably the same bird at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* that evening.

GARGANEY Mull May Lizzy Grieve

NORTHERN SHOVELER Spatula clypeata

AMBER LIST A scarce and localised breeding species restricted to Islay and Tiree. It is more numerous as a passage migrant and winter visitor: also largely restricted to Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). On *Islay* a max of 48 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 16 Feb. On *Tiree* max count of 35 with 19 at Loch Riaghain and 16 at Loch a' Phuill on 17 Jan. In *Kintyre* 2 were at Machrihanish SBO on 12-19 Apr and 1 was on Gigha on 19 Jan. *Breeding* Breeding reported on *Islay* and *Tiree*.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). Max counts of 35 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 13 Dec, 25 on *Tiree* lochs on 13 Dec and 2 at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 9 Dec.

GADWALL Mareca strepera

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular passage migrant and winter visitor with most recent records from: Islay, Kintyre, Mid-Argyll, and Tiree. Breeds sporadically on Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay/Tiree*). A max count of 8 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 2 Jan.

Breeding Up to 4 prs on Tiree and 1 pr at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (Islay/North Argyll/Tiree). A max count of 8 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 16 Aug and 5 at Cnoc Fada Islay on 28 Oct, also 3 were at Balnagown Loch, Lismore North Argyll on 19 Nov.

EURASIAN WIGEON Mareca penelope

AMBER LIST A scarce and local breeding species: common passage migrant and winter visitor to all areas.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 271 on *Tiree* WeBS counts on 22 Jan, 162 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 17 Jan, 160 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 19 Feb, 127 at Eilean Traighe, Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Jan and 114 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Feb.

Breeding Likely breeding prs were noted on Tiree and inland North Argyll.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. First returning single bird at Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 30 Jul. Max counts of 385 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Nov, 365 on *Tiree* WeBS counts on 13 Dec, 315 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 13 Dec, 309 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Nov and 285 at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 31 Oct. Many other counts of up to 100, mostly in *Kintyre*.

MALLARD Anas platyrhynchos

A common breeding, passage and wintering species

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 135 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 17 Jan, 85 at Eilean Traighe, Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Jan, 65 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 19 Jan, 62 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 22 Jan and 59 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Feb.

Breeding/summer Reports from all areas. Ducklings noted in *Mid-Argyll* from 30 Apr. Max counts of 43 at Ardencaple, Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Jul and 41 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 217 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 15 Nov, 162 at Ardencaple, Seil Mid-Argyll on 27 Nov and 116 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 15 Sep.

NORTHERN PINTAIL Anas acuta

AMBER LIST A very scarce breeding species on Tiree and a scarce passage migrant and winter visitor: regular only on Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Coll/Islay/Tiree*). Most reports from *Islay* and max counts of 87 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 19 Mar.

Breeding Up to 7 prs on Tiree.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (Islay/Kintyre/Tiree). Max count of 56 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 15 Nov.

EURASIAN TEAL Anas crecca

AMBER LIST A widespread but uncommon breeding species: common passage migrant and winter visitor.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 901 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 17 Jan and 295 on *Tiree* across two sites on 17 Jan, 94 at Barcaldine *North Argyll* on 4 Feb and 90 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 22 Jan.

Breeding Breeding reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally low nos.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 961 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 13 Dec, 230 at An Fhaodhail *Tiree* on 17 Dec, 118 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Oct, 117 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 30 Oct and 91 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 15 Dec. Many other sites held up to 90 birds.

GREEN-WINGED TEAL* Anas carolinensis

A rare visitor: Thirty or more records since 1980, mostly on Islay or Tiree: some records may well involve returning individuals.

Winter/spring A male remained at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* from 2018 until 17 Jan [John Bowler] and a male (returning bird?) was at RSPB Gruinart floods *Islay* on 8-26 Feb at least [A Saunders *et al*] and probably the same male at Port Charlotte pond on 2 Mar [Mike Peacock *et al*].

Autumn/winter A male was at RSPB Gruinart floods *Islay* from 16 Oct until year end [Peter Roberts *et al*]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON POCHARD* Aythya ferina

RED LIST An increasingly scarce winter visitor and passage migrant, in small numbers, particularly to: Tiree, Islay, and a few Mid-Argyll lochs. There has been no confirmed breeding in recent years.

Winter/spring Only one report – a male at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 2 Jan.

Autumn/winter A 1cy was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 26-27 Sep, 2 males were at Loch Gorm *Islay* on 27 Oct -3 Nov and a male was at Kilchurn Castle, Loch Awe *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Nov. *The downward trend of records for this species continues.*

RING-NECKED DUCK* Aythya collaris

A rare visitor: 26 previous records.

Winter/spring Three birds – adult pr with a 2cy male, frequented Loch Bhasapol and Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* from 12 Nov 2018 to 5 Mar and the adult pr remained until 2 May [John Bowler *et al*].

Autumn/winter A 1cy female was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 25-28 Oct. The adult pr from last winter returned to Loch Bhasapol *Tiree* on 8 Nov and seen frequently there and Loch a' Phuill until the year end and into 2020 [John Bowler *et al*]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

TUFTED DUCK Aythya fuligula

A widespread winter visitor: most numerous on Islay and Tiree. Breeds in small numbers on: Colonsay, Islay, Mull, and Tiree with scattered pairs found throughout mainland Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts on *Tiree* with 142 across island WeBS sites on 22 Jan and 24 at Loch Finlaggan *Islay* on 5 Mar.

Breeding Breeding reported on *Tiree* with 12-15 prs. No data from *Islay*. At least two sites in *Mid-Argyll* and first broods noted on *Tiree* where f with b/2 on 11 Jul and Seil *Mid-Argyll* 2ff with b/3 and b/3 on 15 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura/Kintyre). Max counts of 112 on Loch Gorm Islay on 27 Oct and 97 on Tiree across island WeBS sites.

GREATER SCAUP Aythya marila

RED LIST A winter visitor and passage migrant with most winter reports at Loch Indaal, Islay but scarce and irregular elsewhere. Small flocks of migrants are sometimes seen during autumn sea-watches.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Tiree*). Max count of 25 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 17 Jan and 2 on Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* Jan-Feb, also a Tufted x Scaup hybrid present there.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). First arrivals were 1 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 7 Sep, 1 past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 3 Oct and 18 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 13 Oct. A max count of 25 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 30 Oct.



GREATER SCAUP Islay Oct Jim Dickson

COMMON EIDER Somateria mollissima

AMBER LIST A resident breeding bird: common on all suitable coasts, especially on the Clyde. The Firth of Clyde is a site of national importance for Eiders. Large flocks of moulting drakes and first-year birds gather at some sites during Jun to Sep.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 130 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Mar, 115 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 20 Apr and 68 off Inverneill *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Feb. Counts of up to 50 birds from many other sites.

Breeding Breeding reports from all coastal areas. First ducklings noted in *Cowal* on 22 May, on *Mull* on 26 May and on *Tiree* on 28 May. Max counts of 160 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 21

Jun, 151 at Blairmore, Loch Long Cowal on 16 Aug and 71 at Rubha Glas, The Oa Islay on 17 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts of 410 off Inverneill Mid-Argyll on 14 Nov, 153 at Loch Indaal Islay on 3 Nov, 122 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 24 Nov and 115 at Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 14 Nov.

VELVET SCOTER Melanitta fusca

RED LIST Scarce but regular in and around the Sound of Gigha, and in smaller numbers, at Loch Indaal, Islay. The wintering population in the Sound of Gigha is now much reduced from the population in the 1970s when over 50 were present.

Winter/spring One was at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 6 Jan and 2 (m+f) were at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 6 Apr.

Summer A male was at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 19 May and possibly the same long stayer, of possibly captive origin, was at Easter Ellister *Islay* on 2 Jun at least. A remarkable 21 birds (16 m+5f) >S off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 2 Jun. *This is the largest count in Argyll since the 1970's*.

Autumn/winter In *Kintyre* 4 were at the Sound of Gigha on 13 Jul and 2 there on 10 Nov, also 2 f/1cy >S past Machrihanish SBO on 11 Oct. On *Mull* 2 were at Loch na Keal on 25 Jul and 1 was at Aros on 9 Dec.



VELVET SCOTERS Kintyre Jun Eddie Maguire

COMMON SCOTER Melanitta nigra

AMBER LIST *Present throughout the year at Loch Indaal, Islay and in the Sound of Gigha, Kintyre -* a scarce winter visitor elsewhere and very rare breeding reports.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura*). Max counts of 151 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 27 Feb, 36 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 19 Jan and 25 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 30 Jun.

Summer/breeding Max counts of summering birds with 130 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 13 Jul and 340 there on 3 Aug. Two prs bred at Loch Gorm *Islay*, both laid and a total of 8 fledged juvs.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts of 135 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 27 Dec and 111 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 17 Dec.

LONG-TAILED DUCK Clangula hyemalis

RED LIST An uncommon winter visitor, most frequent in Sound of Gigha (Kintyre), Coll, Islay, and Tiree. Usually marine but occasionally seen on inland lochs. Occasional summer records.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). Generally, 1-4 birds at sites and max counts of 12 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 19 Jan and 8 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 4 Feb. Last report was of 2 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts were 23 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 29 Oct then 15 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 17 Dec. Only 1-3 birds noted elsewhere and a single record from *Cowal* with 1 at Loch Striven on 31 Dec.

COMMON GOLDENEYE Bucephala clangula

AMBER LIST A common winter visitor: birds are regularly present in all areas from early Oct to late Apr with occasional summer records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Max counts of 66 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 22 Jan, 38 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Mar, 33 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 19 Jan, 22 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 17 Jan and 20 at Loch Leathan *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Mar. Last were 2 at Loch Gorm *Islay* on 21 May. Several birds noted to be displaying in Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First report was a f/imm on a flooded pool at Machir Bay *Islay* on 7 Oct. Max counts of 60 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Dec, 48 on *Tiree* WeBS counts on 8 Nov. *Generally, nos have been steadily declining in recent years.*



GOOSANDER Mid-Argyll Feb Jim Dickson

GOOSANDER Mergus merganser

A scarce breeding species mainly in: Cowal, Mid-Argyll, Mull and N Argyll. The population is more widespread in winter but in small numbers.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Kintyre/Tiree*). Generally, only 1-5 birds reported mostly from *Mid-Argyll* and *Mull*. Max counts of 10 at Cairndow *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Mar, 8 at Java Point *Mull* on 7 Jan and 6 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 18 Feb.

Summer/breeding Reports from (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). Reports mostly of only 1-6 birds however 8 at Knock *Mull* on 12 May and 8 f/imms off Dunoon *Cowal* on 27 Jul. No reports submitted of the usually large post breeding moulting flock at Loch Riddon *Cowal*.

Autumn/winter Reports from (*Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). Generally, 1-6 birds however max counts of 10 at Dervaig *Mull* on 17 Nov, 9 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 15 Sep, 9 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Sep and 8 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Sep.



RED-BREASTED MERGANSERS Mid-Argyll Nov Jim Dickson

RED-BREASTED MERGANSER Mergus servator

A common resident breeder: large moulting flocks gather, particularly in Loch Indaal, Islay and Sound of Gigha, Kintyre during late summer. The Sound of Gigha, Kintyre is a site of national importance for wintering birds. Small numbers are found on fresh water.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts of 59 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 17 Jan, 44 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 6 Apr and 34 at Traigh Bhaigh *Tiree* on 9 Jan.

Breeding Breeding reports received from all areas. First young reported on 13 Jun in *Mid-Argyll*. On *Tiree* 10 prs noted at 4 sites.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 680 (post breeding flock) at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 2 Aug, 135 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 7 Nov and 52 on *Tiree* on 13 Dec.

BLACK GROUSE Tetrao tetrix

RED LIST A scarce, localised, resident breeder. Numbers still likely to be declining at a slower rate after a steep decline. Very thinly distributed in all mainland areas: with a few on Islay and Jura. All records required.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). Max count of 4 Balliemore, Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Jan.

Summer/breeding No 2019 data provided from RSPB Scotland by Jun 2020. A total of 101 displaying males were recorded at 34 lek sites throughout Argyll in 2018.

Autumn/winter Only two reports, both in *Mid-Argyll* with a max of 3 at Lochan Anma, Knapdale on 21 Oct.



PTARMIGANS Mull Dec Ewan Miles

PTARMIGAN Lagopus muta

A localised resident breeding bird: generally above 800m in north and east Argyll and on Mull. All records required.

Spring/summer In *North Argyll* 2 were at Bienn Dorain on 17 Apr, a pr were at Beinn Fhionnlaidh on 4 May, 1 at Creach Bheinn on 10 May, 1 at Coire Bliochdaig on 21 May and 1 with young at Beinn Sgulaird on 21 Jun.

Autumn/winter On *Mull* 1 was at Beinn Bheag (E), Strath Bearnach on 14 Jul and 4 were at Beinn na Drise on 25 Dec. In *North Argyll* 1 was at Aonach Eagach on 30 Nov.

RED GROUSE Lagopus lagopus scotica

AMBER LIST A sparsely distributed, resident, breeding bird.

All year Reports from upland moorland areas on (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Only 11 reports in total received from across Argyll and all only of 1-2 birds. Most reports came from *Islay*.

RED-LEGGED PARTRIDGE Alectoris rufa

Birds (some hybrids with Chukar A. chukar) have been introduced to several areas. Although this species is in Category C of the British list, populations in Argyll do not appear to be selfsustaining.

All year Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Seventeen reports mainly of 1-2 birds, however larger counts noted near release sites e.g. counts of 40 on Luing *Mid-Argyll*, 25 at Island House and 15 at Rockmountain, both *Islay*.

COMMON QUAIL* Coturnix coturnix

AMBER LIST A rare and irregular summer visitor: mainly to Kintyre and the islands.

Summer Three reports of four birds. One was calling at Crossapol *Tiree* on 18 Jun, 1 calling at Treshnish Farm (NW) *Mull* on 19 Jun and 2 calling at Langa Quarry *Kintyre* on 6 Jul.

COMMON PHEASANT Phasianus colchicus

May be abundant, in those parts of Argyll, where birds are released for shooting. Reports from Jura and North Argyll are rare.

All year Reports from all areas. Several counts of 100+ birds near release sites in Kintyre and Mid-Argyll.

RED-THROATED DIVER Gavia stellata

A scarce widely distributed breeder (on moorland lochs), winter visitor, and passage migrant.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts of 25 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 31 Mar, 7 at outer Loch Melfort *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Apr and 6 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Mar.

Summer/breeding Reports from likely breeding areas in (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). Juveniles noted on *Mull* from early Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*). Max counts of 63 in Loch Indaal *Islay* on 14 Oct and 18 >S past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 12 Sep with a total of 122 >S in Sep over 18 dates. A max of 9 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 14 Nov.

BLACK-THROATED DIVER Gavia arctica

AMBER LIST A very scarce breeder in Mid and North Argyll: scarce in winter but more numerous on passage. Breeding has been confirmed at 13 sites between 1985-2017. The Sound of Gigha, Kintyre and Kilfinan Bay, Cowal are sites of national importance for wintering birds. Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Max counts of 18 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 5 Mar, 15 off Grogport Kintyre on 4 Jan and 10 off Brenfield, Inverneill Mid-Argyll on 20 Jan.

Breeding A few prs noted breeding in Mid & North Argyll.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura*). Max count of 14 at Grogport *Kintyre* on 3 Nov, 8 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 21 Oct and 6 at Cnoc Fada *Islay* on 1 Nov.

GREAT NORTHERN DIVER Gavia immer

AMBER LIST A numerous winter and passage visitor. Birds in breeding plumage are regularly recorded from Apr to mid-Jun. Pre-migratory gatherings occur off some coasts in late Apr and early May and a few individuals summer. The Sound of Gigha and the seas around Tiree and Coll are sites of international importance for wintering birds and Loch na Keal on Mull, Loch Indaal on Islay, West Loch Tarbert in Kintyre and Lochs Beg & Scridain on Mull are sites of national importance.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Most significant counts from the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre*, the *Mull* sea Lochs, Loch Indaal *Islay* and the *Tiree* coast. Max counts of 97 in Loch Indaal *Islay* on 25 Feb, 91 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 3 Mar, 73 at Loch Tor *Mull* on 16 Mar, 59 at Loch Scridain *Mull* on 5 Mar and 36 at Balemartine and Gott Bay *Tiree* on 21 May.

Summer Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/North Argyll*). Generally, only 1-3 birds at sites. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts of 52 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 3 Nov, 42 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 16 Nov and 32 >W in 1 hr off Aird *Tiree* on 10 Oct.



EUROPEAN STORM PETREL Kintyre Aug Neil Brown

EUROPEAN STORM PETREL Hydrobates pelagicus

AMBER LIST A summer visitor. The main breeding colonies are on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles with a few pairs on Soa and Staffa. Breeding birds first come ashore in late May or Jun. Most sightings away from breeding colonies are during Jul-Sep, when nonbreeders wander extensively. Breeding European Storm-petrel is a feature of Treshnish Isles SPA.

Spring/summer/autumn Reported between 30 May and 13 Oct (*Coll/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). A max count of 12+ at the entrance to Gott Bay *Tiree* on 30 May and 9 off Hynish *Tiree* on 17 Jul. Occasional sightings were made from Calmac ferries to/from *Tiree*, *Colonsay & Mull* of 1-4 birds during Jun-Aug. The last report was 1 at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 13 Oct.

Breeding In Jul a complete census of Bac Mór and Cairn na Burgh More, Treshnish Isles *Mull* estimated a population of 374 and 1,223 AONs. When combined with the estimated breeding

population of Lunga (3,262 AONs), Sgeir a' Chaisteil (262) and Fladda (5,151) surveyed in 2018, this represents over a 113% increase in the species' estimated population of the Treshnish Isles from the only complete census of the islands in 1996, which estimated 5,040 AONs (per TIARG). No data were obtained from Sanda Isle *Kintyre* where the population is thought to be around 200 pairs.

LEACH'S STORM PETREL* Oceanodroma leucorhoa

AMBER LIST A scarce, but regular, autumn passage migrant off western headlands; particularly after strong westerlies. There are occasional reports in spring and summer.

Winter/spring One during a storm was close in at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 12 Mar. *Autumn* In *Kintyre* 1 was off Machrihanish SBO on 4 Sep. On *Tiree* 3 were off Aird on 4 Sep, 1 >W Aird on 5 Sep, 1 was off Hynish on 10 Sep, and 1 was between *Mull* and *Coll* on 26 Sep.

FULMAR Fulmarus glacialis

AMBER LIST A common but localised breeding species in all areas apart from Cowal and North Argyll. Large numbers occur on passage off western headlands.

Winter Only reports during Jan-Mar from (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). Four reports of 2-4 birds in Jan from *Islay* and *Tiree* and 100 birds returning to breeding cliffs on *Tiree* during calmer days in Jan increasing to 700 in Feb. On *Islay* 45 were at Rubha Glas, The Oa on 18 Feb. At Southend *Kintyre* 9 ashore were displaying on 5 Mar.

Spring/breeding Only breeding reports received from (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). Max Apparently Occupied Sites (AOS) of 1,143 at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* with mid-sized young noted on 11 Jul, 212 AOS at Uragaig and 12-16 at four other sites on *Colonsay*, 273 AOS at Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil, Treshnish Isles *Mull* and 40 AOS on Sanda Is. *Kintyre*.

Autumn/winter Only records were from (*Coll/Islay/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts of 75 past Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 4 Sep, 79 >W off Aird *Tiree* on 4 Sep, 98 >SW off Hynish *Tiree* on 10 Sep and 800+ around cliffs of Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* during Dec.



SOOTY SHEARWATER* *Puffinus griseus*

A passage migrant: almost exclusively recorded Jul-Oct. Sometimes seen in large numbers from western headlands, islands and on ferry crossings during Aug-Sep.

Autumn Only records were from *Mull* and *Tiree*. Singles were off NW *Mull* on 19 Aug and 2 Sep, and off W Iona on 3 Sep. Single birds were off *Tiree* on 8 dates between 4 Aug -7 Oct and 2 >SW off Hynish on 21 Aug.

SOOTY SHEARWATER Mull Sep Mike Pearson

MANX SHEARWATER Puffinus puffinus

AMBER LIST Breeding colonies have been confirmed only on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles. Large numbers are seen on passage, especially during Aug-Sep.

Spring/summer Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First report was 4 off Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* and 300 off SW *Coll* (from ferry) on 2 Apr.

Breeding No population estimate this year from Lunga, Treshnish Isles *Mull* (est. 1,992 prs based upon AOSs in 2018 per TIARG). No counts from Sanda Is. *Kintyre* where the est. population thought to be around 300 prs.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max count was 4,917 >W in 1 hr past Aird *Tiree* on 5 Sep. Also 1,200 off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 11 Jul, 362 off Iona *Mull* on 3 Sep and 350 off SE *Islay* on 30 Aug. Last report was 5 off Milton *Tiree* on 24 Oct.



LITTLE GREBE Mid-Argyll Nov Bill Anderson

LITTLE GREBE Tachybaptus ruficollis

A local breeder in small numbers: widespread in sheltered coastal waters in winter with concentrations at Loch Etive, North Argyll and at Loch Sween, Mid-Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Most reports from *Mid-Argyll* and max counts of 20 at Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Jan, 10 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 17 Feb and 6 birds at other sites in *Colonsay*, *Mid-Argyll* and *North Argyll*. Many coastal sites had 1-4 birds. *Breeding* Breeding reports from (*Coll/Colonsay/Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). Six prs were noted on *Colonsay*. First young noted at Loch Barnluasgan *Mid-Argyll* on 24 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 11 at An Lodan, Loch Awe *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Nov, 11 at Dervaig *Mull* on 31 Dec, 10 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 17 Nov and 8 at Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Sep.

PIED-BILLED GREBE* Podilymbus podiceps

A vagrant: Three records; one at Loch Peallach, Mull in Jun 1998, one at Salen Bay, Mull on 22 Mar to 6 Apr 2011 and a long stayer/returning male at Loch Feorlin, Mid-Argyll from at least 2014 until 2017 and paired with a Little Grebe producing one young in 2017.

All year The long staying adult male at Loch Feorlin *Mid-Argyll* was there again from at least 19 Feb until at least 18 Jul [David Jardine *et al*]. Record was accepted by the BBRC as returning bird.

RED-NECKED GREBE* Podiceps grisegena

RED LIST A scarce winter and passage visitor: Most records are in Sep-Mar; at least 45 records.

Autumn/winter One was off Bruichladdich, Loch Indaal *Islay* on 14 Oct [Robert Davison, Peter Roberts]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE* Podiceps cristatus

An uncommon winter and passage visitor: with 1-8 records annually since 1984 and recorded in all months except Jun.

Winter/spring On *Islay* singles reported from Loch Indaal on 2 Feb and Ardbeg on 16 Mar. *Autumn/winter* Singles were at West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre* on 26 Oct and 2 Nov and at Blairmore *Cowal* on 19 Oct.

SLAVONIAN GREBE Podiceps auritus

RED LIST A regular winter and passage visitor to sea lochs and sounds: occasionally on inland waters. The Sound of Gigha, Loch na Keal, Mull and Loch Indaal, Islay are sites of national importance for wintering birds.

Winter/spring Reports only from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Max counts of 34 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 31 Mar, 17 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 13 Feb, and 12 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 6 Apr. Last report was of 1 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 30 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports only from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts of 39 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 3 Nov and 23 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 13 Dec.

GREY HERON Ardea cinerea

A widespread resident: breeding in all areas except Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 15 at Eilean Traighe, Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Jan, 12 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 23 Mar and 12 at Ardpatrick *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Apr. Most other reports were of 1-8 birds.

Breeding Breeding data only received from (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). Max colony counts were 32 AONs at Ardachy *North Argyll*, 18 at Appin *North Argyll* and 15 at Ballachuan Hazel Wood (SWT) *Mid-Argyll*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 22 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 14 Oct, 20 at Loch Tarbert Boathouse *Jura* on 1 Sep, 17 at Appin *North Argyll* on 15 Sep and 14 at Carsaig Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Nov. Counts at many other mainly coastal sites of 1-12 birds.



GREAT WHITE EGRET Mid-Argyll Oct John Speirs

GREAT WHITE EGRET* Ardea alba

A rare visitor: Thirteen records between 1986 and 2017. This species is increasing as a breeding species in the Netherlands and France, and also in England since 2012.

Autumn/winter A non/br bird was at Bunessan *Mull* on 20-26 Oct [David Holden, Bryan Rains *et al*] then re-found at Cullipool, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Oct [L Leggett *et al*] remaining in the Luing and Seil island areas until at least 27 Nov. Records were accepted by the ABRC.

LITTLE EGRET Egretta garzet

A scarce visitor: No records prior to 1958 but several since, mostly in spring and autumn. It has been seen more frequently in Argyll since breeding colonies have become established in England and Ireland.

Winter/spring Seven reports of singles, perhaps involving up to 7 birds; in *Kintyre* at West Loch Tarbert on 2 Jan-28 Mar and Peninver on 1 Apr; in *Mid-Argyll* at Ulva Lagoon on 8 Jan-10 Feb and at Balvicar on 16-18 May; on *Islay* at Loch Gruinart and Bridgend Merse on 7 Feb-4 May; in *North Argyll* at Loch Laich on 27 Feb-17 Mar; on *Coll* at Acha on 7 May and perhaps the same bird at three sites on *Tiree* on 8-28 May.

Autumn/winter Probably many wandering birds, with up to 10 or more in total. First report, in *Mid-Argyll* of a 1cy at Loch Gilp on 19 Jul until year end, joined by another 1cy on 30 Nov. Also 1 at the Add Estuary on 22 Aug to the year end, joined by another (L Gilp bird?) on 30-31 Dec. Other singles at Toberonochy, Luing on 26 Aug, at Ardpatrick on 20 Oct and Loch Feochan on 29 Nov to year end. In *Cowal* 1 was at Holy Loch on 7 Sep, 2 on 9 Sep, 4 on 13 Oct, 5 on 2 Nov and a record Argyll peak of 6 on 5 Nov after which they dispersed then four reports of singles across *Cowal* to year end. On *Mull* 1 was at Loch Beg on 26 Sep. In *Kintyre* 1 was at Kennacraig on 12 Aug-29 Nov with 2 there on 31 Oct and perhaps the same 2 at West Loch Tarbert on 2 Nov. On *Islay* 1 was at Bridgend merse on 12 Oct, also at Rockside, Loch Gruinart and Loch Gorm until year end. In *North Argyll* 1 was at Port Ramsay, Lismore on 26 Oct and 1 at Benderloch on 30 Dec.



LITTLE EGRET Mid-Argyll Dec Jim Dickson

NORTHERN GANNET Morus bassanus

AMBER LIST Most Gannets in Argyll waters probably come from Ailsa Craig (30 km east of Mull of Kintyre) and St Kilda (190 km northwest of Tiree). Gannets are common inshore in Argyll waters from Apr to Oct, often seen high up sea lochs and some birds travel inland to cross between Campbeltown Loch and Machrihanish. They are also reported in small numbers Nov to Mar.

Birds recorded in all months of the year with most seen Apr to Oct. There are routine (mainly Apr to Sep) one-way overland flights (8 km) to the west from Campbeltown Harbour to Machrihanish Bay apparently by breeding adults from the nearby Ailsa Craig colony. A total 2,062 birds on 231 days Mar-Oct (per Machrihanish SBO warden Eddie Maguire).

Winter/spring Regular sightings of 1-10 birds off *Tiree* in Jan and 8 from the Mull of *Kintyre* on 1 Jan. Max count of 60 from the Oban to *Tiree* ferry SW of *Coll* on 2 Apr.

Summer/breeding No breeding records. Max count of 1,170 >S in 5 hrs at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 18 Jul.

Autumn/winter Max count of 688 past Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* in 2 hrs on 4 Sep and 333 in 1 hr off Hynish *Tiree* on 5 Oct. Numbers declined sharply after mid-Oct.

EUROPEAN SHAG Phalacrocorax aristotelis

RED LIST A common resident, breeding on the mainland coast, outer isles and on islands in sea lochs. Widespread in winter and spring but very rare inland.

Winter/spring Records from all coastal areas. Max counts of 200 (some on nests) at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 8 Apr, 97 in 1 hr passing Aird *Tiree* on 7 Jan, 74 at Hynish *Tiree* on 2 Mar and 70+ at Ulva *Mull* on 10 Apr.

Summer/breeding Breeding data only from (*Colonsay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). Max counts of 411 AONs on Sanda Is. *Kintyre*, 81 AONs (mean brood size = 1.63, N = 30) at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* and 21 AONs at two monitoring sites on *Colonsay/Oronsay*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 1,600 at Gunna Sound *Tiree* on 5 Aug, 300 at Loch Eatharna *Coll* on 15 Aug and 100 at Laggan Point *Islay* on 21 Jul.

GREAT CORMORANT Phalacrocorax carbo

Breeds in: Cowal, Jura, Kintyre (including Gigha), Mid-Argyll, Mull, and North Argyll, with around 230 pairs in recent years. Less numerous than Shag, but numbers have increased recently. Small numbers occur on some inland waters.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 24 at Eilean Traighe, Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Jan, 19 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 23 Mar, 1-11 birds at other sites, however most reports of just 1-2 birds.

Summer/breeding Only data received; 14 AONs on Sanda Is. *Kintyre* and a pr with 3 young in a Shag colony off Ardbeg – the first confirmed breeding (in recent times?) for *Islay*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 35 over Brock Rock *Tiree* on 17 Dec, 21 at Aros *Mull* on 15 Dec and 17 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 15 Sep.



GBB GULL and OSPREY Mid-Argyll Apr John Speirs

OSPREY Pandion haliaetus

AMBER LIST A summer migrant, breeding in small but increasing numbers. Occurs more widely on passage.

Spring/summer Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). First arrival of singles at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Mar then reports from three sites on 31 Mar.

Breeding Of the 27 Argyll sites checked 18 sites were occupied by prs and 3 more by single birds. Ten pairs went on to have 17 large young (average = 1.70 young/successful nest, *cf* 2.00 in 2018) (ARSG).

Autumn After mid-Sep reports from only Loch Gruinart Islay of a single and last report of 1 at Gartnatra Islay on 30 Oct.

EUROPEAN HONEY BUZZARD* Pernis apivorus AMBER LIST A rare passage migrant: Thirteen records since 1980.

Summer An adult female was seen on 13-14 Jun at a location in Kintyre. Record was accepted by the ABRC. Note – a National census of this species is planned for 2020 if Covid-19 restrictions allow.



GOLDEN EAGLE Islay Oct Jim Dickson

GOLDEN EAGLE Aquila chrysaetos

A scarce, but widespread, resident breeding species. Immatures tend to wander and may be recorded in areas where breeding does not occur.

All year Reports from all areas. Most reports of 1-2 birds however up to 5 birds, usually involving ads + juvs seen in many areas.

Breeding Of the 83 sites checked 63 sites were occupied and 2 more had single adults. A total of 18 fledged young (ARSG).

EURASIAN SPARROWHAWK Accipiter nisus

A widespread, resident, breeding species.

All year Reports from all areas. Fewer sightings noted during May and Jun. Sightings all of 1-2 birds.

Breeding Of the 26 sites checked 16 had nests with adult pairs and 10 nests had young from which 10 young fledged (ARSG).



EURASIAN SPARROWHAWK Mid-Argyll Mar John Speirs

NORTHERN GOSHAWK* Accipiter gentillis

A sporadic visitor of uncertain status.

Spring/summer One, prob female, was at Torr nan Damh, NE of Dervaig *Mull* on 26 May [A Douglas] and a 1cy was in the Loch Nant area of *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Jul [Blair Urquhart]. Both records were accepted by the ABRC. The true status of this species in Argyll is made difficult due to the secretive nature of the species coupled with under reporting and in some cases misidentification and inadequately documented records. Satellite-tagged birds in central Scotland are now being tracked into Argyll.

WESTERN MARSH HARRIER* Circus aeruginosus

AMBER LIST A scarce, but recently more or less annual, passage migrant: records in every year but one since 1986. Most records Apr-Jun.

Spring/summer Four reports of singles some of which may involve the same bird. A fem/2cy was at Gruinart floods *Islay* on 17 May, a fem/2cy was at Bousd *Coll* on 19 May, 1 was at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 31 May and 1 was at Treshnish Farm NW *Mull* on 6 Jul.

HEN HARRIER Circus cyaneus

RED LIST A sparse but widespread breeding species: Argyll holds around one quarter of the Scottish breeding population. Seen regularly: away from breeding areas, on migration, and in winter with reports from all recording areas.

All year Reports from all areas. Fewer reports during Jun and Jul. Most reports from *Islay* then *Mull*. No roost count data received. Max counts in the field of 5 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* in May. Up to 6 birds on *Tiree* in Nov.

Breeding For the 43 sites checked 22 were occupied, 15 prs laid eggs and 19+ young fledged (ARSG).

RED KITE* Milvus milvus

A re-introduction programme in Scotland since 1996 has involved releases in Highland, central, and south west Scotland. Genuine vagrants have occurred in the past, but most recent Argyll records involve these re-introduced birds.

Spring One was at Mam Lirein (7 km SW of Craignure) Mull on 30 May.

Autumn Singles were at Kilmelford *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Oct, and on *Mull* at Treshnish Farm on 29 Oct, Fishnish Bay on 30 Oct and then at Bunessan on 31 Oct.

WHITE-TAILED EAGLE Haliaeetus albicilla

RED LIST A rare but increasing resident breeder in Argyll: wandering immatures (and sometimes adults) occur widely.

All year Reports from all areas with most from *Mull* and *Islay*. Fewer reports during Jun and Jul. Max counts of 10 at Gruline *Mull* in Apr and 8 (4 ads + 4 juvs) at Loch Gruinart *Islay* in Dec. *Breeding* Of the 33prs that laid eggs 24 prs fledged a min of 31 young (ARSG).

COMMON BUZZARD Buteo buteo

A resident breeding bird: common in all areas and the most abundant raptor in Argyll. All year Reports from all areas. Max counts of 45 on The Oa *Islay* in Feb and 34 on *Tiree* in Mar. *Breeding* Reports from all areas. Of the 110 sites checked 47 sites were occupied and fledged a min of 27 young (ARSG).

WATER RAIL Rallus aquaticus

AMBER LIST A secretive and under-recorded resident: occurs at low density on the mainland but in larger numbers on the outer islands. Immigration is thought to occur in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from areas at 14 sites except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura*). Max counts (birds heard) with 9 at Rubh' Ard an Duine, Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Jan, 5 at Poltalloch marsh *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Apr, 4 Loch Ederline *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Jan and 3 at Ardlamey, Gigha *Kintyre* on 19 Jan, also 1-2 birds reported at the other sites.

Summer/breeding Breeding reported (*Colonsay/Islay/Tiree*). Max counts of 7 Ters on *Colonsay* (incomplete survey) and from at least 5 sites on *Tiree*. At 16 sites, 1-4 birds heard calling.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas at 20 sites except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura/Mull*). Max counts of 10 birds across 6 sites on *Colonsay* on 15-18 Oct and 9 at Lochan Luing *Kintyre* on 14 Nov, also 1-3 birds noted at the other sites.

CORN CRAKE Crex crex

RED LIST A localised summer visitor, now breeding mainly on: Coll, Colonsay, Iona (Mull), Islay and Tiree. Following recent conservation activities, a long-term decline in numbers has being reversed, although numbers still fluctuate annually.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/Kintyre/North Argyll*). First arrivals were singles at Portnahaven on 12 Apr and at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 13 Apr both *Islay*. At least 20 calling males on *Tiree* by 30 Apr.

Summer/breeding Calling male counts: *Tiree* (300), *Coll* (47), *Iona* (15), *Colonsay/Oronsay* (20), *Islay* (54), *'other' Argyll* (3). Total was 439. Numbers down all areas except Iona *Mull*. Argyll total in 2018 was 487 and an Argyll peak was 702 in 2014.

Numbers of calling males declined by almost 10% (9.8%) with declines across all the islands by differing degrees. The largest decrease was on Colonsay/Oronsay 51%; Islay and Coll showed declines of c.10% and Tiree 6.8%. Yet again no birds were reported from Mull out with Iona. Total for UK in 2019 = 887 (per RSPB).

Autumn/winter Still 4 calling at The Reef *Tiree* on 15 Aug and 5 singles seen on *Tiree* in Sep, with last bird noted at Barrapol on 16 Sep.

COMMON MOORHEN Gallinula chloropus

A localised, sparsely distributed, resident breeding species: most numerous on Islay and in Mid-Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from 19 sites except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Kintyre*). Max counts of 5 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 16 Apr, elsewhere 1-3 birds at sites and most from *Cowal* and *Mid-Argyll*.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Jura*). Reports from 28 sites in total.

Autumn/winter Reports from 21 sites except (*Jura/Mull*). Max counts of 6 at Ardtur, Appin *North Argyll* on 17 Nov and 4 Port Charlotte *Islay* on 29 Dec.

COMMON COOT* Fulica atra

A former scarce and irregular breeder and an uncommon winter visitor.

Winter/spring One was at Lochan Ceann a' Choin, nr Ford *Mid-Argyll* on 1-18 Jan. Three were on *Tiree* at Loch a' Phuill/Loch Bhasapol on 2 Jan, then 2 until 26 Feb and 1 at Loch Bhasapol

until 27 Apr. One was at Loch Loskin, Dunoon Cowal during Apr and 1 was at RSPB Loch Gruinart floods Islay on 28 Apr.

Autumn/winter One was at Loch Bhasapol *Tiree* on 19 Aug and a 1cy bird was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 4 Oct.



COMMON CRANE Kintyre May Kevin Hamilton

COMMON CRANE* Grus grus

AMBER LIST A rare visitor: nineteen records; some records of up to three together between 1966-2018. Up to nine individuals were recorded in 2012.

Spring An adult was feeding in a field at Eastbacks Farm, Moss Road nr Machrihanish airport *Kintyre* on 6 May [Kevin Hamilton]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

EURASIAN OYSTERCATCHER Haematopus ostralegus

AMBER LIST A widespread and common breeding species: in all recording areas. Flocks congregate at favoured locations outside the breeding season and numbers often rise noticeably during spring and autumn passage.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 474 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 17 Jan, 346 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Jan, 242 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 17 Feb, and 225 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Feb.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from all Argyll areas. On *Tiree* 170 prs at The Reef and many fledged young by 2 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Passage at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* with 626 >S during Jul with a peak of 229 on 29 Jul and 1,017 >S during Aug with a peak of 316 on 8 Aug. Max

counts of 420 at Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Jul, 350 at Killail *Cowal* on 21 Nov, 320 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 13 Oct, 294 at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 8 Nov and 273 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Oct.

BLACK-WINGED STILT* Himantopus himantopus

A vagrant to Scotland with ten previous records however becoming more frequent in England where it has bred. No previous Argyll records.

Spring A 2cy bird was at Heylipol pools *Tiree* on 16-19 Apr [G Todd, J Bowler, J Hunter, J Dickson *et al*]. Record was accepted by the SBRC and becomes a new species for Argyll (*Article: Scottish Birds* Vol 39 (3) pp 262-5).

PIED AVOCET* Recurvirostra avosetta

AMBER LIST A vagrant: Four records; at Loch Seil, Mid-Argyll in 1936, Mull in 1977 and Kintyre in 1986 and 2002.

Spring Three were at SE corner of Lochan na Nigheadaireachd (5km SW of Bowmore) *Islay* on 19 Apr [Christina Tracey]. Record was accepted by the ABRC and becomes the first record for *Islay*.

NORTHERN LAPWING Vanellus vanellus

RED LIST A localised breeder and widespread wintering species: numbers highest on Tiree and Islay.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Highest nos all *Tiree* and *Islay*. Max counts of 2,485 on *Tiree* all island counts on 14-15 Jan and largest group there of 1,500 at Loch a' Phuill on 25 Jan, also 399 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 16 Feb. Elsewhere counts of up to 50 birds.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). On *Tiree* 314 prs on The Reef where good success but less than in 2018. At RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* 196 prs, and on *Colonsay* (except Oronsay) 27 prs noted, with 68 prs at RSPB Oronsay. At Barsloisnoch and Poltalloch *Mid-Argyll* 3-4 prs are starting to re-establish in this area.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 4,200 on *Tiree* all island counts on 26-27 Nov and largest group there of 960 at Loch a' Phuill on 13 Dec, also 1,330 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 13 Dec, 390 at Westport Marsh *Kintyre* on 20 Oct, 99 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 14 Nov and 83 at Port na Luing *Coll* on 16 Sep. Elsewhere, counts of up to 40 birds.

EUROPEAN GOLDEN PLOVER Pluvialis apricaria

AMBER LIST A moderate but probably decreasing number breed on moorland in several parts of Argyll. Large numbers are present at traditional sites by the coast in winter, also during spring and autumn passage, especially on Islay, Tiree, and Mull.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura*). Max counts of 4,350 at The Reef *Tiree* on 18 Apr, 1,665 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 17 Jan and 370 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 22 Apr. *Summer/breeding* Casual reports of breeding in upland areas where in *North Argyll* at 5+ sites, in *Mid-Argyll* at 5 sites and on *Mull* at 3 sites.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura*). Max counts of 2,895 on *Tiree* all island count on 26-27 Nov, 2,120 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 3 Nov and 860 at Westport Marsh *Kintyre* on 20 Oct.



AMERICAN GOLDEN PLOVER Tiree Sep Jim Dickson

AMERICAN GOLDEN PLOVER* Pluvialis dominica A rare autumn visitor: 25 records; all 2001-2018. *Autumn* A 1cy was at Machir Bay and later between Saligo and Ballinaby *Islay* on 20 Sep [Jim Dickson, David Jardine *et al*], an ad was at Baugh *Tiree* on 26 Sep [J Dickson, J Bowler, S Gibson, R Wesley], a 1cy was at Middleton *Tiree* on 12 & 14 Oct [John Bowler] and another 1cy was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 14-15 Oct [John Bowler]. All four records were accepted by the ABRC.

GREY PLOVER Pluvialis squatarola

AMBER LIST An uncommon passage migrant, recorded most frequently in Kintyre and on the islands: also, a winter visitor in small numbers, mostly on Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree*) of single birds however 4 were at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Feb.

Autumn/winter On *Islay* 2 were at Loch Gruinart on 3 Aug, however no other reports there until 11 on 7 Oct, then 6 until late Oct and 1 until year end. Different singles on *Tiree* on 1 and 5 Oct and 3 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 27 Sep.

COMMON RINGED PLOVER Charadrius hiaticula

RED LIST A widespread and fairly common breeding species: present throughout the year. Flocks congregate at favoured locations outside the breeding season and especially on passage. Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Most wintering birds on *Tiree* and *Islay* Jan-Feb

winterspring Reports from all coastal areas. Most wintering birds on *Tiree* and *Islay* Jan-Feb with several flocks of 80-180 birds. Smaller nos Mar-early Apr, then increased nos with passage birds late Apr and May, with max counts of 369 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 19 Apr, 297 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 20 Apr, 265 across 3 sites on *Tiree* on 23 May and 70+ on Iona *Mull* on 28 May. *Breeding* Limited data received. On *Tiree* 48 prs at The Reef. First newly fledged young in *Kintyre* on 14 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas. Return passage increased from late Jul. Max counts of 290 across 2 sites *Tiree* on 14 Oct, 275 on 26 Aug, 170 at the Strand *Colonsay* on 15 Oct, 117 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 2 Nov, 100 at Killail *Cowal* on 21 Nov and 67 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 14 Nov.

EURASIAN DOTTEREL Charadrius morinellus

RED LIST A scarce migrant: mostly seen in late Apr and May. There are occasional breeding records in North Argyll.

Spring A good showing in spring this year with at least 29 birds. On *Islay* 3 were at Kinnabus, The Oa on 23-25 Apr and 1 was at Borichill, nr Carrabus on 5 May. In *North Argyll* 4 (2mm, 2ff) were at Stob Coir' an Albannaich on 29 Apr. On *Colonsay* 4 were on Oronsay on 4-8 May and 2 were at the golf course *Colonsay* on 5-6 May. On *Mull* 5 (4ff, 1m) were at Maol nan Uan (2 km SW of Craignure) on 6 May. On *Tiree* 4 (3ff, 1m) were at The Reef on 8 May and 1f was at Loch a' Phuill on 9 May. In *Cowal* 5 were on Beinn Ime on 11 May.

WHIMBREL Numenius phaeopus

RED LIST A regular passage migrant: usually in small numbers and mainly on the islands. More frequent in spring (Apr-May) than in autumn (Jul-Oct) and is recorded regularly in summer but rarely in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. One winter report at Garmony *Mull* on 12 Feb. First migrant was a single >N over Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 20 Mar, then 2 at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* on 12 Apr and 6 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Apr. Most passage between 24 Apr and 10 May. At Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* 81 birds >N in late Apr with a peak daily count of 18 on 30 Apr. Max counts of 52 at Gartbreck *Islay* on 3 May, 51 on *Tiree* on 12 May and 40 at Fidden *Mull* on 7 May, however 20 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 11 Jun.

Summer Up to 4 birds on Tiree in Jul and a single at Lochdon Mull in early Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Return passage with a single at Duart Bay *Mull* on 14 Aug and 4 >S at The Reef *Tiree* on 15 Aug. Most passage from 23 Aug, although only 1-6 birds from most sites, and a max of 13 at Traigh Bhi *Tiree* on 28 Aug. Reports of singles on *Islay* in Oct, on *Mull* in Nov and on *Islay* in Dec.

EURASIAN CURLEW Numenius arquata

RED LIST An increasingly rare breeding species in suitable habitat: more numerous on passage and in winter. All breeding records of this declining species are welcome.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 430 on *Tiree* all island count on 11-12 Feb, 166 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 22 Jan and 127 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Feb. Many other sites help up to 50 birds.

Summer/breeding Limited data. On *Islay* 11 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart and birds in suitable habitat on The Oa. In *Mid-Argyll* 2 prs in upland areas and 2 prs at coastal areas, and at least 1 pr noted at sites on *Mull* and in *North Argyll*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 171 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 14 Oct, 161 at Machrihanish links *Kintyre* on 19 Dec, 120 on *Tiree* on 26 Nov, 111 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 15 Sep and 92 at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 1 Dec. Many other sites held up to 70 birds.

BAR-TAILED GODWIT Limosa lapponica

AMBER LIST A mainly autumn migrant and winter visitor: the largest numbers occurring on Islay. Birds are also regular on Tiree and at a few other island and mainland sites.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Max counts of 258 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Feb, 120 at head of Loch Indaal *Islay* on 10 Mar and 14 at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 14 Jan. On *Tiree, Islay*, at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* and at Loch Don *Mull* small nos of non-br birds remained until Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First returning birds from mid-Aug at *Islay Kintyre, Mid-Argyll* and *Tiree*. Max counts of 368 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Nov, 41 on *Tiree* on 18 Oct and 15 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 11 Dec.

BLACK-TAILED GODWIT Limosa limosa islandica

RED LIST A regular passage migrant, especially on Islay, Tiree and south Kintyre with occasional winter records. Most Argyll records have been presumed to relate to the Icelandic race L. l. islandica but at least one individual of the nominate race L. l. limosa has been identified (a bird leg flagged as a chick in The Netherlands and seen on Tiree in 2009).

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). First report of 2 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 Apr then 1 at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* on 9 Apr with 14 there on 10 Apr and 59 on *Tiree* by 12 Apr. Max count of 165 on *Tiree* on 20 Apr. A few birds remained on *Tiree* until late Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/North Argyll*). First returning reports of autumn passage with 20 ads on *Tiree* on 10 Jul and 17 on 18 Jul, also 7 ads >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 21 Jul, 14 ads at Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Jul and 13 ads at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 22 Jul. First juvs noted by mid-Aug on *Tiree* and *Islay*. Max counts of 115 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 20 Aug, 48 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 6 Sep and 25 on *Tiree* on 1 Sep. Reports decreased after early Sep and 1-2 birds remained at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* until mid-Dec.

RUDDY TURNSTONE Arenaria interpres

AMBER LIST A common and widespread passage migrant and winter visitor: mainly from mid Jul to early Jun. Mid-summer records are not unusual.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts from *Tiree* with high counts at several sites and a max 85 at Sandaig on 26 Feb. Elsewhere, 67 at Toward Point *Cowal* on 14 Apr, 55 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 21 Feb and 35 at Garmony *Mull* on 19 Mar. Most birds had left by mid-May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas. First arrivals back were 2 at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 8 Jul then 1 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 24 Jul with 17 there on 25 Jul and up to 10 birds at three sites *Cowal* and *Mull* by end of Jul. Max counts of 135 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 20 Dec, 107 at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 18 Nov and 82 at Dunoon *Cowal* on 17 Dec.



RED KNOT Islay Sep Jim Dickson

RED KNOT Calidris canutus

AMBER LIST An uncommon passage migrant: mostly in autumn, and mainly on Islay and south Kintyre. A few winter, mainly on Islay, and occasional birds occur in summer.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from (*Coll/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts of up to 52 at Loch Gruinart and Loch Indaal *Islay* Feb-Mar. Elsewhere, 8 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 30 May, 3 at Gunna Is. *Coll* on 28 May, 2 at Loch Don *Mull* on 19 Apr, 1 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 19 May and 1 at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 25 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from (*Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). First returning singles at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 8 Jul and at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 19 Jul. Strong passage at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* with 552 >S during Aug, with a max of 147 >S on 30 Aug. Elsewhere, max counts of 112 juvs at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 31 Aug, 48 juvs over Balephuil *Tiree* on 9 Aug and 12 juvs at Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Aug. Nos reduced after Oct, however 12 remained at Loch Indaal *Islay* through Dec and 1 was at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Dec.

RUFF Philomachus pugnax

RED LIST An uncommon passage migrant with most records in autumn.

Winter/spring Singles were at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 26 Apr and 13-14 May, at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 15 May, and at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 27 May.

Summer/breeding Up to 7 males and a female were at one site from early-May until late Jul but successful breeding was not confirmed.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). On *Tiree* a juv was at Loch a' Phuill on 4 Aug and 1-3 birds on the island until 16 Oct, however a max of 6 juvs across *Tiree* on 3 Sep. One was at Ardalanish Bay *Mull* on 10 Aug, 1 on Iona *Mull* on 2 Sep, 1 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 21 Aug, with 4 juvs there on 31 Aug, and a max of 8 there on 1 Sep, and last bird reported on 15 Nov. At Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* a max of 5 >S on 22 Aug.

CURLEW SANDPIPER* Calidris ferruginea

AMBER LIST A scarce but annual passage migrant: most records in autumn.

Spring A 2CY was at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 10 May. *Autumn* Two were at Carnain *Islay* on 10 Oct. *A very poor show of records this year.*

SANDERLING Calidris alba

AMBER LIST A mainly passage migrant, most numerous in Islay, south Kintyre, and Tiree. Regular wintering is confined to Coll, Colonsay, Islay and Tiree. A few non-breeders occur on the islands in summer.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/Mid-Argyll//North Argyll*). Max counts included 405 on *Tiree* on 23 May, 98 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Feb, 64 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 2 Feb and 41 at Rhunahaorine Point *Kintyre* on 2 Jan.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). Max counts of 616 on *Tiree* on 5 Aug, 280 >S past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 27 Jul and a tot of 504 >S there during Aug, 104 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Nov and 50 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 12 Oct.



DUNLIN Mid-Argyll May John Speirs

DUNLIN Calidris alpina

AMBER LIST A very localised breeding species mainly on Tiree. Numbers are highest on passage but large numbers winter on Islay and Tiree with smaller numbers elsewhere.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all coastal areas except (*Jura*). Nos generally low Jan-Mar with increased nos during spring passage from late Apr and May. Max counts of 3,628 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 17 May, 620 on *Tiree* on 30 Apr and 200 at the Strand *Colonsay* on 25 May.

Breeding On Tiree 67 prs at The Reef (a high number), several breeding prs noted in five other areas of *Tiree*, five sites in *North Argyll*, and at RSPB Ardnave *Islay*. Fledged chicks noted on *Tiree* from 3 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 2,900 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 26 Jul, 690 at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 5 Aug, 494 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* during Jul with max 150 there on 25 Jul and 599 >S there during Aug with a max 118 on 4 Aug. Elsewhere, max of 60 at Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Aug and 54 at Blackmill Bay, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Jul. Generally, nos decreased during Sep however up to 900 birds remained at Loch Gruinart *Islay* to Dec.

PURPLE SANDPIPER Calidris maritima

AMBER LIST A widely, but sparsely, distributed winter migrant along rocky coasts from Sep to May.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Jura*). Max counts of 95 at Hough Bay *Tiree* on 11 Jan and 71 at Croggan, Loch Spelve *Mull* on 26 Feb. Last report was of 3 at Gunna *Coll* on 12 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll*). First arrival was early with 1 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 28 Aug and next not until 18 Oct. Max count was 27 at Dunoon *Cowal* on 18 Dec.

BAIRD'S SANDPIPER* Calidris bairdii

A vagrant: Ten records; four on Islay (in Jun 1979, Sep 1999, Sep 2005 and Sep 2011), five on Tiree (in May/Jun 2007, Sep 2009, Sep 2011, Sep 2013 and Sep 2015) and one at the Add Estuary, Mid-Argyll in Sep 2008.

Autumn A lcy was at Vaul golf course on 4-7 Sep then nearby at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 12 Sep [Keith Gillon, J Bowler, A O'Connor, G Todd]. Another 1cy was at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 22 Oct [James How]. Both records were accepted by the BBRC.

LITTLE STINT* Calidris minuta

A scarce but annual passage migrant: with the majority of records in autumn.

Spring Only 2-3 records. One was at Killinallan, Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 May and singles at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 9 Jun and perhaps the same at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 10 Jun. *Unusually no autumn records*.



WHITE-RUMPED SANDPIPER Islay Oct Peter Roberts

WHITE-RUMPED SANDPIPER* Calidris fuscicollis

A vagrant: Six records of singles; on Islay in Aug 2000 and Oct 2005 and on Tiree in Aug and Sep 2011, Aug 2012 and Aug 2014.

Autumn Two 1cy birds were together at Sanaigmore *Islay* on 12-13 Oct [Richard Belter, Ian Brooke, Peter Roberts *et al*]. Record was accepted by the SBRC.

BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER* Tryngites subruficolus

A rare spring and scarce autumn visitor: at least 40 records of up to 54 birds since the first in 1971.

Autumn A 1cy was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 15 Sep [John Bowler]. Records was accepted by the ABRC.

PECTORAL SANDPIPER* Calidris melanotos A scarce mainly autumn visitor: At least 60 records.

Autumn A 1cy was at Carnain, Loch Indaal *Islay* on 4 Sep [Jim Dickson] and a 1cy was at Traigh Doire Dhubhaig (south Loch na Keal) *Mull* on 12-16 Sep [Mel & Mike Ricketts *et al*]. Both records were accepted by the ABRC.

LONG-BILLED DOWITCHER* Limnodromus scolopaceus

A vagrant: Three records; on Islay in June 1986, Apr 2009 and May 2013. There are also four acceptable records (1891-2009) of unidentified to species (Long or Short-billed).

Autumn A 1cy was at Sandaig *Tiree* on 5 Oct with further sightings around Sandaig, Middleton and Balephuil until 8 Nov [John Bowler, Jim Dickson *et al*].

EURASIAN WOODCOCK Scolopax rusticola

RED LIST A widespread, but probably under recorded breeder. Numbers are augmented in winter by immigrants from Scandinavia and other parts of Scotland. A small proportion of native birds leave for Ireland and possibly elsewhere.

Roding birds are under recorded and all records are welcome for this species, which is believed to have declined as a breeding species in Argyll (Bird Atlas 2007-11).

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Generally, 1-2 birds noted and max counts of 18 at Braevallich, E side of Loch Awe *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Jan and 4 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 9 Mar.

Summer/breeding Limited data. On *Colonsay* 12 'registrations' during a survey. Elsewhere only 1-2 birds noted from 8 sites. No reports during Jul or Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura/Kintyre*). Max counts of 15 at Beinn na Drise *Mull* on 25 Dec, 11 along E side of Loch Awe *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Nov and 9 at Appin *North Argyll* on 24 Nov. Elsewhere, reports of 1-5 birds from end of Oct -Dec at 22 sites.

JACK SNIPE Lymnocryptes minimus

A scarce autumn passage migrant and winter visitor, which is greatly under recorded: most records are from Islay, Mid-Argyll, and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/Kintyre/North Argyll*) with single birds from 7 sites and a max of only 2 birds from *Tiree* on 10 Jan.

Autumn/winter Only 6 reports of singles between 17 Oct and 24 Dec from all areas except (Cowal/Jura North Argyll). Anecdotal reports from Cowal saying birds are 'regularly flushed' during Common Snipe shoots.

COMMON SNIPE Gallinago gallinago

AMBER LIST A widespread and locally common breeding species: particularly on the outer islands. Higher numbers occur on passage and as winter visitors: mainly on the islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 36 at Heylipol *Tiree* on 2 May, 30 at Dervaig *Mull* on 7 Feb, 19 at Kennacraig, West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre* on 19 Jan and 15 at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* on 22 Jan.

Summer/breeding Limited data but presumed widespread. At RSPB Totronald *Coll* 21 Ters, 44 Ters at RSPB Gruinart reserve *Islay* and 148 Ters at The Reef *Tiree*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 1,000+ across *Tiree* on 8 Oct in flocks of up to 120, with a notable 800 in the Baugh area *Tiree* on 9 Oct and high nos across *Tiree* during Oct. Elsewhere max counts received only of 20+ at Loch Lussa *Kintyre* on 8 Nov, 15 Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 27 Sep and most other reports of just 1-14 birds.

RED-NECKED PHALAROPE* *Phalaropus lobatus*

RED LIST A very rare breeding species and irregular passage migrant.

Breeding Birds were noted at confidential breeding sites between 15 May and 31 Jul. Up to 22 (10 mm, 12 ff) birds were present and up to 9 broods were produced.

GREY PHALAROPE* Phalaropus fulicarius

Irregular passage migrant particularly associated with autumn gales: rare in winter and spring. Spring One, in breeding plum, was off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 26 May.

Autumn Singles were at Hynish on 21 Aug and Aird on 4 Sep both *Tiree*, and off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 4 Sep and 11 Nov.

COMMON SANDPIPER Actitis hypoleucos

AMBER LIST A widespread and common breeding summer visitor and spring and autumn passage migrant in small numbers: occasional mid-winter records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. One at Dervaig *Mull* on 23 Mar could relate to a wintering bird. First arrival at Craignure *Mull* on 6 Apr and most arrivals after mid-Apr. Max counts of 15 on Iona *Mull* on 30 May and 12 at Loch Ba *Mull* on 2 May.

Breeding Limited data. On *Islay* 18 prs located on RSPB Oa reserve, 18 prs on *Colonsay* and at least 5 prs on *Tiree* where it is increasing. Small chicks noted in *Cowal* from 25 May.

Autumn/winter No reports from (*Coll/Jura*). Max counts total of 22 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 30 Jul where total of 116 >S during Jul. Max count of 16 at Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Jul. Reports decreased during Aug and only one confirmed report after 31 Aug with a single at Blairmore *Cowal* on 5 Nov.



GREEN SANDPIPER Mull Sep Mike Pearson

GREEN SANDPIPER* Tringa ochropus

AMBER LIST A scarce, but almost annual passage migrant, with majority of records in autumn.

Autumn Four reports of singles, at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 28 Jul, at Gruinart Floods *Islay* on 5 Aug, at Salen *Mull* on 30 Aug and at Dervaig *Mull* on 27 Sep.

COMMON REDSHANK *Tringa totanus*

AMBER LIST A localised breeder, mainly on the islands: widespread passage migrant and wintering species. Winter/spring Reports from all areas

except (Jura). Max counts of 64 at Loch

Gruinart *Islay* on 19 Apr and 41 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 24 Mar. *Summer/breeding* Breeding data received; 94 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay*, 52 prs at The Reef *Tiree*, 46 prs at RSPB Totronald *Coll*, 6 prs on *Colonsay* (ex Oronsay) and 13 prs on Oronsay *Colonsay*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 250 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 8 Oct and 84 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 13 Oct. At Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* passage >S with 263 total birds in Jul, max 90 on 24 Jul and 301 in total in Aug with daily max of 77 on 8 Aug.



COMMON REDSHANKS Tiree Oct Richard Whitson

WOOD SANDPIPER* *Tringa glar*

AMBER LIST A scarce passage migrant: recorded in 22 of the 30 years 1980-2009, and majority of records in late spring.

Spring A male was observed singing and displaying at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 9 May and later joined by a second bird and last reported on 28 May. *This is the first record of likely breeding in Argyll.*

Autumn Two 1cy birds were at The Reef Tiree on 30 Jul.

SPOTTED REDSHANK* *Tringa erythropus*

AMBER LIST A scarce passage migrant, almost annual in autumn.

Autumn An adult was at The Reef Tiree on 30 Jul [J Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON GREENSHANK Tringa nebularia

AMBER LIST A scarce breeding species: only in Mull and North Argyll in recent years. A widespread migrant: more numerous in autumn than spring and regular winter records in some localities.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Reports mostly of singles however up to 3-4 birds at several sites in *Islay*, *Mull* and *North Argyll* and most reports were from *Mull* at 24 coastal sites.

Summer/breeding At least 3 prs in *North Argyll* and 4 prs in *Mid-Argyll* in upland areas, however very incomplete coverage, and no breeding data from *Mull*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally, 1-6 birds at sites with max counts of 8 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 10 Oct, 8 at Dervaig *Mull* in Nov-Dec and 7 on *Tiree* on 29 Jul. Most reports were from *Mull* at 22 sites then *Islay* at 10 sites.

GREATER YELLOWLEGS* *Tringa melanoleuca*

A vagrant: Two records; on Islay, in Oct 1985 and May 2002.

Spring One was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 28 Apr [John Bowler]. Record was accepted by the BBRC. (*Article: Scottish Birds Vol 39 (4) pp 366-7*)

KITTIWAKE Rissa tridactyla

RED LIST Normally a strictly marine species. The main breeding area is on Colonsay, with other colonies on Islay, Treshnish Isles and Tiree. Scarce in winter and very scarce inland. Breeding Kittiwakes are a feature of North Colonsay & Western Cliffs SPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal*). Max counts of 230 flying up Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Apr, 200 from the Oban to *Tiree* ferry on 8 Apr and 200 between the Garvellach Is. and *Colonsay* on 26 Apr.

Summer/breeding Only breeding data from (*Colonsay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). At Uragaig *Colonsay* monitoring site there were 30 AONs, on Sanda Is. *Kintyre* 30 AONs, on Lunga, Treshnish Isles *Mull* 843 AONs and at At Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* 339 AONs. Max counts included 900 off Greenhill *Tiree* on 19 Jun and 1 Jul, also 550 feeding between *Coll* and *Tiree* with many 2CY on 10 Jun, and 260 foraging off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* with Manx Shearwaters and Gannets on 5 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura*). Max counts of 2,200 mostly juvs between *Coll* and *Tiree* on 24 Sep, 900 >W off Aird *Tiree* in 1 hr inc 88 juvs on 9 Oct, 800 >S off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 2 Sep, 470 from the Kennacraig to *Islay* ferry on 30 Aug and 380 >S in 1 hr off Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 27 Oct.

SABINE'S GULL* Xema sabini

A scarce and irregular passage migrant mainly in autumn.

Spring A 2cy was seen from the MV Clansman midway between the Garvellachs Is. *Mid-Argyll* and *Colonsay* on 26 Apr [David Jardine]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

BLACK-HEADED GULL Chroicocephalus ridibundus

AMBER LIST A patchily distributed resident breeder: reduced or absent at some sites due to mink predation and scarce in many areas in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 236 on *Tiree* on 22 Apr, 189 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 21 Jan and 150 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Feb.

Summer/breeding Most breeding data from *Tiree* where *ca* 303 prs, however poor success. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all areas. Max counts of 140 at Knock *Mull* on 13 Sep, 80 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 17 Dec and 79 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 18 Sep.



LITTLE GULL Tiree Jun Keith Gillon

LITTLE GULL* Hydrocoloeus minutus An annual visitor, most frequently in autumn but may be encountered at any time of the year. Winter/spring Two adults were at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 7 Jan -7 Feb, then a 2cy was there on 8-27 Apr. An ad was at Ormsary Mid-Argyll on 7 Feb. One (not aged) was at Otter Ferry Cowal on 24 Jan. One (not aged) was at Scalasaig Colonsay on 11 May. A 2cy was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 29 May then joined by another 2cy on 4 Jun and last sighting was at Cornaig on 9 Jun.

Autumn/winter Unusually only one report – 1 at Craignure Bay *Mull* on 10 Oct.

MEDITERRANEAN GULL* Ichthyaetus melanocephalus **AMBER LIST** A scarce visitor mainly in autumn and winter.

Winter/spring Unusually no reports.

Autumn/winter Nine birds in total. A 3cy was at Toward Point *Cowal* on 8 Jul. At Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* a total of 5 birds with, a 2cy on 9-13 Jul, a 1cy (juv) on 27 Jul, a 1cy (first-winter plum) on 15 Aug and different 1cy birds on 18 and 25 Aug. A 2cy was at Bruichladdich *Islay* on 13 Jul. An adult was at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Jul. A 1cy was at Machir Bay *Islay* on 29 Oct.

COMMON GULL Larus canus

AMBER LIST A widespread and common resident breeding species but reduced or absent at some sites due to predation by mink.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 2,230 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 10 Feb and 300 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 10 Mar.

Summer/breeding Limited number of breeding reports received apart from *Tiree* where *ca* 450 AONs, at Ardnave *Islay* with 22 AONs, Sanda Is. *Kintyre* with 28 AONs and Garvard *Colonsay* with 10 AONs.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 395 on *Tiree* on 19 Aug and 300 at Kilmartin Glen *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Dec. Numerous flocks of up to 200 birds across Argyll.



RING-BILLED GULL Tiree Feb John Bowler

RING-BILLED GULL* Larus delawarensis

A scarce to rare visitor: Almost annual and records for every month of the year.

Winter A 3cy from 2018 was at Sandaig *Tiree* to at least 12 Feb [John Bowler *et al*]. Record was previously accepted by the ABRC.

GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL Larus marinus

AMBER LIST A common resident: breeding widely but in small numbers on small islands along the coast.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 148 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 12 Feb and 34 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 10 Apr.

Summer/breeding Breeding data only from (*Kintyre/Islay/Mull/Tiree*). The estimated breeding population on the Treshnish Isles *Mull* was only 24 pairs, *cf* 342 pairs counted by **Seabird 2000** in 1999. On *Islay* 15 AONs at RSPB Ardnave and 27 AON's on Sanda Is. *Kintyre*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 345 at Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Aug rising to a record 676 on 15 Sep after storms. Elsewhere, many counts of up to 55 birds.

GLAUCOUS GULL Larus hyperboreus

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular winter visitor: most frequent Jan-Mar.

Winter/spring All reports given were of singles; on *Islay* (not aged) at Carnduncan on 6 Jan and a 2cy (juv) at Machir Bay on 12 May, on *Tiree* 2cy's at Loch a' Phuill on 11 Jan and Balephetrish on 11 Feb, and on *Mull* (not aged) at Fhionnphort on 13 Mar.

Autumn/winter All reports given were of singles; on *Islay* (not aged) at Ballinaby on 20 Oct and 1cy's (juvs) at Kintra on 18 Nov, Coull Point on 22 Dec and Gartbreck on 31 Dec, on *Tiree* a 3cy was at Loch a' Phuill on 4 Dec then 1cy's at Gott Bay on 21 Dec, Traigh Ghrianal on 26 Dec and The Reef on 31 Dec, in *Cowal* a 1cy was at Craigendive on 29 Dec.

ICELAND GULL Larus glaucoides glaucoides

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular winter visitor: most frequent Jan-Mar, with numbers varying widely from year to year. There are a few summer records.

Winter/spring All reports given were of singles 2cy (juvs) and a below average show; at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Jan, at Loch Scridain *Mull* on 12 Feb, at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 12 Feb, at Mausdale *Kintyre* on 25 Feb and at Caliach Point *Mull* on 5 May.

Autumn/winter All reports given and a poor show with only four birds: 2 (not aged) at Fidden *Mull* on 19 Oct and 1cy's (juvs) at Bowmore *Islay* on 26 Oct and Port Righ *Kintyre* on 11 Dec.



'KUMLIEN'S' ICELAND GULL Kintyre Mar Eddie Maguire

'KUMLIEN'S' ICELAND GULL* Larus glaucoides kumlieni

A sub-species of Iceland Gull, from arctic NE Canada, with no Argyll records prior to 2011 however an influx of eleven birds during late winter 2011/12 reflected record numbers in the UK and Europe.

Winter/spring An adult >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 3 Mar [Eddie Maguire].

EUROPEAN HERRING GULL Larus argentatus

RED LIST A widespread and abundant resident breeding species that forms large flocks outside the breeding season. Recently several large colonies have been abandoned, and very few now breed inland.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 330 on The Oa *Islay* on 5 Mar, 300 on Gigha *Kintyre* on 19 Jan and 265 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 22 Jan.

Summer/breeding Limited and incomplete breeding data. On *Islay* 31 AONs at RSPB Ardnave, 347 AONs on Sanda Is. *Kintyre*, 70 AONs at Bach Island, Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* and at least 73 AONs on *Tiree*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 600 at Airds Point, Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Aug, 420 nr Tobermory *Mull* on 31 Dec and 284 at Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Sep.

LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL Larus fuscus

AMBER LIST A widespread breeding species: generally present from Mar to Sep. Some colonies are much affected by mink predation. A few remain in winter. Seabird 2000 found 3,235 pairs in Argyll and Bute but numbers have since declined greatly.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. First report was an ad at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Feb then 3 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 15 Feb. Max counts of 73 at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 20 May, 59 at RSPB Oa reserve *Islay* on 1 Apr, 56 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 14 Apr and 52 at Heylipol *Tiree* on 15 Apr.

Summer/breeding Limited and incomplete breeding data. On *Tiree* 94 AONs, 9 AONs at RSPB Ardnave *Islay* and 17 AONs on Sanda Is. *Kintyre*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Passage >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* started on 8 Jul where a max of 300+ on 12 Jul and 230 (only18 were juvs) >S in 5 hrs on 20 Jul. Elsewhere, max counts of 37 on *Tiree* on 12 Sep and 30 nr Fidden *Mull* on 4 Aug. Nos decreased sharply during Sep. Last 2 reported at Tobermory *Mull* on 23 Dec.



GULL-BILLED TERN*

Gelochelidon nilotica A vagrant: Two records; both on Tiree, in Sep 2008 and in Apr 2010.

Spring An adult was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 17 May then also at An Fhaodhail and Loch Riaghain on three dates, last seen on 27 May [J Bowler, G Todd, C Verstraete]. Record was accepted by the BBRC. (*Article: Scottish Birds* Vol 39 (3) pp 271-3).

GULL-BILLED TERN Tiree May John Bowler



SANDWICH TERN Kintyre Apr Eddie Maguire

SANDWICH TERN Thalasseus sandvicensis

AMBER LIST A regular passage migrant but very rare, and irregular, breeding species.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll). First arrivals were singles at West Loch Tarbert and Machrihanish SBO both Kintyre on 28 Mar. Higher counts included 12 at Tayinloan Kintyre on 6 Apr, 22 at Machrihanish Bay Kintyre on 18 Apr and 38 at the Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 1 May (a total of 112 birds >S there in Apr), 11 at Toward Pt

Cowal on 11 Apr and 8 at Bruichladdich Islay on 22 Apr.

Summer/breeding No confirmed breeding reports. An ad + juv were at Toward Pt *Cowal* on 27 Jul, 7 ads + a juv at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 30 Jul with up to 9 ads + 3 juvs there in Aug, 3 ads + 1 juv at West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre* on 16 Aug and a juv off Bruichladdich *Islay* on 5-7 Sep.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). Only two reports after mid-Sep with 2 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 7 Oct and 4 at NE *Tiree* on 19 Oct.

LITTLE TERN Sternula albifrons

AMBER LIST A scarce summer visitor with regular breeding restricted to: Coll, Islay, and Tiree. Scarce passage migrant and irregular breeder elsewhere.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). First report was one at Traigh Bhaigh *Tiree* on 11 Apr. Most reports from *Tiree* otherwise 7 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 28 Apr, 2 off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 5 May and 2 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 15 Jun.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports only from; *Tiree* where 30 prs fledged 21 young, Gunna *Coll* with 33 prs and outcome unknown, and *Islay* with 4 AONs.

Autumn All birds had departed before end of Jul.

COMMON TERN Sterna hirundo

AMBER LIST A locally common summer visitor: considerably more numerous than Arctic Tern close to the mainland, but often less so on outer isles. Many colonies are severely affected by mink predation and often unproductive where no trapping is undertaken. Seabird 2000 found that Argyll held the second largest colony in Britain and the largest in Scotland. Breeding Common Terns are a feature of Glas Eileanan SPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas except (*Cowal*) with most reports from *Mull* and *Tiree*. First reports of singles at Traigh Bhaigh *Tiree* on 23 Apr and Feolin *Jura* on 29 Apr. Max counts of 25 off Craignure *Mull* on 15 May and 30 at the Cairns of *Coll* on 24 May.

Summer/breeding Breeding on many offshore islands for which little data. On the Treshnish Isles *Mull* no breeding prs, *cf* 17 prs in 2018. On *Tiree* only 2 nests noted, producing 2 juvs and max count of 5 juvs at Gott Bay on 25 Jul. At least 10 prs at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll*. A max count of 200 at Scallastle beach *Mull* on 16 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Few reports after start of Aug and a max of 5 at Derryguaig *Mull* on 2 Aug. Last reports were 3 juvs off Bruichladdich *Islay* after storms on 2 Sep and a juv at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 5 Sep.

ARCTIC TERN Sterna paradisaea

AMBER LIST A summer visitor and localised breeding species particularly on: Coll, Colonsay, Islay, Jura, Mull, and Tiree. Many colonies are severely affected by mink predation and are often unproductive where no trapping is undertaken. Seabird 2000 counted 1,823 pairs in Argyll & Bute.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas except (*Cowal/Jura*). First report of 1 from the Kennacraig to Islay ferry on 13 Apr then 3 at Traigh Bhaigh *Tiree* on 20 Apr and 1 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 30 Apr. Max count of 250 on rocks at Gunna Is. off *Coll* on 12 May.

Summer/breeding Incomplete data. On the Treshnish Isles *Mull* no birds were found to be breeding *cf* 127 pairs in 2018. On *Tiree* 333 nests at 11 sites produced fledged young from 8 Jul and a fair breeding year. Breeding success not known for additional 120 pairs nesting on *Tiree* islets. On *Islay* 43 nests at Ardnave.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas except (*Cowal/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll*). Larger counts from *Mull, Islay* and *Tiree* in Jul included fledged juvs. Small nos in Aug with max of 7 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 2 Aug, a max of 4 off Aird *Tiree* on 4 Sep, and last reports of singles off NW *Mull* on 2 and 8 Oct.

GREAT SKUA Stercorarius skua

AMBER LIST Previously an uncommon passage migrant and summer visitor but an increasing summer visitor which now breeds or holds territory in very small numbers on Coll, Treshnish Isles Mull, Tiree, Colonsay, Islay and Staffa.

Winter/spring No winter reports. First report of a single off NW *Mull* on 1 Apr. Recorded from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). Only 1-2 birds noted however a max of 5 birds from sites on *Mull* and *Tiree* in May.

Summer/breeding Breeding/possible reports received from sites in (*Coll/Colonsay/Mull/Tiree*) with most on Oronsay *Colonsay* where 5 prs of which 3 prs nested.

Autumn/winter Passage birds noted from 15 Aug when a single off Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* then generally 1-4 birds noted from coastal sites in all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*) and peak sea-watch counts, all from Aird *Tiree* in Sep of 7 on 4th, 12 on 5th and 24 on 6th. Last report was a single off Orsay *Islay* on 29 Oct.

POMARINE SKUA* Stercorarius pomarinus

A scarce but regular passage migrant; mainly seen in autumn but has been recorded in all months.

Autumn/winter On *Tiree* 1 was off the Ringing Stone (N coast) on 16 Sep, a 1cy was off Balevullin on 30 Sep, a 1cy off Hynish on 5 Oct and 4 > W off Aird on 9 Oct. Two were seen from the Oban to *Colonsay* ferry on 14 Oct and a 1cy was off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 24 Oct.

ARCTIC SKUA Stercorarius parasiticus

RED LIST Previously the most common skua in Argyll with small numbers regularly seen in summer near large seabird colonies, this species has become scarce. The small breeding colonies on Jura and Coll have been in serious decline in recent years. Passage birds can be widespread in spring and especially autumn, but variable in numbers from year to year.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Coll/Colonsay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). First report of 2 between the Garvellach Is. and *Colonsay* on 26 Apr then singles from N *Islay* and NW *Mull* on 2 May. Several other reports of 1-2 birds from sea areas off *Kintyre, Mull* and *Tiree* in May.

Summer/breeding One pair held a Ter on *Coll* and several reports of 1-2 dark-phase birds seen feeding offshore there. Two birds on Treshnish Is. *Mull* on 23-24 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from 16 sites during Aug-Oct of 1-4 birds and max counts of 10 off SW *Coll* (seen from ferry) on 24 Sep and 5 there on 9 Oct, 7 >S off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 28 Aug and 5 from there on 7 Aug. Last report of 3 >W off Aird *Tiree* on 9 Oct.

LITTLE AUK* Alle alle

A scarce and irregular winter visitor: usually seen during sea-watches or after severe gales. Winter Only report was of 3 >W off Aird Tiree on 7 Jan.

Autumn/winter Only two reports, both *Kintyre* with 1 was at mouth of Campbeltown Loch on 8 Nov and 2 >S off Machrihanish SBO on 11 Nov.

COMMON GUILLEMOT Uria aalge

AMBER LIST A highly colonial, and locally abundant, breeding species. Adults with small young appear on the sea far from colonies in late summer. Large numbers of passage migrants may be seen from headlands and smaller numbers are regular in sea lochs in winter. Breeding Common Guillemots are a feature of North Colonsay & Western Cliffs SPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas with most counts of 1-40 birds, however 600 at sea from the *Coll* to *Tiree* ferry on 10 Apr.

Summer/breeding Birds were back at breeding colonies from early Apr and a notable count of 2,000 at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 9 Apr and 2,871 on cliffs there plus 1,500 on sea below. No chicks noted on 14 Jun however some 415 mid-sized chicks by 11 Jul. On Sanda Is. *Kintyre* a count of 5,500 birds in Jun. On the Treshnish Is. *Mull* breeding was confirmed on Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil with the main concentration within the vicinity of Harp Rock where 10,073 adults were estimated. The total for Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil combined was 10,687. The mean count for the past five years is 9,153 birds (range 7,360-10,687) (TIARG).

Autumn/winter Reports from all coast areas. Max counts of 1,000-1,500 large auks, mainly Guillemots with large young from the Kennacraig to *Islay* ferry on 30 Aug and 1,350 >S in 1 hour off Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 27 Oct.

RAZORBILL Alca torda

AMBER LIST A locally common breeding species, although much less numerous and with smaller colonies than Common Guillemot. Large numbers of passage migrants may be seen from headlands with smaller numbers regular in sea lochs in winter.

Winter/spring Reports only from (*Coll/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max count of 196 >W in 1 hr off Aird *Tiree* on 7 Jan. A count of 800 from the Oban to *Tiree* ferry on 9 Apr. On *Islay* 64 were off Bruichladdich Loch Indaal on 2 Apr.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from (*Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree*). At least 300 birds back at cliffs of Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 8 Apr and still 291 birds, some with large chicks on 11 Jul. On the Treshnish Is. *Mull* breeding was confirmed on Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil. A total of 734 birds on Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil (TIARG). At least 500 birds at Sanda Is. *Kintyre* in Jun/Jul. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all areas except (*North Argyll*). Most high counts were from sea areas around *Coll* and *Tiree* with 900+ from the Oban to *Tiree* ferry on 24 Sep and an impressive 7,485 >W off Aird *Tiree* in 1 hr (mostly this species) on 10 Oct.

BLACK GUILLEMOT Cepphus grylle

AMBER LIST A widespread, resident breeding species: on coasts, islands, and in sea lochs. Black Guillemot is a protected feature of Clyde Sea Sill MPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts included 23 at Oban Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Mar, 22 at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 8 Apr and 318 on a coastal survey of The Oa *Islay* on 11 Apr.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. On the Sanda Is. *Kintyre* 207 birds on 23 Apr. Max count of 25 at Oban Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jul. At Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* 5 ads + 6 juvs on 4 Aug. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all coastal areas. Counts from most coastal sites usually 1-10 birds and a max count of 22 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 14 Nov.

ATLANTIC PUFFIN Fratercula arctica

RED LIST A very localised breeding species with main colonies on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles: only very occasionally recorded in winter.

Winter/spring No reports from (*Cowal/Islay/Jura/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). A dead bird was found at Sandaig *Tiree* on 18 Feb. One was off Calgary *Mull* on 24 Mar. Seen in higher nos from early Apr e.g. 150 from the Oban to *Tiree* ferry on 9 Apr and 100+ Staffa *Mull* on 10 Apr. Most reports were birds seen from headlands or the island ferries.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. On the Treshnish Isles *Mull* the estimated breeding population on Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil was 3,135 AOBs. Numbers since 2004 have fluctuated between 2,423 and 3,349 AOBs, with the exception of the comparatively low estimates of the two years 2010-2011; 1,705 and 1,611 AOBs respectively (TIARG). On Sanda Is. *Kintyre* a count of 75 AOBs.

Autumn/winter Birds moved away from breeding colonies in by late Jul to early Aug and last reports were off *Tiree* with 12 off Hynish on 21 Aug and last single at sea between *Coll* and *Tiree* on 24 Aug.

ROCK DOVE Columba livia

A resident breeder except in Cowal: concentrated on the islands and in Kintyre. Large flocks often gather on arable fields out with the breeding season. The genetic integrity of most populations is now in doubt because of interbreeding with feral pigeons. Those on the islands being probably nearest 'pure' Rock Dove. Feral Pigeons are recorded from most areas, but there is little information on population size.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal*). Max counts of 45 at Ruaig *Tiree* on 14 Jan, 30+ at Salen *Mull* on 26 May and 26 at Rockside *Islay* on 16 May.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal*). Max counts of 440 on *Tiree* (across 5 sites) on 16 Sep, 261 at Carnain *Islay* on 8 Nov and 230 at Sunderland *Islay* on 7 Nov.

FERAL PIGEON Small groups reported from the larger towns in Argyll with max counts of 50+ in Oban.

STOCK DOVE* Columba oenas

AMBER LIST A very scarce and local resident: only regularly reported from Cowal and Mid-Argyll in recent years. All records required please.

Winter/spring Five were at Killail *Cowal* on 1 Jan, 2 were at Ardtur, Loch Laich *North Argyll* on 17 Apr and 2 were at Croggan, Loch Spelve *Mull* on 13 May.

Autumn/winter One was at Baluachraig, nr Slockavullin *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Jul, 2 were at Carradale Bay *Kintyre* on 22 Sep and a remarkable count of 12 at Torrisdale *Kintyre* on 25 Sep.

COMMON WOOD PIGEON Columba palumbus

A common resident breeding species: less numerous on Mull, scarce on Coll, and rare on Tiree. Large flocks which form on the mainland in winter may include immigrants.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max count of 25 at Inverchapel *Cowal* on 14 Feb. On *Tiree* 9 on 16 May inc a flock of 7 that flew off SW.

Summer/breeding On *Islay* 4 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart was only breeding data received. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all areas. Max counts of 45 at Dalmally *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Dec, 40 at Loch Allan *Islay* on 1 Nov and 38 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Dec.

EUROPEAN TURTLE DOVE *Streptopelia turtur*

RED LIST A scarce but almost annual passage migrant: most frequently recorded during May and Jun.

Spring Single birds were at Salen *Mull* on 8 Jun and at Heylipol *Tiree* on 8-10 Jun. *Autumn* Single birds were at Octofad farm *Islay* on 20 Sep and at Bunessan *Mull* on 22-28 Oct.

EURASIAN COLLARED DOVE Streptopelia decaocto

A widespread but sparsely distributed species throughout Argyll usually associated with human settlement. It is resident at many locations however is mainly a late spring migrant or summer visitor to some islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Under reported. Max counts received were 31 in one Bruichladdich garden *Islay* on 12 Jan and 14 at Gigalum Bay, Gigha *Kintyre* on 19 Jan.

Summer/breeding No specific breeding data received. Juvs noted in *Mid-Argyll* from 2 Jun. Widespread counts of up to 10 birds.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 57 at Octofad farm *Islay* on 20 Sep and 35 at Laphroaig *Islay* on 30 Dec.

GREAT SPOTTED CUCKOO* Clamator glandarius

A vagrant from southern Europe, with only one previous Scottish record: Rendall, Orkney 14-30 Aug 1959.

Spring/summer An adult was at Lagandorain, Iona *Mull* on 23-26 Jun [Rudolf Hummel, Phillip Higginson *et al*]. Record was accepted by the BBRC and becomes a new species for Argyll. (*Article: Scottish Birds Vol 39 (3) pp 278-80*).

COMMON CUCKOO Cuculus canorus

RED LIST A common summer visitor that is more frequent and widespread on the mainland: less numerous on the outer islands.

Spring Reports from all areas. First reports of singles from Lismore *North Argyll* and High Lossit, Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 16 Apr. Widespread arrivals across Argyll from 17 Apr.

Breeding Noted calling at sites in; Coll (3), Colonsay (20), Cowal (16), Islay (24), Kintyre (10), Mid-Argyll (49), Mull (98), North Argyll (19) and Tiree (5).

Autumn Seven reports in Jul, three in Aug, none in Sep and the latest ever report from *Tiree* of one feeding on hairy caterpillars at Loch Stanail, Kilmoluaig on 17 Oct. *The latest ever in Argyll was on 7 Nov 1935.*



BARN OWL Kintyre Jun Neil Brown

BARN OWL Tyto alba A patchily distributed breeding species: probably most numerous in Kintyre. It is widespread on Cowal, Islay, and Mull but only a rare visitor to Coll, Colonsay, and Tiree. All records are requested.

All year Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll/Tiree). Most reports from Islay, Mull and Mid-Argyll. Reports mainly of singles in all months with more reports during Jan-May then fewer thereafter and only one report in Jul and none in Sep.

Breeding Data from the ARSG; 109 sites were checked (out of a total of 135). No fresh signs were found at over half of these (55 sites). Six sites were occupied by single birds, with pairs being found at the remaining 39 sites [39 sites occupied by pairs in 2018]. Eggs were known to have been laid at 26 sites and at seven sites no eggs were laid; the outcome is not known at the remaining sites. The fledging outcome was known at 26 sites, where 50 % of nests were successful [56.5% in 2018]. The mean young per successful nest was 3.00 [1.85 in 2018].

SNOWY OWL* Bubo scandiacus

A vagrant: Seven records; a male on Coll on 27 Jan 2007, an immature female on Tiree on 29 Jan 2007 and an adult male in mountains NW of Tyndrum, North Argyll on 27 Feb 2016. Four old records between 1870 and 1892 are also considered acceptable.

Spring A female was at Grishipoll *Coll* on 23 Apr [D & R Wainwright]. Record was accepted by the BBRC.



TAWNY OWL Strix aluco

AMBER LIST A widespread and common resident breeding bird: absent from Coll and with only single records for Colonsay and Tiree.

All year Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Tiree*). More frequent reports during Mar-Jun and in Dec however no reports in Jul and mostly from sites in *Mid-Argyll* (16), *Mull* (13) and *Cowal* (8). Most reports of birds calling as expected and only a few sight records.

Breeding Data from the ARSG; 70 sites were checked (out of a total of 85). No signs or birds were found at 40 sites and only fresh signs were found at 7 sites. Three sites had single birds and breeding pairs were found at 20 sites [17 sites in 2018]. The fledging outcome was known at 12 sites, where 75% of nests were successful. The mean young per successful nest was 1.44 [1.00 in 2018].

TAWNY OWL Kintyre Jun Neil Brown

LONG-EARED OWL Asio otus

A very scarce resident breeding bird and winter visitor: almost certainly under recorded. All records are requested.

All year Only reports received were singles at Glen More *Mull* on 4 Apr, at Airleod *Coll* on 11 May, location not stated *Mull* on 13 Jun and at Kintra *Mull* on 6-7 Jul.

Breeding Six regularly checked sites were unoccupied. A new site was located on *Mull* which reared at least four young (ARSG).

SHORT-EARED OWL Asio flammeus

AMBER LIST A widely but thinly distributed breeder and winter visitor. Numbers fluctuate and distribution varies with the abundance of small rodents, especially field voles (Microtus agrestis).

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Colonsay/Jura/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Most reports were from *Mull* (9 sites) of 1-4 birds and max counts of 3 at Achnahard on 20 Feb and 4 at Ensay NW *Mull* on 18 Apr and 3 May. On *Jura* up to 4 birds seen in Apr-May. A single was at Upper Kilchattan *Colonsay* on 21 May.

Summer/breeding Eleven sites were checked; nine had no signs of occupation. The breeding outcome was unknown at the site occupied by a pair. A single bird was present at the other site (ARSG).

Autumn/winter Only reports were singles at Ruaig *Tiree* on 18 Sep and at Machrihanish airfield *Kintyre* on 18 Nov.



SHORT-EARED OWL Mull Aug Mike Pearson

COMMON NIGHTHAWK* Chordeiles minor

A vagrant with only one previous Scottish record: one in Kirkwall, Orkney on 12 Sep 1978.

Autumn An adult was seen briefly in flight at Loch Laich, Portnacroish *North Argyll* on 11 Sep [Ashley Cooper]. Record was accepted by the BBRC and becomes a new species for Argyll.

COMMON SWIFT Apus apus

AMBER LIST A summer visitor, breeding locally on the mainland: wandering birds and passage migrants may occur anywhere.

Spring/summer Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay*). First arrivals were 2 at Kilmichael Glassary *Mid-Argyll* on 9 May when back at nest boxes and 2 in Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 10 May. Noted from sites in; *Cowal* (4), *Islay* (4), *Kintyre* (3), *Mid-Argyll* (20), *Mull* (9), *North Argyll* (2) and *Tiree* (3). Max counts of 12 in Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 15 Jul, 25 in Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Jul and 10 in Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Jul. Between 2 and 11 birds on three dates over

Lunga, Treshnish Isles *Mull* in late Jun (TIARG). Higher counts in Jul reflect the appearance of fledged young.

Breeding Limited data. Nesting noted in Dunoon *Cowal*, Campbeltown *Kintyre*, Kilmichael Glassary, Lochgilphead, Kilmelford and Oban *Mid-Argyll*. Last seen going to a nest in Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 8 Aug.

Autumn Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Jura/North Argyll, Tiree*). Twelve reports in Aug with max of 20 in Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Aug and 10 in Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Aug. No reports in Sep and a report of a late single at Loch Don *Mull* on 17 Oct.



COMMON KINGFISHER Mid-Argyll Oct Jim Dickson

COMMON KINGFISHER Alcedo atthis

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular visitor with most records in autumn and winter at a few regular mainland locations. The only proven breeding record was in Kintyre in 1993.

Winter/spring Reports of single birds only from; *Cowal* at River Eachaig on 29 Mar, in *Mid*-*Argyll* at Loch Gilp on 1- 4 Jan, at Connel on 11 Jan and at Caol Scotnish on 28 Feb. *Summer/breeding* No confirmed breeding reports and no sighting reports received between 29 Mar-15 Jul. Singles at Loch Don *Mull* on 15 Jul and Blackmill Loch *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Jul. *Autumn/winter* More widespread with reports of singles from; *Cowal* at Holy Loch on 7 Sep-2 Nov, at Kilfinan on 30 Nov and at Gairletter on 20 Dec. On *Islay* reports from Bridgend Woods and Carnain on 25 Sep-3 Nov and at Ardistry Bay, nr Ardbeg on 28 Oct. On *Jura* at Inverlussa on 30 Sep. In *Kintyre* at Machrihanish golf course on 2 Nov, at Loch Lussa on 5 Nov and at Carradale on 6 Nov. In *Mid-Argyll* at Cairnbaan on 12 Sep then at Loch Gilp on 16 Sep-31 Dec with 2 there on 22 Dec, also at Loch Feochan on 16 Oct-3 Nov and Ballachuan Loch, Seil on 18 Nov, On *Mull* at Loch Don on 15 Jul and 2 Oct- 25 Dec.

EURASIAN HOOPOE* Upupa epops

A scarce passage migrant, with most records in spring.

Spring One was at Blairmore golf course, Loch Long Cowal on 13 May.



GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER Dendrocopos

major A resident breeder: widespread on the mainland and Mull, with occasional records on Islay.

Winter/spring Reports from and sites reported; *Cowal* (11), *Islay* (4), *Kintyre* (1), *Mid-Argyll* (15), *Mull* (14), *North Argyll* (2). Generally, 1-2 birds reported and a max of 4 together in Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* in Jan. Drumming heard from early Feb.

Summer/breeding Although breeding long suspected on *Islay* confirmed breeding at three sites with active nests from 4 Jun. First fledged young noted at Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from and sites reported: *Cowal* (3), *Islay* (2), *Kintyre* (3), *Mid-Argyll* (7), *Mull* (4) and *North Argyll* (2).

GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER *Mid-Argyll* Bill Anderson

GREEN WOODPECKER* Picus viridis

Rare: infrequent in Cowal in recent years as well as in Mid-Argyll, Mull and N Argyll. Breeding may have occurred in Kintyre in 1998. All records required.

Spring Only two reports with singles at Ardalanish Bay *Mull* on 7 Apr and at Cairnbaan (north side of canal) *Mid-Argyll* on 11 Jun.

COMMON KESTREL Falco tinnunculus

AMBER LIST A widespread, but declining, breeding bird. There is emigration from some areas in autumn and immigration to others.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*). All reports of 1 -2 birds in Jan (12), Feb (5), Mar 10), Apr (15), May (18) and report from sites in; *Coll* (1), *Colonsay* (1), *Cowal* (2), *Islay* (8), *Kintyre* (6), *Mid-Argyll* (5), *Mull* (28), and *Tiree* (9). Most frequent reports were in Mar and May. The number of reports on *Mull* increased markedly in Apr-May whereas most

reports from *Tiree* were in Jan. Unfortunately, no data from *Jura* where usually a good number of reports.

Summer/breeding Data from the ARSG; 25 sites were checked of which only 2 occupied and one site produced 1 young.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Reports of 1-2 birds in Aug (6), Sep (5), Oct (19), Nov (13) and Dec (4) and from sites in; *Coll* (1), *Colonsay* (1), *Cowal* (1), *Islay* (19), *Kintyre* (2), *Mid-Argyll* (9), *Mull* (8), *North Argyll* (2) and *Tiree* (4).

MERLIN Falco columbarius

RED LIST Breeds very locally on open moorland and bogs: more widely distributed on passage and in winter on low coastal ground and farmland.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll)*. Most reports of single birds mainly in Feb (17) then Mar (10). Most reports were from *Islay* (20), *Mull* (16), *Tiree* (10), *Colonsay* (3), *Kintyre* (3) and *Cowal* (1).

Summer/breeding Only three reports in Jun-Jul with singles from *Coll*, *Mid-Argyll* and *Tiree*. Occupied sites were noted in *North Argyll* (2) and *Islay* (1).

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Most reports of singles and max counts of up to 4 on *Tiree* in Oct. Reports by month were; Aug (6), Sep (13), Oct (30), Nov (14) and Dec (18). Reports from sites in; *Coll* (4), *Islay* (36), *Kintyre* (6), *Mid-Argyll* (6), *Mull* (8) and *Tiree* (21).

EURASIAN HOBBY* Falco subbuteo

A rare visitor: Mostly in spring and autumn.

Spring/summer An adult was at Cnocan Sgeir'e (Glendaruel) *Cowal* on 2 Apr [Duncan Cameron], a 2cy+ was at Milton *Tiree* on 7 Jun [C Verstraete] and a 2cy+ was at Grasspoint *Mull* on 8 Jun [S Milton]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.



PEREGRINE FALCON Falco peregrinus

A widespread but scarce breeding species in all areas of Argyll, with about 70 occupied territories in 2005. There have been indications of a decline in numbers breeding away from coastal areas. Found throughout the year in most areas.

All year Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-2 birds at sites across Argyll and most reports from *Islay*.

Breeding Data from the ARSG; 19 sites were checked, six sites were occupied and raised a min. of 8+ large young.

PEREGRINE FALCON Mull Sep Mike Pearson



RED-BACKED SHRIKE* Lanius collurio

RED LIST A rare passage migrant: 20 records between 1954 and 2018.

Spring A 2cy+ female was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 21 May [John Bowler].

Autumn A 1cy was at Glenastle, The Oa *Islay* on 28-29 Sep [Bonnie Wood, Phill Catton]. Both records were accepted by the ABRC.

RED-BACKED SHRIKE Islay Sep Phill Catton

EURASIAN GOLDEN ORIOLE* Oriolus oriolus **RED LIST** A rare and irregular passage migrant, mainly in spring.

Spring/summer Two reports of adult males, at Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 30 May and at Avonvogie plantation *Islay* on 4 Jul.

EURASIAN JAY Garrulus glandarius

A widely distributed (but scarce) woodland resident on most of the mainland: rarely reported from the islands. There is some immigration in autumn.

Winter/spring Reports of 1-2 birds from sites in; *Cowal* (5), *Kintyre* (3), *Mid-Argyll* (5), *Mull* (13) and *North Argyll* (8).

Summer/breeding All reports from mainland Argyll and *Mull* with 1-2 birds at sites, however no specific breeding reports.

Autumn/winter Reports of 1-3 birds from sites in; *Cowal* (5), *Kintyre* (5), *Mid-Argyll* (11) and *Mull* (7). Max counts of 6 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 10 Aug, 6 at Torrisdale *Kintyre* on 25 Sep and 6 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 17 Nov.

EURASIAN MAGPIE *Pica pica*

A local breeder restricted to Cowal. Elsewhere, has been a scarce and sporadic visitor (mainly in spring): in recent years appearing to be becoming more widespread.

Winter/spring Reports from (*Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). *Cowal* had most reports, although likely under reported and only a max of 3 birds noted at sites. Only noted in *Kintyre* at Campbeltown on 11 Apr and Peninver on 15 Apr-12 May. Only 3 reports of singles from *Mid-Argyll* at Balvicar, Ellery and Ford. On *Mull* 1 was at Salen on 18 Apr. In *North Argyll* 1 was at Barcaldine House on 8 Jun.

Summer/breeding No breeding reports out with *Cowal*.

Autumn/winter Only reports away from *Cowal* were 1 at Dalmally *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Aug-1 Sep and 1 at Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Dec into 2020.

RED-BILLED CHOUGH *Pyrrhocorax pyrrhocorax*

The Argyll islands hold almost the entire Scottish population. Islay is the stronghold, with smaller numbers on Oronsay and Colonsay. All records away from Islay are appreciated.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay*). Max counts on *Islay* with 8 at The Oa on 29 Mar, 42 at Ardnave on 2 Feb and 35 at Machir Bay on 21 Feb. On Oronsay *Colonsay* 11 birds were present.

Summer/breeding On *Islay* 64 known sites were visited, prs were present at 45 sites and at least 31 nests fledged young; 71 nestlings were ringed at 24 of these sites. At least 7 nesting attempts resulted in no young being fledged, 4 sites had birds that were regarded as "prospecting" as no eggs were laid or no nest built. At 3 sites the outcome was not known. At least 13 young were fledged from the 7 sites where there was no ringing of nestlings (per Eric Bignal). On *Colonsay* there were 5 confirmed prs of which 4 successful pairs and reared at least 9 young (2.25 yng / successful nest), outcome from other pair unknown (per David Jardine).

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay*). Few counts received, however max counts on *Islay* of 39 at Ardnave on 27 Oct and 19 at Machir Bay on 20 Sep. On *Colonsay* a max of 4 during Oct-Dec and a max of 16 on Oronsay *Colonsay* in Sep-Oct.

WESTERN JACKDAW Corvus monedula

A resident breeder, common throughout much of mainland Argyll: scarce on Mull and does not breed on Coll or Tiree. Breeding colonies are often located in towns and villages.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Higher counts received included 160 going to roost in Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Jan, 100 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 2 Feb and 50 at Toward point *Cowal* on 14 Apr. A group of 18 wandered around W *Tiree* during Jan-Mar.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received. Reports all less than 30 and generally of 1-6 birds. Max counts were 200 at Kilchoman *Islay* on 3 Aug and 40 at Kames *Cowal* on 2 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Higher counts included; 400 at Loch Sween *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Oct, 282 at Kiloran meadows *Colonsay* on 15 Oct, 160 at Gartnatra *Islay* on 30 Oct and 150+ at Kilkivan Quarry *Kintyre* on 7 Nov.

ROOK Corvus frugilegus

A resident breeder, common throughout much of Argyll, but scarce on Mull and does not breed on: Colonsay, Coll or Tiree. There can be a post breeding influx of juveniles to some islands, e.g. Mull and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Few higher counts received particularly from *Kintyre* where large flocks are common. A max count of 100 at Gruinart *Islay* on 23 Apr and 54 on Iona *Mull* on 8 Apr. Two singles on *Tiree* with a 2cy at Loch an Eilein on 1 Jan and an adult at Balephuil on 16 Apr.

Summer/breeding Few specific breeding data received. Birds on nests from early Mar and juv birds noted in *Mid-Argyll* in mid Jul. A count of 162 nests at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Max count received of 680 at Carrabus *Islay* on 5 Sep. A single was at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* on 8 Nov.

CARRION CROW Corvus corone

A sedentary resident: mainly in east Cowal and parts of Mid-Argyll, in a variety of mainly low ground habitats. It hybridises readily with Hooded Crow where ranges overlap.

Winter/spring Most reports from usual strong hold areas of *Cowal* where max counts of 30+ at Sandbank on 14 Feb and 10 at Inverchapel on 14 Feb. Smaller nos elsewhere, with 1-2 birds at sites in *Coll, Kintyre, Islay, Mid-Argyll* and *Mull*.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received.

Autumn/winter Most reports again from *Cowal* where max counts of 25 at Tighnabruaich on 22 Dec and 20 at Kilfinan on 8 Dec. Reports of 1-2 birds elsewhere, however a high count of 10 at Kildalloig *Kintyre* on 17 Dec. Birds noted flying in off the sea at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* with 2 on 16 Oct and 3 on 18 Oct.

HOODED CROW Corvus cornix

A widespread, and very common, resident breeding species.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Numbers reported generally low, with 1-10 birds from sites however higher counts included 24 at Bunessan *Mull* on 1 Apr, 20 at Kilinver *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Jan and 20 at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 20 Mar.

Summer/breeding Only breeding data received; 40 Ters on *Colonsay* (of 16 monitored nests - 4 failed, 3 with b/1, 8 with b/2, 1 fledged (no brood count), mean brood = 1.27). First fledged on *Tiree* on 1 Jun. Max count of 52 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 1 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 90 at Sleivemore Islay on 7 Nov, 84 at Kilchoman Islay on 5 Nov and 72 at Ormsary Mid-Argyll on 28 Dec.

HYBRID CROW Corvus corone x cornix

Hybrids between Carrion and Hooded Crow are most prevalent where the ranges of the two species overlap. Any records are welcome as they will help to document the change in position of the hybrid zone, which is known to have moved north westwards in the past.

All year Reports from (Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull). Counts of up to 8 reported from 12 sites.

NORTHERN RAVEN Corvus corax

A common resident breeding species on both the mainland and islands: large flocks may occur, especially in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts received of 83 in Glen Orchy *North Argyll* on 18 Jan and 40 at Crossapol *Tiree* on 22 Feb. Most counts elsewhere of 1-10 birds.

Summer/breeding Prs and displaying bird noted from Jan. On *Tiree* 11 active nests at 10 sites in Apr. On *Colonsay* 8 prs located, 7 prs reared 20 young (final pair outcome unknown, but 2 large young in nest). Data from the ARSG; of 62 Argyll sites checked they produced a min 81 young and 2.62 young per successful nest.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts included 35 at Crossapol *Tiree* on 27 Sep, 35 nr Tobermory *Mull* on 31 Dec, 33 at Ardnave Point *Islay* on 2 Nov and 32 at Ulva Lagoons *Mid*-*Argyll* on 22 Sep.

BOHEMIAN WAXWING* Bombycilla garrulous

An irruptive winter visitor in varying numbers: not seen every year but some large influxes have occurred recently.

Winter/spring No reports.

Autumn/winter First report was of 8 on rowans in Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 2 Oct, then 2 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 24 Oct with 1 there on 6 Nov, 2 at Loch Buie *Mull* on 29 Oct, 12 at Carradale *Kintyre* on 7-27 Nov, 12 at Southend *Kintyre* on 14 Nov, 3 at Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Nov, 1 at Connel *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Nov and 2 at Redhouse *Kintyre* on 27 Nov.

COAL TIT Periparus ater

A widespread and abundant resident breeder: except on Coll and Tiree. Found almost exclusively in woodland: especially conifers.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Tiree*). Generally, 1-3 birds noted however 10 at Inverchapel *Cowal* on 5 Mar.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received. Two ads feeding 2 juvs in *North Argyll* on 8 Jun. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Tiree*). Generally, 1-6 birds noted however 10 nr Jura House *Jura* on 29 Oct.

EURASIAN BLUE TIT Cyanistes caeruleus

A widespread and common resident breeder: an infrequent visitor to Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Tiree*). Generally, 1-6 birds at sites and a max flock of 12 at Rhudle Mill *Mid-Argyll* on 12 May.

Summer/breeding Generally, 1-8 birds noted at sites and first fledglings noted on 16 Jun. A flock of 30+ at Taynish House *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Tiree*). Generally, up to 12 birds at sites however 40 at Gartnagrenoch, Loch Coillie-Bharr *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Nov and 19 at Calgary *Mull* on 6 Oct.

GREAT TIT Parus major

A widespread and common resident breeder: only an infrequent visitor to Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). All reports of 1-6 birds. One was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 4 Apr. Birds noted with avian pox in *Mid-Argyll* in Feb.

Summer/breeding No specific breeding data.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Tiree*). All reports of 1-9 birds however 20+ birds in a mixed tit flock at Inverchapel *Cowal* on 4 Oct.

EURASIAN SKYLARK Alauda arvensis

RED LIST A widespread breeding species: common in some areas. Many emigrate in winter, with remaining birds mainly in coastal and low-lying localities.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas mostly from sites in; *Mull* (76), *Mid-Argyll* (20), *Islay* (14) and *Kintyre* (11). Small flocks of up to 20 noted particularly on *Islay* and *Tiree* in Jan-Feb however 80 were at RSBP Oa reserve *Islay* on 27 Feb then notable passage from early Mar with 162 birds passing through RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 Mar. Song noted on calmer days from early Mar. *Summer/breeding* Little specific breeding data. A count of 35 Ters on Oronsay *Colonsay*. More records from the islands than mainland Argyll.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Visible migration noted from mid-Sep and heavy passage from 25 Sep until early Oct. Max counts of 225 >SSW over *Tiree* on 25 Sep and 140 on a beach at Ard Mor *Tiree* on 1 Oct, also 75 wintered on Oronsay *Colonsay*. Smaller nos of 20 or less noted during Nov-Dec from 5 locations.

SAND MARTIN Riparia riparia

AMBER LIST A summer visitor: localised breeding species and passage migrant. All breeding records required.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First arrivals noted with 1 at Portnahaven *Islay* on 27 Feb, 2 at Loch Leathan *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Mar and 1 at Kellan, Loch na Keal *Mull* on 24 Mar. More widespread arrivals from end of Mar and arrived in larger numbers from 5 Apr. Higher counts included 60 at Loch Riddon *Cowal* on 22 Apr and 60 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 24 Apr. *Summer/breeding* Limited data on breeding colonies received. On *Tiree* 127 prs across 8 sites

and 40 AONs at Kilchoman *Islay*. *Autumn* Reports from all areas. Numbers decreased during early Sep and last report was of 30 at Heylipol *Tiree* on 11 Sep.

BARN SWALLOW Hirundo rustica

A widespread, common, summer visitor and passage migrant.

Spring Reports from all areas. First arrival was of 1 at Lochgilphead caravan park *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Mar then 1 at Salen *Mull* on 21 Mar and 15 at Corran View *Mull* on 2 Apr. Small nos noted across Argyll until the main arrivals during 17-19 Apr. Max counts of 19 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 17 Apr and a peak there of 42 >N in 4hrs on 1 May. Generally thought to be less about than 'usual'.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. First fledged birds noted on *Tiree* on 6 Jul, *Islay* on 21 Jul and *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Jul. Post breeding flocks building up from late Jul-early Aug and a count of 90 at Barloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Jul. Two prs at Balephuil *Tiree* abandoned their (8) young in nests on 6 Sep.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 350 at Dalvore, Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Aug, 120 at Keills *Islay* on 7 Sep, 100 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 13 and 18 Sep. Six reports during Oct and last single at Dunoon golf course *Cowal* on 29 Nov.

COMMON HOUSE MARTIN Delichon urbicum

AMBER LIST A common summer visitor on the mainland: less numerous on the islands with only one recently recorded breeding attempt on Tiree.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). First report was an exceptionally early single at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 19 Feb, however tied in with other early UK reports. The next was not until 1 at Loch Loskin *Cowal* on 3 Apr, then 1 at Pennyghael *Mull* on 10 Apr. Most arrivals were not until after 26 Apr. Highest count was 10 at Toward Point *Cowal* on 5 May.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. Nested at 3 sites on *Tiree* and appeared to be successful. At least 10 nests at Oban Hospital *Mid-Argyll* of which 6 appeared to be successful. Fledged young being fed while on the wing at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 8 Jul.

Autumn Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Max count of 80 at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Aug, 55 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 4 Sep and 20 at Clachaig *Cowal* on 3 Aug. Last report was of 4 at Kildalton *Islay* on 9 Oct.

LONG-TAILED TIT Aegithalos caudatus

A widespread and fairly common resident: scarce on Colonsay and a rare visitor to Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Islay/Jura/Tiree*). Max counts of 12 nr Loch Eck *Cowal* on 1 Jan and 10 at Java Point, Craignure *Mull* on 13 Jan. Generally, counts of 1-8 elsewhere with most at sites in *Mid-Argyll* (14) and *Mull* (8).

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. Juvs noted at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* from early Jun. A count of 14 nr Ardpatrick *Mid-Argyll on* 28 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 35 at Glen Lonan *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Dec, 16 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Dec and 16 in Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Nov. Most reports from sites in *Mid-Argyll* (16) and *Islay* (14). Six were at The Lodge *Coll* on 4 Nov and a flock of 10 arrived at Balephuil *Tiree* on 29 Oct with 2 remaining to 7 Nov.

WOOD WARBLER *Phylloscopus sibilatrix*

RED LIST A scarce but widely distributed summer visitor to mature broadleaved woodlands. Infrequent on Islay and Jura and only occurs as a rare passage migrant on Coll and Tiree.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Kintyre*). First reports at Quinish *Mull* on 21 Apr and Taynish NNR *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Apr. Singing males reported from sites in; *Cowal* (2), *Mid-Argyll* (10), *Mull* (9) and *North Argyll* (6). A passage bird was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 5 May.

Autumn One at Balephuil Tiree on 18-20 Sep was the latest ever in Argyll.

YELLOW-BROWED WARBLER* Phylloscopus inornatus

A scarce autumn migrant from east of the Urals: at least 79 records between 1954 and 2018, the majority on Tiree.

Autumn Up to 7 birds on *Tiree* with 1 at Carnan Mor/Balephuil on 25-26 Sep, 1 at Vaul on 26 Sep, 2 at Balephuil on 29-30 Sep and another at Main Rd farm on 30 Sep, 1 at Balephuil on 7 Oct and 1 there on 16-18 Oct [John Bowler, Jim Dickson *et al*]. One was at Port Righ (Carradale) *Kintyre* on 28 Sep and another there on 13 Oct [Alasdair Paterson]. One was at Java Beach,

Craignure *Mull* on 2 Oct [Nancy Somerville] and 1 was at Duart Castle *Mull* on 4 Oct [Anne Sinclair]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

WILLOW WARBLER *Phylloscopus trochilus* **AMBER LIST** *A widespread and abundant summer visitor.*

Spring Reports from all areas. First arrival at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 6 Apr then 2 at Kilmichael Glen *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Apr and more widespread arrivals in Argyll from 8 Apr with heavy arrivals from 11 Apr.

Summer/breeding Singing males widespread across Argyll from mid-Apr. Higher breeding counts included; 34 Ters at Kilmichael Forest BBS *Mid-Argyll*, 25 at Bellanoch BBS *Mid-Argyll* 14 Ters at 6 sites on *Tiree*, 14 Ters at Loch Striven *Cowal*, 10 Ters at Rhudle BBS *Mid-Argyll*. Fledged young noted on *Tiree* from 24 Jun.

Autumn/winter Number of reports decreased during Aug. A few reports of only singles in Sep from *Islay, Kintyre, North Argyll* and *Tiree*. A single remained at the Glebe *Tiree* on 26 Sep-4 Oct and an exceptionally late bird was at Glenbranter *Cowal* on 15 Nov with identity confirmed from photographs provided.

COMMON CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita

A summer visitor and local breeding species: occasionally recorded in winter. More frequent on passage on some of the islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). No winter reports. First arrivals of singles at Gruinart *Islay* on 16 Mar then at Java, Craignure *Mull* on 25 Mar. Max count of 3 at several sites. *Summer/breeding* Reports from breeding sites (singing males); *Coll* (1), *Colonsay* (7 Ters), *Cowal* (10), *Islay* (7), *Kintyre* (3), *Mid-Argyll* (18), *Mull* (11), *North Argyll* (6) and *Tiree* (3).

Autumn/winter Reports from (*Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). First migrant was a single at Balephuil *Tiree* on 28 Aug. Max count of 6 on *Tiree* on 29 Oct, also two reports there in Nov and last single there on 6 Dec. Several single birds on *Tiree* during Oct-Nov were of the Scandinavian race *abietinus*.

'SIBERIAN' CHIFFCHAFF* Phylloscopus collybita tristis

A rare visitor: an eastern race of Chiffchaff, still regarded as a sub-species of Common Chiffchaff, rather than a distinct separate species. Rare in Argyll, although small numbers of this race occur during late autumn in Scotland.

Autumn At least one was at Balephuil Tiree on 10 days between 25 Oct and 22 Dec [John Bowler].

SEDGE WARBLER Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

A locally common summer visitor, breeding in suitable habitats.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from all areas. First arrivals of singles in *Mid-Argyll* at Loch Craignish on 20 Apr and Castle Sween on 21 Apr. Four reports on 22 Apr then more widespread arrivals from 23 Apr. Max count of 9 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 May. Limited breeding data received of this widespread species. Many fledglings noted on *Tiree* on 2 Jul.

Autumn Most birds departed during Aug and last 2 noted at Balephuil Tiree on 1-2 Sep.

EURASIAN REED WARBLER* Acrocephalus scirpaceus

A rare visitor in spring and summer: Fifteen records; 13 from the islands and two from Aros Moss, Kintyre.

Autumn One was at Balephuil Tiree on 19 Sep [John Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON GRASSHOPPER WARBLER Locustella naevia

RED LIST A summer visitor: breeding locally in open habitats with dense ground vegetation, including young conifer plantations. Numbers fluctuate from year to year.

Spring Reports from all areas. First arrival of one at Lochgilphead meadows *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Apr, thereafter widespread arrivals across Argyll from 18 Apr.

Summer/breeding Most reports of singing males e.g. 10 Ters on *Colonsay*, 8 Ters in Glendaruel *Cowal*, 3 Ters at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* and 4 at a Moine Mhor NNR *Mid-Argyll* BBS site. **Autumn** Reports decreased during Jul and last report was of 1 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 18 Aug.



EURASIAN BLACKCAP Mid-Argyll Apr Jim Dickson

EURASIAN BLACKCAP Sylvia atricapilla

A common summer visitor and regular passage migrant especially in autumn: an increasing number winter in Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Only winter report of 1 at Innellan *Cowal* on 11 Jan. First arrivals of singles at Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* and The Oa *Islay* on 3 Apr, thereafter more widespread arrivals. A max count of 7 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 23 Apr.

Summer/breeding Widespread reports of males in song across Argyll with most in mainland areas particularly *Mid-Argyll* where high densities (45 sites e.g. 12 Ters Taynish NNR), also *Colonsay* (13 Ters), *Cowal, Kintyre, Islay* (e.g. 10 Ters Bridgend Woods) and *Mull*.

Autumn/winter Reports of 1-3 birds across Argyll with an increase in records during Oct and a max count of 7 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 18 Oct. Only six reports in Nov and last report of 1 at Southend *Kintyre* on 29 Nov.

GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

A scarce but increasing summer visitor: breeding in woodland and scrub habitats.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from sites in: *Cowal* (3), *Kintyre* (1), *Mid-Argyll* (16), *Mull* (3), *North Argyll* (4) and *Tiree* (2). First arrivals of singles at Scotmill *Kintyre* on 28 Apr and Glen Nant *Mid-Argyll* on 30 Apr, with most arrivals noted after 1 May. On *Tiree* single migrants were at Balephuil on 1 May and in song at The Glebe on 9 Jun. Highest density of singing birds noted in *Mid-Argyll* between Cairnbaan and Bellanoch with at least 6 Ters.

Autumn Only report was a single, with a Blackcap, at Balephuil Tiree on 16 Sep.

LESSER WHITETHROAT* Sylvia curruca

A rare/scarce passage migrant in both spring and autumn: most recent records have been from the islands.

Spring One was at Carnan Mor *Tiree* on 13 May and another at Balephuil *Tiree* on 23 May [J Bowler].

Autumn One was at Lochdon Mull on 17 Oct [A & J Harden]. All records accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis

A summer visitor with numbers fluctuating from year to year: breeding is most widespread in low lying areas, particularly in coastal scrub.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from all areas. First arrival was of 1 at Port Charlotte *Islay* on 19 Apr then at Mausdale *Kintyre* on 22 Apr, 2 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 23 Apr, 1 at Gruinart *Islay* on 23 Apr and 1 at Dervaig *Mull* on 23 Apr. Most arrivals after 25 Apr and a max count of 11 migrants at Kilmolluaig *Tiree* on 16 May. Most region reports from sites in; *Mull* (49), *Mid-Argyll* (32), *Kintyre* (12), *Cowal* (11) and *Islay* (10). On *Colonsay* 57 Ters excluding Oronsay and at RSPB Loch Gruinart reserve *Islay* 26 Ters. First fledged young noted on *Islay* on 27 Jun and *Tiree* on 2 Jul.

Autumn Reports decreased during Aug and last reports were of 2 at Fanmore *Mull* on 31 Aug, 2 at Scarinish *Tiree* on 1 Sep and 1 at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 1 Sep.



GOLDCREST Mid-Argyll Oct Jim Dickson

GOLDCREST Regulus regulus

A common resident breeding species: augmented by passage migrants in spring and especially autumn but scarce on Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-2 birds from sites and max counts of 6 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 8 Apr, 6 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 21 Apr and 5+ at Loch an Torr *Mull* on 8 Apr. One at Balephuil *Tiree* on 22 Feb was the earliest spring record for the island.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. Singing birds noted from mid-Apr until early Jul. A pr with 6 fledged young at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll* on 20 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas with counts of 1-10 birds. Max counts of 20 at Kiloran Farm *Colonsay* on 18 Oct, 13 at Torrisdale *Kintyre* on 25 Sep, 12 at Crinan Ferry *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Oct and 12 at Foreland *Islay* on 29 Oct.

WREN Troglodytes troglodytes

A common resident breeder in all areas: numbers often decline following hard winters; additional birds winter on the islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds at sites however 7 at Loch Frisa *Mull* on 24 Apr.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. On *Tiree* 24 males in song at 12 sites in Apr and 30 at 16 sites in May (a high total) with first fledged group noted on 20 Jun. At Bellanoch *Mid-Argyll* BBS site 18 birds noted on 7 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-6 birds noted at sites.



EURASIAN NUTHATCH Cowal Aug George Newall

EURASIAN NUTHATCH Sitta europaea

A rare but increasing visitor: currently spreading north and west in Scotland.

All year Becoming more established and recorded in all months with most reports in Apr (7), Jul (5) and Oct (5) from sites in *Cowal* (7), *Mid-Argyll* (7), *Mull* (5) and *North Argyll* (3). In some areas where now regular often birds are no longer being reported. Most reports are from wooded gardens, and in particular, when visiting bird feeders.

EURASIAN TREECREEPER Certhia familiaris

A widespread and fairly common resident: rare on Tiree and Coll.

Winter/spring Reports only from (*Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). Counts of 1-2 birds however 5 at Kilmory Woods, Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Mar.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received.

Autumn/winter Reports from (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). Counts of 1-2 birds however 5 at Bridgend Woods *Islay* on 7 Nov.



ROSY STARLING Islay Jun Jenny Woodward

ROSY STARLING* Pastor roseus

A rare summer and autumn visitor: More frequent in recent years.

Summer An ad male was at Esknish Farm (nr Ballygrant) *Islay* on 17 Jun [M & J Woodward], an ad male was at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 18-24 Jun [W Young, R Wesley, B Wilson *et al*] and an ad male was at Craighouse *Jura* on 6-13 Jul [J Turton, G Turnbull *et al*]. All three records were accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON STARLING Sturnus vulgaris

RED LIST A common resident on: Coll, Islay, part of Kintyre, and Tiree, less common on most of the mainland. Flocks containing juveniles appear in many parts in late summer and numbers are boosted by immigration in winter from north-west Europe.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Largest flocks generally noted on *Tiree* and *Islay*. Several flocks of 600-1,300 birds across *Tiree* Jan-Mar. On *Islay* up to 800 at Gruinart in Jan. Also 200 at Southend *Kintyre* in Jan. Generally, much smaller nos elsewhere.

Summer/breeding Nesting during late Apr-Jun with fledged birds in *Mid-Argyll* on 27 May and *Tiree* from 30 May. Flocks of juveniles built up in numbers from mid-Jun. Max counts of 400 at several sites on *Tiree*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Most flocks of >100 birds were from the island regions. Several flocks of 700+ reported from *Kintyre* with a max count of 1,300 at the Laggan on 8 Nov. Several flocks on *Tiree* of 500+ and a max count of 1,200 at Balephetrish on 6 Nov. Max count on *Islay* of 900 at Ballygrant on 7 Nov.

RING OUZEL* Turdus torquatus

RED LIST A summer visitor; breeding very locally in upland areas but declining in numbers: more widespread, though still very scarce, on migration. All records required please.

Spring/summer A male was at Risabus, The Oa *Islay* on 10-11 Apr, 1 was at Balure, Loch Etive *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Apr, 2 were at Beinn Narnain *Cowal* on 14 May and 2 were at Beinn an Dothaidh *North Argyll* on 8 Aug.

Autumn On Tiree single 1cy birds with other thrush species were at Balephuil on 15 Oct, Heylipol on 18 Oct and Carnan Mor on 30 Oct. One was at Slatrach Bay, Kerrera, *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Oct.



COMMON BLACKBIRD Mid-Argyll Oct Jim Dickson

COMMON BLACKBIRD Turdus merula

A widespread breeding species: common and locally abundant resident. There is immigration in winter and noticeable autumn passage in some years with some remaining during winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally low nos of only 1-5 birds and a max count of 14 at Lochbuie *Mull* on 2 May.

Summer/breeding Limited data. First fledglings noted on *Colonsay* from 30 Apr and *Mid-Argyll* on 5 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Generally, reports of 1-8 birds until an influx from 25 Oct onwards with 20 at Kilchoman *Islay* on 25 Oct, 32 at Kilsleven *Islay* on 1 Nov and 50 at Mid-Argyll Hosp grounds, Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Nov then smaller nos noted until end Dec.



FIELDFARES Mid-Argyll Oct John Speirs

FIELDFARE *Turdus pilaris*

RED LIST A passage migrant and winter visitor: abundant in autumn but relatively few remain in winter or passing through in spring.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/North Argyll*). Generally low nos with higher counts including; 29 at Foreland *Islay* on 3 Feb, 25 at Inverneil *Cowal* on 22 Jan and 20 at Drimvore *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Apr. Last report was a single at Jura House *Jura* on 2 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. First arrival was 13 at Inverchapel *Cowal* on 1 Oct. Main arrivals after mid-Oct and larger movements during 20-26 Oct. Max counts included 500 at Fearnoch, Knapdale *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Oct, 600 at Mid-Argyll Hosp grounds, Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Nov and 500 at Lephenstrath Farm *Kintyre* on 11 Nov. Several other reports of flocks with 50-300 birds. Only a few reports and low nos during Dec.

REDWING Turdus iliacus

RED LIST A passage migrant and winter visitor: abundant in autumn but relatively few remain during winter. Occasional individuals are recorded in late spring or summer. The species bred on Mull in 1991 but there have been no subsequent breeding records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally low numbers Jan-early Mar of 1-40 birds however higher nos on *Tiree* and *Mull* where max counts of 1,000 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 7 Apr, 400 at inner Loch Scridain *Mull* on 30 Mar and 300 at Bunessan *Mull* on 1 Apr. Return passage birds widely noted from mid-Mar to early Apr. Last report of a single at Balephuil *Tiree* on 1 May. A colour-ringed bird at Balephuil *Tiree* on 7 Apr was from Höfn, SE Iceland.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. First arrivals on 30 Sep when up to 8 at Balephuil *Tiree*, followed by 2 at West Hynish and 3 at Baugh *Tiree* on 1 Oct. Most arrivals from 5 Oct with nos peaking between 18-26 Oct. Max counts of 1,000 over Cairnbaan and 450 at Crinan, both *Mid*-*Argyll* on 18 Oct and 1,000 across *Tiree* on 24 Oct. Numbers dropped during Nov-Dec however still several flocks of 300-500 birds in *Kintyre*, *Mid*-*Argyll* and on *Tiree*.

SONG THRUSH Turdus philomelos

RED LIST A widespread and common resident breeding species with some locally bred birds departing in the autumn. There is a noticeable autumn passage, with other birds arriving for the winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, reports of only 1-4 birds with a max of only 6 at Lochbuie *Mull* on 29 Apr. A continental type bird was noted at Balephuil *Tiree* on 31 Jan.

Summer/breeding Limited data reported. First bird on eggs noted at Foreland *Islay* on 31 Mar. Fledged young noted on Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* from 22 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Only small numbers noted, generally 1-4 birds and a max of only 10 at Balnahard *Colonsay* on 16 Oct.

MISTLE THRUSH Turdus viscivorus

RED LIST A widespread but thinly distributed resident breeding species. On Coll and Tiree it is only an occasional visitor. Flocks are sometimes seen on passage.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Kintyre/Jura/Tiree*). Generally, sightings of 1-5 birds, most reports from sites in; *Mid-Argyll* (21), *Mull* (20) and *Cowal* (13). Max counts of 25 at Inverneil *Cowal* on 22 Jan.

Summer/breeding Limited data reported. Ads carrying food for young in *Mid-Argyll* on 1 May. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay*). Max counts of 30 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 16 Sep, Bunnahabhainn *Islay* on 13 Oct and 18 at Gearach *Islay* on 1 Sep. Generally, sightings of 1-10 birds, most reports from sites in *Islay* (21), *Mid-Argyll* (13) and *Mull* (7).

SPOTTED FLYCATCHER Muscicapa striata

RED LIST A summer visitor breeding widely, but sparsely, in mature woodlands; particularly where there are gaps in the canopy or along edges. Regular passage migrant on the islands.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). First report was one at Crinan Wood *Mid-Argyll* on 3 May and most arrivals were from 10 May onwards. Migrant birds on *Tiree* reported 14 May-19 Jul, with peaks of 5 on 17 May and 6 Jun. Most reports from breeding areas came from sites in *Mid-Argyll* (23), *Mull* (20) and *North Argyll* (8).

Autumn Only reports of migrants were singles on *Tiree* at Balephuil on 24-27 Sep and at Caoles on 25 Sep.

EUROPEAN ROBIN Erithacus rubecula

A widespread and common resident breeder: a migrant only on Tiree. Small numbers now breed regularly on Coll. Autumn passage is noticeable on the islands with many migrants overwintering.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, only 1-4 birds at sites. Max count of 20 at Castle Stalker *North Argyll* on 7 Apr.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. Five males in song around Arinagour and the Lodge *Coll* in May. First juv noted at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 21 May and last juv noted at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Most reports of 1-5 birds. Max counts of 30 at Carradale *Kintyre* on 24 Sep.



EUROPEAN PIED FLYCATCHER Tiree Sep Jim Dickson

EUROPEAN PIED FLYCATCHER* Ficedula hypoleuca

RED LIST A scarce summer visitor and passage migrant breeding very locally in oak woods in parts of the mainland and possibly Mull. An increase in the breeding population in the 1990s-2000s was attributable to the Argyll Bird Club nest-box scheme but numbers have since declined; possibly due to Pine Marten predation of boxes, with no confirmed breeding records in recent years. Rare but near-annual on passage on the islands, especially Tiree.

Spring/breeding The only report was of a singing male at Inveroran *North Argyll* on 25 May then later paired with a female at a nest box and breeding confirmed, with last sighting on 13 Jul. *Autumn* A male was seen at Craighouse *Jura* on 2 Aug. On *Tiree* 1cy birds were at Balephuil on 16 Sep, 30 Sep, 14 Oct and another at The Glebe on 14 Oct.

RED-BREASTED FLYCATCHER* Ficedula parva

A rare passage migrant: Twelve records; on Islay in Nov 1974 and Oct 1975, Colonsay and Gigha in 2010, two singles on Tiree in Oct 2012, two in Jun and two Sep/Oct on Tiree in 2014, singles on Tiree in Oct 2016 and Sep 2017.

Autumn A lcy was at Balephuil Tiree on 14 Oct [J Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

BLACK REDSTART* Phoenicurus ochuros

RED LIST A less than annual passage migrant: most records have been in spring (late Mar to May) or late autumn (Oct to mid-Nov).

Spring A male was in a garden in N Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 17 Apr, and an adult male was at Balemartine *Tiree* on 12 May.

COMMON REDSTART Phoenicurus phoenicurus

AMBER LIST A summer visitor: locally common in open woodland. It is a scarce passage migrant on: Coll, Colonsay, Islay and Tiree.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). First reports were a female at Balevullin *Tiree* on 11 Apr and a male in song at Dunoon *Cowal* on 12 Apr. Most reports from breeding site areas were from *Mid-Argyll* (8), *Cowal* (3), *Mull* (3) and *North Argyll* (3). A pr were feeding small young at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 28 May and a juv was seen at Lochdon *Mull* on 5 Aug. Last report was one at Glen Nant *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Aug. *Autumn* No reports.

WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra

RED LIST A sparse but widespread, summer visitor.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from all areas. First arrival was 1 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 20 Apr followed by 2 at Glendaruel *Cowal* on 21 Apr and 2 on The Oa *Islay* on 22 Apr. Most arrivals noted after 26 Apr. Only 1 pr noted on *Colonsay* (ex Oronsay), 11 Ters were at RSPB Loch Gruinart, 10+ Ters at Moine Mhor area *Mid-Argyll* and a count of up to 11 birds at Glendaruel *Cowal* on 2 Jul. Fledged birds noted in *Mid-Argyll* from 30 Jun. A count of 10 birds made along a 10 mile stretch of road on *Jura* on 19 Aug.

Autumn Reports reduced during Aug and only a few reports of juvs on *Islay* at the end of Aug with last juv noted at Craigens, Gruinart on 5 Sep. Two juvs were at Blackmill Bay Luing *Mid*-*Argyll* on 26 Aug. A late single was at Scarinish *Tiree* on 18 Oct.

EUROPEAN STONECHAT Saxicola torquatus

A widespread resident, but some leave breeding areas during winter. Numbers can decline dramatically after severe winters.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds from numerous widespread sites. *Summer/breeding* On *Colonsay* (except Oronsay) 20 Ters located, 16 Ters on *Tiree*, 15 Ters at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* and 10+ Ters at Moine Mhor area *Mid-Argyll*. First fledged young noted on 12 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds from numerous widespread sites and 8 birds recorded at sites in *Cowal, Coll* and *Islay.*

NORTHERN WHEATEAR Oenanthe oenanthe

A common summer visitor; and passage migrant.

Spring Reports from all areas. First arrival of an early single at Tayinloan *Kintyre* on 27 Feb with the next not until 1 at Loch Spelve *Mull* on 21 Mar with birds reaching most areas by the end of

Mar. Max counts noted were 7 at The Oa *Islay* on 26 Mar, an obvious influx on *Tiree* on 23 Apr, 12+ at Gruinart *Islay* on 28 Apr and a notable 'fall' of 100+ on N Iona *Mull* on 1 May.

Summer/breeding Widespread breeding mainly on the islands in low numbers. First fledglings on *Tiree* on 24 Jun, in *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Jun and in *North Argyll* on 26 Jun.

Autumn Reports from all areas. Small nos noted with highest count of 5 at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 27 Sep. Last report was of 1 at Ardnave Point *Islay* on 14 Oct.



NORTHERN WHEATEAR Tiree Sep Jim Dickson

'GREENLAND' WHEATEAR Oenanthe. o. leucorhoa

A scarce passage migrant: probably under-recorded.

Spring Only reports of singles on *Islay, Kintyre* and *Tiree* between 23-28 Apr. *Autumn* Max counts of 100+ around *Tiree* on 29-30 Aug and good nos on *Islay* with 12+ birds noted at several sites 31 Aug-6 Sep. Last report was of 2 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 14 Oct.

ISABELLINE WHEATEAR* Oenanthe isabellina

A vagrant from SE Greece to Turkey and eastwards with no previous Argyll records. One record, at Machir Bay, Islay on 27 Nov to 3 Dec 2016.

Autumn A lcy was at Langamull Mull on 27 Sep [David Hatfield]. Record still subject to acceptance by the BBRC.

WHITE-THROATED DIPPER Cinclus cinclus

AMBER LIST A widespread resident breeder but scarce on Islay and generally absent from: Coll, Colonsay and Tiree. *Winter/spring* Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). Noted at 37 sites in total where 1-2 birds.

Breeding Birds noted singing in Jan and at nest sites from Mar.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Reports all months Jul-Dec with 1-2 birds noted. Song and display noted in *Mid-Argyll* on 30 Nov.



WHITE-THROATED DIPPER Mid-Argyll Apr Jim Dickson

HOUSE SPARROW Passer domesticus

RED LIST A resident breeding bird commonly associated with human habitation. Distribution is rather localised in sparsely inhabited areas. Larger flocks gather in late summer and autumn where traditional agriculture persists.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Largest counts included; 80 at Gigalum Bay, Gigha *Kintyre* on 19 Jan, 55 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 1 Jan and 50+ at Bruichladdich and Port Charlotte *Islay* on 12 Jan.

Summer/breeding First fully-fledged birds noted at Bridgend *Mid-Argyll* on 5 May and at Balephuil *Tiree* on 16 May. Max count of 90 at Ruaig *Tiree* on 26 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Largest counts included; 120 at Ruaig *Tiree* on 7 Oct, 120 at Arinagour *Coll* on 18 Oct and 60 at Gigalum Bay, Gigha *Kintyre* on 3 Aug.

EURASIAN TREE SPARROW* Passer montanus

RED LIST Nowadays mostly a very scarce migrant but after a gap of nearly 30 years breeding was recorded on Islay in 2009.

Spring Three were at Hynish *Tiree* on 28 May and 1 was at Calgary *Mull* on 29 May. *Autumn* Five were at Octofad *Islay* on 20 Sep and 1 was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 2 Oct.

DUNNOCK Prunella modularis

AMBER LIST A widespread resident breeder although nowhere numerous. It is scarce on Coll and Jura and does not breed on Tiree. Recent observations would suggest that birds are quite frequent in pre-thicket/thicket conifer plantations as well as in more traditional habitats. Increased numbers in autumn presumably relate to migrants.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds noted. Most reports from Cowal, Mid-Argyll and Mull.

Summer/breeding Singing birds noted from early Mar. First fledglings noted at Cairnbaan *Mid*-*Argyll* from 21 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas with most reports from *Islay*, *Kinytre*, *Mid-Argyll* and *Mull* generally of 1-4 birds and max count of 6 at Cnoc Fada *Islay* on 30 Oct.

WESTERN YELLOW WAGTAIL Motacilla flava

RED LIST A scarce passage migrant: birds of the Blue-headed race M. f. flava occur from time to time, and there have been at least two records of the Grey-headed race M. f. thunbergi (in 1985 and 2005).

Spring A male *flavissima* was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 8-10 May [E & E Prince, J Bowler, I MacArthur]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

GREY WAGTAIL Motacilla cinerea

RED LIST Widespread resident breeding species, although does not breed on Tiree and Coll; some emigration in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree*). Generally, sightings of 1-2 birds however 4 birds at Loch an Torr *Mull* on 8 Apr. Most reports from sites in *Mid-Argyll* (20) and *Mull* (14).

Summer/breeding Limited data received. Some in prs from Mar and juvs noted from late Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Most reports from sites in *Mid-Argyll* (22), *Islay* (20) and *Kintyre* (10). Generally, only 1-2 birds noted however 4 at Lagganulva *Mull* on 13 Sep. One was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 20 Sep.

PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla alba yarrellii

A widespread and common breeder: absent from many areas in winter. Returning birds generally arrive in late Feb to early Mar and depart Aug-Oct.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 40 at Dervaig *Mull* on 20 Mar and 11 at Point Sands *Kintyre* on 2 Jan.

Summer/breeding Prs noted as widespred on *Tiree* in May. Fledged juvs noted at Lochbuie *Mull* on 30 May, at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 1 Jun, at Bridgend *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jun and at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 7 Jun. Family groups noted from Jun and widespread Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max count of 65 at Sandaig *Tiree* on 8 Aug, 60 at Dalvore, Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Aug, 45 at Gruinart and 35 at Ardnave, both *Islay* on 4 Sep and included some 'White' Wagtails.



'WHITE' WAGTAIL Islay Sep Jim Dickson

'WHITE' WAGTAIL Motacila alba alba A passage migrant, usually recorded in spring and extent of autumn passage obscured by identification difficulties. May have bred.

Spring First arrivals with 1 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 9 Mar, 2 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 25 Mar, 1 at Stonefield *Kintyre* on 31 Mar and 1 at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 5 Apr. Exceptionally heavy passage was noted at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* during Apr/May with a total of 490 birds > N in 22 days in Apr with peak daily counts of 112 in 5hrs on 21 Apr and 80 on 25 Apr. In May 111 birds >N in with a peak daily count of 40 on 7 May. Elsewhere, higher counts included; 9 at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 10 Apr, 10 at Mausdale *Kintyre* on 22 Apr, 17 at Tayinloan *Kintyre* on 1 May and 14 at Portnahaven *Islay* on 3 May. Last report of 1 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 11 Jun.

Autumn/winter First report of 1 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 6 Aug and an Aug peak there of 12 on 26 Aug, 188 tot birds there in Sep with a daily peak of 40 on 20 Sep and a peak of 10 there on 4 Oct. Elsewhere, max counts of 15 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 23 Sep and 10 at Rockside *Islay* on 25 Sep.

RICHARD'S PIPIT* Anthus richardi

A vagrant: Three records; singles on Islay, on 28 Sep 1971 and 10 Sep 1973 and on Colonsay on 18 Oct 2013.

Autumn One was by the Oronsay track, Oronsay *Colonsay* on 18 Oct [David Jardine, Andy Knight, Ryan Woodcock]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

MEADOW PIPIT Anthus pratensis

AMBER LIST An abundant breeding species: most leave higher ground and some islands in winter, and significant flocks occur on passage. Those wintering in Argyll occur mainly in coastal and low lying localities.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Only small nos during Jan-Feb. Numbers increased and passage flocks noted from late Mar to early Apr, with max 100 nr Benmore *Cowal* on 29 Mar. Flocks noted generally of 20-30 birds.

Summer/breeding Good numbers and widespread. Often the main host species of Common Cuckoo. Birds noted on eggs from mid-Apr. Large numbers of active nests on *Tiree* during May with many fledglings noted during Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Increase in numbers noted from late Jul with many flocks of 20-50 birds. Max counts were 300 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 28 Aug and 80 at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Aug. Numbers decreased steadily during Sep and only a few reports by Dec.

TREE PIPIT Anthus trivialis

RED LIST A summer visitor breeding commonly on the mainland: also widespread on Jura and Mull, but very scarce on Islay.

Spring summer/breeding Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll/Tiree*). First reports from Clachaig *Cowal* with 1 on 31 Mar and 3 there on 2 Apr. Most arrivals after 11 Apr on *Mull* and *Mid-Argyll*. Most reports were of birds singing in suitable habitat from sites in *Mid-Argyll* (24), *Mull* (23), *North Argyll* (11) and *Cowal* (10). Most noted at one site was 10 at Blackmount, Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 21 Apr. Single birds were noted at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 18 Apr and at Balephuil *Tiree* on 23 Apr. Very few reported after early Jul however last bird was at Glen Lonan *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Aug.

EURASIAN ROCK PIPIT Anthus petrosus petrosus

A common resident breeding species on coasts, sea lochs and islands with some emigration and passage in autumn: scarce passage and winter visitor elsewhere.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 20 at Gribun *Mull* on 17 Mar and 10 at Point Sands *Kintyre* on 2 Jan. Elsewhere, counts generally low with only 1-5 birds reported at sites. One at the top of Beinn Hough *Tiree* (>100m) on 1 Jan was unusual.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. Three prs at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* in Jun with numerous young fledged. A count of 12 on Lunga, Treshnish Isles *Mull* on 1 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 26 at Tayinloan *Kintyre* on 17 Dec, 25 at Point Sands *Kintyre* on 14 Nov, 21 at Claonaig *Kintyre* on 21 Oct and 14 at Ormsary *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Nov. Elsewhere, counts of 1-12 birds reported at sites.

COMMON CHAFFINCH Fringilla coelebs

An abundant resident breeder: except on Coll (breeds only in very small numbers) and Tiree. Foraging flocks gather out with the breeding season when numbers are augmented by winter visitors.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 200 at Loch Skerbolin *Kintyre* on 2 Jan, 60 at Braevallich *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Jan, 50 at Grogport *Kintyre* on 1 Jan and 40 at RSPB The Oa reserve *Islay* on 14 Feb.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. Birds present in breeding areas throughout Argyll and first song heard in Feb. First fledged young noted in *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Jun. Max count of 30 at Bridgend *Islay* on 30 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 220 at Nearabus *Islay* on 20 Sep, 65 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Dec and 63 at Ardrishaig *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Dec.

BRAMBLING Fringilla montifringilla

An uncommon winter visitor in varying numbers: there have been a few summer records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*). A less than average show with only single birds noted at 12 sites and most reports came from *Mid-Argyll*. Last was at Milton *Tiree* on 24 Apr, one of three passage birds noted on *Tiree* 16 Feb-24 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Mull/North Argyll*). First report of 1 at The Glebe *Tiree* on 29 Sep. Generally low numbers with only 1-5 birds noted at 12 sites however a report of 20+ birds at Victoria Bridge, Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 17 Nov.



HAWFINCH Mull May Laurence Potter

HAWFINCH* Coccothraustes coccothraustes RED LIST A rare visitor: 37 records between 1953 and 2018.

Spring A male was at Bellochantuy *Kintyre* on 19 Apr [Sally Nicholson] and a male was at Baile Mor, Iona *Mull* on 21 May [Neil Verlander, Laurence Potter *et al*]. Both records were accepted by the ABRC.

EURASIAN BULLFINCH Pyrrhula pyrrhula

AMBER LIST A widely but thinly distributed resident. Scarce or absent on most of the islands apart from Islay and Mull. Flocks occur in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree*). Max counts of 6 at Innellan *Cowal* on 8 Jan, 5 at Bolsay *Islay* on 1 Jan and 5 at Glenegedale *Islay* on 17 Feb. Elsewhere, 1-4 birds at 28 sites, mostly *Mid-Argyll* then *Mull*.

Summer/breeding Limited data received. Prs noted and breeding mainly from mainland Argyll and *Mull*. Fledged young noted in *Mid-Argyll* in Jun. A female at the Glebe, Scarinish *Tiree* on 3 Jun is a rarity for there.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll/Tiree*). Max counts of 12 at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 31 Oct and 10 at Glen Finart *Cowal* on 19 Dec. Elsewhere, 1-4 birds at 24 sites, mostly *Islay* and *Mid-Argyll*.

COMMON ROSEFINCH* Erythrina erythrina

A scarce to rare visitor which may have bred: 28 records between 1989 and 2018, mostly in May and Jun however more frequent reports of juveniles in the autumn recently.

Spring/summer A 2cy male was in song briefly at Loch an Sgoltaire *Colonsay* on 13 Jun [M Davison, D & J Jardine, A Middleton]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.



EUROPEAN GREENFINCH Kintyre Neil Brown

EUROPEAN GREENFINCH Chloris chloris

A locally common resident and partial migrant: with fewer breeding on the islands than on the mainland. Small groups are widespread outside the breeding season.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Max counts of 8 at Glean Mor, Port Charlotte *Islay* on 25 Mar. Elsewhere, counts of 1-6 birds at sites in; *Cowal* (3), *Islay* (4), *Kintyre* (2), *Mid-Argyll* (14), *Mull* (5), *North Argyll* (3) and *Tiree* (2).

Summer/breeding Limited data received. Juvenile birds noted on *Mull* from early Jun. One on *Colonsay* on 16 Jun was the only island record.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay*). Max counts of 25 at Portavadie *Cowal* on 2 Nov and 6 at Craignure *Mull* on 21 Dec. Counts of 1-5 birds at sites in; *Cowal* (3), *Islay* (6), *Jura* (1), *Kintyre* (2), *Mid*-Argyll (8), *Mull* (3), *North Argyll* (1) and *Tiree* (7).

TWITE Linaria flavirostris

RED LIST A local resident, mainly in coastal areas on the mainland and islands; winter flocks may comprise resident and migrant birds.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). All higher counts were on The Oa *Islay* where peaks of 380 on 8 Jan and 250 on 15 Mar. Away from The Oa 25 were at Ardnave *Islay* on 5 Jan and first returning bird at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* was on 1 Mar.

Summer/breeding Prs noted and heard singing at sites in (*Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*) from early Apr. First fledglings noted on *Tiree* from 14 Jun and young being fed on *Colonsay* on 16 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal*). Max counts included of 340 at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 25 Sep, 200 at Gruinart *Islay* on 20 Sep, 120 The Reef *Tiree* on 15 Dec, 40 wintered on Oronsay *Colonsay*, 35 at Ardalanish Bay *Mull* on 15 Aug and 30 at Connel *Mid*-*Argyll* on 3 Dec.



COMMON LINNET Kintyre Mar Eddie Maguire

COMMON LINNET Linaria cannabina

RED LIST A sparsely distributed partial migrant, breeding mainly on Islay, Tiree, and in Kintyre. Flocks occur locally in some areas in autumn with most reports from Colonsay, Islay and Kintyre.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/North Argyll*). All higher counts from *Islay* and peaks of 215 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 14 Feb and at RSPB Oa reserve on 15 Mar. Elsewhere the highest count was only 8 at Bleachfield *Kintyre* on 18 Apr.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data however birds present in all areas during the summer and noted as widespread on *Tiree* in May. Fledged birds noted on *Tiree* from 31 May and at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* from 8 Jun. Higher counts all *Tiree* and *Islay*. Elsewhere, max counts of 25 at Slockavuillin, Kilmartin Glen *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Aug and on Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Aug. Flocks (up to 30 birds) noted on *Islay* from 4 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura/North Argyll). Max counts of 240 at Meningie Tiree on 23 Aug, 240 on Oronsay Colonsay on 29 Sep, 180 at Saligo Bag Islay on 2

Sep, 110 at each of The Reef *Tiree* on 16 Sep, Balemartine *Tiree* on 14 Oct and Kilnave *Islay* on 29 Dec. Max mainland count was 40 on Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Dec.

COMMON REDPOLL Acanthis flammea

Includes Mealy Redpoll C. f. flammea & Greenland Redpoll C. f. rostrata (latter now sometimes known as North- western Redpoll, which includes islandica). A scarce passage migrant: and irregular winter visitor. Mealy has bred on Tiree and also suspected of breeding on other islands.

Spring/summer First arrival of 2 at The Glebe *Tiree* on 22 Apr then at four other *Tiree* sites during May. A few reports of 1-2 birds from *Mull* and *Colonsay* during May-Jun.

Breeding All reports from *Tiree*. Prs thought likely to be nesting at Balephuil/Carnan Mor, Heylipol and The Glebe in May- Jun. Fledged young noted at The Glebe from 29 Jun.

Autumn/winter All reports *Tiree* where numbers increased during Sep to a peak of 23 including juvs at Balephuil on 18-20 Sep then numbers decreased during Oct with last report of singles at The Glebe and Balephuil on 18 Oct.

Larger 'Greenland' rostrata type birds noted at Balephuil Tiree with 1 on 12th and 2 on 13 Oct.

LESSER REDPOLL Acanthis cabaret

RED LIST A locally common partial migrant, breeding locally: numbers fluctuate from year to year. Post breeding flocks gather from July and most birds move south for the winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Kintyre*). Only one report in Jan, a bird at Balvicar, Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Jan, one in Feb at Dervaig *Mull* on 7 Feb and 1 in Mar at Port Charlotte *Islay* on 25 Mar. Birds returned in small numbers from early Apr and higher counts of 13 at Ardpatrick *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Apr and 15 at The Lodge *Coll* on 11 May.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. Prs noted from suitable areas across Argyll. Juvs noted from early Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Flocks from early Sep. Higher counts later in the year mostly on mainland. Max counts of 140 at Inverneill *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Dec, 100 at Laggan wood, Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Dec, 80 nr Tarbert *Kintyre* on 21 Nov and several flocks of 50 in *Mid-Argyll* during Dec.

COMMON CROSSBILL Loxia curvirostra

An irruptive species: large numbers breed in good cone years, but few stay when cones are scarce.

Winter/spring No reports from (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree*). No reports in Jan then most reports Apr-Jun with max counts of 31 at Achnabreck *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Jun, 15 at Loch Ba *Mull* on 29 Apr and 10 at Scotmill *Kintyre* on 14 May.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received or reports of juvenile birds.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay*). Max counts of 22 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Dec, 30 at Finlaggan *Islay* on 31 Dec and 15 at Loch Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 30 Dec. A single was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 24 Aug and numbers generally low elsewhere with 1-6 birds.

TWO-BARRED CROSSBILL* Loxia leaucoptera

A scarce migrant to Scotland often following autumn irruptions from Finland and NW Russia. No previous Argyll records.

Autumn An adult female was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 10 Aug [John Bowler, Janet Hunter]. Record was accepted by the BBRC and becomes a new species for Argyll.



EUROPEAN GOLDFINCH Mid-Argyll Apr Jim Dickson

EUROPEAN GOLDFINCH Carduelis carduelis

A widely distributed resident with recent breeding on Coll, Colonsay and sporadically on Tiree. Flocks occur in autumn.

Winter/spring No reports from (*Colonsay*). Several reports of small nos in Jan including 20 at Innellen *Cowal* on 11 Jan and unusually high numbers for *Tiree* with 15 at Balinoe on 21 Jan. Numbers remained low until early Apr then higher counts of 30 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 5 Apr and 30 at Kilchoman *Islay* on 30 May.

Summer/breeding No breeding data other than fledglings noted from late Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Flocks sizes increased during late Aug-Sep, most of 20-40 birds and max counts of 110 at Loch Gorm *Islay* on 2 Sep, 86 at Carsaig Bay *Mull* on 16 Nov and 50 at Port Righ, Carradale *Kintyre* on 21 Aug.

EURASIAN SISKIN Spinus spinus

A locally common partial migrant: present in all areas apart from Coll and Tiree where it is an occasional visitor. Numbers fluctuate from year to year depending on cone crops.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Most reports from sites in; *Mid-Argyll* (25), *Mull* (20) and *Cowal* (11). Generally low numbers reported with a max of only 10+ noted at Loch an Torr *Mull* on 8 Apr. One report from *Tiree* of a male at Carnan Mor on 24 Apr.

Summer/breeding Higher counts, all *Mid-Argyll*, included 20 at Minard on 4 Jul, 15 at Arduaine on 6 Jul and 14 at Balvicar on 30 Jun. Several prs with juvs noted at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* from early Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Ten flocks of 30 or more noted. Max counts of 100+ at Craigendive, Loch Striven *Cowal* on 15 Dec and in *Mid-Argyll* with 80 at Inverneill on 10 Dec and 80 at Crinan on 11 Dec. A flock of 30 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 29 Oct was notable.



EURASIAN SISKIN Mid-Argyll Jun Jim Dickson

LAPLAND BUNTING* Calcarius lapponicus

AMBER LIST A scarce passage migrant: recorded most frequently in autumn.

Autumn/winter Only three reports, all singles from *Tiree* at Beinn Hough on 5 Sep, at West Hynish on 7 Sep and at Vaul on 4 Nov.

SNOW BUNTING Plectrophenax nivalis **RED LIST** Occurring annually in varying numbers (on passage and in winter): along the coast and in the hills and has probably bred in North Argyll. *Winter/spring* Only four reports. Singles at Clachandhu, Gribun *Mull* on 17 Mar, Craignure *Mull* on 4 Apr, at the summit of Beinn a Lochain *Cowal* on 12 Apr and 2 at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 11 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). First arrival of 1 at Beinn Hough *Tiree* on 1 Oct. Elsewhere, 20 reports generally of 1-4 birds and peak counts of 6 at Hough Bay *Tiree* on 18 Oct, 15 at Ardnave Point *Islay* on 21 Oct, 62 at Machir Bay *Islay* on 30 Oct, 6 at Meal Mor, Knapdale *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Nov and 26 at Machrie *Islay* on 23 Nov.

YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella

RED LIST A localised resident which is absent from Coll and Tiree and appears to be declining elsewhere. Currently, most birds breed near the coast. All records are welcome.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Jura/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Max count of 7 at Ardnahoe *Islay* on 25 Apr. Elsewhere, counts of only 1-4 birds at 12 sites.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received. No reports received during May. A juv was at Rhuvaal lighthouse *Islay* on 27 Jun. Reports of 1-2 birds from sites in *Islay*, *Mid-Argyll* and *Mull. Autumn/winter* Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Max counts of 12 at Kildalton *Islay* on 22 Oct and 7 at Ormsary *Kintyre* on 27 Oct. Elsewhere, counts of only 1-5 birds at 10 sites.

COMMON REED BUNTING Emberiza schoeniclus

AMBER LIST A locally distributed resident breeder: while nowhere abundant, small flocks sometimes gather outwith the breeding season.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas and generally widespread with mostly 1-3 birds at sites. Max counts of 20 at Achafolla, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 2 Feb, 10 at RSPB Oa reserve *Islay* Jan-Mar and 8 at Gott tip *Tiree* on 11 Feb.

Summer/breeding Singing males noted from early mid-Mar. On *Colonsay* (excluding Oronsay) 29 Ters located late Apr, 27 Ters at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay*, 15 scattered prs noted across *Tiree* and 3 Ters at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas and generally widespread in small nos of 1-6 birds at sites. Max counts of 20 at Kilnave *Islay* on 24 Oct, 16 at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Oct, 12 at RSPB Oa reserve *Islay* on 27 Sep and 10 at the Glebe, Scarinish *Tiree* on 18 Oct.

WHITE-CROWNED SPARROW* Zonotrchia leaucophrys

A North American vagrant: Four previous Scottish records and no Argyll records..

Spring/summer An adult was at Risabus, The Oa *Islay* on 12 Jun [Bonnie Wood]. Record was accepted by the BBRC and becomes a new species for Argyll. (*Article: Scottish Birds Vol 40 (1) pp 79-80*)

Escapes and Introductions

This section includes species which are not on the British list or whose occurrence in the UK is EXCLUSIVELY within Categories B, D or E. Other species, whose occurrence in Argyll arises partly or wholly from introduced birds which may not or do not form self-sustaining breeding populations, include White-fronted Goose, Snow Goose, Barnacle Goose, Mandarin Duck, Red Kite, Red-legged Partridge, Grey Partridge and Rock Dove (Feral Pigeon). These are dealt with in the main systematic list.

BLACK SWAN Cygnus astratus

Summer/autumn One was at Linne na Craige, Loch Etive Mid-Argyll Jul - Oct at least.

Getting Involved

Argyll Bird Club The ABC is a registered charity with membership open to all. The club aims to promote an interest in birds in Argyll. We are a friendly club for anybody interested in wild birds, living in, or visiting, Argyll, irrespective of their level of knowledge, experience or skill. Visitors are more than welcome to our two annual indoor meetings which are all-day events held on a Saturday in spring and autumn. The club produces a quarterly magazine, '*The Eider*' and also has a website with sections on 'Recent Sightings' with photographs, News with details of upcoming meetings and trips, 'Publications' and 'Surveys'. Volunteers are always welcome to help with committee matters, bird recording and the website and to contribute to *The Eider*.

Scottish Ornithologists Club The SOC exists to promote the study, enjoyment and conservation of wild birds and their habitats across Scotland and is a birdwatching club with 15 local branches across the country and a growing membership of over 3,000. Like-minded individuals with a passion for birds, nature and conservation are brought together through a programme of talks, outings, conferences and via the Club's quarterly members' journal, *Scottish Birds*. The SOC acts as the umbrella organisation for bird recording in Scotland, managing the network of recording birds in Scotland, or the Local Recorders' Network and the Scottish Birds Records Committee, the latter of which maintains the official Scottish List on behalf of the Club. The database of information Local Recorders collect is an extremely important archive of local bird information – a critical tool for their future conservation.

British Trust for Ornithology Through the efforts of volunteers participating in BTO surveys, the bird populations of the British Isles have been monitored more effectively and for longer than those of most other parts of the world. This has produced a uniquely rich and detailed body of scientific work. This will help us to understand the complex challenges facing wild birds at a time of great change in the environment. Volunteer surveyors, members and staff work in partnership to provide unbiased information about birds and their habitats.

In Argyll we have many volunteers who participate in the following surveys and you can get involved by contacting the bird recorder or any of the BTO representatives given on page 2:

BirdTrack is an exciting project, through a partnership between the BTO, the RSPB, Birdwatch Ireland, the Scottish Ornithologists' Club and the Welsh Ornithological Society, that looks at migration movements and distributions of birds throughout Britain and Ireland. BirdTrack provides facilities for observers to store and manage their own personal records as well as using these to support species conservation at local, regional, national, and international scales.

Breeding Bird Survey (BBS) is the main scheme for monitoring the population changes of the UK's common breeding birds. It is a national volunteer project aimed at keeping track of changes in the breeding populations of widespread bird species in the UK. Wild bird populations are an important indicator of the health of the countryside, and knowing to what extent bird populations are increasing or decreasing is fundamental to bird conservation.

The Wetland Bird Survey (WeBS) monitors non-breeding waterbirds in the UK. The principal aims of WeBS are to identify population sizes, determine trends in numbers and distribution, and identify important sites for waterbirds.


