

Argyll Bird Club

The Argyll Bird Club was formed in 1985 and aims to play an active role in the promotion of ornithology and conservation in Argyll, in the District of Argyll and Bute, and in Strathclyde Region.

The club has steadily built up its membership to the present level of around 170. One day-long meeting is held in the spring and another in the autumn. These include talks, scientific papers and field trips. Conferences on selected topics are also organised occasionally. In 1986, the club held its first conference, a successful meeting between foresters and bird conservationists. This was followed, in 1987, by a two-day conference in Oban on fish farming and the environment.

The club has close contacts with other conservation groups, both locally and nationally, including the British Trust for Omithology, the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds, the Scottish Ornithologists' Club and the Scottish Wildlife Trust.

The club promotes a greater interest in birds by participation in various recording schemes. Members receive four newsletters a year as well as the annual Argyll Bird Report. The report is distributed free to all members (one per family membership) and is the major publication of the club. Much of the annual subscription is used to pay for the report and newsletters. Corporate membership of the club is also available to hotels, companies and other bodies wishing to support bird conservation in Argyll.

Editorial

This is the ninth Argyll Bird Report and its appearance coincides with several changes in production.

Firstly, Steve Petty has resigned as editor. During Steve's editorship this Annual Report has become a well established and widely read vehicle, both for the annual Systematic List and for scientific papers relating to the birds of Argyll. All readers and club members will wish to convey their whole-hearted thanks to Steve for his three years of work as editor. It is fitting that his editorship should have been rewarded by the shortlisting of the seventh *Argyll Bird Report* (for 1990) in the Best Annual Bird Report competition, organised by the journal *British Birds* (see *British Birds* 85(6) 1992 299-308).

Secondly, I have now taken over as editor and will do my best to uphold the high standard that Steve Petty achieved.

Thirdly, the change in editor has necessitated a change in printer, as it is easier if these two functions are as geographically close as possible. We have chosen Harlequin Press of Oban and I hope that everyone will be pleased with the results. Many thanks to them for their excellent and helpful cooperation.

Fourthly, the Systematic List, which is the heart of the Bird Report, has been produced as before by Mike Madders, the Recorder for Argyll. This year, however, he has been assisted by a team of four other compilers. Mike gives more details in his Introduction. Here I would add that the Argyll Database, which Mike conceived, developed and maintains, is the essential raw material on which the compilers have worked. The present Systematic List remains very largely the work of one person, the Recorder, and depends entirely on his keeping of detailed records throughout the year. The Club will wish to thank not only Mike in particular for his hard work in this endeavour, but also the compilers and proof-readers for meeting several deadlines and collectively producing an excellent Systematic List. As always, many thanks also to Philip Snow for continuing to provide so many drawings of such high quality, and thanks to Gordon Yates for allowing us to use his excellent photograph, of a peregrine and its brood, on the cover of this issue.

I would like to take this opportunity of encouraging anyone interested in wild birds, wholly or partly in Argyll, to consider publishing their results and observations in this journal. I would welcome offers of papers, short notes, letters or other contributions.

This is the second year in which I have not written a Ringing Report to accompany the Systematic List. It was clear from comments received that the former Ringing Reports were perhaps too elaborate and detailed. I welcome readers' comments on whether a regular report of bird-ringing in Argyll is worthwhile and, if so, how such results might best be presented in future issues of the *Argyll Bird Report*.

County Bird Reports such as this fulfil many different functions. They provide a permanent record of ornithological events each year. They undoubtedly raise the level of ornithological knowledge and awareness of those who read them. By no means

least, they are a thoroughly enjoyable read for those with experience of the county and its birds. Everyone will find something different in the following pages to fire his or her imagination. For some, I suspect that highlights of the 1992 Systematic List will include the talon-grappling, sky-diving duo of golden eagles, the sparrowhawk preying on merlin, the buzzard carrying a large adder, and an incident of serial piracy involving three bird species (I'll let you find out which ones!) Those whose taste is for the unusual or the extreme will appreciate the records of amazing numbers of ravens at Oban rubbish tip, the exceptionally large brood of redstarts raised in one of the nestboxes of the Argyll Bird Club's own Nestbox Programme, the rock dove nesting in January, and the snipe drumming in October. Everyone will be encouraged by the successful launch of the Corncrake Initiative in the outer islands of Argyll. The relentless long-term decline of this species is well known, but the precise 1992 counts and the conservation measures recorded in these pages lighten the gloom with a welcome ray of hope.

As I said, something for everyone. Good reading!

INTRODUCTION

For the first time the production of the systematic list of the *Argyll Bird Report* has been a co-operative effort. This has enabled a more rigorous analysis of records. The division of species was based largely upon people's expertise and specialisation. Roger Broad dealt with divers, grebes, raptors and schedule 1 breeding species; Clive Craik with seabirds; David Jardine with passerines and Malcolm Ogilvie with wildfowl. This left me to deal with waders, gamebirds and a few odds and ends, before editing the overall systematic list. I think that the overall quality of the report has benefited greatly from this approach.

The format of the systematic list closely follows that of previous *Argyll Bird Reports*. One important departure, however, is that sightings of rare birds pending acceptance by either the British or Scottish Rarities Committees are now listed separately at the beginning of the systematic list, rather than being integrated with the species accounts.


A lively debate was generated among the compilers and proof readers when it was proposed that the new *British Birds* list of English bird names be adopted in the report. The consensus was in favour of using the existing names, at least for the time being.

This is my final systematic list for the *Argyll Bird Report*. After five years as recorder I have decided it is time to make way for someone with new ideas and enthusiasm. As yet, no one has been appointed. Please send your 1993 bird records to me, therefore, and I will pass these on to my successor. Please note that owing to pressure of other work I will be unable to acknowledge all records individually in future.

BIRD RECORDING IN ARGYLL

Advice to contributors

All bird records are welcomed by the recorder. Sightings should be listed in Voous order (as in this report) and include the following details: species, number (incl. sex & age if relevant / known), date and location. The location should be as precise as possible - a place name followed by a six figure grid reference is ideal, eg. Lochdon, Mull, NM 745315 (an explanation of the national grid system can be found on all Landranger 1:50,000 Ordnance Survey maps). Observers are asked to consult this and previous Argyll Bird Reports for the kind of information required. It would help the recorder considerably if 1993 records were sent on a regular basis throughout the year, but if this is not possible, please send them by January 31 1994 at the latest.

Rare or unusual birds

To ensure that published records of unusual species are accurate and will withstand critical scrutiny, a three-tier structure has been developed to consider records of birds which are rare in either a British, Scottish or Argyll context. Details of unusual species should be sent to the recorder as soon as possible after the sighting. It is helpful if these records are submitted on the standard "unusual record form" available free of charge from the recorder. As a general rule, the rarer the species the more detailed the description required. Notes should be taken at the time of sighting or as soon afterwards as possible, before any reference is made to textbooks. Photographs are highly desirable if the opportunity permits. There is a clear advantage in obtaining independent confirmation of the sighting. Depending on the rarity of the species, details of the sighting will be sent by the recorder to either the British Birds Rarities Committee

(BBRC), Scottish Birds Records Committee (SBRC) or the Argyll Records Panel (ARP). Species considered by the ARP are listed in the 7th Argyll Bird Report (1990). In some cases more detail may be requested from an observer before the record is submitted. The above information has been prepared from advice given by the Scottish Birds Records Committee of the Scottish Ornithologists' Club.

INTERPRETATION OF THE SPECIES ACCOUNTS

Species names and sequence follow the Voous order as in The *British Birds* List of the Birds of the Western Palearctic (1984). Sub-species names follow The Status of Birds in Britain and Ireland (BOU 1971). Each species heading in the report contains the following information:

Note that Gaelic names & BTO codes are not available for all species. Each heading is followed by a summary of the bird's known status and distribution within Argyll together with any other relevant information. Significant 1992 sightings are then listed. Histograms, where included, generally show monthly maximum counts. These are generally derived from National Wildfowl Count (NWC) & Birds of Estuaries Enquiry (BOEE) data, but sometimes include other counts if higher figures were available.



ARGYLL BIRD RECORDS 1992

Because of unfavourable weather conditions in spring 1992, mean arrival dates of many migrants were considerably later than usual, possibly by as much as a week or ten days. Mean arrival dates are, however, much more difficult to determine than are first arrival dates. Because observers almost always report the latter, Systematic Lists such as that published here may fail to reflect important delays in arrival such as that of 1992. Such delays are, of course more important in describing the behaviour of entire populations of birds than are the dates of arrival of one or a few early birds.

RED-THROATED DIVER Gavia stellata Learga Ruadh 0002 RH B W P Widely distributed but sparse breeding species. Breeding recorded in 26% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90). Breeding divers are very susceptible to disturbance. 1992: with the exception of Coll, numbers and breeding success poorly documented throughout Argyll.

Islay: recorded on 2 freshwater lochs, Apr 19; 27 L.Indaal, Apr 19; 10 off Port Charlotte, Jun 7; 21 off Port Charlotte, Oct 20. Scarba: 1 pr bred. Colonsay: 1 pr reared b/1. Mid-Argyll: 1 pr bred near L.Awe; recorded on inland water near L.Melfort from Apr 4. Coll: 9-10 breeding prs and 2-3 non-breeding birds; only one pr successful rearing b/2. Falling water levels during severe drought from mid-May probably a major factor in poor breeding success.



Adult RED THROATED DIVER & juvenile, Anzun sound , 20 9.92, NO

BLACK-THROATED DIVER Gavia arctica Learga dhuôb 0003 BV B W P Scarce, although probably under-recorded in winter. Breeding now only in Mid-& N.Argyll. Breeding divers are very susceptible to disturbance.

1992: 8 prs summered with additional non-breeding birds present at 2 lochs. 7 prs are known to have bred (2 on rafts) and to have raised 5 chicks. Black-throats generally nest a little later than the previous species, and the long dry period in May-June probably helped to make this by far the most successful and productive breeding season in recent years. At one site, a chick fledged for the first time in more than 10 years [RSPB]. There was also a small but welcome increase in summer records from inland water areas outwith present breeding areas, eg. Jura and Mull.

GREAT NORTHERN DIVER *Gavia immer* (Dure obtaction) 0004 ND W P The Argyll coast is an important wintering area. S/pl. birds regularly recorded Apr - early Jun in all regions except Cowal. Pre-migratory gatherings occur off some coasts in early May. A few individuals summer. 1992



MANX SHEARWATER Puffinus puffinus fachadh ban 0046 MX B P Very localised breeding species, colonies confirmed only on Sanda & Treshnish Is. The following record of birds on the sea, and similar records in earlier Argyll Bird Reports, suggest a colony may await discovery on the Garvellachs. 1992 Islay: 207 >S /40 mins, Frenchman's Rocks, Sep 2. Garvellach Is: 1,250, Jun 26.



STORM PETREL Hydrobates pelagicus DARAIG 0052 TM B P Very localised breeding species, large colonies known only on Sanda & Treshnish Is. Breeding birds come ashore late May/Jun. Passage off W coasts Aug-Sep. 1992

Islay: 1 Frenchman's Rocks, Sep 2. Mid-Argyll: 8 at sea off Oban, Sep 1. Mull: 11 Sound of Mull, Sep 1. Tiree: 7 Hynish, Aug 31.

LEACH'S PETREL Oceanodroma leucorhoa Gobhlan mara 0055 TL P Rare 1992#

Mid-Argyll: 1 found alive Oban, Sep 11, died in captivity.

GANNETMorus bassanusSulanc0071 GXS P Does not breed in Argyll; nearest colonies are Ailsa Craig (40 km E of Mull of
Kintyre) and Shiant Is (140 km N of Mull). Common inshore May-Sep: often seen high
up sealochs, usually those with wide mouths such as L.Caolisport and West L.Tarbert.
Very frequent L.Fyne.






Numbers of white-fronted geese in Argyll regions : Mar 25 - Apr 4, 1992.






Numbers of scaup at L. Indaal, Islay, in 1992.



Numbers of common scoter at L. Indaal, Islay, in 1992.



1992 breeding season: A cold and wet spring caused some early nest failures, but those that hatched enjoyed a high fledging rate. A total of 64 nests were monitored. Of these, 57 nests were successful, rearing a total of 171 young. Mean 1st egg date of 31 clutches was May 8 (range Apr 19-May 28); mean initial size of 40 clutches was 4.1; mean size of 62 broods at last visit was 2.69; mean of 36 fledged broods was 2.28. A total of 157 young were ringed and 156 were fitted with wing tags as part of a national study by RSPB [MM/MAO/MAP].

GOLDEN EAGLE Aquila chrysaetos Colaire 0296 EA B W Breeding in all regions. Imms. tend to wander in winter & may be recorded in areas where breeding does not occur. Breeding recorded in 39% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90).

1992: Full results of a national census completed in 1992 will be published elsewhere. Interim summary figures for Argyll are given below. 94-102 home ranges were monitored; the spread of these figures is due to the unresolved relationship between historical and current home ranges, including the apparent amalgamation of previously separate home ranges into larger ranges containing only a single pr. 9-14 home ranges were apparently vacant; birds were present in 85-88 with prs occupying 79-83. Breeding confirmed in 48 10km sq. 57 prs were proved to breed with perhaps as many as 64 laying eggs. Eggs hatched in at least 31 nests and 19 chicks fledged from 17 sites. Overall productivity was low with poor weather in the early spring a contributory factor. Eggs were stolen from a nest in **N. Argyll** and an adult was found dead in the same home range. Its cause of death could not be determined. Elsewhere, a subadult male was electrocuted on **Colonsay**, and examination of an adult female that died close to her nest on **Mull** showed recent injuries inflicted by another eagle. She had partly eaten her own chick [RSPB, MG, *et al.*]

1991: In retrospect, the figures for 1991 need upward revision to 3 prs. The additional site was built and occupied in 1991 but no eggs were thought to have been laid.

1992: 3 sites were occupied by prs. The nest constructed in 1991 was blown out during the winter and delay while the birds rebuilt in 1992 was probably one reason why this pr did not lay eggs. Two other prs laid clutches but both failed. Failure at one site occurred during a period of bad weather but the possibility of robbery cannot be entirely discounted [RSPB].

1992: Birds were recorded in several known breeding areas and 6 sites were monitored (Kintyre 2, Islay 1, Cowal 1, Mid-Argyll 2). One pr failed and 5 successful prs fledged 18 young. Despite visits to all known sites, there was again no evidence of breeding on Coll.







As part of a study over a wider area, breeding terns were monitored on islands along the mainland coast between Machrihanish and the Highland border. There were 11 colonies (2 pure and 9 mixed with arctic tern) containing 1186 prs of common tern: these produced 563 +/- 120 fledged chicks. The largest two colonies held 700 (59%) and 269 (23%) prs of common tern and produced 500 +/- 100 (89%) and 40 +/- 20 (7%)fledged chicks. There was heavy predation by otter and mink at the first colony and by otter at the second, reducing fledging numbers respectively to about half and an eighth of what they might otherwise have been in a year when tern feeding conditions were good and unpredated colonies averaged over 1.0 fledged chicks/pr. The other nine colonies held 217 prs of common tern. 23 chicks fledged at four of these colonies. None fledged at five, mainly because of mink and otter predation. As in previous years, the overwhelming contribution of the few largest colonies is stressed, as are the severe

effects of mammalian predators in killing large numbers of chicks and eggs every year [JCAC]. The 700 pr colony is believed to be the largest colony of this species in the British Isles.

Argyll, particularly Islay, remains the stronghold for Scottish choughs and only one pr was found outside the Argyll recording area. Islay held 74 prs. Jura 3 prs. Colonsay 9 prs and Mull 1 pr. Additionally, 47 non-breeding birds were found on Islay and 8 on Colonsay, Comparative figures from previous censuses were 105 prs on Islay, Jura and Colonsay in 1986 and 76 prs for the three islands in 1982. 105-140 additional non-breeding birds were found in 1986. Full details will be published elsewhere but preliminary details indicate that much of the recent decline on Islay appears to have taken place on The Oa. Of 54 potential nest sites monitored as part of a long term programme: 10 were unoccupied, birds at 10 sites failed to lay eggs and at 34 sites (63%) eggs were produced. From these 34 sites, 22 nests (65%) reared young to fledging and produced a maximum of 64 young. The overall productivity of 1.99 young/nest site where eggs were laid is a little below the long term average for Islav birds [Scottish Chough Study Group, JNCC]. On Colonsay, 9 breeding attempts produced 22 young [JC] and one pr on Mull bred unsuccessfully for the 4th successive vear.





Breeding recorded in 36% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90). Flocking in low-lying arable & coastal areas, Aug onwards. Some evidence to suggest emigration from Argyll in autumn, although there may also be an influx of wintering birds to some areas.


REDPOLL Carduelis flammea Ocarcan scilich 1663 LR B W P Localised distribution, mainly associated with birchwoods & young conifer plantations. Numbers fluctuate from year to year, but breeding population has probably increased as a consequence of coniferous afforestation. Breeding recorded in 41% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90). Flocking occurs in autumn-winter. 1992

COMMON CROSSBILL Loxia curvirostra Cam ghob 1666 CR B W Numbers & distribution vary depending on abundance of conifer cone crops. Highly irruptive species with large flocks sometimes moving to locate a new seed area, usually in summer. Breeding recorded in 16% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90). 1992

Kintyre: small influx mid-June. Colonsay: 2-3 on Jun 25 and in Oct. Mid-Argyll: 2 Glen Cruitten, Apr 19 and 3 Erines, May 16 were only spring records; then small parties of 2-6 birds in several localities Jul-Nov. Mull: 1M Toll Doire, Jun 25. N.Argyll: *ca* 6 L. Tulla, Oct 23.



BULLFINCH *Pyrrhula pyrrhula* Corcan-coite 1710 BF B W Locally common. Absent from Coll & Tiree and irregular on Gigha & Colonsay. Breeding recorded in 35% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90). 1992

YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella Budheag obeatadh 1857 Y B W Locally common in dry open ground, arable areas & moorland edges. Breeding recorded in 46% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90). Birds forage in cut hay & silage fields outwith breeding season. 1992

REED BUNTING *Emberiza schoeniclus* Ceatag tom 1877 RB B W Locally common in farmland, scrub & young conifer plantations. Breeding

recorded in 56% of 10km sq (BTO Atlas, 1988-90). Small flocks sometimes gather outwith the breeding season.
