

Argyll Bird Club

The Argyll Bird Club was formed in 1985 and aims to play an active role in the promotion of ornithology and conservation within Argyll, in the District of

Argyll and Bute, in Strathclyde Region.

The club has steadily built up its membership to the present level of around 170. One day-long meeting is held in the spring and another in the autumn, these include talks, scientific papers and field trips. Conferences on selected topics are also organised occasionally. In 1986 the club held its first conference, a successful meeting between foresters and bird conservationists. This was followed in 1987 with a two-day conference in Oban on fish farming and the environment.

The club has close contacts with other conservation groups both locally and nationally, including the British Trust for Ornithology, the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds, Scottish Ornithologists' Club and the Scottish

Naturalists' Trust.

Membership of the club promotes a greater interest in birds through individual and shared participation in various recording and surveying schemes, and the dissemination of this information to members through four newsletters each year and the annual Argyll Bird Report. The report is distributed free to all members (one per family membership) and is the major publication of the club. Most of the annual subscription is used to pay for this. Corporate membership of the Club is also available to hotels, companies and other bodies wishing to support bird conservation in Argyll.

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

INTRODUCTION

This is the first time that the annual systematic list has been compiled using information from a computerised database. Such a system enables far greater use to be made of all bird records and makes the generation of a report such as this one considerably easier. A total of just under 4,500 records were entered onto the database in 1990 and this information should prove to be a valuable resource in the future. Clearly, there is not space available here to publish all these data and much editing and summarising was necessary to meet the page allocation for the report. Even so, it is the largest systematic list yet and likely to expand in future years. We are perhaps reaching the point at which we should be exploring alternative ways of using and presenting the detailed data that are accumulating, although the continued publication of some kind of annual summary of sightings is desirable. The views of all readers would be very much appreciated.

The area covered by this report is the administrative district of Argyll & Bute (but excluding the Isle of Bute). As in previous years this area is divided

into 6 regions (see map).

One of the most satisfying aspects of compiling the systematic list is that it is very much a team effort. We are indebted to everyone who submitted records in 1990 and hope that they will continue to support the report in future years. Note that observers initials are not usually cited in the systematic list unless a summary of an individual's or organisation's fieldwork has been included. In previous reports, initials have also been included for sightings of rarities, but we have discontinued this because it seems to us that it discriminates against the many contributors who send in valuable counts and behavioural observations of commoner species.



BIRD RECORDING IN ARGYLL

Advice to contributors

All bird records are welcomed by the recorder. Sightings should be listed in Voous order (as in this report) and include the following details: species, number (inc. sex & age if relevant / known), date and location. The location should be as precise as possible - a place name followed by a six figure grid reference is ideal, eg. Lochdon, Mull, NM 745315 (an explanation of the national grid system can be found on all Landranger 1:50,000 Ordnance Survey maps). Observers are asked to consult this and previous Argyll Bird Reports for the kind of information required.

It would help the recorder considerably if 1991 records were sent on a regular basis throughout the year, but if this is not possible, please send them

by January 31 1992 at the latest.

Rare or unusual birds

To ensure that published records of unusual species are accurate and will withstand critical scrutiny, a three-tier structure has been developed to consider records of birds which are rare in either a British, Scottish or Argyll context. Details of unusual species should be sent to the recorder as soon as possible after the sighting. It is helpful if these records are submitted on the stan-

dard "unusual record form" available free of charge from the recorder. As a general rule, the rarer the species the more detailed the description required. Notes should be taken at the time of sighting or as soon afterwards as possible, before any reference is made to textbooks. Photographs are highly desirable if the opportunity permits. There is a clear advantage in obtaining independent confirmation of the sighting. Depending on the rarity of the species, details of the sighting will be sent by the recorder to either the British Birds Rarities Committee (BBRC), Scottish Birds Records Committee (SBRC) or the Argyll Records Panel (ARP). Species considered by the ARP are listed below. In some cases more detail may be requested from an observer before the record is submitted.

The above information has been prepared from advice given by the Scot-

tish Birds Records Committee of the Scottish Ornithologists Club.

INTERPRETATION OF THE SPECIES ACCOUNTS

Species names and sequence follow the Voous order as in The 'British Birds' List of the Birds of the Western Palearctic (1984) and subsequent changes published in 'British Birds'. Sub-species names follow The Status of Birds in Britain and Ireland (BOU 1971).

Each species heading in the report contains the following information:

Note that Gaelic names & BTO codes are not available for all species.

Each heading is followed by a summary of the bird's known status and distribution within Argyll together with any other relevant information. Sig-

nificant 1990 sightings are then listed.

Tables, where included, show monthly maximum counts. These are generally derived from National Wildfowl Count (NWC) & Birds of Estuaries Enquiry (BOEE) data, but sometimes include other counts if higher figures were available. A detailed summary of NWC & BOEE counts for the winter 1989/90 is given in Newton & Newton 1991, see this report. Anyone interested in participating in wildfowl or wader counts should contact Steve Newton see addresses.



Red-throated diver Gavia stellata Learga ruadh 0002 RH B W P Widely distributed but sparse breeding species. Breeding recorded in 26% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90). Breeding divers are very susceptible to disturbance. 1990:

- I Breeding proven at 1 site. Evidence of passage at several sites in S Kintyre during March, eg. 5 Ru Stafnish, 17 Mar; 6 Brunerican Bay, 25 Mar. Black-throated diver Gavia arctica Learga dhubh 0003 BV B W P Scarce, although probably under-recorded in winter. Breeding now only in regions IV & VI. Breeding divers are very susceptible to disturbance. 1990: 7 pairs summered at traditional sites. Additional non-breeding birds present near two of these sites. Another 3 non-breeding birds recorded on lochs close to unoccupied, but previously regular breeding sites (includes 2 in Highland Region). 1-2 birds seen irregularly on other inland waters in Mid Argyll (Apr-Jul) and at one loch in Kintyre in Jun. 5 pairs proved to breed; all successfully hatched egg(s) and 4 pairs fledged 4 young. The most productive season for many years including one site where breeding was last proven 12 years ago. Birds at another site produced the first chick to be seen in the 6 years that this study has been underway [RSPB]. Large numbers were again recorded off W Kintyre in spring & autumn. The origins of these birds is unclear.

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INTRODUCTION

In 1990, ringing in Argyll was carried out by thirteen individuals or groups, five resident and eight visiting. Altogether, 8500 birds of 78 species were ringed, down 12% on 1989. Of the 1990 total, 52% were seabirds, 41% passerines, 5% birds of prey, 1% wildfowl and 1% waders. Large scale ringing was carried out on the mainland and on Sanda, Colonsay, Islay and at seabird colonies in the Sound of Jura and elsewhere. The Treshnish Auk Group did not visit in 1990.

Two privately produced reports on ringing on Colonsay are now available. The first (November 1989: 4 pp) and the second (November 1990: 3 pp) Reports on Bird Ringing on Colonsay and Oronsay are available from David Jardine, 61 Eastwood Grange Road, Hexham, Northumberland NE46 1UE. Research projects on buzzard and raven, carried out by two research students at the Department of Zoology, University of Glasgow, were continued in Argyll in 1990.

Requests are made for details of sightings of individually numbered birds to be sent to the following people. For the wildfowl, the three-digit number is legible with binoculars or telescope: for choughs, the colours of the

leg rings are required.

The following Icelandic family saga is better told in prose than in the usual impersonal codes and conventions. It concerns a family of whooper swans ringed in Iceland with Darvic rings, legible at distance. An adult pair, NBZ and PYJ, were ringed at Svartarvatn, Bardardal, North Iceland (65°21'N 17°15'W) on 15 August 1987. NBZ was at the same site on 4 September 1988. On 17 August 1989, again at the same site, both adults were caught together with their four cygnets several weeks old. The cygnets were ringed PYD, PYF, PYI and PYH. The two adults and three of the cygnets were seen together in Loch Indaal, Islay, Argyll on 1 and 5 December 1989 and had almost certainly been there since 25 November or earlier. The fourth cygnet, PYH, was never recorded on Islay but was seen just across the North Channel on Lough Foyle, Ireland, in January 1990, having apparently been adopted by another family of swans. The two adults and two cygnets (PYF and PYJ) were again on Islay for several weeks in winter 1990-91. They were seen on 14 November and 14 December and did not leave Islay until the last week of December 1990. Next time you see whoopers flying in formation high overhead, calling noisily to each other, remember this 1140 km odyssey. (Records supplied by M. Ogilvie and A. Fox).

White-fronted goose

Because of its precarious world status, the Greenland race of this species has been intensively studied in recent years in both Britain and Ireland by the Greenland White-fronted Goose Study Group and Irish Wildlife Service. Eighty-nine percent of the British wintering population occurs in Argyll, with about two-thirds of these on Islay. During three summer expeditions to Greenland, geese were individually numbered with leg rings (in 1979 and 1984) and neck-collars (in 1989), both legible at distance. These facts, together with the high numbers of birds marked in Greenland and resighted in the British Isles, and the striking success of the work in general, give this species pride of place in this account of ringing in Argyll. Intriguing new findings are reported almost every year (see GWFGS Reports 1-6 and comments in previous Argyll Bird Reports). This year is no exception and the following account is taken, some of it verbatim, from the GWFGS Research Report No. 7 (1990).

Of 96 birds ringed in Greenland in 1979, 71 (74%) had been resighted by the end of winter 1989-90. Naturally, most of these were in the winters immediately after ringing. During winter 1989-90, six were seen in the British Isles, all but one on Islay. Interestingly, one ringed bird was not resighted until winter 1989-90, so there may still be other 1979-ringed birds out there unrecorded!

Of 88 birds ringed in Greenland in 1984, 54 (61%) had been resighted by the end of winter 1989-90. Ten were seen in the British Isles in winter 1989-90,

eight on Islay, one at Wexford (Eire) and one on Stronsay (Orkney).

Of 32 birds fitted with numbered collars in Greenland in summer 1989, 26 (an amazing 81%) had been seen on wintering grounds by the end of winter 1989-90. Fourteen were on Islay, five on Tiree, two each at Rhunahaorine and Machrihanish, and one each at Loch Ken, at Corrib (Ireland) and in Iceland (shot on passage). Besides the very high resighting percentage, it is of particular interest that all but one were in Scotland (all but three in Argyll). This was despite a very high level of search in Ireland, especially at Wexford. (A wintering population of 8238 was recorded at Wexford in November 1989, with 4044 in the rest of Ireland. This compared with 14,295 in Scotland, 123 in Wales and 16 in England in the census of autumn 1989.) The geese marked in 1989 were among the most southerly ever ringed in Greenland. Earlier ringing has suggested that the breeding grounds of Wexford birds lie much further north in Greenland than those of Scottish birds. Together, these findings add support to Salomonsen's hypothesis of "leapfrog" migration, the concept that birds breeding furthest to the north winter furthest to the south.

A notable event during the year was the capture and ringing on Islay of sixteen Greenland Whitefronts. Very few birds of this species have been ringed in Great Britain, and these are believed to be the first of this subspecies ringed here. (Information supplied by D. Stroud and M. Ogilvie.)

Note the relatively rapid movements of C749280 (35 km/day) and F669724 (18 km/day). Note also the remarkable wanderings of E500969 (although the two recovery dates are probably too late and early to allow a definite conclusion of breeding site infidelity). There were also nine reported movements of 104-157 km between Argyll and eastern Scotland, and four of less than 100 km within the Argyll-Glasgow area.

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WINTERING WILDFOWL

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Wintering Wildfowl in Argyll 1989/1990

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INTRODUCTION

Birdwatchers have long been attracted to Argyll, and the southern Innner Hebrides in particular, to see nationally scarce species such as barnacle and greenland white-fronted geese and scaup. Although numbers of other wildfowl species seldom exceed criteria for national importance (Kirby et al. 1991), the area supports a diverse winter waterfowl fauna. Most species occur in coastal habitats, especially sea lochs.

Most wildfowl counting in the Argyll area is usually done under the auspices of the National Wildfowl Counts scheme (NWC), and for the sites with wader populations, the Birds of the Estuaries Enquiry (BoEE). For these schemes, sites should be counted mid-monthly from September through to March. Since 1980 the number of sites covered in this way has risen dramatically from a handful on Islay and mid-Argyll to the present level of 39

throughout the whole area.

It is hoped that an annual wildfowl summary in this format will appear on a regular basis in the *Argyll Bird Report*. The aim of the present paper is to document sites covered by the NWC and BoEE schemes, to present monthly totals of all wildfowl counted in the county, and to highlight important sites for various species.

SITES AND COUNTS

A total of 34 sites in Argyll were covered regularly over the winter of 1989/90 (Table 1). Two thirds of these were counted in all seven months and the remainder were usually covered on at least five occasions. Of the 34 sites, 32 had been counted at about the same frequency in the previous winter. Regular monthly coverage has not yet been achieved on Tiree but most sites were counted on about three occasions giving a reasonable impression of the situation.

An indication of habitat is also given in Table 1: 60% of sites are loosely termed sea lochs and 30% are inland lochs and lochans. The character of sea lochs varies enormously. Lochs Indaal, Gruinart and Don are predominantly estuarine with extensive areas of mud and sandflats, whilst more typically, the majority have sandy or muddy areas at their heads but are otherwise flanked by rocky or pebbly shores for most of their length. Inland water bodies covered by NWC are predominantly on the islands and are consequently often in very close proximity to the coast eg. all sites on Tiree, most on northwest Mull and Ardnave Loch on Islay.

The remainder of sites include two fairly open coastal sections north and south of the Holy Loch on the Firth of Clyde, and Moine Mhor and the Reef (Tiree) are categorised as bog mosses. New sites covered for the first time in the 1989/90 winter were Campbeltown Loch, Traigh Mhor on the Ross of Mull

near Bunessan and the Reef in central Tiree.

WINTERING WILDFOWL

The size of sites varies considerably, ranging from a large sea loch/ estuary such as Loch Indaal to a tiny inland lochan such as Craiglin at the head of Loch Sween. The true complexity of habitats and diversity of waterfowl populations vary accordingly.

Table 2 gives the summed monthly Argyll totals of each species by month for winter 1989/90, excluding Tiree. Other waterbirds including divers, grebes, cormorants, shags and herons that frequent the wetlands of Argyll are also included. Similar data for the previous winter (1988/89) are presented in Table 3. Although the recent winter totals include two new sites there were only very small numbers of waterfowl at one (Traigh Mhor) whereas significant numbers of eider occurred at Campbeltown Loch. With the latter exception, the two tables are almost directly comparable and reveal both interesting differences in totals of species between years and some similar parallel trends through the course of a winter. These are discussed in the following species summaries.



SPECIES ACCOUNTS

Divers

Both great northern and red-throated divers are recorded annually in small numbers. With the exception of a single at Loch Craignish, great northern divers were only recorded on four island sea lochs. Maximum counts were 8 at L. Indaal, 5 at L. Gruinart, 3 at Loch Don and 8 at Loch na Keal. Red-throated divers were less numerous and only occurred at L. Indaal (max 4) and L. Don (max 3).

Grebes

No species are very numerous in winter. Great-crested grebes were only recorded in September, February and March at Campbeltown, West Loch Tarbert and L. Feochan (singles at each site). Little grebes are the most wide-spread species, occurring at 16 sites, mostly on Mull and the mainland. The highest count was 13 at L. Etive in February, and 6 were recorded on the Keills Peninsula (Nov) and L. Don (Jan). With the exception of Ardnave Loch and some of the NW Mull lochs, all were recorded on sea lochs. Wintering slavonian grebes are confined to L. Indaal (max 14 in Feb) and Loch na Keal (max 11 in Dec).

Mute swan

Fairly widespread in winter, occurring at 25 sites, mostly in small numbers. However, winter maxima over 10 were recorded at head of West L. Tarbert (32 in Oct), Holy Loch (16 in Oct), Keills Peninsula (20 in Sept), L. Craignish (27 in Oct), L. Crinan (25 in Jan), L. Feochan (10 in Jan), Loch Don (13 in Oct and Nov), L. Etive (18 in Sept), L. Laich (10 in Oct & Nov) and L. a'Phuill (73 in Sept). The latter count almost certainly comprised part of the summer moult flock. Most of the individuals at sites with high autumn counts are probably inexperienced adults and these herds partially break up in mid-winter as pairs presumably move off locally to seek or re-establish breeding territories

or are displaced by the resident pair. The Argyll wintering population seems fairly stable (peak count of 146 in 1989/90 and 174 in 1988/89). The difference may be attributable to variations in breeding success. However, by January/February, the numbers at NWC sites are consistently between 50 and 70 individuals.

Whooper swan

Very similar numbers seen in both winters, with the total peaking at about 70 soon after their arrival in October. At most other Scottish haunts whooper swans are primarily birds of agricultural land, especially favouring stubble fields in autumn. Argyll, and Tiree in particular, is one area where this species can still be found in more typical wetland habitats. Most whoopers seem to be autumn visitors to most of Argyll, except on Tiree, as numbers fall rapidly by mid-winter. Peak numbers at the important sites were 17 L. Indaal (Oct & Dec), 13 Keills Peninsula (Jan), 26 Moine Mhor/River Add Estuary (Dec) and 18 Mishnish Lochs (Oct). The situation on Tiree is less clear. The close proximity of sites means that all lochs need to be covered on the same day to get an accurate estimate of numbers; this was only achieved on three occasions, including the September count which preceded the main arrival. The December total was 54 and between 29 and 37 were still present at the end of March. Loch a'Phuill usually holds the highest numbers: on 27 October 111+ landed briefly on the loch before heading off towards Ireland (SSW). Otherwise, 25-50 are more typical of this site during autumn and early winter, with up to 30 at L. Bhasapol (Nov & Dec), 18 L. Riaghin (Dec) and 24 on the Reef (Oct).

Greenland white-fronted goose

Whitefronts are only regularly recorded at two "mainland" NWC sites. The highest count on Danna was 210 (Nov), though 240 were recorded on nearby Ulva in early January. Loch Crinan held 60 in December; and a single was recorded L. Cuin, NW Mull, in November. The boggy fringes of most NWC sites on Tiree usually hold greater or lesser numbers of whitefronts at some stage in the winter. However, many feed on agricultural land and the NWC scheme does not give a good indication of population size. A complete survey of the whole island at the end of March located 987 Greenland whitefronts.

Greylag goose

Recorded at 12 sites including all on Tiree. Loch Crinan and Moine Mhor are the most important sites for this species on the mainland. The former held a maximum of 458 in December and the latter 180 in March. There is undoubtedly interchange between these two sites. Elsewhere on the mainland greylag were only recorded on the coastal strip south of Dunoon (max 24 in March), a group of 4 seen on a single occasion at L. Etive (Nov) and 60 were at L. Laich in early February, but the latter were not detected in the midmonthly count. Small numbers (<10) were seen infrequently on L. Indaal and L. Gruinart and 17 were at Traigh Mhor on Mull in February. The Tiree goose count recorded 594 for the whole island in late March, though September maxima of 223 and 440 were recorded in the vicinity of Loch a'Phuill and L. Riaghain respectively.

Barnacle goose

A small party of 8 was recorded at L. Cuin (Mull) in October and a single was at L. Scridain in March. The only regular mainland NWC site holding barnacle geese is Danna. Numbers peaked at 350 in November. The spring goose count on Tiree located a minimum of 581 (end March).

Other goose species

Small numbers of other goose species often occur in barnacle and white-front flocks. Counts on Tiree produced 2 pinkfeet and singles of both canada and snow goose. A small flock of 7 pinkfeet were at L. Cuin, Mull in November.

Pale-bellied brent geese were only recorded at L. Gruinart with up to 3 in February and March.

Shelduck

Shelduck numbers build up on the sea lochs of Argyll throughout the course of the winter as birds return from their moulting grounds. Very few are present in September and October and the highest counts are always in February and March. Most shelduck occur in the larger and more estuarine sea lochs. Maxima in 1989/90 were 212 at L. Gruinart, 46 at L. Indaal and 79 at L. Don. Other sites with 10-25 birds included Campbeltown Loch, Keills Peninsula, L. Gilp, L. Craignish and L. Laich. L. a'Phuill was the only inland site where shelduck were recorded. 23 in late March.

Wigeon

The most numerous dabbling duck in Argyll. Peak counts are usually between late October and December; numbers fall considerably by March. 1989/90 appeared to be a good year for wigeon and the country total considerably exceeded 2000 in both October and November. Recorded at 27 sites with 6 having peak counts of 250 or more; 334 head West L. Tarbert (Oct), 615 L. Indaal (Nov), 341 L. Gruinart (Dec), 250 Keills Peninsula (Nov), 520 Moine Mhor/R. Add Estuary (Oct) and 352 L. Don (Nov). Three other sites held over 100; Holy Loch (115), L. Craignish (158) and L. Laich (170). Gadwall

The small breeding population on Tiree usually means a few are recorded during winter. Ten were present on L. Bhasapol in September and the highest number recorded on L. a'Phuill was 5 (Dec).

Teal

A similar distribution to wigeon, recorded at 24 sites, but numbers never as high. The main stronghold appears to be Islay, with maxima of 448 at L. Indaal (Dec) and 310 at L. Gruinart (Nov). Other sites with significant counts (>100) were 124 Ardnave L. (March), 132 Moine Mhor/R. Add Estuary (Dec), 191 L. Don (Oct), 145 L. a'Phuill (Dec) and 150 on the Reef (Nov). Mallard

The most widespread species in Argyll - recorded at 37 sites. Loch an Tor (Mull) and Port Appin were the two exceptions. The high numbers recorded in early autumn may reflect a sizeable local breeding population. Only four sites held maxima over 200; L. Indaal (262 in Sept), L. Gruinart (292 in Dec), Holy Loch (229 in Sept) and L. Craignish and L. Begg (412 in September). Two other sites are worth noting; L. Crinan with 175 in October and L. a'Phuill with 154 in September.

Pintail

Recorded at two sites on Islay and three on Tiree. L. Indaal supports the only significant wintering population; numbers in 1989/90 were slightly down on the previous year and the peak count was 37 in October. A single drake was present on Ardnave Loch from the end of November through to mid December. A maximum of six were recorded on Tiree in December (4 L. Riaghain and 2 L. a'Phuill.).

Shoveler

This species has a very similar distribution to pintail. L. Indaal held a maximum of 12 in November. L. a'Phuill held 11 in November and small numbers (1-3) were seen at the remaining 4 Tiree sites (Sept-Dec).

Pochard

Loch Drimnin is the only regular mainland site, with a peak count of 9 in February. Pochard were unusual visitors to West L. Tarbert in January and March-perhaps displaced to the sea loch from a frozen inland site. Three sites on Tiree held pochard; highest numbers were on L. a'Phuill with 37 in early December, L. Bhasapol held 5 in early December and Loch an Eilein peaked at 9 (Nov).

Tufted duck

Another rather scarce diving duck in Argyll. Recorded at 9 sites including all on Tiree. Strongholds are Ardnave Loch (max 40 in Mar) and the December island total for Tiree was 111. Most of the latter were on L. a'Phuill and L. Bhasapol. On the mainland tufted duck were noted at West L. Tarbert (max 39 in Jan), L. Leathan (max 12 in Jan and Feb) and 4 were on L. Drimnin in January.

Coot

The scarcest species of waterfowl in the county. Only recorded on L. Bhasapol, Tiree, with a maximum count of 5 in December.

Cormorant and Shag Small numbers (1-20) of cormorants were recorded at 23 sites. Only three sites held maxima exceeding 20; Campbeltown Loch, the Clyde south of Dunoon and Port Appin. Shags were present at 5 sites; L. Indaal (max 56 Dec), Keills Peninsula & Danna (max 10 Feb), L. Crinan (max 20 Jan) and at Campbeltown Loch and L. Gruinart.

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
