Introduction

Welcome to the 2020 (32nd) Argyll Bird Report and a big thank you to everyone who has kindly provided a total of 40,000+ records over the year to make this report possible. Feedback on this PDF format had been very positive and one of the several benefits enables a production almost a year earlier than for previous 'hard' copies. Also, by concentrating solely on the systematic list of species, papers, articles and ringing report summaries can now appear in the quarterly bird club 'Eider' magazine.

Birdwatching and bird recording in 2020 was challenging for everyone due to COVID-19 travel restrictions, particularly in early spring, just as summer migrants were arriving and the breeding season was getting underway. Visits to monitor seabirds on the Sanda and the Treshnish Isles perhaps felt the main impact as did the cancellation of other survey work and the early Breeding Bird Surveys (BBS) however the later visits thankfully were allowed. On a more positive note, there were numerous examples and anecdotal reports of more people enjoying bird song and engaging with birds and nature and often experiencing a deeper appreciation of locations closer to home.

During the summer, bird club volunteers carried out a useful survey of the Common Swift which are just hanging on as a breeding species in Argyll. This has highlighted the need for more nest box provision, which the bird club has agreed to help provide if requested by members. It appears that some owl and raptor species had a good productive breeding season due to plentiful food availability in summer. Nuthatches continue to extend their range and a survey is being undertaken during March to June 2021. A national survey of the Honey-buzzard had been planned for summer 2020 but was partially curtailed, again due to travel restrictions, and is now extended to summer 2021. Despite several visits to a few suitable areas none were found in 2020 but this secretive raptor could well occur in some Argyll forests and volunteers are encouraged to get in touch regarding survey areas in 2021.

Rare bird highlights of the year exceeded all expectations for one dedicated and skilful observer on Tiree, who not only added four potential new species to the Argyll list in as many weeks, but found a real gem, which was not only new for Britain but also the Western Palearctic!

On the flip side some expected species failed to appear such as Red-necked Grebe, Green Woodpecker, Hobby, Golden Oriole and Reed Warbler while others such as Common Pochard, Quail, Little Stint and Waxwing just scraped in an appearance. North American waders were in short supply and numbers of wintering duck species such as Scaup and Goldeneye continue to decline in some places. Yellow-browed Warblers put in a record appearance and there were much higher than average numbers of Green Sandpiper, Bonaparte's Gull, Pied Flycatcher, Hawfinch and Rosy Starling. Hopefully, these accounts and excellent photographs in this report, will inspire you to record and submit your sightings this year.

Submitting your bird records

The Argyll bird recorders maintain the Argyll bird database on behalf of the Scottish Ornithologists' Club and the Argyll Bird Club and in recent years have been receiving more than 40,000 records per year. We welcome all bird records however please look at the guidance sheet on the Argyll Bird Club website under Bird Recording which gives threshold guidelines on what to report. The recorders are happy to input casual reports, however when larger volumes of records are submitted, we recommend that these are sent in *Excel* spread sheet format compatible with the Argyll bird database. We can send you a template or for regular record providers we can send an automated input form. Please email abcrecorder@outlook.com for more details. Records sent to the BTO's BirdTrack and WeBS can be accessed by the recorders as well as records sent to Birdguides.

Rare birds

Details and photographs of all rare bird sightings should be sent in (preferably emailed) as soon as possible after the sighting to **Jim Dickson**, 11 Pipers Road, Cairnbaan, Lochgilphead, Argyll PA31 8UF. Tel: 01546 603967 E-mail: Argyllbirder@outlook.com Please use the standard form (available from Jim). These will be judged locally by the Argyll Bird Records Committee (ABRC) whose members are listed on p. 3, sent on to the *Scottish Birds* Records Committee (SBRC), or passed to the *British Birds* Rarities Committee (BBRC), depending on the species/level of rarity.

The list below is made up of the ABRC list of Argyll rarities and the SBRC list of Scottish rarities (those marked #) details rare species whose occurrence in Argyll needs to be fully documented i.e. details of the circumstances surrounding the sighting and a detailed description of the bird and if possible, photographs and field notes.

Records of rarities in the systematic list are accompanied by the names of the observers, starting with the finder(s)/identifier(s), (or, in the absence of this information, the person who first reported the bird to the recorder), followed by the observer(s) who submitted details of the record, if different.

<u>Birds of Conservation Concern.</u> (BoCC 4) was published in British Birds (December 2015 Vol.108) and the updated species status has been applied to this report.

RED **L**IST is the highest conservation priority with species needing urgent action.

AMBER LIST is the next most critical group followed by Green (not given here) species that don't fall into the Red or Amber category.

Systematic List for 2020

The following systematic list includes entries for 236 Category A and C species recorded in Argyll during 2020 (*cf.* average 222 species during the years 1993- 2018). This is the same total as last year (adjusted after removing Isabelline Wheatear which was later found 'not-proven' by the BBRC), but just short of the record 240 species in 2014. Four new species were added to the list in 2020 (Yellow-bellied Flycatcher, Dusky Warbler, Hume's Leaf Warbler and Pine Bunting) two of which are still subject to acceptance by the BBRC. If all are accepted that would take the Argyll list to 365 species.

All records are listed where 20 reports or fewer and marked with *. Observers names are given for description rarities accepted by rare bird committees.

BRENT GOOSE Branta bernicla

AMBER LIST A passage migrant, in varying numbers: few in winter. Most birds seen in Argyll are of the Pale-bellied race B. b. hrota. Birds of the Dark-bellied race B. b. bernicla have occurred, mainly on Islay and Tiree, with less than 20 records. There has been one record of the Black Brant B. b. nigricans on Islay in winter 1989/90.

'PALE-BELLIED' BRENT GOOSE (B. b. hrota)

Winter/spring Reports from only (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree). Max counts of 741 on Tiree on 15 Apr (555 at The Green, 170 at Vaul, 16 at Hynish) were unusually high nos of return passage birds. On Islay a max of 52 at Loch Indaal on 12 Jan. Elsewhere, 2 at were at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 5-9 Apr, and 1 >S there on 18 Apr, 1 at An Lodan, Loch Awe Mid-Argyll on 8-10 Mar and 2 at Easdale, Seil Mid-Argyll on 10 May. Last report was of 4 at Gott Bay Tiree on 20 May. Autumn/winter Reports from only (Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). First arrivals were 2 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 29 Aug, 9 at Balephetrish Bay Tiree on 4 Sep, 34 >S at Frenchman's Rocks Islay on 4 Sep and 19 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 4 Sep. Max counts of 121 (grounded in mist) at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 8 Sep, 100 at Gartmain Islay on 3 Oct and 35 >S at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 9 Sep. Reports of only 1-2 birds from sites Nov-Dec.

'DARK-BELLIED' BRENT GOOSE* (B. b. bernicla)

Winter/spring Four were at Gortain, Loch Indaal Islay on 8 Jan. One, with a 'Pale-bellied' bird, at Kilnaughton Bay, Port Ellen Islay on 23 Apr.

GREATER CANADA GOOSE Branta canadensis

The resident population on Colonsay was introduced in 1934. Regular breeding has taken place since 1992 in Mid-Argyll in increasing numbers, with increasingly frequent breeding attempts elsewhere. A transatlantic origin seems probable for at least some of the medium-sized and small individuals seen in winter goose flocks on Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 410 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan, 174 at Loch Craignish *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Mar, 124 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Mar, 120 at Kilmore *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Jan, 103 on *Colonsay* on 9 Jan, 98 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 12 Jan and 82 at Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 1 Feb. Generally, counts of only 1-50 elsewhere but included 15 on *Coll* on 17 Mar. Max of 8 appeared on *Tiree* on 14 Apr.

Breeding/summer Most reports from mainland Argyll. Most breeding reports from *Mid-Argyll* where first occupied nest noted on 14 Apr, 10 prs at the Add Estuary and first broods seen on 2 May. A pr with a b/3 at Loch Cliad *Coll* on 11 Jun.

Autumn/winter Most reports from (Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll). Max counts of 390 at Barsloisnoch Mid-Argyll on 27 Nov, 300 at The Laggan Kintyre on 5 Nov, 241 at Ulva Lagoon Mid-Argyll on 11 Oct, 182 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 13 Dec, 170 at Loch Laich, Appin North Argyll on 13 Dec, 150 at Loch Craignish Mid-Argyll on 14 Nov and 132 at Gorsten Mull on 14 Dec.

LESSER CANADA and TODD'S CANADA GOOSE* Branta c. parvipes/interior

Lesser Canada B. c. parvipes and Todd's Canada B. c. interior are races considered by the BBRC. The race parvipes breeds W Alaska, E to Yukon Territory and most winter Washington and Oregon. The race interior breeds NE Canada from Hudson Bay to Baffin Island and NW Greenland wintering in SE USA. There is however some ovelap in breeding ranges and variability in size and plumage of races, therefore separation is not always possible.

Winter/spring One Todd's type was reported from several sites on *Islay* 17 Jan-20 Mar. One (from 2019) remained on *Tiree* until 19 Mar.

Autumn/winter Up to 3 Todd's type birds on Islay on 18 Oct-19 Nov. One at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 18 Oct showed a black throat stripe similar to a Taverner's type, but is included here as Todd's due to size and was reported again at Bridgend on 23 Oct and possibly same at The Oa in Nov. Two together at Bridgend on 24 Oct, otherwise all reports across several locations were of singles. One, presumed returning, Todd's type was at Balephetrish Tiree on 5 Nov then seen at various sites across NW Tiree until the year end with a second almost identical bird at sites in East Tiree from 9 Nov until the year end. All reports subject to acceptance by the BBRC.

BARNACLE GOOSE Branta leucopsis

AMBER LIST Approximately two thirds of the Greenland population winter in Argyll, mostly on Islay with smaller numbers elsewhere. Coll, Colonsay, Islay, and Tiree are sites of international importance for wintering birds of the Greenland population of this species. A few birds occasionally summer and a few introduced birds have bred on the Rinns of Islay.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura/North Argyll). Max Argyll total count (per NatureScot/ International goose counts) of 43,782 on 17-18 Mar. Max regional counts of 33,202 on Islay on 17-18 Mar and 5,656 on Tiree on 19-20 Mar. Elsewhere, 540 on Island of

Danna *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Jan, 490 nr Golf Cse *Colonsay* on 10 Jan and 340 on Isle of Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Feb. Most birds had departed by mid-Apr. Last report of 11 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 3 May.

Breeding/summer One (injured?) was at Vaul Tiree on 2 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). First arrival of 1 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 23 Sep then 189 there by 26 Sep, 1,075 by 2 Oct and first big arrivals of 9,320 by 6 Oct and 20,740 by 27 Oct. Elsewhere, max counts on *Tiree* of 5,557 on 14-15 Dec, 475 on Isle of Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Nov, 400 at Port na Luing *Coll* on 13 Oct and 300 at Island of Danna *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Nov.

CACKLING GOOSE* Branta hutchinsii/minima

This species group has recently been accepted by the BOURC as a split from other 'Lesser Canada Goose' types. A transatlantic origin seems probable for most of these hutchinsii birds being from the Canadian High Arctic. The first accepted Argyll record was in 1984 and many subsequent records are still under consideration by the BBRC.

Winter/spring Singles from 2019, with one in the Redhouses to Ballygrant area, then at Bridgend merse *Islay* from 1 Jan-17 Mar and one on Oronsay *Colonsay* from 1-12 Jan. Records subject to acceptance by the BBRC.

Autumn/winter Two were reported at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 3 Oct, then numerous reports of presumably the same 1-2 birds ranging from the Loch Gorm area across to Ballygrant, where last report was on 8 Dec. One was again on Oronsay *Colonsay* from 9 Dec. Records subject to acceptance by the BBRC.

SNOW GOOSE Anser caerulescens

The small introduced population on Coll breeds on a small off-shore island and is now very sedentary and decreasing. Stragglers among wintering goose flocks of other species are probably often genuine vagrants.

All year The resident flock on *Coll* continues to decrease with now only 8 noted on 11 Mar and 7 on 20 Oct. No reports of breeding.

GREYLAG GOOSE Anser anser

AMBER LIST A resident: with an increasing breeding population. Some may be native birds that have colonised from the Outer Hebrides, while birds of introduced origin breed in Mid-Argyll. Now that it is no longer possible to distinguish between them, WeBS refers to them as 'British/Irish' and identifies Tiree as a site of national importance. Migratory flocks are also reported from most areas.

Winter/spring Max Argyll total count (per NatureScot/ International goose counts) of 5,747 on 17-18 Mar. Higher regional counts of 2,879 on mainland Argyll on 5 Feb, 2,243 on *Tiree* on 22 Jan and 2,223 in *Kintyre* on 18 Mar.

Breeding/summer Breeding reports only from (*Islay/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*) however presumably present in all regions. First broods noted at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 2 May and on *Tiree* on 14 May. Higher WeBS counts on <u>Tiree</u> with many young noted of 435 on 8 Jun and 646 on 6 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Winter counts across Argyll incomplete or suspended. Max count of 2,704 on *Tiree* (all island) count on 14-15 Dec.

PINK-FOOTED GOOSE Anser brachyrhynchus

AMBER LIST There are variable numbers on passage, with occasional large flocks but relatively few overwinter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Small nos of 1-12 birds wintered in some areas and a max of 30 at Drumlemble *Kintyre* in Jan. Return passage flocks noted heading NW from 27 Mar, with 60 over Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* and a max over there of 150 on 3 May. Elsewhere, higher counts of 60 >N at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 3 Apr, 58 at Treshnish Farm *Mull* on 13 Apr, 55 >N at *Tiree* on 13 Apr and 55 >N at Kilmory Bay, Knapdale *Mid-Argyll* on 3 May. **Summer** Single birds noted at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* (sick) on 14 Jun. at head of Loch Crean

Summer Single birds noted at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* (sick) on 14 Jun, at head of Loch Creran *North Argyll* on 9 Jul and at Loch Peallach *Mull* on 13 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Autumn arrivals from 10 Sep with 1 at Drumlemble *Kintyre*, 1 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 12 Sep and 4 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 16 Sep. Notable passage over Argyll with many flocks noted from (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll/Mull*) totalling 488 on 16 Sep. On *Tiree* an island count of 700 on 23 Sep (departed overnight) and 609 on 24 Sep in flocks of up to 288 >S. Elsewhere, highest counts of 150 >S over Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Sep and 130 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 25 Sep. Only small nos of 1-15 birds noted at sites until year end.

GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE Anser albifrons

RED LIST Both the nominate European and the Greenland races have occurred in Argyll. The Greenland race A. a. flavirostris winters in a small number of traditional haunts and is also a passage migrant. Argyll holds about 50% of the world population of this race in winter and all the locations where they occur regularly are sites of international importance in the UK.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura). Max Argyll total count (per NatureScot/ International goose counts) of 9,585 on 18-19 Mar. Max regional counts of 5,910 on Islay on 17 Mar, 3,234 on mainland Argyll on 9 Jan, 2,348 in Kintyre on 18 Mar, 1,011 on Coll & Tiree on 17-20 Mar, 116 nr Ulva Lagoon Mid-Argyll on 9 Feb and 28 at Loch Creran North Argyll on 20 Jan. Only 5 at the Moine Mhor area Mid-Argyll. Most departing passage from late Mar and most away by 10 Apr, with last report of 2 at Kenovay Tiree on 20 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura/Cowal). First arrivals noted were 19 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 6 Oct, 40 there on 8 Oct and 3 at Hynish Tiree on 9 Oct. Max counts of 6,350 on Islay on 15 Dec, 1,794 on mainland Argyll on 13 Dec, 1,050 at The Laggan Kintyre on 15 Nov, 886 on Tiree on 14-15 Dec, 256 on Coll on 14 Dec, 116 at Loch na Cille Mid-Argyll on 20 Dec and a total of 33 in North Argyll in Nov. On Mull 16 were at Craignure Golf Cse on 2 Nov and 5 at Loch Pottie on 6 Dec. At the Moine Mhor area Mid-Argyll only 4 (2 ads+2 juvs) there from 22 Nov.

MUTE SWAN Cygnus olor

AMBER LIST A widespread and fairly common breeding species on the mainland and Tiree: scarcer on the other large islands. Not recorded recently on Colonsay until 1999. Flocks gather at favoured localities throughout the year, especially during moult but in decreasing numbers in autumn and winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Jura*). Max counts of 37 on *Tiree* on 5 Feb, 12 at Ulva Lagoon *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Jan, 9 at Ardencaple Ho., Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jan and 7 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 Feb. Elsewhere, counts of up to 6 birds, with most counts of 1-2 birds.

Breeding/summer Breeding reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). On Tiree 10 prs at 7 sites and a max count of 35 birds on 6 Jul. First broods noted on Tiree on 27 May and an ad

with 6 cygnets at Tarbert *Kintyre* on 27 May. At least one brood of 8 and two of 7 noted, however most broods noted were 4-6 young.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Jura*). Max counts of 67 on *Tiree* on 26 Aug, 27 at Ulva Lagoon *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Oct, 19 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Nov, 18 at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 27 Oct and 16 at Loch Caithlim, Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Nov.

WHOOPER SWAN Cygnus cygnus

AMBER LIST A common passage migrant: smaller numbers wintering. Loch a' Phuill (Tiree) is a site of national importance for wintering birds. A few birds summer in most years and breeding has been recorded.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*). Max counts of 202 >N at the Sound of *Islay* on 20 Mar, 143 (inc 25 cygnets) on *Tiree* on 23 Jan, 52 over Carradale Bay *Kintyre* on 27 Mar, 50 at the Sound of *Mull* on 26 Mar and 50 over Tighnabruaich *Cowal* on 27 Mar. Most return passage noted between 22 Mar and 8 Apr with many flocks up to 40 birds.

Summer/breeding No reports of breeding. Summering birds included; 8 on *Tiree*, 1 at Crosshill Loch, Campbeltown *Kintyre* in May, 1 at Dervaig *Mull* in May-Jun, 1 at the Laggan *Kintyre* on 13 Aug and 1 at Loch Airigh Meall Bhreide, Arinagour *Coll* Jun-Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. First arrivals noted were 4 at Ulva Lagoon *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Sep, 7 at East Loch Fada *Colonsay* on 23 Sep and 8 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 29 Sep. Most arrivals were after 8 Oct. Max counts of 600+ over Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 2 Nov and probably the same birds counted with 573 over Loch Indaal *Islay* on 2 Nov, also 343 over *Tiree* on 22 Oct and a peak count of 186 at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 28 Oct. Elsewhere, many counts of up to 100 and most flocks flying over were of 20-50 birds.

COMMON SHELDUCK Tadorna tadorna

AMBER LIST A widespread, but not very numerous, breeding species around sandy coasts. The majority are absent from mid-Aug to late Oct when they migrate to moulting grounds.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 134 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 Feb, 53 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 8 Mar, 47 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 18 Mar, 39 at Loch Don *Mull* on 18 Feb and 27 at Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Apr.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports received from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). First ducklings at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 11 May. Prs widespread around *Tiree* in May. A fem with a creche of 28 young at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Jun.

Autumn/winter Most reports from (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll). Max counts of 18 at Gorsten Mull on 14 Dec, 13 at Ulva Lagoon Mid-Argyll on 6 Dec, 12 at Bridgend merse Islay on 27 Oct and 11 at Kennacraig, West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 30 Dec. Counts of up to 10 elsewhere.

MANDARIN DUCK Aix galericulata

An introduced species which has bred regularly, at Loch Eck (Cowal), in recent years. The present size of the Argyll population (whose origin is unknown) suggests that it may well now be self-sustaining.

Winter/spring Fewer reports than usual. A pr was at Braevallich, Loch Awe on 23 Jan and was the only report from *Mid-Argyll*. All other reports were from *Cowal* with 2 at Cambusdhu, N Loch Eck on 7 Feb and several reports around the Holy Loch to Little Eachaig River area in Mar-Apr, with max of 4 on 21 Mar.

Summer/breeding Nine (pr with 7 ducklings) were at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 27 May. Reported from Cambusdhu, N Loch Eck *Cowal* in Jun and 2 ff there with 2 ducklings on 1 Jul. **Autumn/winter** No reports received.

GARGANEY* Spatula querquedula

AMBER LIST A regular spring visitor to Islay and Tiree and has bred in Kintyre in 1994, on Islay in 1997, and on Coll in 2004.

Spring A pair was at Kilmoluaig *Tiree* on 5 May with the fem still there on 14 May. A male was at The Reef *Tiree* on 8 Jun.

NORTHERN SHOVELER Spatula clypeata

AMBER LIST A scarce and localised breeding species restricted to Islay and Tiree. It is more numerous as a passage migrant and winter visitor: also largely restricted to Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Coll/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). On *Islay* a max of 53 were at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 16 Feb. On *Tiree* max count of 20 during island WeBS counts on 5 Feb. A pr were at Strath Farm, The Laggan *Kintyre* on 7-8 Jan, a fem was at Loch a Keal *Mull* on 24 Jan and 1 was at Port na Luing *Coll* on 9 Mar.

Breeding Breeding reported at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* and on *Tiree* with 12 prs at 8 sites. **Autumn/winter** Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). Max counts of 35 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 31 Oct and 25 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 25 Nov. A fem was at the head of Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Nov-14 Dec.

GADWALL Mareca strepera

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular passage migrant and winter visitor with most recent records from: Islay, Kintyre, Mid-Argyll, and Tiree. Breeds sporadically on Islay and Tiree. Winter/spring Reports from only (Islay/Tiree). Only 1-2 birds seen at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay and at Loch a' Phuill Tiree in Jan-Mar.

Breeding Up to 4 prs on *Tiree* where a fem with a brood on 28 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay/Tiree*). A fem was on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 29 Sep, a male was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 30 Sep and 2 were at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 30 Sep-1 Nov and 3 there on 19-20 Nov.

EURASIAN WIGEON Mareca penelope

AMBER LIST A scarce and local breeding species: common passage migrant and winter visitor to all areas.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 375 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 6 Feb, 343 on *Tiree* WeBS counts on 12 Jan with a max site count of 230 at Loch a' Phuill on 5 Feb, 219 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan, 190 at Gartbreck, Loch Indaal *Islay* on 30 Jan, 78 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Feb and 72 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 8 Mar. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 50 birds.

Breeding A likely breeding pr was noted on each of *Islay* and *Tiree*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Single males, possibly from the summer, at Machrihanish Kintyre in Jul-Aug, at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 5 Aug and at Garmony Mull on 30 Jul. First returning birds with; 12 at Ardnave Loch Islay on 19 Aug and 6 at the Add Estuary Mid-Argyll on 25 Aug. Max counts of 470 at Loch Skerrols Islay on 28 Oct, 424 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 11 Nov, 286 on Tiree WeBS counts on 15 Dec and 199 at the Add Estuary Mid-Argyll on 16 Nov. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 80 birds.

AMERICAN WIGEON* Mareca americana

A rare visitor: 16 or more records.

Autumn/winter An adult male was at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 27 Oct-11 Nov [D Brown *et al*]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

MALLARD Anas platyrhynchos

A common breeding, passage and wintering species

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 189 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 10 Jan, 106 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 12 Jan, 84 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 12 Jan, 81 at Ardencaple Ho., Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jan and 70 at Ardlarach, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 31 Jan. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 60 birds.

Breeding/summer Reports from all areas. Ducklings noted in *Mid-Argyll* from mid-Apr and a max brood count of 15 noted. Max counts of 60 at Blackmill Bay, Luing, Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Jun and 60 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 147 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 14 Oct, 137 at the Holy Loch *Kintyre* on 20 Sep, 74 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 20 Nov, 73 on *Tiree* WeBS counts on 21 Sep and 63 at Port na Luing *Coll* on 20 Oct. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 60 birds.

NORTHERN PINTAIL Anas acuta

AMBER LIST A very scarce breeding species on Tiree and a scarce passage migrant and winter visitor: regular only on Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). Most reports from *Islay* and max counts of 80 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 Feb. On *Tiree* only 1 at Loch Bhasapol in Jan-Feb and 2 at Loch a' Phuill in Mar. A fem was at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 7-8 Jan and 2 mm & 1 f >N at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 12 May.

Breeding Up to 7 prs on Tiree.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). Max count of 97 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 31 Oct, and on *Tiree* a max count of 7 at An Fhaodhail on 17 Dec. In *Kintyre* 6 >S at Machrihanish SBO on 4 Oct and 1 >S on 26 Oct.

EURASIAN TEAL Anas crecca

AMBER LIST A widespread but uncommon breeding species: common passage migrant and winter visitor.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 870 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 10 Jan and 463 on *Tiree* across WeBS sites on 12 Jan, 86 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 9 Feb, 72 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan and 65 at Port na Luing *Coll* on 9 Mar. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 50 birds.

Breeding Breeding reports from all areas except (*Jura*). At least 21 prs across 8 sites on *Tiree* in Apr. Generally, low nos elsewhere.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 1,555 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 23 Oct, 370 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 2 Nov, 260 at An Fhaodhail *Tiree* on 26 Nov, 172 at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 28 Oct, 84 at Lochan na Nigheadaireachd, nr Laggan point *Islay* on 11 Sep and 82 at Ulva Lagoon *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Dec. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 80 birds.

GREEN-WINGED TEAL* Anas carolinensis

A rare visitor: Thirty or more records since 1980, mostly on Islay or Tiree: some records may well involve returning individuals.

Winter/spring A male remained at RSPB Loch Gruinart floods *Islay* from 2019 until 30 Mar and joined by a second male there on 24 Mar [J How *et al*].

Autumn/winter A male was at RSPB Loch Gruinart floods *Islay* on 25-26 Oct [D Brown *et al*]. A male was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 2 & 12 Nov [J Bowler]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON POCHARD* Aythya ferina

RED LIST An increasingly scarce winter visitor and passage migrant, in small numbers, particularly to: Tiree, Islay, and a few Mid-Argyll lochs. There has been no confirmed breeding in recent years.

Autumn/winter A male was at Loch Gorm *Islay* on 1 Oct then 2 males there on 20-29 Oct. These are the only reports and the downward trend of records for this species continues.

RING-NECKED DUCK* Aythya collaris

A very scarce North American visitor: 27 previous records.

Winter/spring A pair from 2019 remained at Loch Bhasapol & Loch a' Phuill Tiree until 15 Apr [J Bowler et al].

Autumn/winter A 1cy female was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 29 Sep-2 Oct [J Bowler, J Dickson]. A 1cy male was at Loch Bhasapol on 11-15 Oct [D Jardine, J Bowler]. An adult female, presumably a returning bird, was at Loch Bhasapol on 30 Oct and 4-25 Nov, then joined by an adult male, presumably a returning bird, from 19 Nov and a second female from 25 Nov, with all three remaining into 2021 [J Bowler]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

TUFTED DUCK Aythya fuligula

A widespread winter visitor: most numerous on Islay and Tiree. Breeds in small numbers on: Colonsay, Islay, Mull, and Tiree with scattered pairs found throughout mainland Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from (Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). Max counts on Tiree with 99 across island WeBS sites Jan-Mar and a peak site count of 70 at Loch a' Phuill on 19 Jan and 17 at Loch Finlaggan Islay on 12 Apr. On Coll 1 was at Ballyhaugh Loch on 10 Feb. In Cowal 2 at Lock Loskin, Dunoon on 23 Apr. In Mid-Argyll only 1-3 birds at 4 sites and a max count of 5 at Loch Ederline on 20 Apr. On Mull 2 at Loch Pottie on 5 Mar.

Breeding Breeding reported on *Tiree* with 10+ prs and a fem with b/4 at Loch an Eilein on 17 Jun, also present at RSPB Ardnave *Islay*. In *Mid-Argyll* a fem with a b/3 at Beinn Dearg on 7 Jul, and 2 were at Ellary, Loch Caolisport on 17 Aug. On *Colonsay* a male was at East Loch Fada on 13 Jun. A male was at Loch Leathan *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Jul & 22 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from (Coll/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). Max counts of 147 on Loch Gorm Islay on 1 Oct and 83 on Tiree across island WeBS sites on 16 Nov. On Mull max count of 9 at Loch Pottie on 15 Nov and in Mid-Argyll a max count of 4 at Ballachuan Loch, Seil on 3 Nov.

GREATER SCAUP* Aythya marila

RED LIST A winter visitor and passage migrant with most winter reports at Loch Indaal, Islay but scarce and irregular elsewhere. Small flocks of migrants are sometimes seen during autumn sea-watches.

Winter/spring Reports from only (Islay/Tiree). Max count of 12 at Loch Indaal Islay on 12 Jan. A 2cy fem was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree 1-12 Jan. Last reports were from Islay on 4 Mar

Summer One was at RSPB Loch Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 22 Jun and 4 >S at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on the unusual date of 28 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). In *Kintyre* 40 >S at Machrihanish SBO after a squall on 8 Oct. On *Mull* a fem was at Loch an Torr on 25-27 Aug and 1 was at Loch Don on 28 Sep. On *Islay*, first report of 12 at Loch Indaal on 23 Sep and a max count there of 14 on 2 Nov. A 1cy fem was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 10 Oct-28 Nov.

COMMON EIDER Somateria mollissima

AMBER LIST A resident breeding bird: common on all suitable coasts, especially on the Clyde. The Firth of Clyde is a site of national importance for Eiders. Large flocks of moulting drakes and first-year birds gather at some sites during Jun to Sep.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 250 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 5 Mar, 100 at Kilfinan *Cowal* on 8 Apr, 98 at Blairmore, Loch Long *Cowal* on 12 Feb, 70 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 18 Feb, 51 at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 18 Feb and 42 at Dunoon *Cowal* on 26 Apr. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll coasts of up to 40 birds.

Breeding Breeding reports from all coastal areas. First ducklings noted at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 20 May and Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 21 May. Many coastal areas with females and ducklings May-Jul. Max flock counts of 317 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 19 Aug, 268 eclipse males at Otter Ferry *Cowal* on 15 Jul and 217 at Blairmore, Loch Long *Cowal* on 8 Jun. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts of 320 off Inverneill, Loch Fyne *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Oct, 200 at Blairmore, Loch Long *Cowal* on 21 Nov, 170 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Dec and 190 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 15 Sep. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 120 birds.

SURF SCOTER* Melanitta perspicillata

A rare visitor: At least 19 previous records.

Autumn A 1cy was at Kiloran Bay *Colonsay* on 27-30 Sep [D & J Jardine, P Madden, E Mackay]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

VELVET SCOTER Melanitta fusca

RED LIST Scarce but regular in and around the Sound of Gigha, and in smaller numbers, at Loch Indaal, Islay. The wintering population in the Sound of Gigha is now much reduced from the population in the 1970s when over 50 were present.

Winter/spring One was at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 15 Jan.

Summer A male was at Easter Ellister *Islay* on 8 Jun and presumably the long stayer, of possibly captive origin.

Autumn/winter In *Kintyre* 1 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 26 Oct and a 1cy male was at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Nov.

COMMON SCOTER Melanitta nigra

AMBER LIST Present throughout the year at Loch Indaal, Islay and in the Sound of Gigha, Kintyre - a scarce winter visitor elsewhere and very rare breeding reports.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). Max counts of 224 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 5 Mar, 69 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 8 Mar, 14 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Mar and 10 at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 17 Mar.

Summer/breeding Max counts of only 36 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 21 Jul. Elsewhere, 4 were at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 27 May and 28 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 11 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from (Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). Max counts of 132 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 19 Aug and 70 at Loch Indaal Islay on 15 Oct. Elsewhere, 12 were at Carradale Bay Kintyre in Dec and 11 were off Dunoon Cowal late Nov to Dec.

LONG-TAILED DUCK Clangula hyemalis

RED LIST An uncommon winter visitor, most frequent in Sound of Gigha (Kintyre), Coll, Islay, and Tiree. Usually marine but occasionally seen on inland lochs. Occasional summer records.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). Most reports from *Islay*, *Kintyre* and *Tiree*. Max counts of 20 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 9 Jan, 11 at Hough Bay *Tiree* on 20 Mar and 6 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 15 Jan. Also 2 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan. Last report of 1 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 9 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree). First reports; 4 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 14 Oct, 1 at Loch Bhasapol Tiree on 15 Oct and 3 at The Oa Islay on 16 Oct. Max counts of 10 at Loch Indaal Islay on 2 Nov, 10 at Hough Bay Tiree on 22 Dec and 9 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 11 Dec. Elsewhere, 1-6 birds noted at sites. Only Mid-Argyll record was 1 at Ulva Lagoon on 29 Nov.

COMMON GOLDENEYE Bucephala clangula

AMBER LIST A common winter visitor: birds are regularly present in all areas from early Oct to late Apr with occasional summer records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Max counts of 101 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 6 Jan, 53 across island WeBS sites on Tiree on 12 Jan incuding 45 at Loch a' Phuill, 31 at Loch na Keal Mull in Jan-Feb, 21 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 12 Jan, 21 at Gartbreck, Loch Indaal Islay on 30 Jan and 14 at Loch Tulla North Argyll on 15 Mar. Elsewhere, counts of 1-13 at many sites. A 2cy male was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 8-9 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First of autumn was a 1cy at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* from 21 Sep and 8 there by 14 Oct. A 1cy was at Loch Loskin, Dunoon *Cowal* on 11 Oct. Max counts of 87 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Dec, 43 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 12 Dec, 10 at Loch Poit na h-I (Pottie) *Mull* on 6 Dec and 10 at West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre* on 30 Dec.

Elsewhere, widespread reports of 1-9 birds. Nos have been steadily declining in recent years at mainland sites.

GOOSANDER Mergus merganser

A scarce breeding species mainly in: Cowal, Mid-Argyll, Mull and N Argyll. The population is more widespread in winter but in small numbers.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree/North Argyll*). Only 1-6 birds reported mostly from *Mid-Argyll* and *Mull*. Max counts of 6 at Knock, Loch na Keal *Mull* in Mar and 5 at An Lodan, Loch Awe *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Mar. Some birds in prs from Feb.

Summer/breeding Most reports of prs from sites in (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Fems with ducklings noted at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* with a b/6 and at Auchalick Bay, Loch Fyne *Cowal* with a b/12. A post breeding moulting flock of 40 at Loch Riddon *Cowal* on 1 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree). Reports mostly of 1-6 birds at sites. Max counts of 10 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 20 Sep, 9 at Dervaig Mull on 15 Nov, 8 at the Add Estuary Mid-Argyll on 4 Sep, 8 at Loch Don Mull on 14 Sep and 8 at Scallastle Mull on 22 Oct. A fem was at Finlaggan Islay on 24 Oct and perhaps the same bird at Loch Gruinart on 28 Oct.

RED-BREASTED MERGANSER Mergus serrator

A common resident breeder: large moulting flocks gather, particularly in Loch Indaal, Islay and Sound of Gigha, Kintyre during late summer. The Sound of Gigha, Kintyre is a site of national importance for wintering birds. Small numbers are found on fresh water.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts of 48 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 5 Mar, 22 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Mar and 21 at Pennyghael *Mull* on 24 Jan. Elsewhere, counts up to 20 however most flocks were of 8 or less.

Breeding Limited breeding data other than 10 prs from 4 sites on *Tiree* and prs noted mainly from (*Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). First young reported at Otter House, Kilfinan *Cowal* where a fem with b/3 on 18 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 622 (post breeding flock) at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 2 Jul, falling to 356 on 21 Jul. Max counts elsewhere included; 57 at Loch Craignish Mid-Argyll on 12 Dec, 56 at Loch na Keal Mull on 7 Nov, 55 at Kintra, Laggan Bay Islay on 24 Aug and 42 at Gott Bay Tiree on 1 Dec.

BLACK GROUSE Tetrao tetrix

RED LIST A scarce, localised, resident breeder. Numbers still likely to be declining at a slower rate after a steep decline. Very thinly distributed in all mainland areas: with a few on Islay and Jura. All records required.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll*). In *Mid-Argyll* 4 mm were noted at the Moine Mhor NNR on 10 Jan & 14 May, 5 were at Feorlin, nr Minard on 13 Mar, 1-2 were at Ganavan, nr Oban late Mar-Apr, 1 was at Stroneskar, nr Ford on 10 Apr and 1 m was calling at Kilmartin between 4-15 May. In *Cowal* 3 mm were at An t-Suil, nr Stronfian between 5-15 May and 1 was at Balliemore, Loch Striven on 21 May.

Breeding No breeding data received.

Autumn/winter Two were N of Strachur *Cowal* on 4 Aug and up to 7 were at Feochag, S of Campbeltown *Kintyre* between 15 Sep- 6 Oct.

PTARMIGAN* Lagopus muta

A localised resident breeding bird: generally above 800m in north and east Argyll and on Mull. All records required.

Spring/summer Two were at Creach Bheinn *Mull* on 2 Jul and 2 were at Fraochaidh, Appin *North Argyll* on 14 Jul. An estimated population on *Mull* thought to be in the region of 25-50 birds (*per* Ewan Miles).

Autumn/winter Seven were at Beinn Narnain *Cowal* on 15 Oct, 1 was at Stob Coire Cragach *Cowal* on 18 Oct and 7 were at Ben Buie *Mull* on 6 Dec.

RED GROUSE Lagopus lagopus scotica

AMBER LIST A sparsely distributed, resident, breeding bird.

All year Reports from moorland areas on (*Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Few reports in total from across Argyll, generally of 1-5 birds, and a max of 8 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 16 Sep. Under reported and all future reports encouraged.

RED-LEGGED PARTRIDGE Alectoris rufa

Birds (some hybrids with Chukar A. chukar) have been introduced to several areas. Although this species is in Category C of the British list, populations in Argyll do not appear to be self-sustaining.

All year Reports from 18 sites in (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll*). Most reports of just 1-2 birds, however larger counts noted near release sites e.g. counts of 50+ at sites on Luing *Mid-Argyll* in Sep.

COMMON QUAIL* Coturnix coturnix

AMBER LIST A rare and irregular summer visitor: mainly to Kintyre and the islands.

Summer/breeding One report (location withheld) from north Mid-Argyll on 25 Jun. One was heard calling at Aros, The Laggan Kintyre on 15 Jul.

COMMON PHEASANT Phasianus colchicus

May be abundant, in those parts of Argyll, where birds are released for shooting. Reports from Jura and North Argyll are rare.

All year Reports from all areas except (*Coll/North Argyll*) however greatly under reported. Several counts of 25+ birds near release sites.

RED-THROATED DIVER Gavia stellata

A scarce widely distributed breeder (on moorland lochs), winter visitor, and passage migrant. Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts of 15 at outer Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 28 May. Only 5 at Loch Indaal Islay on 30 Mar. Some in breeding plumage from early Mar. Summer/breeding Reports from likely breeding areas in (Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll). Juvs noted in Mid-Argyll at hill lochans from early Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 41 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 17 Oct and 27 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 17 Oct. A total of 49 birds >S past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* in Oct with peak count there of 14 on 10 Oct.

BLACK-THROATED DIVER Gavia arctica

AMBER LIST A very scarce breeder in Mid and North Argyll: scarce in winter but more numerous on passage. Breeding has been confirmed at 13 sites between 1985-2017. The Sound of Gigha, Kintyre and Kilfinan Bay, Cowal are sites of national importance for wintering birds. Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Max counts of 12 at West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 28 Feb and 7 at the Sound of Islay Islay/Jura on 23 Feb. Elsewhere, counts of only 1-6 birds.

Breeding No breeding data received, although juvs noted at a few inland lochs.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll). Max count of only 4 at Carradale Bay Kintyre on 28 Dec. Numbers have been well down this year.

GREAT NORTHERN DIVER Gavia immer

AMBER LIST A numerous winter and passage visitor. Birds in breeding plumage are regularly recorded from Apr to mid-Jun. Pre-migratory gatherings occur off some coasts in late Apr and

early May and a few individuals summer. The Sound of Gigha and the seas around Tiree and Coll are sites of international importance for wintering birds and Loch na Keal on Mull, Loch Indaal on Islay, West Loch Tarbert in Kintyre and Lochs Beg & Scridain on Mull are sites of national importance.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Most significant counts from the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre*, the *Mull* sea lochs, Loch Indaal *Islay* and the *Tiree* coast. Max counts on *Mull* (of roosting flocks) with 123 at Loch na Keal on 21 Mar and 64 at Loch Scridain on 22 Mar. Also, 64 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 5 Mar and 55 off Baugh *Tiree* on 24 Apr. Only 36 were at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 30 Mar, also 28 at Kilmory Bay, Knapdale *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Apr.

Summer Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/North Argyll*). Reports of 1-13 birds from coastal sites. Last report was on 15 Jun off *Colonsay* then none until autumn.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas. First autumn birds were 3 at mouth of Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 15 Aug. Max counts of 88 at Loch na Keal Mull on 9 Nov, 76 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 17 Oct, 50 at Loch Indaal Islay on 23 Sep and 48 at Loch Scridain Mull on 6 Nov.

WHITE-BILLED DIVER* Gavia adamsii

A vagrant: Eleven records; all since 1986, most recently on Mull in 2009, off Tiree in Oct 2011 and off Machrihanish SBO, Kintyre in Mar 2013.

Autumn An adult flew SW past Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 29 Aug [J Sweeney]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

EUROPEAN STORM PETREL Hydrobates pelagicus

AMBER LIST A summer visitor. The main breeding colonies are on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles with a few pairs on Soa and Staffa. Breeding birds first come ashore in late May or Jun. Most sightings away from breeding colonies are during Jul-Sep, when non-breeders wander extensively. Breeding European Storm-petrel is a feature of Treshnish Isles SPA.

Spring/summer/autumn Reported between 12 Jun and 9 Sep (*Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). First report was 1 off NE *Colonsay* on 12 Jun. A few counts of 1-3 birds, mostly late Aug-early Sep, off *Tiree* and Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* and max counts of 6 off Hynish *Tiree* on 20 Aug and 5 off Frenchman's Rock's *Islay* 30 Aug.

Breeding No counts or data from the known breeding colonies on Sanda *Kintyre* or Treshnish Isles *Mull* as no visits due to Covid-19 restrictions.

LEACH'S STORM PETREL* Oceanodroma leucorhoa

AMBER LIST A scarce, but regular, autumn passage migrant off western headlands; particularly after strong westerlies. There are occasional reports in spring and summer.

Autumn Two >SW off Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 3 Sep and 1 off there on 4 Sep. On *Tiree* 19 >W off Aird on 5 Sep and 3 >W off Vaul on 5 Sep, 1 >W off Aird on 9 Sep and 1 >W off Vaul on 9 Sep. Two >SW off Caliach Point *Mull* on 9 Sep. One >S off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 28 Oct. One was off Carraig Fhada, Kilnaughton Bay *Islay* on 28 Oct.

FULMAR Fulmarus glacialis

AMBER LIST A common but localised breeding species in all areas apart from Cowal and North Argyll. Large numbers occur on passage off western headlands.

Winter Small nos ashore on calmer days from Jan-Mar from (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*) and a max count of 700+ at Ceann a' Mhara cliffs *Tiree* on 12 Jan.

Spring/breeding Only breeding reports received from (*Colonsay/Islay/Tiree*). Max Apparently Occupied Sites (AOS) of 844 at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 19 Jun (905 in Jun 2019) and 97 at RSPB Oa *Islay* in Jun.

Autumn/winter Only records were from (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts of 300 in 4 hrs past Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 4 Sep, 98 in 1 hr past Hynish *Tiree* on 10 Sep and 125 in 2 hrs past Aird *Tiree* on 5 Sep. Reports reduced from early to mid-Sep. Noted from *Tiree* in Nov-Dec including 800+ at Ceann a' Mhara cliffs on 12 and 30 Dec.

SOOTY SHEARWATER* Puffinus griseus

A passage migrant: almost exclusively recorded Jul-Oct. Sometimes seen in large numbers from western headlands, islands and on ferry crossings during Aug-Sep.

Autumn One was off NW *Mull* on 8 Aug, 2 were off NE *Coll* on 15 Aug, 1 was off Iona *Mull* on 18 Aug, 1 >S off Inverneill L Fyne *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Aug, 3 >SW off Hynish *Tiree* on 20 Aug, 4 were between *Coll* and *Tiree* on 20 Aug, 1 >SW off Hynish *Tiree* on 1 Sep and 2 >SW there on 2 Sep, 1 >W off Aird *Tiree* on 5 Sep and 2 >W there on 9 Sep, 5 >SW off Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 3 Sep and 2 >SW there on 9 Sep, 2 were off Caliach Point *Mull* on 9 Sep, 1 >W off Aird *Tiree* on 9 Oct and 2 >W off there on 26 Oct.

MANX SHEARWATER Puffinus puffinus

AMBER LIST Breeding colonies have been confirmed only on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles. Large numbers are seen on passage, especially during Aug-Sep.

Spring/summer Reports from only (*Colonsay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). First reports; 39 in 1 hr off Hyinsh *Tiree* on 24 Mar and 1 off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 5 Apr. Higher counts all from *Tiree* with 300 on 19 Apr, 1,200 on 24 Apr and 3,000 on 8 Jun.

Breeding No population estimate this year from Lunga, Treshnish Isles *Mull* (est. 1,992 prs based upon AOSs in 2018 per TIARG). No counts from Sanda Is. *Kintyre* where the previous est. population thought to be around 300 prs.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Higher counts all *Tiree* with max of 6,500 in 2 hrs off Aird on 5 Sep. Also, max counts from *Islay* with 705 in 1 hr off Frenchman's Rocks on 5 Sep and 500 in 2 hrs off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 5 Sep. Last report was 2 off Aird *Tiree* on 9 Oct.

BALEARIC SHEARWATER* Puffinus mauretanicus

RED LIST A scarce passage migrant (Aug-Dec) since 1992 but in very small numbers: usually seen with Manx Shearwaters.

Autumn Only one report. A single passed Hynish Tiree on 20 Aug.

LITTLE GREBE Tachybaptus ruficollis

A local breeder in small numbers: widespread in sheltered coastal waters in winter with concentrations at Loch Etive, North Argyll and at Loch Sween, Mid-Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Most reports from Cowal, Mid-Argyll and Mull and max counts of 15 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 12 Jan and 11 at Dervaig Mull on 19 Feb. No reports of the usual high nos from Loch Etive North Argyll. Many coastal sites had 1-5 birds.

Breeding Limited breeding data. Birds noted on nests from 4 May. Max count of 5 at Loch Loskin, Dunoon *Cowal* on 24 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 14 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 30 Nov, 9 at Loch na Cuilce, Dervaig *Mull* on 21 Sep and 7 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Sep. Elsewhere, counts of 1-6 at coastal sites.

PIED-BILLED GREBE* Podilymbus podiceps

A vagrant: Three records; one at Loch Peallach, Mull in Jun 1998, one at Salen Bay, Mull on 22 Mar to 6 Apr 2011 and a long stayer/returning male at Loch Feorlin, Mid-Argyll from at least 2014 until 2019 and paired with a Little Grebe producing one young in 2017.

All year The long staying adult male at Loch Feorlin *Mid-Argyll* was there again from at least 7 Feb until at least 6 Nov. Paired again with a Little Grebe but was unsuccessful. [D Jardine *et al*]. Record was accepted by the BBRC as a returning bird.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE* Podiceps cristatus

An uncommon winter and passage visitor: with 1-8 records annually since 1984 and recorded in all months except Jun.

Winter/spring Regular reports from Loch Long *Cowal* (mainly off Blairmore) with 1 on 9 Jan rising to 8 on 23 Jan, then 5 on 4 Feb, 6 on 27 Feb and last report of 1 on 10 Mar. One at Balephetrish Bay *Tiree* on 1-28 Apr was only the third for *Tiree* in 20 years.

Autumn/winter One was at Garmony *Mull* on 8 Sep, 1 at Loch Feochan *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Sep, 2 at Loch Long *Cowal* on 21 Nov and a peak of 3 there from 27 Nov and through Dec.

SLAVONIAN GREBE *Podiceps auritus*

RED LIST A regular winter and passage visitor to sea lochs and sounds: occasionally on inland waters. The Sound of Gigha, Loch na Keal, Mull and Loch Indaal, Islay are sites of national importance for wintering birds.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll)*. Max counts in each region were; 1 at Loch Long *Cowal* on 6 Jan- 3 Mar, 9 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 5 Feb, 35 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 5 Mar and 36 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 19 Mar. Last report was 1 at Salen Bay *Mull* on 4 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports only from (Coll/Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). First arrivals were 13 together at Loch Indaal Islay on 30 Aug and was also a max count there, equalled on 2 Nov. Max area counts elsewhere; on Colonsay 1 at Feall Bay on 18 Sep, Cowal 1 at Kilfinan on 21 Sep and 1 at Sandbank on 15 Oct, in Kintyre 19 at Sound of Gigha on 11 Dec, in Mid-Argyll 2 at Loch Gilp on 24 Dec, on Mull 26 at Loch na Keal on 7 Nov and on Tiree 1 at Balephetrish Bay on 6 Sep, 1 at Vaul Bay on 11 Sep and 1 at Loch Bhasapol on 19 Nov.

GLOSSY IBIS* Plegadis falcinellus

A vagrant: Thirteen records of up to 20 birds since 1901; the most recent being; one at Loch Sween, Mid-Argyll on 25 to 26 Sep 2009, Colonsay from 27 Dec 2013 to 5 Feb 2014, Tiree on 13 Jan 2014, and a remarkable influx of up to 8 birds from 21 Dec 2017, with birds reported from Islay (1), Mull (6) and Tiree (1) into 2018 with last report from Tiree on 19 Apr 2018. Autumn A 1cy was at Craigens Islay on 11-15 Sep [A & N Radcliffe et al]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

GREY HERON Ardea cinerea

A widespread resident: breeding in all areas except Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Jura) and most reports from sites in; Mid-Argyll (32), Mull (24) and Cowal (23). Max count of 9 at Ballachuan Loch, Seil Mid-Argyll on 9 Mar. Breeding Limited breeding received from only (Colonsay/Islay/Mid-Argyll) where up to 8 AONs at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay and up to 3 AONs elsewhere. No data from the usual larger colonies in North Argyll.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 23 at Gorsten *Mull* on 14 Dec, 22 at Duine, Loch Craignish *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Sep and 16 at Appin *North Argyll* on 15 Nov. Counts at many other mainly coastal sites of 1-15 birds.

GREAT WHITE EGRET* Ardea alba

A rare visitor: Fourteen records between 1986 and 2019. This species is increasing as a breeding species in the Netherlands and France, and also in England since 2012.

Autumn A non-br plumaged bird was at the head of Loch Fyne (opposite the Oyster Bar) *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Aug-8 Sep [A Hamilton, J Dickson *et al*]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

LITTLE EGRET Egretta garzet

A scarce visitor: No records prior to 1958 but several since, mostly in spring and autumn. It has been seen more frequently in Argyll since breeding colonies have become established in England and Ireland.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Mull/Tiree). Total numbers uncertain as birds frequently move around the region, however a min of 9 and a max of 12 birds probably involved. Reports of 1-3 birds from 'sites in'; Cowal (4), Islay (3), Kintyre (5), Mid-Argyll (9) and North Argyll (3). Most sites only recorded singles and max count of 3 birds at the Holy Loch Cowal on 9-25 Apr and 3 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 29 May. Two together were recorded at five sites across Argyll. Most sightings were in Jan to Mar reducing in Apr and only one report in May, none in Jun and one report in Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Mull). Again, total numbers uncertain, however a min of 14 and a max of 18 birds probably involved. Reported from 'sites', with 1-8 birds in; Cowal (5), Islay (2), Kintyre (6), Mid-Argyll (7), North Argyll (3) and Tiree (1). Many sites had 1-2 birds present and an Argyll record count of 8 was at the Holy Loch Cowal on 15-19 Oct after a steady increase from 4 there in late Aug. There were 4 at Kennacraig, West Loch Tarbert Kintyre in late Aug to early Sep, a max of 3 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll in Oct-Dec and a max of 3 at Carnain, Loch Indaal Islay on 10 Nov. As elsewhere in the UK this species continues to increase in Argyll, particularly in the autumn and winter months and we can speculate that they may perhaps breed here within the next few years.

NORTHERN GANNET Morus bassanus

AMBER LIST Most Gannets in Argyll waters probably come from Ailsa Craig (30 km east of Mull of Kintyre) and St Kilda (190 km northwest of Tiree). Gannets are common inshore in Argyll waters from Apr to Oct, often seen high up sea lochs and some birds travel inland to cross between Campbeltown Loch and Machrihanish. They are also reported in small numbers Nov to Mar.

Winter/spring Generally small numbers noted Jan-Mar, however higher counts of 44 in 1 hr past Hynish *Tiree* on 13 Jan and 124 >SW in 1 hr off Aird *Tiree* on 4 Feb. Overland flights from

Campbeltown to Machrihanish (crossing the Laggan) *Kintyre* with peak totals of 122 birds in Apr and 1,045 in May.

Summer/breeding No breeding records. Max counts of 400 feeding in the Lynn of Lorne *North Argyll* on 28 Jul and 390 at Gunna Sound *Coll* on 24 Aug. Overland birds crossing the Laggan *Kintyre* peaked at 622 in total during Aug.

Autumn/winter Max counts of 568 > W in 1 hr at Aird Tiree on 9 Oct, 510 off Caliach Point Mull on 9 Sep and 250 > W in 1 hr off Frenchman's Rocks Islay on 5 Sep. Overland birds crossing the Laggan Kintyre peaked at 524 in total during Sep. Reports decreased after Oct, although included 208 > SW in 1 hr off Hynish Tiree on 11 Nov, and only four reports of 1-2 birds during Dec, all from Tiree.

EUROPEAN SHAG Phalacrocorax aristotelis

RED LIST A common resident, breeding on the mainland coast, outer isles and on islands in sea lochs. Widespread in winter and spring but very rare inland.

Winter/spring Records from all coastal areas. Max counts of 212 passing in 1 hr off Hynish *Tiree* on 13 Jan, 69 at Loch Don *Mull* on 24 Mar, 51 at Bunnahabhain *Islay* on 9 Jan and 49 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 5 Mar.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. 15 AONs on Oronsay *Colonsay*, 22 AONs at RSPB Oa *Islay* in Jun and 83 AONs at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 19 Jun. A feeding group of 50+ mostly juvs at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* in Aug is suggestive of good local breeding success.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 400 at Gunna Sound *Tiree* on 24 Aug, 250 at Arinagour *Coll* on 3 Oct, 126 >S at Port Mor *Colonsay* in 90 mins on 5 Sep and 84 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* in 90 mins on 4 Sep. Elsewhere, counts of 1-80 birds.

GREAT CORMORANT Phalacrocorax carbo

Breeds in: Colonsay, Cowal, Jura, Kintyre (including Gigha), Mid-Argyll, Mull, and North Argyll, with around 230 pairs in recent years. Less numerous than Shag, but numbers have increased recently. Small numbers occur on some inland waters.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Jura). Max counts of 16 at Aros Mull on 12 Jan, 12 at Braevallich, Loch Awe Mid-Argyll on 23 Jan, 11 at Bunnahabhain Islay on 9 Jan, 10 at West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 1 Feb and 10 at Loch na Keal Mull on 12 Feb. Reports of 1-9 birds at other sites, however most reports were of just 1-2 birds.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts included an unusually high count of 120 (confirmed and seen with Shags) at Arinagour *Coll* on 8 Oct. Also 34 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 7 Nov, 25 at Scallastle Bay *Mull* on 19 Nov and 21 at Cretshengan Bay, nr Kilberry *Kintyre* on 18 Aug. Reports of 1-20 birds at other sites.

GREAT (Continental) CORMORANT* Phalacrocorax carbo sinensis

A rare but increasingly frequent visitor to Scotland. Increasing as a breeder at inland sites in England where some hybridisation occurs with nominate Atlantic Great Cormorant. One record, at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 13 Oct 2014.

Autumn An imm (2cy) was seen and photographed at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Nov [J Dickson]. Record was accepted by the ABRC. In addition, a photograph of a bird came to light on facebook of a 1cy at Kilmartin Burn, Poltalloch *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Nov and judged by the ABRC to be most probably this sub-species.

OSPREY Pandion haliaetus

AMBER LIST A summer migrant, breeding in small but increasing numbers. Occurs more widely on passage.

Spring/summer Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). First arrivals of singles at Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Mar and at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 31 Mar. Most arrivals were during first two weeks of Apr.

Breeding Of the 23 sites checked, 17 sites were occupied by prs, 15 prs laid eggs and 15 prs hatched eggs of which 13 pairs went on to have 23 large young (average = 1.77 young/successful nest cf 1.70 in 2019) (ARSG). On *Islay* 1-2 birds noted 30 Apr to 12 Sep but no evidence of breeding.

Autumn After mid-Sep, only one report of a single, fishing at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 12 Oct.

GOLDEN EAGLE Aquila chrysaetos

A scarce, but widespread, resident breeding species. Immatures tend to wander and may be recorded in areas where breeding does not occur.

All year Reports from all areas except (*Tiree*). Most reports of 1-2 birds however up to 4 birds together reported from (*Islay/Jura/Mull*) in Jan-Feb and Nov.

Breeding Of the 56 sites checked 52 sites were occupied. A total of 17-18 fledged young (ARSG).

EURASIAN SPARROWHAWK Accipiter nisus

A widespread, resident, breeding species.

All year Reports from all areas. Fewer sightings noted during May and Jun. Sightings of 1-2 birds, however 4 together at Kilchiaran *Islay* on 9 Jan. Prey items noted included Rock Dove, Chaffinch and Redwing.

Breeding Of the 4 sites checked, 2 nests had young from which 8 young fledged (av no of young per nest = 4.00) (ARSG).

NORTHERN GOSHAWK* Accipiter gentillis

A sporadic visitor of uncertain status.

Autumn One, presumed juv female, was at Dereach (NE Loch Scridain) *Mull* on 29 Sep [D & J Dimmock]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

The true status of this species in Argyll is made difficult due to the secretive nature of the species coupled with under reporting and in some cases misidentification and inadequately documented records. Satellite-tagged birds in central Scotland are now being tracked into Argyll.

WESTERN MARSH HARRIER* Circus aeruginosus

AMBER LIST A scarce, but recently more or less annual, passage migrant: records in every year but one since 1986. Most records Apr-Jun.

Spring/summer A sub-adult male was at Ardmaddy Bay and occasionally Seil Is. *Mid-Argyll* on 3-22 Mar. A male was at Bleachfield *Kintyre* on 11-13 Mar. A male was at Sunderland Farm *Islay* on 29 Mar. A fem was near Heylipol Church *Tiree* on 21 Apr. A fem was at Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 21 & 28 May.

Autumn A fem was at Dervaig *Mull* on 2 Jul. A fem was at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Aug and also nearby at Drimvore *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Aug.

HEN HARRIER Circus cyaneus

RED LIST A sparse but widespread breeding species: Argyll holds around one quarter of the Scottish breeding population. Seen regularly: away from breeding areas, on migration, and in winter with reports from all recording areas.

All year Reports from all areas. Fewer reports during Jun and Jul. Most reports from Islay then Mull of 1-4 birds at sites. Max count was of 5 using a roost nr The Laggan Kintyre in Nov.

Breeding For the 41 sites checked 39 were occupied, 29 prs laid eggs and 60 young fledged (cf 19+ in 2019) (ARSG). A notably good breeding season presumably reflecting food supply.

RED KITE* Milvus milvus

A re-introduction programme in Scotland since 1996 has involved releases in Highland, central, and south west Scotland. Genuine vagrants have occurred in the past, but most recent Argyll records involve these re-introduced birds.

Spring Singles were at Dervaig *Mull* on 21 Mar, S of Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 21 Mar, Barcaldine *North Argyll* on 22 Mar and possibly same bird at Achnacreebeag, North Connel *North Argyll* on 12 Apr.

Autumn Singles were at Barsloisnoch, Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll* on 2 Oct, Benderloch *North Argyll* on 12 Oct and E of Dunstaffnage Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 9 Nov.

WHITE-TAILED EAGLE Haliaeetus albicilla

RED LIST A rare but increasing resident breeder in Argyll: wandering immatures (and sometimes adults) occur widely.

All year Reports from all areas and most reports from *Mull* and *Islay*. Fewer reports during Jun and Jul. Max counts of 6 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* in Nov-Dec, 5 at Loch na Keal *Mull* in Mar and Nov-Dec, and 5 imms nr Loch Avich *Mid-Argyll* on 31 Jul.

Breeding Of the 43 Ters checked, 35 prs laid eggs 29 prs fledged a min of 34 young (ARSG).

COMMON BUZZARD Buteo buteo

A resident breeding bird: common in all areas and the most abundant raptor in Argyll.

All year Reports from all areas. Max counts of 23 during *Tiree* goose survey on 22-23 Jan and 15 around Balvicar, Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Mar.

Breeding Reports from all areas. Of the 104 sites checked 44 sites were occupied and fledged a min of 63 young (cf 50 in 2019) (ARSG).

WATER RAIL Rallus aquaticus

AMBER LIST A secretive and under-recorded resident: occurs at low density on the mainland but in larger numbers on the outer islands. Immigration is thought to occur in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas and at 8 sites except (Cowal/Jura/North Argyll). Max counts (birds heard) with 8 at Loch na Cuilce, Dervaig Mull on 8 Apr, 3 at East Loch Fada Colonsay on 9 Jan and 3 at Balephuil Tiree during Mar.

Summer/breeding Breeding reported (*Islay/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). On *Islay* up to 6 calling at RSPB Loch Gruinart. On *Tiree* birds heard calling from 11 locations and chicks observed at Balephuil on 14 May. An adult with 3 small chicks was at the head of Loch Gilp, Corran area *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas at 20 sites except (Coll/Cowal/Jura/Mull/North Argyll). Max counts of 6 at the reedbed on Kerrera Mid-Argyll on 22 Dec and 1-3 birds elsewhere.

CORN CRAKE Crex crex

RED LIST A localised summer visitor, now breeding mainly on: Coll, Colonsay, Iona (Mull), Islay and Tiree. Following recent conservation activities, a long-term decline in numbers has being reversed, although numbers still fluctuate annually.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/Kintyre/North Argyll*). First arrivals were singles at Friesland *Coll* and at Loch Gorm area *Islay* both on 9 Apr. Next report was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 15 Apr and most arrivals were during last week of Apr.

Summer/breeding Calling male counts: Tiree (294), Coll (43), Iona (16), Colonsay/Oronsay (17), Islay (44), 'other' Argyll (2). A total of 416. Argyll total in 2019 was 439, in 2018 was 487 and an Argyll peak was 702 in 2014 (per RSPB). First (large) chick was noted at Balephuil Tiree on 19 Jun.

Autumn/winter Last bird noted was at Balephuil Tiree on 17 Sep.

COMMON MOORHEN Gallinula chloropus

A localised, sparsely distributed, resident breeding species: most numerous on Islay and in Mid-Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from 21 sites except (*Colonsay/Jura/Kintyre*). Max counts of 7 at Ganavan *Mid-Argyll* on 15 May and 4 at Port Charlotte pond *Islay* on 25 Feb. Elsewhere, 1-3 birds at sites and most from (*Coll/Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll*)

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Jura*). Reports from 12 sites in total. Most broods reported were of 4 young.

Autumn/winter Reports from 20 sites except (Colonsay/Jura/Mull). Max count of 4 at Kilmahumaig, Crinan Wood Mid-Argyll on 3 Aug.

COMMON COOT* Fulica atra

A former scarce and irregular breeder and an increasingly scarce to rare visitor.

Autumn/winter A 1cy was at Loch Bhasapol Tiree on 27 Oct-17 Nov. One was at Glenfeochan House, Balinoe Mid-Argyll on 4 Sep.

COMMON CRANE* Grus grus

AMBER LIST A rare visitor: twenty records; some records of up to three together between 1966-2019. Up to nine individuals were recorded in 2012.

Spring An adult was feeding in a short grass field just south of Stewarton (nr Campbeltown) *Kintyre* on 3 May [S MacKinnon]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

A very similar occurrence to a record in Kintyre on 6 May 2019.

STONE-CURLEW* Burhinus oedicnemus

RED LIST A vagrant: One at Loch Gruinart Flats, Islay on 23-24 May 1997.

Spring An adult (2cy+) was at Ardalanish Bay, Ross of Mull *Mull* on 19 Apr [Nigel Shannon]. Record was accepted by the SBRC.

EURASIAN OYSTERCATCHER Haematopus ostralegus

AMBER LIST A widespread and common breeding species: in all recording areas. Flocks congregate at favoured locations outside the breeding season and numbers often rise noticeably during spring and autumn passage.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 315 on *Tiree* on 6 Mar, 280 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 8 Mar, 273 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan and 232 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 12 Jan.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from all Argyll areas. On *Islay* 23 prs at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa. In *Mid-Argyll* birds on eggs from late Apr and large young noted by mid-Jun. First chicks noted on *Tiree* on 26 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Passage at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre with a total of 850 >S during Jul and a peak of 190 on 30 Jul. Max counts of 382 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 17 Oct, 315 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 13 Dec, 240 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 24 Aug and 37 at Loch Indaal Islay on 31 Jul.

NORTHERN LAPWING Vanellus vanellus

RED LIST A localised breeder and widespread wintering species: numbers highest on Tiree and Islay.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Highest nos on *Tiree* and *Islay*. Max counts of 2,600 on *Tiree* all island counts on 22-23 Jan, 675 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 10 Jan, 100 at Machrihanish airfield site *Kintyre* on 23 Jan, 76 at RSPB Totronald *Coll* on 14 Jan, 76 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 5 Feb, 35 at Kiloran Bay *Colonsay* on 9 Jan and 27 at Barsloisnoch *Mid*-*Argyll* on 1 Mar. Elsewhere, counts of up to 20 birds.

Summer/breeding At RSPB Oronsay *Colonsay* 72 prs. On *Tiree* 50 prs on partial (wetland compartment) survey at The Reef *Tiree*. At RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* (n/c) 196 prs in 2019. At Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* 5 prs laid but failed due to mowing and nearby 2+ prs at the Moine Mhor NNR to Drimvore raised young.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 3,065 on *Tiree* all island counts on 14-15 Dec, 560 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 31 Oct, 500 at Bleachfield *Kintyre* on 12 Dec, 147 at RSPB Totronald *Coll* on 14 Dec and 120 at Arinagour *Coll* on 8 Oct. Elsewhere, counts of up to 75 birds.

EUROPEAN GOLDEN PLOVER Pluvialis apricaria

AMBER LIST A moderate but probably decreasing number breed on moorland in several parts of Argyll. Large numbers are present at traditional sites by the coast in winter, also during spring and autumn passage, especially on Islay, Tiree, and Mull.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Cowal/Jura). Max counts of 5,500 at The Reef Tiree on 16 Apr, 3,000 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 2 Feb, 318 at The Laggan Kintyre on 29 Jan, 94 at Traigh nam Barc Colonsay on 9 Jan and 80 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa Islay on 16 Apr. Generally, only 1-3 birds reported away from (Islay/Kintyre/Tiree)

Summer/breeding Casual reports of breeding in upland areas, with 2 birds noted at Beinn Narnain *Cowal* on 31 May, 7 prs in *Mid-Argyll* and a flock of 25 nr Beinn Dearg on 8 Jul, 3 prs on *Mull* and chicks noted on 3 Jul and 2 prs in *North Argyll* and a flock of 11 on 10 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura*). Max counts of 2,950 on *Tiree* all island count on 16-17 Nov, 2,010 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 5 Nov, 750 at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 3 Oct and 135 at Traigh nam Barc *Colonsay* on 27 Oct.

AMERICAN GOLDEN PLOVER* Pluvialis dominica

A rare autumn visitor: 29 records; all 2001-2019 and mostly from Tiree.

Autumn An adult was at Sandaig and Greenhill *Tiree* on 21-22 Sep [J Bowler, R Jones, S Nichols, K Shaw] and a juv (1cy) was at Crossapol and Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 4-9 Nov [J Bowler]. Both records were accepted by the ABRC.

GREY PLOVER Pluvialis squatarola

AMBER LIST An uncommon passage migrant, recorded most frequently in Kintyre and on the islands: also, a winter visitor in small numbers, mostly on Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring On Islay a max count of 10 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 2 Feb. Only other reports were singles at Loch Don Mull on 17 Mar, at Miodar Tiree on 19 Mar, at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 16 Apr, at Gott Bay Tiree on 20 Apr and at Hough Bay Tiree on 12-14 May.

Autumn/winter First reports were on *Islay* of a juv at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 30 Aug, a juv at Bridgend Loch Indaal on 8 Sep and max counts of 9 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 30 Sep and 18 on 24 Oct. On *Coll* 3 were at Breachacha on 17 Sep. On *Colonsay* 4 were at Traigh nam Barc on 26 Sep. In *Mid-Argyll* 2 were at Ardpatrick, West Loch Tarbert on 20 Oct. On *Mull* 2 were at Loch

na Keal on 23 Sep with 1 until 12 Dec. On *Tiree* single juvs were at 8 sites from 26 Sep to 28 Nov with 4 at Gott Bay on 8 Oct and 4 at Clachan on 28 Nov.

COMMON RINGED PLOVER Charadrius hiaticula

RED LIST A widespread and fairly common breeding species: present throughout the year. Flocks congregate at favoured locations outside the breeding season and especially on passage. Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Winter max counts of 145 on Tiree on 4 Jan, 120 at Skipness Kintyre on 4 Jan, 81 at Traigh nam Barc Colonsay on 9 Jan, 70 at Loch Breachacha Coll on 25 Feb and 51 at Bridgend, Loch Indaal Islay on 3 Feb. Elsewhere, many counts of up to 35 birds. In May nos increased with passage through Argyll and max counts of 2,220 across Tiree on 11 May, 280 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 12 May, and 53 at Loch na Cille Mid-Argyll on 10 May. Last passage birds noted on Tiree on 12 Jun.

Breeding Limited data received. Prs noted in Apr, birds on eggs at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* and Benderloch *North Argyll* from early May and broods/chicks noted in *Tiree*, *Cowal* and *Kintyre* from 7 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas. Return passage increased from late Jul including 67 on *Tiree* on 31 Jul and 65 on Gigha *Kintyre* on 28 Jul. In Aug a total of 154 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* with a peak of 30 on 13 Aug and 110 were at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 22 Aug. Late autumn/winter max counts of 460 across *Tiree* on 30 Dec, 189 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 31 Oct, 118 at Traigh nam Barc *Colonsay* on 28 Sep, 109 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 11 Dec and 70 at Southend *Kintyre* on 5 Nov. Elsewhere, many counts of up to 60 birds.

EURASIAN DOTTEREL* Charadrius morinellus

RED LIST A scarce migrant: mostly seen in late Apr and May. There are occasional breeding records in North Argyll.

Spring After reports of at least 29 birds in 2019, only one report this year. A single was nr A' Chruach, Craigendive *Cowal* on 15 May.

WHIMBREL Numenius phaeopus

RED LIST A regular passage migrant: usually in small numbers and mainly on the islands. More frequent in spring (Apr-May) than in autumn (Jul-Oct) and is recorded regularly in summer but rarely in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Jura/North Argyll). Winter reports of singles at Salen Bay Mull on 9-12 Jan and the Holy Loch Cowal on 23 Feb. First migrants; 1 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 10 Apr, 1 at Loch na Cille Mid-Argyll on 10 Apr with 25 there on 17 Apr and 7 >S at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 16 Apr and 14 there on 18 Apr. Max counts of 45 on Tiree on 24 Apr, 22 at Loch Indaal Islay on 26 Apr and 20 at Portnahaven Islay on 21 Apr. Elsewhere, several counts of up to 20, however most reports were of 1-4 birds, and most passage between 16 Apr and 13 May. Most birds had moved through by late May however 3 were at Loch Indaal Islay on 9 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura/North Argyll). First return passage with 1 at Sandaig Tiree on 20 Jun, 3 at the Maze Tiree on 21 Jun and 1 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 29 Jun. Max counts of 17 at Loch Indaal Islay on 31 Jul and 14 at RSPB Ardnave Islay on 29 Jul. Elsewhere, only 1-3 birds at sites from 1 Aug-18 Oct. Winter reports of 1-2 at Loch Don & Java Point Mull on 14-25 Dec.

EURASIAN CURLEW Numenius arguata

RED LIST An increasingly rare breeding species in suitable habitat: more numerous on passage and in winter. All breeding records of this declining species are welcome.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 165 on *Tiree* (across two sites) on 20 Feb, 151 at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 11 Jan, 145 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 12 Jan, 124 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 9 Feb and 79 at Loch Don *Mull* on 18 Feb. Many other sites help up to 70 birds.

Summer/breeding Limited data. On *Islay* 14 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart and birds in suitable habitat on The Oa. In *Mid-Argyll* 2 prs noted in upland areas nr Musdale.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Return passage from late Jun. Max counts of 168 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 26 Sep, 161 on *Tiree* WeBS counts on 28 Nov, 127 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 24 Aug and 100 at Loch Don *Mull* on 17 Sep. Many other sites held up to 60 birds.

BAR-TAILED GODWIT Limosa lapponica

AMBER LIST A mainly autumn migrant and winter visitor: the largest numbers occurring on Islay. Birds are also regular on Tiree and at a few other island and mainland sites.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Max counts of 355 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 10 Jan, 80 at Ardnave Islay on 29 Jun, 54 on Tiree on 20 Feb, 18 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 12 Feb and 11 on Oronsay Colonsay on 18 Mar. In summer, 213 were at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 6 Jul and 21 were at Gott Bay Tiree on 8 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First returning birds from early Jul. A s/p male with 4 Black-tailed at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Jul was presumably an early returning bird. Most reports from (*Islay/Tiree*). Max counts of 257 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 24 Oct, 55 on *Tiree* on 22 Dec and 29 at Duart Bay *Mull* on 7 Sep.

BLACK-TAILED GODWIT Limosa limosa islandica

RED LIST A regular passage migrant, especially on Islay, Tiree and south Kintyre with occasional winter records. Most Argyll records have been presumed to relate to the Icelandic race L.l. islandica but at least one individual of the nominate race L.l. limosa has been identified (a bird leg flagged as a chick in The Netherlands and seen on Tiree in 2009).

Winter/spring/summer Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). First reports of 4 at Craignure Bay *Mull* on 21 Mar, 5 at Sandaig *Tiree* on 22 Mar and 1 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 25 Mar. Max count of 105 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 11 Apr and nos falling there in early May although still 4 on 28 Jun. In *Kintyre* 3 >S on 27 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). In Kintyre a total of 35 ads > S in Jul, with a peak of 19 on 30 Jul. In Mid-Argyll 4 ads were at Loch Gilp on 10 Jul. On

Mull 17 ads were at Bunessan on 23 Jul. On Tiree 35 ads in total on 31 Jul. First juvs were 2 at Balephuil Tiree on 21 Aug, a single at the Add Estuary Mid-Argyll on 25 Aug then 17 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 27 Aug with 35 on 31 Aug and a peak of 49 at Loch Indaal Islay on 3 Sep. On Tiree small numbers in late Aug and early Sep with a peak of 10 on 15 Sep. Reports decreased after mid-Sep, then only 1-4 birds noted (Islay/Tiree) until last on 4 Nov.

RUDDY TURNSTONE Arenaria interpres

AMBER LIST A common and widespread passage migrant and winter visitor: mainly from mid Jul to early Jun. Mid-summer records are not unusual.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all coastal areas. Most high counts from *Tiree* and a max count of 175 at Loch a' Phuill on 30 Jan. Elsewhere, higher counts included; 70 at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 23 Jan, 50 at Scallastle *Mull* on 13 Mar, 48 at Ardrishaig, Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Jan and 45 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 6 Feb. Most birds had departed by mid-May, however 1-6 birds from sites on *Mull* and *Tiree* until 22 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas. First arrivals back were 1 at Sandaig *Tiree* on 12 Jul, 2 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 15 Jul and 1 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 25 Jul. Max counts of 142 at Kirn, Dunoon *Cowal* on 17 Aug, a total of 71 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* in Sep with a peak of 20 there on 4 Sep, 70 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 12 Dec and 69 at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 31 Aug.

RED KNOT Calidris canutus

AMBER LIST An uncommon passage migrant: mostly in autumn, and mainly on Islay and south Kintyre. A few winter, mainly on Islay, and occasional birds occur in summer.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from only (Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). Max counts on Islay of 64 at Loch Indaal on 22 Mar and 50 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 6 Feb. In Mid-Argyll 1 was at Loch

Gilp on 12 Jan-13 Feb, 1 at Easdale, Seil on 6 May and 1 at Loch Crinan on 8 & 22 May. On *Mull* 3 were at Garmony on 3 Feb, and on *Tiree* 1 was at Gott Bay on 22 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from (Coll/Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree). First returning single ad was at Gott Bay Tiree on 13 Jul and 11 on 31 Jul. At Machrihanish SBO Kintyre a total of 46 >S in Aug with a peak of 20 on 21 Aug and a total of 117 >S in Sep with a peak of 54 on 3 Sep. On Islay a max count of 218 (mostly juvs) at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 28 Aug. On Tiree a max count of 31 juvs at Vaul Bay on 4 Sep. Elsewhere, 22 were at Ulva Lagoon Mid-Argyll on 1 Nov, 10 at Kennacraig, West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 28 Aug, 4 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 14 Aug and 3 on Iona Mull on 16 Aug. Singles were noted in Cowal in Aug and Nov. Only report in Dec was 1 at Gott Bay Tiree on 1 Dec.

RUFF Philomachus pugnax

RED LIST An uncommon passage migrant with most records in autumn.

Winter/spring Only report was a single at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 13 Apr.

Summer/breeding Up to 5 males and a female were at one site from 5 May until mid-Jun and up to 5 males were at another site from 20 May until 8 Jun. Breeding was thought to be unsuccessful. Autumn/winter Reports from only (Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree). On Tiree first juv was at Vaul on 21 Aug then 1-2 birds across island sites, and a max of 3 on 31 Aug, with last single on 30 Sep. On Islay 1 was at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 22 Aug, 2 at Bridgend merse, Loch Indaal on 3 Sep, 2 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 3 Oct and last single there on 6 Oct. In Kintyre singles were at Machrihanish SBO on 4 & 15 Sep and 2 at Strath pools, The Laggan on 6 Sep. In Mid-Argyll 1 was at Loch na Cille, Keills on 22 Aug, and on Mull singles were at Ardalanish on 17 Sep, at Calgary on 20 Sep and 5 at Fidden on 23 Sep.

CURLEW SANDPIPER* Calidris ferruginea

AMBER LIST A scarce but annual passage migrant: most records in autumn.

Autumn All reports were of juvs (1cy). One was at Bellochantuy *Kintyre* on 24-25 Aug. One was at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 24 Aug. On *Islay* 1 was at Loch Indaal on 28 Aug, 1 at RSPB Loch Gruinart

on 30 Aug, 2 there on 6 Sep with a peak of 7 on 9 Sep, also 1 there on 15-31 Oct, 2 on 18 Oct and last single there on 1 Nov. One was at Traigh nam Barc *Colonsay* on 31 Aug and 5 Sep.

SANDERLING Calidris alba

AMBER LIST A mainly passage migrant, most numerous in Islay, south Kintyre, and Tiree. Regular wintering is confined to Coll, Colonsay, Islay and Tiree. A few non-breeders occur on the islands in summer.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Largest nos were on *Tiree*, with higher nos Mar-May and max counts of 550 on 22 Apr. On *Islay* 153 were at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 7 Feb. On *Colonsay* 45 were at The Strand on 12 Jan. Peak passage at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* of 40 on 1 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*). Max counts of 438 on *Tiree* on 7 Aug. Passage at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* with total of 330 >S in Aug and a peak of 70+ on 24 Aug, and 340 >S total in Sep and peak of 70+ on 15 Sep. On *Islay* 220 were at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 22 Aug and on *Colonsay* 51 were at Traigh nam Barc on 3 Sep.

DUNLIN Calidris alpina

AMBER LIST A very localised breeding species mainly on Tiree. Numbers are highest on passage but large numbers winter on Islay and Tiree with smaller numbers elsewhere.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all coastal areas except (*Cowal/Jura*). Nos generally low Jan-Feb with increased nos during spring passage from late Apr and May. Max counts of 3,440 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 12 May, 2,130 on *Tiree* on 11 May, 130 at Calgary Bay *Mull* on 8 May, 128 at Loch na Cille *Mid-Argyll* on 10 May and 85 at Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 8 May.

Breeding On *Tiree* 43 prs on partial survey at The Reef (wetland compartment) and noted at five other island sites. Breeding prs at RSPB Ardnave and Loch Gruinart *Islay*. No breeding data from *Mid & North Argyll* or *Mull*. Fledged chicks noted on *Tiree* from 6 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas except (*Jura*). Return passage noted at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* with 10 >S on 24 Jul, 393 >S there in Jul with a peak of 90 on 30 Aug and 452 >S in Aug with a peak of 140 on 23 Aug. Max counts of 1,600 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 29 Aug and 215 on *Tiree* on 21 Aug. Elsewhere, away from *Islay* and *Tiree* counts of up to 60 birds. Generally, nos decreased during Sep however up to 850 birds remained at Loch Gruinart *Islay* in Dec and 164 on *Tiree* on 30 Dec.

PURPLE SANDPIPER Calidris maritima

AMBER LIST A widely, but sparsely, distributed winter migrant along rocky coasts from Sep to May.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll). Max counts of 40 at Balephetrish Bay Tiree on 9 Mar, 26 at Dunoon Cowal on 3 Apr, 21 at Croggan, Loch Spelve Mull on 26 Jan and 20 at Bruichladdich Pier Islay on 27 Feb. Also 11 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 12 Mar and smaller nos elsewhere. Last report was of 1 at Hough Bay Tiree on 18 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). Max count was 25 at Balephetrish Bay *Tiree* on 25 Nov & 14 Dec. At Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* a total of 53 >S during Oct and 9 there on 22 Dec, also 13 nr Craignish Point *Mid-Argyll* on 9 Nov and 7 at Arduaine Point, Loch Melfort *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Nov.

LITTLE STINT* Calidris minuta

A scarce but annual passage migrant: with the majority of records in autumn.

Autumn A juv (1cy) was at Salum Bay *Tiree* on 24 Aug. A juv (1cy) was at Loch na Cille, Danna Island causeway *Mid-Argyll* on 8-17 Sep – originally submitted as a Semipalmated Sandpiper but found not proven by the BBRC.

A very poor year.

EURASIAN WOODCOCK Scolopax rusticola

RED LIST A widespread, but probably under recorded breeder. Numbers are augmented in winter by immigrants from Scandinavia and other parts of Scotland. A small proportion of native birds leave for Ireland and possibly elsewhere.

Roding birds are under recorded and all records are welcome for this species, which is believed to have declined as a breeding species in Argyll (Bird Atlas 2007-11).

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally, 1-2 birds from across 22 Argyll sites and max counts of only 3 at Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* on 9 Jan and 3 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 24 Feb.

Summer/breeding Limited data. On *Colonsay* 4 'roding' birds at Colonsay House grounds on 14 Jun. Elsewhere, only singles birds noted from sites at Portfield *Mull* on 21 May and Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Jun. No reports during Jul, Aug or Sep.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Jura/Kintyre*). First report of 1 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 18 Oct. Generally, only 1-2 birds from across 14 Argyll sites and max counts of 4 at Milton to Ruaig *Tiree* on 10 Dec and 3 at Glen Aros *Mull* on 19 Nov.

JACK SNIPE Lymnocryptes minimus

A scarce autumn passage migrant and winter visitor, which is greatly under recorded: most records are from Islay, Mid-Argyll, and Tiree.

Winter/spring Singles from 'sites' in; Cowal (1), Mull (3) and Tiree (1) and a max of 2 birds at Caliach Point Mull on 19 Mar.

Autumn/winter First report was at Hynish *Tiree* on 10 Oct. On *Islay* several reports from RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* and a max of 7 on 6 Dec. Elsewhere, only 8 reports of singles from sites in *Kintyre* (1), *Mid-Argyll* (1), *Mull* (1), *Tiree* (4).

COMMON SNIPE Gallinago gallinago

AMBER LIST A widespread and locally common breeding species: particularly on the outer islands. Higher numbers occur on passage and as winter visitors: mainly on the islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 15 at Crossapol *Tiree* on 21 Jan and 9 at Caliach *Mull* on 19 Mar. Counts of only 1-5 birds elsewhere.

Summer/breeding Limited data but presumed widespread. On *Islay* at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa 13 Ters in Jun and on *Tiree* 148 Ters on partial survey at The Reef (wetland compartment) in Jun. **Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. All higher counts noted were from *Tiree*. Max counts of 43 at Balephuil on 28 Sep and 42 at Heylipol on 17 Nov. Elsewhere, reports of just 1-14 birds.

RED-NECKED PHALAROPE* Phalaropus lobatus

RED LIST A very rare breeding species and irregular passage migrant.

Breeding Birds were noted at confidential breeding sites between 20 May and 17 Jul. Up to 12 breeding males produced at least 11 broods.

GREY PHALAROPE* Phalaropus fulicarius

Irregular passage migrant particularly associated with autumn gales: rare in winter and spring. Autumn One flew SW off Caliach Point Mull on 9 Sep. One flew SW off Hynish Tiree on 11 Nov.

COMMON SANDPIPER Actitis hypoleucos

AMBER LIST A widespread and common breeding summer visitor and spring and autumn passage migrant in small numbers: occasional mid-winter records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Jura). First arrivals; 1 at Ford Mid-Argyll on 5 Apr, 1 at Loch Feochan Mid-Argyll on 5 Apr, 1 at Ardrishaig, Loch Fyne Mid-Argyll on 9 Apr and 2 at the Add Estuary Mid-Argyll on 9 Apr. Most arrivals noted in the period 13-25 Apr and max counts of 24 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa Islay on 28 Apr, 8 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 2 May and 6 at Ardachy, Loch Etive North Argyll on 24 Apr.

Summer/breeding Limited data. On *Islay* 21 prs were at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* in Jun. On *Tiree* 10 prs at 9 sites in Jun. Small chicks noted in *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Jun. Max count (inc juvs) of 13 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Jun.

Autumn/winter No reports from (*Jura*). A total of 194 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* in Jul with peak of 26 on 24 Jul and total of 96 >S there in Aug with peak of 20+ on 10 Aug. Also, 18 at Loch Feochan *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Jul, 10 at Tayinloan *Kintyre* on 2 Jul, and 10 at Blairmore *Cowal* on 4 Jul. Reports decreased during Aug and only one report in Sep of a single >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 6 Sep.

SPOTTED SANDPIPER* Actitis macularius

A vagrant: three records; at Loch Indaal, Islay in Jun 1984, at Heylipol, Tiree in Aug 2009 and at Ard Mor, Tiree in Aug 2016.

Autumn A 1cy (juvenile) was at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 22-23 Sep [S Nichols, J Bowler *et al*]. Record was accepted by the BBRC.

GREEN SANDPIPER* Tringa ochropus

AMBER LIST A scarce, but almost annual passage migrant, with majority of records in autumn.

Spring One was at Kilchoman Islay on 5 Apr.

Autumn Seven reports of singles at; Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* >S on 28 Jun, at An Fhaodhail *Tiree* on 6 Aug, at Mill Burn, Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 10 Aug, at St Columba's Bay, S Iona *Mull* on 18 Aug, at Sorisdale *Coll* on 26 Aug, at Craigens *Islay* on 28 Aug and at Cornaigmore *Tiree* on 1 Sep. *A much higher than average number of reports*.

COMMON REDSHANK Tringa totanus

AMBER LIST A localised breeder, mainly on the islands: widespread passage migrant and wintering species.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Widespread at coastal sites usually in small nos. Max counts of 88 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 10 Jan, 48 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 12 Jan and 18 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. At RSPB Oronsay *Colonsay* 13 prs, at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* (n/c) *cf* 94 prs there in 2019 and on *Tiree* 40 prs on partial survey at The Reef (wetland compartment). Chicks noted on *Tiree* from 18 May and juvs at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* from 29 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 180 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 28 Aug, 55 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 13 Dec and 34 at Appin *North Argyll* on 23 Aug. At Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* passage >S with 155 total birds in Jul, a peak of 33 on 26 Jul and 134 in total in Aug with a peak of 35 on 6 Aug. Elsewhere, widespread counts of up to 30 birds.

WOOD SANDPIPER* Tringa glar

AMBER LIST A scarce passage migrant: recorded in 22 of the 30 years 1980-2009, and majority of records in late spring.

Spring A pair were at a site in North Argyll on 2 Jun and a migrant bird was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 2 Jun.

Autumn One was at Dervaig *Mull* on 14 Sep and 1 was at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 11-30 Oct.

COMMON GREENSHANK Tringa nebularia

AMBER LIST A scarce breeding species: only in Mull and North Argyll in recent years. A widespread migrant: more numerous in autumn than spring and regular winter records in some localities.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Reports mostly of 1-3 birds at several sites in *Islay*, *Mid-Argyll* and *Mull*. Max counts of 11 at the Strand, *Colonsay* on 12 Jan, 10 at Dervaig *Mull* on 10 Feb, 6 at Balinoe, Loch Feochan *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Mar and 5 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 6 Mar.

Summer/breeding Breeds on *Mull*, *Mid & North Argyll* however restricted data due to Covid constraints. A pr on *Mull* hatched 2 eggs on 25 May. Birds were on territory in an area of *North Argyll* and at least one site in *Mid-Argyll* in Jun. Max counts of 6 at Loch Craignish *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Jun and 4 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Jun were likely post breeding adults.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Return passage in many areas from early Jul. Max counts of 9 at Dervaig *Mull* on 25 Aug, with 14 there on 24 Sep, 14 at Loch Eatharna *Coll* on 16 Sep, 6 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 31 Jul, 4 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 31 Aug and max there of 8 on 3 Nov. Elsewhere, many sites with 1-4 birds.

KITTIWAKE Rissa tridactyla

RED LIST Normally a strictly marine species. The main breeding area is on Colonsay, with other colonies on Islay, Treshnish Isles and Tiree. Scarce in winter and very scarce inland. Breeding Kittiwakes are a feature of North Colonsay & Western Cliffs SPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Max counts of 770 >S in 4 hrs at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 12 Mar, 361 >W in 1 hr at Aird *Tiree* on 4 Feb, 348 >SW in 1 hr at Hynish *Tiree* on 13 Jan and 150 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Apr.

Summer/breeding Only breeding data from (*Colonsay/Islay/Tiree*). At Uragaig *Colonsay* monitoring site there were 26 AONs. At RSPB The Oa *Islay* 55 AONs. At Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* 383 AONs on 19 Jun and 317 AONs on 8 Jul with *ca* 500 large chicks close to fledging. Max counts included; 1,500-2,000 at Ruadh Sgeir, Sound of Jura *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Jul, 600 feeding off Traigh Ghrianal (Maze) *Tiree* on 21 Jun and 150 at the Lynn of Lorne *North Argyll* on 28 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Max counts of 601 >W in 90 mins at Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 7 Oct, 460 >S in 3 hrs (inc 137 juvs) at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 4 Sep and 301 >SW in 1 hr (inc 49 juvs) at Hynish *Tiree* on 20 Aug.

SABINE'S GULL* Xema sabini

A scarce and irregular passage migrant mainly in autumn.

Autumn Single juvs (1cy) flew past Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 28 Aug and 4 Sep [J Sweeney], 2 juvs were off Gruinart Farm, Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 4 Sep [J How], a juv was off Caliach Point *Mull* on 9 Oct [A Brown] and an adult was off Gruinart Farm, Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 26 Oct [D Brown, J Wilkinson]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

BONAPARTE'S GULL* Chroicocephalus philadelphia

A vagrant: Nine or ten previous records. Most recent were in 2018; a 2cy at Heylipol, Tiree on 31 May-1 Jun and an adult at Loch Gilp, Mid-Argyll on 20 Dec.

Summer/autumn A 2cy (first-summer then moulted to second-winter) was at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Jun-25 Aug, also seen nearby at Loch Gilp on 13-14 Aug [J Dickson *et al*]. A 2cy (second-winter) was at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 28 Aug- 11 Sep [J How, J Dickson, P Roberts *et al*].

Winter An adult was at Otter Ferry *Cowal* on 17-18 Dec [N Hammatt]. All records were accepted by the BBRC. *The Islay bird was the first report on the island since one in 1975 and the Cowal report was a first for that region*.

BLACK-HEADED GULL Chroicocephalus ridibundus

AMBER LIST A patchily distributed resident breeder: reduced or absent at some sites due to mink predation and scarce in many areas in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 495 on *Tiree* on 20 Apr, 130 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 15 Jan, 120 at Eilean Traighe, Ormsary *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Mar and 100 at RSPB Ardnave *Islay* on 2 Feb.

Summer/breeding Most breeding data from *Tiree* where *ca* 296 AONs across 11 sites, however poor success. First juv > Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 5 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 317 at Eilean Traighe, Ormsary *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Aug, 100 at Dunaverty *Kintyre* on 19 Aug and 80 at the Halibut Fish Farm outlet, Gigha *Kintyre* on 26 Nov.

LITTLE GULL* Hydrocoloeus minutus

An annual visitor, most frequently in autumn but may be encountered at any time of the year. Winter/spring An adult was at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 12 Feb and 18 & 21 Apr. One (not aged) was at Dunbeg Mid-Argyll on 1 Mar. A 2cy was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 27 Apr.

Autumn/winter A 2cy was at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 6-17 Aug. A 1cy was off Craignure Mull on 23 Aug. An adult was off Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 26 Oct. A 1cy was at Loch Gruinart Islay on 30 Oct. One (not aged) was at Kennacraig Kintyre on 7 Nov. An adult was at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 14 Dec and same bird at Ardrishaig Mid-Argyll on 16 Dec.

MEDITERRANEAN GULL* Ichthyaetus melanocephalus

AMBER LIST A scarce visitor mainly in autumn and winter.

Winter/spring An adult was at the Holy Loch Cowal on 15 Jan.

Autumn/winter A 2cy, with yellow c/r on L leg, was at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Jun, also an adult was there on 29 Jun, a new 2cy there on 5 Jul and a 1cy there on 24 Aug. A 2cy flew S past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 28 Jun. A 2cy was at Eilean Traighe, Ormsary *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Aug. An adult was at Otter Ferry *Cowal* on 12 & 17 Dec.

COMMON GULL Larus canus

AMBER LIST A widespread and common resident breeding species but reduced or absent at some sites due to predation by mink.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 1,510 across Tiree on 22 Jan, 436 at Loch Indaal Islay on 8 Mar, 395 at Rhunahaorine Kintyre on 5 Feb and 380 at Barsloisnoch Mid-Argyll

on 28 Feb. Elsewhere, many counts of up to 300. Birds returned to some *Tiree* breeding sites in late Mar.

Summer/breeding Limited number of breeding reports received apart from; *Tiree* where *ca* 437 AONs, at Ardnave *Islay* with 5 AONs and at Egg Shed site, Ardrishaig *Mid-Argyll* with 25 AONs. First fledged young at Ardrishaig *Mid-Argyll* in mid-Jun and on *Tiree* in late Jun. Passage at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* from mid-Jul and max count of 430 >S (inc 32 juvs) on 15 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Most higher counts were from *Tiree* where a max of 480 at Ruaig on 20 Oct. Elsewhere, a max of 203 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 24 Aug and counts in (*Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*) of up to 140 birds.

GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL Larus marinus

AMBER LIST A common resident: breeding widely but in small numbers on small islands along the coast.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 82 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 30 Jan, 37 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Mar and 34 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Mar.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. Small nos of juvs noted on Islay and Tiree from early Jul

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 79 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 29 Sep, 66 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 15 Nov and 51 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Oct. Elsewhere, many counts of up to 42 birds.

GLAUCOUS GULL* Larus hyperboreus

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular winter visitor: most frequent Jan-Mar.

Winter/spring A better than average showing with ca 21 birds. An ad was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 4 Jan, a 2cy at Balliemore, Loch Striven Cowal on 6 Jan, a 2cy at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 7 Jan, an ad at Bunnahabhain Islay on 9 Jan, a 3cy at Ardrishaig Mid-Argyll on 11-12 Jan, a 2cy at Gott Bay Tiree on 14 Jan with another at Loch a' Phuill on 19 Jan, 2 at Gartbreck Islay on 30 Jan, an ad at Ruaig Tiree on 20 Feb-5 Apr, 1 at Calgary Bay Mull on 26 Feb, 1 at Backs Water Kintyre on 28 Feb, a 2cy at Cornabus, The Oa Islay on 1 Mar, a 2cy at Machrihanish on 2 Mar, an ad >S past Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 12 Mar, 1 at Derryguaig Mull on 13 Mar, a 3cy at Sorobaidh Bay Tiree on 29 Mar-6 Apr, a 2cy at Ruaig Tiree on 20 Apr, an ad at Gott Bay Tiree on 21-22 Apr, a 3cy at Balevuillin Pools Tiree on 28 Apr, a 2cy at Gott Bay Tiree on 27 May and 1 at Westport Marsh Kintyre on 28 Jun.

Autumn/winter All reports given with 6-7 singles. A 1cy was at Bowmore *Islay* on 31 Oct, an ad >S past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 2 Nov, a 1cy was at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 3 Nov, a 1cy was at Kilnaughton Bay *Islay* on 4 Nov, a 2cy >N past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 15 Nov, a 1cy was at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 24 Dec and a 1cy was at Rubha Chraiginis *Tiree* on 31 Dec.

ICELAND GULL* Larus glaucoides glaucoides

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular winter visitor: most frequent Jan-Mar, with numbers varying widely from year to year. There are a few summer records.

Winter/spring A better than average showing with 13 singles. A 2cy was at Craigendive, Loch Striven *Cowal* on 2-9 Jan, an ad was at S Loch Scridain *Mull* on 14 Jan, an ad was at Craigens, Loch Indaal *Islay* on 15 Jan, a 2cy was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 19 Jan, a 3cy at Ardinamir, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 1-4 Feb, 1 at Inverneill *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Feb, 1 at Clachan, Head of Loch Fyne *Mid-Argyll* on 2 Mar, a 2cy at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 8 Mar, 1 at Garmony *Mull* on 14-15 Mar, a 3cy at Scallastle *Mull* on 9 Apr and a 2cy at Gott Bay Tiree on 20 Apr.

Autumn/winter At least 6 or 7 birds reported. One was at Machir Bay *Islay* on 22 Oct, a 1cy at Loch Gruinart on 26 Oct, a 1cy >S past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 2 Nov & >E past on 5 Nov,

a 1cy at Kilnaughton Bay *Islay* on 12 Nov perhaps to end of Dec, an ad/3cy was at Arduaine *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Nov, an ad at E Connel *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Dec and 2 were at Cragabus, The Oa *Islay* on 22 Dec.

EUROPEAN HERRING GULL Larus argentatus

RED LIST A widespread and abundant resident breeding species that forms large flocks outside the breeding season. Recently several large colonies have been abandoned, and very few now breed inland.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 540 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Feb, 460 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 5 Feb, 450 at Drimvore *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Mar, 360 across *Tiree* on 22 Jan, 259 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 12 Jan and 251 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 12 Jan.

Summer/breeding Limited and incomplete breeding data. At least 53 AONs on *Tiree* and first chicks noted on 1 Jun. At least 10 prs on Campbeltown roof tops *Kintyre* in Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 385 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Oct, 350 at Gigalum Bay *Kintyre* on 26 Nov, 304 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 19 Oct and 270 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 11 Dec.

LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL Larus fuscus

AMBER LIST A widespread breeding species: generally present from Mar to Sep. Some colonies are much affected by mink predation. A few remain in winter. Seabird 2000 found 3,235 pairs in Argyll and Bute but numbers have since declined greatly.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Presumably wintering birds in the Clyde area noted in *Cowal* with 1-2 birds at Blairmore and Innellan in Jan-Feb. More typical 'arrivals' in Feb with 1 at Tarbert Harbour *Kintyre* on 1 Feb, 1 at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 6 Feb, also 6 there on 13 Feb and 1 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Feb. Max counts of 60 at Milton *Tiree* on 21 Apr, 60 at Drimvore *Mid-Argyll* on 19 May and 40 >W over Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 2 Apr. Elsewhere, other than *Tiree*, counts generally of 1-20 birds.

Summer/breeding Limited and incomplete breeding data. On Tiree 69 AONs.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Nos declined from late Aug. Max counts of 24 >S off *Colonsay* on 4 Sep and 23 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 13 Sep after which reports of only 1-3 birds mainly from (*Colonsay/Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll*). Only two reports in Dec, with 3 at The Strand *Colonsay* on 15 Dec and 2 at Blairmore *Cowal* on 22 Dec.

SANDWICH TERN Thalasseus sandvicensis

AMBER LIST A regular passage migrant but very rare, and irregular, breeding species.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll). First arrivals of 1 at Port Righ Kintyre on 6 Apr, 3 at Kirn Cowal on 8 Apr and 6 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 9 Apr. Thereafter, more widespread reports from (Islay/Mid-Argyll/Tiree). A max count of 120+ at Campbeltown Loch Kintyre on 23 Apr. Most reports were from S Kintyre and single figure nos from Cowal, Islay and Mid-Argyll.

Summer/breeding No breeding reports. Higher counts at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* with 43 (8 juvs) on 18 Jul, 55 (20+ juvs) on 30 Jul and 34 (8 juvs) on 22 Aug. Elsewhere, higher counts of 10 (4 juvs) at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Aug and 5 at Innellan Pier *Cowal* on 27 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). Higher counts included; 45 at West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre* on 28 Aug and a total of 66 >S at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* in Sep, with a peak daily count of 18 on 4 Sep and the last report of 2 there on 27 Sep.

LITTLE TERN Sternula albifrons

AMBER LIST A scarce summer visitor with regular breeding restricted to: Coll, Islay, and Tiree. Scarce passage migrant and irregular breeder elsewhere.

Winter/spring Reports from only (*Islay/Tiree*). First report was of 1 at the Big Strand *Islay* on 7 Apr then 8 at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 12 Apr. Most arrived after 20 Apr and a max count of 20 at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 22 Apr.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from; *Colonsay* with 3prs (failed) at RSPB Oronsay, *Islay* with 4 prs at RSPB Ardnave and 1 pr at RSPB Loch Gruinart, and on *Tiree* where 21 prs produced a min of 9 fledged young and likely that others attempted to nest on Gunna. A count of 50 ads with 3 fledged young at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 6 Jul.

Autumn In Kintyre 7 ads >S at Machrihanish SBO on 29 Jul. On Mull 3 were at Iona on 1 Aug and last birds on Tiree with 11 (inc 5 juvs) at Gott Bay on 5 Aug and 3 (inc 1 juv) there on 7 Aug.

ROSEATE TERN* Sterna dougallii

RED LIST A rare migrant; prior to 1980 it occasionally bred in Argyll. The most recent records were from Kintyre in 2005, 2007, 2009 and 2012.

Autumn An adult was seen off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 6 Sep [E Maguire, G Crabtree]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON TERN Sterna hirundo

AMBER LIST A locally common summer visitor: considerably more numerous than Arctic Tern close to the mainland, but often less so on outer isles. Many colonies are severely affected by mink predation and often unproductive where no trapping is undertaken. Seabird 2000 found that Argyll held the second largest colony in Britain and the largest in Scotland. Breeding Common Terns are a feature of Glas Eileanan SPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll). First reports of singles at Innellan Cowal and Ardrishaig Mid-Argyll on 11 Apr, then 1 at Loch Bhasapol Tiree on 15 Apr. Higher counts of 33 at Duncuan Is, Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 22 May, 20 at Scallastle Mull on 13 May and 12 at Java Point Mull on 6 May.

Summer/breeding Breeding on offshore islands for which little data. No data from Treshnish Isles *Mull*. On *Tiree* in early Jul 25 prs were at Milton and 5 prs at Caoles but all failed. In *North Argyll* 100 birds at South Shian with some juvs noted. Small nos elsewhere in *Cowal, Mid-Argyll* and *Mull*. Max counts of 400 at Glas Eileanan, Sound of *Mull* on 27 Jul, 50 at Scallastle *Mull* on 13 Jun and 36 feeding at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Jun.

Autumn/winter Few reports after start of Aug. A max of 10 (5 juvs) at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 7 Aug and 7 (1 juv) at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Aug. Only up to 5 birds at sites on *Mull* in early Sep and last 2 birds at Largiemore, Otter Ferry *Cowal* on 19 Sep.

ARCTIC TERN Sterna paradisaea

AMBER LIST A summer visitor and localised breeding species particularly on: Coll, Colonsay, Islay, Jura, Mull, and Tiree. Many colonies are severely affected by mink predation and are often unproductive where no trapping is undertaken. Seabird 2000 counted 1,823 pairs in Argyll & Bute.

Spring Reports from all coastal areas except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). First reports on *Tiree* of 8 on on 20 Apr and rising to 56 at Traigh Bhaigh on 5 May.

Summer/breeding Incomplete data. On Islay 56 AONs at RSPB Ardnave. On Tiree 270 AONs at 17 sites producing ca 85 fledged young by mid-month. Small nos noted breeding on Colonsay, Islay, Kintyre and Mull. No data this year from the Treshnish Isles Mull. A build up of 2cy birds on Tiree from first early bird at Loch Bhasapol on 27 May and then higher counts of 650 at Eilean Ghreasamuill, off Caoles on 6 Jul, 300 at Milton on 13 Jul and 60 at Gott Bay on 31 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Coll/Islay/Tiree*). Most birds had departed by mid-Aug and only small nos *Islay* and *Tiree* to early Sep with last report of 2 off Aird and 1 off Vaul *Tiree* on 5 Sep.

GREAT SKUA Stercorarius skua

AMBER LIST Previously an uncommon passage migrant and summer visitor but an increasing summer visitor which now breeds or holds territory in very small numbers on Coll, Treshnish Isles Mull, Tiree, Colonsay, Islay and Staffa.

Winter/spring First report was of a single off Caliach Point *Mull* on 19 Mar. Only 1-3 birds noted in early spring from *Mull* and *Tiree*.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received from sites in (*Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree*). Five AOTs at RSPB Oronsay *Colonsay* with fledged young from 2 prs and at least 2 prs on *Tiree* and 1 pr on *Islay*.

Autumn/winter Passage birds noted from 13 Aug when 1 >S off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre*, and only 1-4 birds noted from coastal sites, with max counts of 10 >SW off Hynish *Tiree* on 20 Aug, 12 >W off Aird *Tiree* on 5 Sep, 5 >S off Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 5 Sep, 7 off Caliach Point *Mull* on 9 Sep and 8 >W off Aird *Tiree* on 9 Oct. Last report was a single from the Kennacraig to *Islay* ferry on 9 Nov.

POMARINE SKUA* *Stercorarius pomarinus*

A scarce but regular passage migrant; mainly seen in autumn but has been recorded in all months.

Autumn/winter An ad >S at Crossapol Dunes *Coll* on 23 Aug, a sub-ad >W at Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 4 Sep, a 1cy >W at Aird *Tiree* on 5 Sep, 1 >S at Port Mor *Colonsay* on 5 Sep, a

1cy >W at Aird *Tiree* on 9 Oct, 1 >W at Dun Mor, Vaul *Tiree* on 9 Oct and a 1cy >W at Aird *Tiree* on 26 Oct.

ARCTIC SKUA* Stercorarius parasiticus

RED LIST Previously the most common skua in Argyll with small numbers regularly seen in summer near large seabird colonies, this species has become scarce. The small breeding colonies on Jura and Coll have been in serious decline in recent years. Passage birds can be widespread in spring and especially autumn, but variable in numbers from year to year.

Winter/spring Only four reports. Two were at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 18 Apr, 2 at Arinagour Coll on 22 Apr, 1 at Keills, Loch na Cille Mid-Argyll on 26 May and 1 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 29 Jun.

Summer/breeding No confirmed breeding data. A bird was seen inland on *Coll* on 22 Apr and may have been a potential breeder however no further information received.

Autumn/winter Three were at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 3 Aug, also 1 on 12 Aug, 3 on 4 Sep and 3 on 12 Sep. One was at Loch Eatherna Coll on 18 Aug, 1 was at The Reef, 2 at Hynish on 20 Aug and 1 at Hynish on 2 Sep, all Tiree, 1 was at Balnahard Bay on 3 Sep and 2 at Port Mor on 5 Sep, both Colonsay, 1 was at Frenchman's Rocks Islay on 3 Sep, also 2 on 5 Sep and 3 on 6 Sep, 1 was at Caliach Point Mull on 9 Sep, 1 seen from the Kennacraig to Islay ferry on 9 Sep, 1 was off Scarba Mid-Argyll on 23 Sep, 1 was at Aird on 9 Oct and 1 at Vaul Bay on 9 Oct, both Tiree and last report of 1 seen from the Kennacraig to Islay Ferry on 9 Nov.

LONG-TAILED SKUA* Stercorarius longicaudus

A scarce and irregular passage migrant: spring and autumn records off western coasts and islands.

2018. Autumn A juv (1cy) was seen and photographed from the Kennacraig to *Islay* ferry on 23 Aug [M Lewis]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

LITTLE AUK* Alle alle

A scarce and irregular winter visitor: usually seen during sea-watches or after severe gales. Winter Only report was of 1 >W off Aird Tiree on 4 Feb.

COMMON GUILLEMOT Uria aalge

AMBER LIST A highly colonial, and locally abundant, breeding species. Adults with small young appear on the sea far from colonies in late summer. Large numbers of passage migrants

may be seen from headlands and smaller numbers are regular in sea lochs in winter. Breeding Common Guillemots are a feature of North Colonsay & Western Cliffs SPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas with most counts of 1-25 birds, however higher counts of 215 in 1 hr passing Hynish *Tiree* on 24 Mar and 170 >S off Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 12 Mar.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from (*Colonsay/Islay/Tiree*) with 279 on cliffs at RSPB The Oa *Islay* in Jun and on *Tiree* at Ceann a' Mhara on 19 Jun where 3,938 on cliffs with 400 small to mid-sized chicks and a further 2,100 on sea mostly this species, and on 8 Jul; 2,809 birds brooding some 280 mid-sized chicks, others had already left. A moderately good breeding year (some 400 chicks fledged in total).

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas, with low nos of 1-40 birds. Few reports, and of only 1-7 birds after mid-Oct.

RAZORBILL Alca torda

AMBER LIST A locally common breeding species, although much less numerous and with smaller colonies than Common Guillemot. Large numbers of passage migrants may be seen from headlands with smaller numbers regular in sea lochs in winter.

Winter/spring Most reports from (*Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). Max counts of 2,400 >S in 3 hrs at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 6 Apr and 138 >W in 1 hr off Aird *Tiree* on 4 Feb.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from (Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree). At RSPB The Oa Islay 138 birds in Jun. On cliffs at Ceann a' Mhara Tiree counts of 384, with most on eggs (many more birds on the sea) on 30 Jun, and 409 adults, many with large young on 8 Jul. Begging juvs with adults on the sea off Tiree in mid-Aug. Many more reports around Argyll coasts during Aug than usual. A group of 46 adults were at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 15 Aug. At Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll at least 11 juvs just off the front green from 25 Aug and several found dead in following weeks.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Most high counts were from sea areas around *Coll* and *Tiree* during Sep-Oct with max count of 1,125 >W in 1 hr off Aird *Tiree* on 9 Oct.

BLACK GUILLEMOT Cepphus grylle

AMBER LIST A widespread, resident breeding species: on coasts, islands, and in sea lochs. Black Guillemot is a protected feature of Clyde Sea Sill MPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all coastal areas. Max counts included 18 at Oban Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Feb, 12 at Ardskenish *Colonsay* on 9 Jan, 11 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 5 Feb and 10 at Bunnahabhain *Islay* on 27 Feb.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data due to Covid-19 restrictions.

Autumn/winter Reports from all coastal areas. Counts from most coastal sites, usually of 1-10 birds, and max counts of 28 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 15 Sep, 20 at Appin *North Argyll* on 17 Oct, 14 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 7 Nov and 10 at Tarbert Harbour *Kintyre* on 7 Oct.

ATLANTIC PUFFIN Fratercula arctica

RED LIST A very localised breeding species with main colonies on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles: only very occasionally recorded in winter.

Winter/spring A dead bird was found at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 23 Feb. One was off Calgary *Mull* on 4 Mar. No reports in Apr and only one report in May. Reports of only singles in Jun from (*Islay/Jura/Mull/Tiree*). Counts from the ferry between *Mull* and *Coll* gave 20 on 23 Jul and 30 on 28 Jul. 12 in 1 hr passed Hynish *Tiree* on 30 Jul.

Summer/breeding No breeding data from island colonies due to Covid-19 restrictions.

Autumn/winter Only reports were of birds at the Lunga, Treshnish Isles *Mull* in early Aug, 3 off NE *Coll* on 28 Aug and last report of 1 from the Kennacraig to *Islay* ferry on 19 Sep.

ROCK DOVE Columba livia

A resident breeder except in Cowal: concentrated on the islands and in Kintyre. Large flocks often gather on arable fields out-with the breeding season. The genetic integrity of most populations is now in doubt because of interbreeding with feral pigeons. Those on the islands being probably nearest 'pure' Rock Dove. Feral Pigeons are recorded from most areas, but there is little information on population size.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Cowal*). Max counts of 145 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 20 Feb, 50 at Saligo Bay *Islay* on 2 Feb, however many counts of up to 40 around *Tiree* Jan-Apr. Under reported.

Summer/breeding No specific breeding data received. Higher counts included 105 at Balephetrish *Tiree* on 8 Jun and up to 90 at Laphroaig *Islay* Jul-Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Cowal*). Max counts of 140 at Drumlemble *Kintyre* on 14 Sep (some feral types in flock), 130 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 12 Nov, 125 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 8 Sep, 105 at Balevullin *Tiree* on 11 Sep, 104 at RSPB Totronald *Coll* on 16 Nov and 100 at Bellochantuy *Kintyre* on 16 Oct. Elsewhere, many flocks of up to 50.

FERAL PIGEON Small groups reported, mainly from the larger towns in Argyll with max counts of 35+ in Oban. A flock of 22 around Barnakill farm *Mid-Argyll* and nearby a flock of 18 almost pure Rock Dove types have taken residence at the Islandadd Bridge, Bellanoch *Mid-Argyll*.

STOCK DOVE* Columba oenas

AMBER LIST A very scarce and local resident: only regularly reported from Cowal and Mid-Argyll in recent years. All records required please.

Winter/spring One was at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 26 Mar, 1 was at Nether Largie, Kilmartin Glen *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Apr and 1 was at Toward *Cowal* on 11 May.

COMMON WOOD PIGEON Columba palumbus

A common resident breeding species: less numerous on Mull, scarce on Coll, and rare on Tiree. Large flocks which form on the mainland in winter may include immigrants.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 60 >SE over Lingerton landfill, Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan and 11 at Tayvallich *Kintyre* on 25 Jan

Summer/breeding Limited data received. Bred at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay. Usually breeds in low nos in Argyll.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 270 >SW over Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* towards large forest area on 26 Oct, also smaller flocks of 30-35 over Cairnbaan on several days in late Oct and 200 over Drimlee, Glen Shira *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Oct. Counts of up to 33 on *Colonsay* in late Sep, otherwise 1-16 birds reported at sites elsewhere.

EUROPEAN TURTLE DOVE* Streptopelia turtur

RED LIST A scarce but almost annual passage migrant: most frequently recorded during May and Jun.

Spring One was at Loch Don Mull on 1 Jun.

Autumn A juv (1cy) was at Caliach *Mull* on 16 Sep and an adult was at The Lodge, Arinagour *Coll* on 17 Sep.

EURASIAN COLLARED DOVE Streptopelia decaocto

A widespread but sparsely distributed species throughout Argyll usually associated with human settlement. It is resident at many locations however is mainly a late spring migrant or summer visitor to some islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Under reported. Max counts of 40 at Peninver *Kintyre* on 10 Apr, 15 at Mill Park *Kintyre* on 4 Jan, 14 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Jan and 11 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Jan

Summer/breeding No specific breeding data received. Widespread counts of up to 12 birds. **Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. Max counts of 36 at Octofad farm *Islay* on 7 Sep, 30 at Port Charlotte *Islay* on 19 Sep and 30 at Loch Eatherna *Coll* on 30 Sep.

COMMON CUCKOO Cuculus canorus

RED LIST A common summer visitor that is more frequent and widespread on the mainland: less numerous on the outer islands.

Spring Reports from all areas. First reports of singles from Carradale *Kintyre* on 7 Apr, Ford *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Apr and Ardbeg *Islay* on 8 Apr, followed by scattered reports until a notable increase from 13 Apr onwards, around four days earlier than 2019.

Breeding Noted calling at sites in; Coll (0), Colonsay (no survey cf 20 in 2019), Cowal (29 cf 16 in 2019), Islay (4 cf 24 in 2019), Jura (0) Kintyre (5 cf 10 in 2019), Mid-Argyll (42 cf 49 in 2019), Mull (21 cf 98 in 2019), North Argyll (5 cf 19 in 2019) and Tiree (6 cf 5 in 2019). Big reductions in reports in some areas this year presumably as a consequence of Covid-19 travel restrictions.

Autumn Last report of an adult was on 7 Jul, thereafter several reports of juvs on Mull to 12 Aug, at Croabh Haven Mid-Argyll on 22 Aug and at Vaul Tiree to 24 Aug.

BARN OWL Tyto alba

A patchily distributed breeding species: probably most numerous in Kintyre. It is widespread on Cowal, Islay, and Mull but only a rare visitor to Coll, Colonsay, and Tiree. All records are requested.

All year Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Most reports from Islay, Kintyre, Mull and Mid-Argyll. Reports mainly of 1-2 in all months with more reports during Jan-May then fewer during Jun-Jul. Several reports of fledged broods of 4-6 young. One on Tiree from 17 Oct into 2021 was unusual.

Breeding Data from the ARSG; 104 sites were checked [cf 109 in 2019]. Nine sites were occupied by single birds, and 66 breeding attempts (including second broods) were reported at 58 sites [39 sites occupied by pairs in 2019]. Eggs were known to have been laid at 64 sites. The fledging outcome was known at 30 sites, where 93.3% of nests were successful [50.0% in 2019]. The mean young per successful nest was 4.96 [cf 3.00 in 2019]. (Article: **The Eider** Dec 2020 pp 14 -16)

TAWNY OWL Strix aluco

AMBER LIST A widespread and common resident breeding bird: absent from Coll and with only single records for Colonsay and Tiree.

All year Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree). More frequent reports during Apr-Jun. Most reports from sites in Mid-Argyll (17), Cowal (12) and Mull (9) and most of birds calling with few sight reports.

Breeding Data from the ARSG; 38 sites were checked (cf 70 in 2019). No signs of birds were found at 14 sites. Two sites had single birds and breeding pairs were found at 19 sites [cf 20 sites in 2019]. The fledging outcome was known at 12 sites, where 83% of nests were successful. The mean young per successful nest was 2.00 [cf 1.44 in 2019].

LONG-EARED OWL Asio otus

A very scarce resident breeding bird and winter visitor: almost certainly under recorded. All records are requested.

All year/breeding One was on Oronsay Colonsay on 24 Feb. Several reports of confirmed and also likely breeding birds from late May to early Jul from; Uig Coll, Kiloran Colonsay, Moine Mhor and Kerrera Mid-Argyll, Southend and nr Campbeltown Kintyre. One was at Colonsay Hotel, Scalasaig Colonsay on 26 Sep and 2 were at the Moine Mhor Mid-Argyll on 23 Dec. Due to the nocturnal nature of this species they are presumably greatly under recorded.

SHORT-EARED OWL Asio flammeus

AMBER LIST A widely but thinly distributed breeder and winter visitor. Numbers fluctuate and distribution varies with the abundance of small rodents, especially field voles (Microtus agrestis).

Winter/spring Reports from only three sites on *Mull* (nine sites in 2019) of 1-2 birds. No reports received from *Jura*. Two were on *Tiree* on 20 Jan and an injured bird was taken into care. One was at Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll* on 11 Feb, 1 was on Seil Is *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Apr, 1 was nr Stronafian *Cowal* on 15 May, 1 was at Balliemore, Loch Striven *Cowal* on 21 May.

Summer/breeding Data from the ARSG; twelve sites were checked. Three had no signs of occupation and two sites were occupied by a single bird. Pairs were present at seven sites. At these, the breeding outcome was unknown at three sites, one site failed and the remaining three sites fledged at least 5 young (ave = 1.66 young/successful nest and 1.25 young/monitored nest). **Autumn/winter** One was at Glen More *Mull* on 5 Aug, 1 at Scarinish *Tiree* on 8 Aug, 1 at Crossapol *Coll* on 18 Sep, 1 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 14 Oct, 1 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 17 Oct and 2 at Loch Spelve *Mull* on 6 Dec.

COMMON SWIFT Apus apus

AMBER LIST A summer visitor, breeding locally on the mainland: wandering birds and passage migrants may occur anywhere.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay*). First arrivals on 5 May with; 3 in Cambeltown *Kintyre*, singles at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay*, also in Lochgilphead, Kilmichael Glassary and Oban all *Mid-Argyll*. One at Java Point *Mull* on 6 May and 5 over Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* in low cloud on 7 May. Noted from 'sites' in; *Cowal* (4), *Islay* (4), *Kintyre* (3), *Mid-Argyll* (20), *Mull* (9), *North Argyll* (2) and *Tiree* (3).

Breeding/summer In view of limited data in previous years and a known UK decline of up to 50% since 1995 the **ABC carried out an Argyll breeding survey** involving 40 volunteers (*Article: The Eider Sept 2020 pp 14 -15*). Overall total thought to be around 50 prs, with prs noted at: *Cowal* Carrick Castle (3), Strone (1), Sandbank (3), Dunoon (1-3) and Tighnabruaich (1); *Kintyre* Campbeltown (5+); *Mid-Argyll* Benderloch (1+), Connel (1), Taynuilt (3+), Oban (north (3) & south (4/5)), Lerags (3), Kilmelford (1+), Portsonachan (6), Kilmartin (1), Slockavulin (2), Poltalloch (1), Kilmichael (3+), Lochgilphead (4) and Ardrishaig (1). Max counts late summer; 21 at Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 20 Jul, 14 at the Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Jul, 35 at Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 31 Jul and 12 at Lower Fernoch, Loch Awe *Mid-Argyll* on 31 Jul.

Autumn Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura/North Argyll). Reported from 13 locations in Aug with max counts of 20 in Campbeltown Kintyre 11 Aug and 7 at Kilmichael Glassary Mid-Argyll on 20 Aug. Most birds had departed by late Aug however a juv in a nest box at Kilmichael Glassary was reluctant to leave until 9 Sep. One was at Balnahard Bay Colonsay on 3 Sep. One was seen briefy at Machrihanish Kintyre on 22 Oct and Pallid Swift not ruled out. One was found (dead several days) at Ardrishaig Mid-Argyll on 23 Oct and confirmed as Common Swift.

COMMON KINGFISHER Alcedo atthis

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular visitor with most records in autumn and winter at a few regular mainland locations. The only proven breeding record was in Kintyre in 1993.

Winter/spring Few reports; 1-2 (m+f) at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* between 2 Jan-13 Mar, a fem at Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Jan, 1 at Loch Don *Mull* between 4 Jan-3 Mar and 1 at Ferlochan, Loch Creran *North Argyll* on 7 Feb.

Summer/breeding No confirmed breeding reports and no reports received between 13 Mar-17 Aug.

Autumn/winter More widespread, presumably involving post breeding movements from outwith Argyll. Reports of from; Cowal with 2 at Lochgoilhead on 22 Aug, 1 at Portavadie ferry slip on 30 Aug and 15 Oct, 1 at the Holy Loch on 26 Sep; in Mid-Argyll 1 just S of Cairnbaan on 17 Aug, 1 at Lochan Taynish on 21 Aug, 1 m at Loch Gilp on 22 Aug to year end, also a fem there from 8 Nov, 2 at Loch Sween on 7 Sep, 1 at Dalmally on 20 Oct, 1 at Kerrera slip on 15-16 Oct and 1 at Airds Bay on 29 Dec; on Mull 1 at Loch Don on 2 Nov-27 Dec.

EURASIAN HOOPOE* Upupa epops

A scarce passage migrant, with most records in spring.

Spring One was in a garden at Lochdon *Mull* on 13 May.

Autumn One remained in the Bridgend/Whin Park area *Islay* on 25 Sep-23 Oct.

EURASIAN WRYNECK* Jynx torquilla

RED LIST A rare and irregular passage migrant in spring and autumn; twelve records since 1969. Lasts record were at The Oa, Islay in Aug 2013 and Gribun, Mull in Sep 2017.

Autumn One was at St Columba's Bay, Iona Mull on 18 Aug [Paul St Pierre]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER Dendrocopos major

A resident breeder: widespread on the mainland and Mull, with occasional records on Islay. Winter/spring Reports from sites in; Cowal (18), Islay (7), Kintyre (3), Mid-Argyll (30), Mull (13), North Argyll (7). Generally, 1-2 birds reported and a max of 4 together in Tayvallich Mid-Argyll in Jan. Drumming heard from early Feb.

Summer/breeding First fledged young noted at Tayvallich Mid-Argyll on 13 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports and sites reported from only: Islay (6), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (14), Mull (7) and all of 1-2 birds.

COMMON KESTREL Falco tinnunculus

AMBER LIST A widespread, but declining, breeding bird. There is emigration from some areas in autumn and immigration to others. All reports are requested.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Colonsay/Jura). All reports of 1-2 birds from 'sites' in Coll (2), Cowal (4), Islay (3), Kintyre (2), Mid-Argyll (22), Mull (10), and Tiree (2). Most frequent reports were in Jan to Mar. Unfortunately, no data from Jura where they are known to occur.

Summer/breeding Data from the ARSG; 25 sites were checked of which 13 were occupied (cf 2 in 2019) and a min of 28 large young produced (cf 1 in 2019).

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura). Reports from 'sites' in; Coll (5), Colonsay (1), Cowal (4), Islay (1), Kintyre (9), Mid-Argyll (11), Mull (23), North Argyll (2) and Tiree (4). Generally single birds, occasionally 2 and max counts of 5 at Gribun Mull on 8 Sep and 3 on Luing Mid-Argyll on 29 Dec.

MERLIN Falco columbarius

RED LIST Breeds very locally on open moorland and bogs: more widely distributed on passage and in winter on low coastal ground and farmland.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Colonsay/North Argyll). Most reports of single birds by month mainly; in Feb (26) then Jan (11). Most reports were from; Islay (18), Tiree (10), Kintyre (8), Mull (4), Mid-Argyll (3) and Cowal (1).

Summer/breeding No reports in Jun and only 4 reports in Jul. No occupied territories were found at previously occupied sites (per ARSG). No other breeding reports were received.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (North Argyll). All reports were of singles, however up to 3 across Tiree on 15 Nov. Most reports by month were in; Oct (18), Sep (14), Aug (8), Nov (8) and Dec (7). Most reports by region were Tiree (27), Kintyre (11), Islay, Mid-Argyll & Mull (6), Coll & Colonsay (3). Note - in some areas e.g. Tiree the same lingering birds may be reported many times during their stay.

PEREGRINE FALCON Falco peregrinus

A widespread but scarce breeding species in all areas of Argyll, with about 70 occupied territories in 2005. There have been indications of a decline in numbers breeding away from coastal areas. Found throughout the year in most areas.

All year Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-2 birds at sites across Argyll and most reports from *Islay*. Reports from all months however a notable increase in sightings during Aug and Sep. Max

count away from nest sites of 5 in central *Tiree* on 29 Jul, 3 at Loch Buie *Mull* in Sep and 3 at Bunnahabhain *Islay* in Jul.

Breeding Data from the ARSG; 39 sites were checked, 15 sites were occupied and raised a min. of 19 large young.

YELLOW-BELLIED FLYCATCHER* Empidonax flaviventris

No previous Western Palearctic records. A New World tyrant flycatcher which breeds across wet northern (spruce) woodland and bogs of Canada and NE USA migrating through central America and winters in southern central America.

Autumn A 1cy was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 15-23 Sep [J Bowler *et al*]. Record subject to acceptance by the BOU and BBRC. (*Article: Scottish Birds Vol 41 (1) March 2021 pp 78-80*)

As a first record for the Western Palearctic this was a major find and attracted a lot of attention from far and wide across the birding world. A well-managed 'twitch' under Covid-19 guidelines ensued and allowed 120+ birders to get amazing views at close range (down to 2 metres!) as it fed on a good supply of flies during its stay. Almost £2,000 was given by visiting birders for Covid-19 related projects on Tiree.

EURASIAN JAY Garrulus glandarius

A widely distributed (but scarce) woodland resident on most of the mainland: rarely reported from the islands. There is some immigration in autumn.

Winter/spring Reports of 1-2 birds from 'sites' in; Cowal (10), Mid-Argyll (19), Mull (1) and North Argyll (1). Highest number of reports were in Apr (12) and May (11).

Summer/breeding All reports from mainland Argyll and *Mull* with generally 1-2 birds at sites and max counts of 9 at Barnluasgan *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Aug, 5 at Benmore Botanic Gardens *Cowal* on 10 Jul and 4 at Dalsmirren *Kintyre* on 12 Jul. No breeding data received.

Autumn/winter Reports of 1-3 birds from 'sites' in; Cowal (6), Kintyre (3), Mid-Argyll (13), Mull (10) and North Argyll (2). Max counts of 9 at Kilbride, Seil Mid-Argyll on 26 Sep and 4 at Garmony Mull on 26 Sep. Highest number of reports were in Sep (12).

EURASIAN MAGPIE Pica pica

A local breeder restricted to Cowal. Reports scarce and sporadic elsewhere. There is some evidence to show that some birds arrive in early spring to Kintyre from Northern Ireland and move north through Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from (Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull). Cowal had most reports, from 12 'sites', then Kintyre (9), Mid-Argyll (8) and Mull (5). Under reported from Cowal where only a max of 4 birds noted at sites. Elsewhere, max counts were 3 at Lossit House Kintyre on 28 May and only singles noted in Mid-Argyll and Mull.

Summer/breeding No breeding reports out-with Cowal.

Autumn/winter Reports from 'sites' in Cowal (5), Kintyre (3) and Mid-Argyll (5) with max counts of only 4 at Kames Cowal on 4 Dec and 3 at Machrihanish Kintyre in Sep.

RED-BILLED CHOUGH Pyrrhocorax pyrrhocorax

The Argyll islands hold almost the entire Scottish population. Islay is the stronghold, with smaller numbers on Oronsay and Colonsay. All records away from Islay are appreciated.

Winter/spring Reports from only (Colonsay/Islay). Max counts on Islay with 36 at Ardnave in Jan-Feb.

Summer/breeding On *Islay* a full survey was not possible however from information gathered, of the 58 known sites were checked, prs were present at 36 sites of which 29 nests had a known outcome; 10 fledged no young and 19 sites produced 45 young (2.36 young per successful nest *cf* 2.53 in 2019)(per SCSC). No birds were ringed in 2020 due to Covid-19 travel restrictions. Limited permitted survey work on *Colonsay* in mid-Jun, breeding data; at least 8 young fledged from 3 nests, 1 failed, 1 outcome unknown.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay*). Few counts received, however max counts on *Islay* of 42 roosting at RSPB Smaull in Aug, a mobile flock of 50 at Eilean Mor on 8 Aug and 29 at Ardnave in Oct. On *Colonsay* in Sep, mostly 2 birds at sites and a max of 6 together on 6 Sep.

WESTERN JACKDAW Corvus monedula

A resident breeder, common throughout much of mainland Argyll: scarce on Mull and does not breed on Coll or Tiree. Breeding colonies are often located in towns and villages.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Tiree*). Higher counts received included; 260 at Kilkivan Quarry *Kintyre* 10 Mar, 180 at Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Jan, 120 at Ardencaple House, Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jan and 110 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Mar.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received. Reports generally of 1-12 birds. Max count was 25 at Ledaig *North Argyll* on 9 Aug. Most reports from (*Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll*).

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Higher counts included; 254 going to roost in Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Nov, 230 at Eallabus *Islay* on 7 Sep, 230 at Ballinaby *Islay* on 10 Sep, 230 at Dunadd *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Oct and 100 at Torsa Beag *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Dec. Two at Loch an Eilein on 12-14 Dec was the only record from *Tiree* in 2020.

ROOK Corvus frugilegus

A resident breeder, common throughout much of Argyll, but scarce on Mull and does not breed on: Colonsay, Coll or Tiree. There can be a post breeding influx of juveniles to some islands, e.g. Mull and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree*). Few high counts received. Max count of 200 at Blackmill Bay, Luing *Mid-Argyll* 1 Feb, 150 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 2 Feb and 65 at Loch Scammadale *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Jan.

Summer/breeding On *Islay* 163 nests at RSPB Loch Gruinart. Most reports from (*Cowal/Islay*). Max counts of 110 at Laphroaig *Islay* on 27 Jul and 85 at Drimvore *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Few counts received. Max counts of only 100+ at Ardnave *Islay* on 27 Sep, 100+ at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 30 Sep and 67 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Dec. A group of 15 1cy birds arrived in East *Tiree* on 13 Nov and remained into 2021.

CARRION CROW Corvus corone

A sedentary resident: mainly in east Cowal and parts of Mid-Argyll, in a variety of mainly low ground habitats. It hybridises readily with Hooded Crow where ranges overlap.

Winter/spring Most reports from usual stronghold areas of *Cowal* however only single figure counts and a max of 8 at Inverchapel on 4 Mar. In *Mid-Argyll* 1-2 birds noted at 8 sites, also 1 at Kintra, The Oa *Islay* on 8 Jan and 1 at Knock *Mull* in Feb.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received. A pr present in Lochgilphead in summer.

Autumn/winter Most reports again from *Cowal* at 6 sites and a max count of only 6 birds. Reports of 1-2 birds elsewhere in *Kintyre* and *Mid-Argyll*.

HOODED CROW Corvus cornix

A widespread, and very common, resident breeding species.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Numbers reported generally low, with 1-10 birds from sites, however 110 at a pre-roost Kiloran *Colonsay* on 5 Jan, 30 at Clachandubh Burn, nr Ford *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Mar and 25 at Lephenstrath Bridge *Kintyre* on 29 Feb.

Summer/breeding No breeding data received. Fledged young noted from 26 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 44 at pre-roost count A' Chroic *Coll* on 4 Oct and 28 at Ben Mannal *Tiree* on 17 Sep.

HYBRID CROW Corvus corone x cornix

Hybrids between Carrion and Hooded Crow are most prevalent where the ranges of the two species overlap. Any records are welcome as they will help to document the change in position of the hybrid zone, which is known to have moved north westwards in the past.

All year Reports of small nos from (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll*).

NORTHERN RAVEN Corvus corax

A common resident breeding species on both the mainland and islands: large flocks may occur, especially in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max count received of 55 at the Lingerton landfill site *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan, elsewhere counts on 1-24 birds.

Summer/breeding Prs and displaying birds noted from Jan. Data from the ARSG; of 60 Argyll sites checked they produced a min of 54 young and 3.06 young per successful nest.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts included; 97 at Lingerton landfill site, Mid-Argyll on 12 Nov, 80 going to roost at Bridgend Islay on 9 Nov, 60 at An Crosan, nr Loch Assapol Mull on 6 Sep and 32 Heylipol Tiree on 26 Aug.

BOHEMIAN WAXWING* Bombycilla garrulous

An irruptive winter visitor in varying numbers: not seen every year but some large influxes have occurred recently.

Winter/spring A 2cy was in Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Jan and an adult male was at Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* on 20-24 Apr.

Autumn/winter No reports.

COAL TIT Periparus ater

A widespread and abundant resident breeder: except on Coll and Tiree. Found almost exclusively in woodland: especially conifers.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Tiree*). Generally, 1-4 birds noted however 12 at Colonsay House *Colonsay* on 9 Jan and 6 at Inverchapel *Cowal* on 7 Feb.

Summer/breeding On Mull 25 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park in Apr-Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally, up to 10 birds at sites. On *Tiree* 2 were at The Glebe, Scarinish on 12 Oct, then an island record of 4 there on 13 Oct and 1 at Heylipol Church on 12 Dec.

EURASIAN BLUE TIT Cyanistes caeruleus

A widespread and common resident breeder: an infrequent visitor to Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Tiree*). All reports of 1-6 birds however 26 birds at Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* on a lawn, mostly gathering moss on 14 Feb.

Summer/breeding Generally, 1-8 birds noted at sites and first fledglings noted on 10 Jun in *Mid*-Argyll. 39 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park *Mull* in Apr-Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally, up to 8 birds at sites. On *Tiree* 4 arrived at Balephuil on 14 Oct with Yellow-browed Warblers, and an island record of 6 there on 17-19 Oct with 2 remaining to 3 Dec and 1 into 2021 at Crossapol.

GREAT TIT Parus major

A widespread and common resident breeder: only an infrequent visitor to Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Jura/Tiree). All reports of 1-7 birds.

Summer/breeding On *Mull* 25 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park in Apr-Jun. Fledged birds noted from 10 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura/Tiree). All reports of only 1-5 birds.

EURASIAN SKYLARK Alauda arvensis

RED LIST A widespread breeding species: common in some areas. Many emigrate in winter, with remaining birds mainly in coastal and low-lying localities.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Mostly from 'sites' in; *Mull* (17 cf at 76 sites in 2019), *Mid-Argyll* (14), *Kintyre* (10) and *Islay* (7). Only three reports in Jan. Returning flocks noted from late Feb with 400 at Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 28 Feb also 200 >SE there on 2 Mar, 90 >N at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 2 Mar, 62 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Feb and 114 there on 11 Mar, 264 at Ardlarach, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Mar and 500 at High Ranachan, N of Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 29 Mar. Singing was noted on calmer days from *Cowal* and *Tiree* from early Mar.

Summer/breeding Little specific breeding data. Around the Moine Mhor area Mid-Argyll 4 Ters at Dalnahasaig, 5 at Dalvore and 4 at Dunadd in May-Jun. Fledged juvs noted around Keills Mid-Argyll from 2 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Visible migration noted from early Sep with small groups >S across *Tiree*. Most birds departing during Sep and early Oct. Higher counts in late Sep e.g. 260 Balephetrish *Tiree* on 28 Sep. Smaller nos during Nov with max counts of 50 at Sunderland *Islay* on 12 Nov, 80 at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 15 Nov and 70 at Heylipol *Tiree* on 26 Nov. No reports received in Dec.

SAND MARTIN Riparia riparia

AMBER LIST A summer visitor: localised breeding species and passage migrant. All breeding records required.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). First arrivals noted; 3 at Loch Leathan *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Mar, 4 at Calliburn *Kintyre* on 26 Mar, 1 at Dervaig *Mull* on 27 Mar. More widespread from 28 Mar when 60 at Dalvore, Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll*.

Summer/breeding Limited data on breeding colonies received. On *Tiree* 127 AOBs at 8 sites, most Loch a' Phuill (80+ AOBs), 4 AOBs Kiloran dunes *Colonsay*, 30 AOBs Auchgoyle Cottage *Cowal*, 300+ Langa Quarry *Kintyre* (noted as big increase from 2019), 12 AOBs Dunadd *Mid-Argyll* and 20 AOBs Connel *North Argyll*.

Autumn Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Most birds had departed by mid-Sep. Highest counts of 40 at Carnan Mor *Tiree* on 3 Sep and 30 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 7 Aug. Last report was of 2 at Castle Sween *Mid-Argyll* on 2 Oct.

BARN SWALLOW Hirundo rustica

A widespread, common, summer visitor and passage migrant.

Spring Reports from all areas. A very early bird at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Feb seen flying low into a strong cold wind. More typical early arrivals were 1 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 24 Mar then 1 at Dervaig *Mull* on 4 Apr with more widespread arrivals from 5 Apr. Higher counts noted were 25 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Apr and 20 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 5 Apr.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. First broods on *Tiree* noted on 30 Jun. Young were still in nest at Auchgoyle *Cowal* on 13 Sep and gone by 27 Sep.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 80 at Drimvore *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Aug, 70 at The Reef *Tiree* on 4 Sep, 65 at Sandaig *Tiree* on 19 Aug and 50 at Ardnave Point *Islay* on 27

Sep. Most birds had departed by end of Sep, smaller nos until mid-Oct and scattered reports of 4 singles in Nov with last reports at Dervaig *Mull* on 26 Nov and at Kildalloig *Kintyre* on 30 Nov.

COMMON HOUSE MARTIN Delichon urbicum

AMBER LIST A common summer visitor on the mainland: less numerous on the islands with only one recently recorded breeding attempt on Tiree.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). First reports; 4 at Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 6 Apr, 1 at Dervaig *Mull* on 8 Apr and 6 at North Connel *North Argyll* on 9 Apr. Most arrivals were after 12 Apr and more widespread across Argyll from early May. Higher counts included 40 at Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 9 May and 22 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 7 May.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. Most site reports (usually houses) with 1-4 nests however 16 nests at Ugadale Hotel *Kintyre*. A nest at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* was successful and produced 2+ fledged young.

Autumn Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Max count of 40 at Java Point Mull on 1 Aug, 40 at Kames Cowal on 6 Sep and 30 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 30 Aug. 16 feeding at Carnan Mor on 22 Aug was a record count for Tiree. Most birds had departed by end of Sep. Last reports were 3 at Bruichladdich Islay on 6 Oct and 5 at Port Righ Kintyre on 11 Oct.

LONG-TAILED TIT Aegithalos caudatus

A widespread and fairly common resident: scarce on Colonsay and a rare visitor to Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Tiree). Most counts of 1-8 birds and six counts of 10 or more birds from mostly at sites in Mid-Argyll (16) and Cowal (9). Max counts of 15 at Dalsmirren Kintyre on 8 Jan, 13 at Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll on 1 Jan and 12 at Kilmory Castle Mid-Argyll on 25 Jan.

Summer/breeding On Mull 7 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park in Apr-Jun. An adult was carrying food in Mid-Argyll on 10 Jun and fledged juvs noted on Mull on 19 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura/Tiree*). Most counts of 1-12 birds and mostly from sites in *Mid-Argyll* (11) and *Mull* (8). Max counts of 16 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Oct, 15 at Craignure *Mull* on 2 Nov, 14 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 2 Oct, and 14 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 30 Dec.

WOOD WARBLER Phylloscopus sibilatrix

RED LIST A scarce but widely distributed summer visitor to mature broadleaved woodlands. Infrequent on Islay and Jura and only occurs as a rare passage migrant on Coll and Tiree. Spring/summer/breeding Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll). First reports at Taynish and Barnakill Mid-Argyll on 25 Apr and at Glenfinart Cowal on 27 Apr. Singing males reported from 'sites' in; Cowal (3), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (11) and Mull (3). A passage bird was at Meningie Tiree on 6 May.

Autumn One was at Kinnabus, The Oa Islay on 21 Jul.

HUME'S LEAF WARBLER* Phylloscopus humei

No previous Argyll records. A rare late autumn visitor to the Britain from breeding grounds of inner Asian mountain forests and winters in parts of Arabia to India.

Autumn One was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 31 Oct-3 Nov [J Bowler, J Hunter]. Record was accepted by the BBRC.

This bird arrived during a southerly gale and heavy rain on 31 Oct and did not allow conclusive views until 2 Nov when it was also photographed and was heard calling on 3 Nov. This becomes the first Argyll record.

YELLOW-BROWED WARBLER* Phylloscopus inornatus

A scarce autumn migrant from east of the Urals: at least 90 records between 1954 and 2019, the majority on Tiree.

Autumn A new Argyll record total of at least 37 birds – previous high total of 23 birds in 2016. The first single of the autumn was at Heylipol *Tiree* on 27 Sep and the last report was of 2 at RSPB Gruinart woodland/moorland trail *Islay* on 30 Oct. Reports from *Coll* with singles at Sorisdale on 30 Sep, Totamore on 5 Oct and 2 at The Lodge plantation, Arinagour on 10 Oct; *Islay* with a total of at least 16 birds, with 8 across five sites on The Oa on 4-17 Oct, at Finlaggan on 6 Oct, up to 3 at RSPB Loch Gruinart woods/farm on 6-30 Oct and at Bridgend on 22 Oct; *Mull* with a single at Lochdon on 20 Oct; *Tiree* with at least 16 birds across six sites on 27 Sep-27 Oct, with peaks of 5 at Balephuil on 3 & 8-12 Oct and 3 at The Glebe/Manse, Scarinish on 3 & 10 Oct. No reports from *Colonsay, Cowal, Jura, Kintyre, Mid* or *North Argyll*.

DUSKY WARBLER* Phylloscopus fuscatus

No previous Argyll records. A rare late autumn visitor to Scotland from Siberian breeding areas and winters in Nepal, India and eastern Asia.

Autumn One was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 14 Oct [J Bowler, J Hunter]. Record was accepted by the SBRC. (Article: **Scottish Birds** Vol 41 (1) March 2021 pp 86 -89)

The bird was located by call and then seen and photographed but was very skulking. It arrived after strong NE winds on 13 Oct along with arrivals of thrush species and Brambling. This becomes the first Argyll record.

WILLOW WARBLER Phylloscopus trochilus

AMBER LIST A widespread and abundant summer visitor.

Spring Reports from all areas. First arrival was an early male in song (our earliest) at Craignure *Mull* on 22 Mar and the next not until 1 at Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Apr. More widespread arrivals from 7 Apr. Higher counts of 30 at Loch Frisa *Mull* on 16 Apr and a remarkable count of 100+ at Machrihanish airbase site *Kintyre* involving migrant birds on 17 Apr.

Summer/breeding Singing males widespread across Argyll from mid-Apr. Higher counts and Ters included; 38-40 Ters/singing males on a full survey of Aros Park *Mull* in Apr-Jun, 32 tot birds at Kilmichael Forest BBS *Mid-Argyll*, 21 birds at Bellanoch BBS *Mid-Argyll*, 17 birds at Rhudle BBS *Mid-Argyll* and 10 Ters at 5 sites on *Tiree*. Brood/4 noted on *Tiree* on 24 Jun.

Autumn/winter Number of reports decreased during Aug with few reports by end of Sep. Last report was a juv at Balephuil *Tiree* on 3 Oct. A bird thought to be this species, but unconfirmed, was at RSPB Totronald *Coll* on 30 Dec.

COMMON CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita

A summer visitor and local breeding species: occasionally recorded in winter. More frequent on passage on some of the islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). No winter reports. First arrivals of singles at Inverneill *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Mar, at Cullipool, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Mar and at Machrihanish airfield site *Kintyre* on 24 Mar. More widespread arrivals from 25 Mar. One at Aros Park *Mull* on 30 Apr was thought to be of the Scandinavian race *abietinus*.

Summer/breeding Reports at 'sites' in; *Colonsay* (n/a), *Cowal* (23), *Islay* (3), *Kintyre* (5), *Mid-Argyll* (20), *Mull* (6), *North Argyll* (7) and *Tiree* (1). Five in song/Ters along the Crinan Canal *Mid-Argyll* between Cairnbaan and Crinan Wood on 10 Apr.

Autumn/winter Local birds departed during Aug to mid-Sep then reports mainly from the island areas. A max count of 8 at Colonsay Hotel *Colonsay* on 24 Sep. Elsewhere, just 1-3 birds reported and last report of 1 on Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Nov. Two at Balephuil *Tiree* on 11 Oct were of the Scandinavian race *abietinus*.

'SIBERIAN' CHIFFCHAFF* Phylloscopus collybita tristis

A rare visitor: an eastern race of Chiffchaff, still regarded as a sub-species of Common Chiffchaff, rather than a distinct separate species. Rare in Argyll, although small numbers of this race occur during late autumn in Scotland.

Autumn Singles were at Balephuil Tiree on 11-12 Oct and 19 Oct [John Bowler].

SEDGE WARBLER Acrocephalus schoenobaenus A locally common summer visitor, breeding in suitable habitats.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First arrivals of 1 at Balvicar Lagoon, Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Apr, 2 at Ostel Bay *Cowal* on 21 Apr and 1 at Dervaig *Mull* on 21 Apr, thereafter more widespread arrivals from 22 Apr.

Summer/breeding On *Islay* (n/c) at RSPB Loch Gruinart. 20 Ters at Machrihanish airbase site *Kintyre* on 3 May with good nos fledged juvs in Jun. 15 Ters between Carnan Mor and Loch a' Phuill on 6 May with 12 Ters at Balephuil *Tiree* alone on 8 May. Six in song along the Crinan Canal *Mid-Argyll* between Cairnbaan and Lochgilphead on 8 May.

Autumn Most birds departed during Aug to early Sep and last 2 were at Balephuil *Tiree* on 19-20 Sep.

MARSH WARBLER* Acrocephalus palustris

RED LIST A rare passage migrant: Five records; all on Tiree with one at Balephuil on 8-10 Jun 2007, one at Carnan Mor on 28 May 2012, one at Mannal, Tiree on 28 May 2014, one at The Glebe, Scarinish on 4 Jun 2016 and one at Balephuil on 3 Jun 2018.

Autumn A 1cy was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 19 Sep [J Bowler]. Record was accepted by the SBRC. This becomes the first autumn record for Argyll.

ICTERINE WARBLER* Hippolais icterina

A rare passage migrant: Six records; Islay 28 Aug 1976; Taynuilt in Jun 1984; Tiree in Jun 1987, Islay on 4 to 5 Sep 1993, Tiree on 9 Jun 2016 and 7 Sep 2018.

Spring An adult was at Meningie, Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 21 May [J Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON GRASSHOPPER WARBLER Locustella naevia

RED LIST A summer visitor: breeding locally in open habitats with dense ground vegetation, including young conifer plantations. Numbers fluctuate from year to year.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). First arrivals of 'reeling' birds at Ardfern *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Apr, 3 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Apr, 1 at Portnahaven *Islay* on 14 Apr and 1 at Glen Lean *Cowal* on 15 Apr, thereafter widespread arrivals across Argyll from 17 Apr.

Summer/breeding Most reports of singing males e.g. at least 10 Ters on partial survey *Colonsay*, 8 Ters at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* and at least 8 Ters around Moine Mhor NNR *Mid-Argyll* area. A fledged juv was noted at Balephuil *Tiree* on 13 Jul. One was still in song at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Jul.

Autumn Reports decreased during Jul and last report was of 1 at Ballachuan Loch, Seil Mid-Argyll on 11 Aug.

EURASIAN BLACKCAP Sylvia atricapilla

A common summer visitor and regular passage migrant especially in autumn: an increasing number winter in Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Winter reports of a male at Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 1-8 Jan and a male at Tobermory *Mull* on 29 Jan. First arrivals of 2 ff at Balephuil *Tiree* on 5 Apr then from more widespread locations from 6 Apr. Max count of 7 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 23-25 Apr.

Summer/breeding Widespread reports of males in song across Argyll with most in mainland areas particularly Mid-Argyll where high densities. 24-29 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park Mull in Apr-Jun. Six in song along the Crinan Canal between Cairnbaan and Bellanoch Mid-Argyll on 16 Apr and 9 in song between Cairnbaan and Lochgilphead Mid-Argyll on 8 May, also 5 in song at Blarantibert, Bellanoch Mid-Argyll on 25 Apr. A male was in song at Balephuil Tiree during Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports of 1-3 birds across Argyll, with an increase in records during Oct and max counts of 6 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 15-16 Sep and 5 at Port Charlotte *Islay* on 19 Nov. Only seven reports in Nov and last report of 1 at Tobermory *Mull* on 16 Dec.

GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

A scarce but increasing summer visitor: breeding in woodland and scrub habitats.

Spring/summer/breeding Reported from 'sites' in: Colonsay (1), Cowal (6), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (10), Mull (2), North Argyll (1) and Tiree (2). First arrivals of singles at Machrihanish airfield Kintyre on 24 Apr, Black Crofts North Argyll on 27 Apr and Striven Cowal on 28 Apr. Most arrivals during first week of May. On Tiree single migrants were at Balephuil on 21 May and at The Glebe on 1 Jun. Highest density of singing birds noted in Mid-Argyll with 5 in song along the Crinan Canal between Cairnbaan and Bellanoch and 2 in song between Cairnbaan and Lochgilphead with 2 Ters. A nest with 4 eggs found at Blarantiberth, Bellanoch Mid-Argyll on 25 May. A male was in sub-song at Balephuil Tiree on 21 Jul.

Autumn Four reports on *Tiree* between 28 Aug and the last Argyll sighting at Hynish on 30 Sep.

LESSER WHITETHROAT* Sylvia curruca

A rare/scarce passage migrant in both spring and autumn: most recent records have been from the islands.

Spring One was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 14 May.

Autumn At least four singles, all *Tiree*, were at Balephuil on 10-17 Sep, another there on 19-24 Sep, at Meningie on 11 Oct and prob same bird at Balephuil on 12 Oct, and another at The Glebe, Scarinish on 15 Oct. A 'probable' was at The Glebe on 17 Sep.

COMMON WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis

A summer visitor with numbers fluctuating from year to year: breeding is most widespread in low lying areas, particularly in coastal scrub.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll*). First arrivals of 1 at Innellan *Cowal* on 17 Apr and 2 at Bardrishaig, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Apr, then more widespread arrivals from 20 Apr.

Breeding/summer Reported from 'sites' in *Mid-Argyll* (21), *Mull* (15), *Cowal* (13) and *Kintyre* (5). On *Islay* 36 Ters at RSPB Loch Gruinart. In *Kintyre* 10 in song at Machrihanish airbase site on 3 May with good nos of fledged birds there in Jun. On *Tiree* birds in song at Balephuil, Carnan Mor and Heylipol in May-Jun and a pr bred at The Glebe, Scarinish feeding young in the nest on 17 Jun and with 3 fledged juvs on 6 Jul.

Autumn Reports decreased during Aug and most birds had departed by early Sep. Last reports of singles at Balephuil *Tiree* on 15 Sep, Laphroaig *Islay* on 29 Sep and a late bird at The Oa *Islay* on 21 Oct.

FIRECREST* Regulus ignicapilla

A rare visitor with only eight previous Argyll records. The last record on Tiree in 2010. Autumn A male was at Balephuil Tiree on 9 & 15 Nov [J Bowler, J Hunter]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

GOLDCREST Regulus regulus

A common resident breeding species: augmented by passage migrants in spring and especially autumn but scarce on Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-2 birds from sites and max counts (passage) of 8 at Balephuil/Carnan Mor *Tiree* on 31 Mar.

Summer/breeding 34 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park *Mull* in Apr-Jun. Singing birds noted from late Mar. Higher counts included 6 at Laphroaig *Islay*, Taynuilt *Mid-Argyll* and at Loch Frisa *Mull*

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas with counts of only 1-8 birds. Max counts of 8 at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 20 Sep. First migrant on *Tiree* was 1 at Balephuil on 15 Sep and max of 3 there on 23-26 Sep with 1 lingering to 31 Dec.

WREN Troglodytes troglodytes

A common resident breeder in all areas: numbers often decline following hard winters; additional birds winter on the islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-5 birds at sites. Birds singing from mid-Mar. *Summer/breeding* On *Mull* 73-85 Ters at Aros Park. On *Tiree* 30 Ters at 16 sites on 1 May (a high total). In *Mid-Argyll* at BBS sites singing males in Jun with; 34 birds at Blarbuie, Kilmichael Forest, 25 at Bellanoch and 12 at Rhudle Mill. On *Coll* at least 3 Ters at The Lodge, Arinagour on 11 May. On *Tiree* fledged b/6 on 23 Jun and b/9 on 31 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-6 birds noted at sites and a max of 7 at Laphroaig woods *Islay* on 2 Nov.

EURASIAN NUTHATCH Sitta europaea

A rare but increasing visitor: currently spreading north and west in Scotland.

All year Becoming more established and recorded in all months with most reports in spring. Most reports from birds noted at 'sites' in Cowal (14), Mid-Argyll (25), Mull (5) and North Argyll (3).

In addition, the first record for *Islay* was at Bunnahabhain on 2 Jun. All reports are encouraged, and an Argyll is survey underway during spring 2021.

EURASIAN TREECREEPER Certhia familiaris

A widespread and fairly common resident: rare on Tiree and Coll.

Winter/spring Reports of 1-2 birds from 'sites' in *Cowal* (8) *Islay* (10), *Kintyre* (2), *Mid-Argyll* (12) and *Mull* (7). Max count of 6 nr Salen *Mull* on 7 May. Birds noted signing from mid-Feb.

Summer/breeding A complete survey of Aros Park Mull with at least 9 Ters.

Autumn/winter Reports of mostly singles from 'sites' in *Cowal* (4) *Islay* (2), *Mid-Argyll* (7) and *Mull* (6). Max count of 6+ at Laphroaig woods *Islay* on 6 Nov.

ROSY STARLING* Pastor roseus

A rare summer and autumn visitor: More frequent in recent years.

Spring/summer/autumn Reports of at least 8 birds. A male was at Torrisdale *Kintyre* on 2-5 Jun [V Cannell], a prob male was at Friesland *Coll* on 4 Jun [M Mitchell], an unsexed bird was at Bowmore *Islay* on 18 Jun-28 Oct [J & R McGowan, G Turnbull *et al*], an unsexed bird was on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 22 Jun-1 Jul [A Knight *et al*], a male was at Blackmill Bay, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 25-29 Jun [V Johnson, J & S Blackwell *et al*], a male was at Uisken *Mull* on 29 Jun-1

Jul [D Holden, B Rains *et al*], an unsexed bird was at Port Righ, Carradale *Kintyre* on 13 Jul [J McKinnon, A Charlwood] and a male was at Ardfern *Mid-Argyll* on 15-17 Jul [J & C Brown]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

COMMON STARLING Sturnus vulgaris

RED LIST A common resident on: Coll, Islay, part of Kintyre, and Tiree, less common on most of the mainland. Flocks containing juveniles appear in many parts in late summer and numbers are boosted by immigration in winter from north-west Europe.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Largest flocks noted in *Kintyre, Islay and Tiree*. Several flocks of 400-1,200 birds across *Tiree* in Jan-Mar, 800 at Bleachfield *Kintyre* on 9 Jan and up to 500 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* in Feb and 300 at West Carrabus *Islay* in Jan.

Summer/breeding Flocks of juveniles built up in numbers from mid-Jun, with highest counts from *Tiree* where flocks of up to 600 at several sites and max counts of 800 at Hough on 21 Jun and at Meningie on 28 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Largest flocks generally noted in *Kintyre, Islay and Tiree*. Many flocks on *Tiree* of 300-900 and max counts of 1,700 at Ruaig on 9 Oct and 1,100 at Heylipol on 27 Oct. Several flocks of 150-600 reported from *Kintyre* and max counts of 1,000 at West Parkfergus on 24 Oct and 800 at Machrihanish SBO on 23 Sep. On *Islay* several flocks up to 600, and 903 birds counted using the Bruichladdich pier to roost on 18 Oct.

RING OUZEL* Turdus torquatus

RED LIST A summer visitor; breeding very locally in upland areas but declining in numbers: more widespread, though still very scarce, on migration. All records required please.

Spring/summer A male was at Meall Dhub, Beinn Mhor Cowal on 12 Jun.

Breeding Likely breeding at Beinn Buidhe, Glen Fyne *Mid-Argyll* where 3-4 birds on 3 Aug. **Autumn** A 1cy was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 15 Oct. One was at Bruichladdich *Islay* on 25 Oct.

COMMON BLACKBIRD Turdus merula

A widespread breeding species: common and locally abundant resident. There is immigration in winter and noticeable autumn passage in some years with some remaining during winter. Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally low nos of only 1-5 birds and a max count of 10

at Dervaig Mull on 26 Mar.

Summer/breeding Limited data. 36 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park *Mull* in Apr-Jun. Present Eilean Mor, McCormaig Is., *Mid-Argyll*. First fledged birds on *Tiree* from 20 May. At Tayvallich *Mid-Argyll* 6 males "lekking" on lawn watched by 8 fems on 6 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Generally, reports of 1-10 birds. An influx from mid-Oct onwards with 40 at Oakfield, Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Oct, 18 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 15 Oct and 16 at Laphroaig *Islay* on 12 Nov.

FIELDFARE Turdus pilaris

RED LIST A passage migrant and winter visitor: abundant in autumn but relatively few remain in winter or passing through in spring.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Generally low nos of 1-25 with highest counts of; 100 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Jan, 50 at Kilfinan *Cowal* on 15 Jan and 50 at Feorlin *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Mar. Last report was 4 at Bridge of Orchy *North Argyll* on 21 Apr.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura/North Argyll). First arrival was 12 at Machrihanish airbase site Kintyre on 20 Sep, and main arrivals during 12-22 Oct. Max counts included; 1,000 at Southend Kintyre on 26 Oct, 500 at The Oa Islay on 18 Oct, 350 at Lochead,

Knapdale *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Oct, 170+ at Clunach *Islay* on 1 Nov, 140 at Bleachfield *Kintyre* on 22 Nov, 120 at Kilmichael Glen *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Nov and 120 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 14 Oct. Most birds had moved on by late Nov and only one report in Dec.

REDWING Turdus iliacus

RED LIST A passage migrant and winter visitor: abundant in autumn but relatively few remain during winter. Occasional individuals are recorded in late spring or summer. The species bred on Mull in 1991 but there have been no subsequent breeding records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally widespread, with low numbers of 1-30 birds and higher counts of only 100 at Portnahaven *Islay* on 9 Apr, 100 at Ruaig *Tiree* on 15 Apr and 70 at Ford *Mid-Argyll* on 8 Apr. Few reports during Apr and last report was 1 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 4-5 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*). A very early arrival, or perhaps a bird that had summered, at Cornaigbeg *Tiree* on 30 Aug. More typical arrivals with 1 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 27 Sep and 3 at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 27 Sep. Most arrivals between 10 Oct to early Nov. Higher counts included 3,000 across *Tiree* on 22 Oct, 1,800 at The Oa *Islay* on 24 Oct, 1,100 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 22 Oct, 600 at Dunadd *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Oct and 460 at Lochead, Knapdale *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Oct. Most birds had moved through by mid-Nov.

SONG THRUSH Turdus philomelos

RED LIST A widespread and common resident breeding species with some locally bred birds departing in the autumn. There is a noticeable autumn passage, with other birds arriving for the winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, reports of only 1-4 birds with a max of only 6 at Daill *Islay* on 13 Feb and 6 at Kirnan, Kilmichael Glen *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Feb.

Summer/breeding Limited data reported. 16-18 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park *Mull* in Apr-Jun. 30 Ters on *Tiree* in May where first fledged birds on 4 May. 6 Ters along the Crinan Canal from Cairnbaan to Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* in May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Only small numbers noted, generally of 1-5 birds and a max of only 10 at Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 7 Nov, 10 at West Hynish *Tiree* on 7 Nov and 8 at Keillbeg, Loch na Cille *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Aug.

MISTLE THRUSH Turdus viscivorus

RED LIST A widespread but thinly distributed resident breeding species. On Coll and Tiree it is only an occasional visitor. Flocks are sometimes seen on passage.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Generally, sightings of 1-2 birds, and reported from 'sites' in; Cowal (12), Mull (11) Mid-Argyll (8), Islay (6), Kintyre (3) and North Argyll (2). Max counts of only 8 at Kirnan, Kilmichael Glen Mid-Argyll on 26 Feb and 6 at Mingary Mull on 13 Mar. One was at Beinn Hough Tiree on 24 Feb.

Summer/breeding Limited data reported. Fledged young noted in Mid-Argyll from 6 Jun. Higher counts of 25 at Loch Finlaggan Islay on 17 Jul and 18 at Ardentallen, Loch Feochan Mid-Argyll on 19 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura/North Argyll). Most reports were of 1-12 birds. Max counts of 46 Keills Hill, Loch na Cille Mid-Argyll on 21 Aug, 15 at Crinan Ferry Mid-Argyll on 9 Aug and 15 at Mingary Mull on 24 Sep.

SPOTTED FLYCATCHER Muscicapa striata

RED LIST A summer visitor breeding widely, but sparsely, in mature woodlands; particularly where there are gaps in the canopy or along edges. Regular passage migrant on the islands.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). An early first report was one at Ballymeanoch, N of Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Apr, then 1 at Minard *Mid-Argyll* on 2 May and several reports from *Mid-Argyll* on 5 May, including birds at 4 sites around the Moine Mhor NNR. Migrant birds on *Tiree* reported on 6 May-26 Jun, with a peak of 7 on 21 May.

Breeding summer Most reports from breeding areas came from 'sites' in *Islay* (1), *Mid-Argyll* (35), *Mull* (8), *Cowal* (5) and *North Argyll* (4). A min of 9 Ters around the Moine Mhor NNR *Mid-Argyll*, 8-10 Ters on full survey of Aros Park *Mull* Apr-Jun. First eggs laid on 17 May at Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* and birds fledged there on 15 Jun.

Autumn Local breeding birds had departed by 18 Aug. Only migrant was 1 at An Airidh Tiree on 9 Oct.

EUROPEAN ROBIN Erithacus rubecula

A widespread and common resident breeder: a migrant only on Tiree. Small numbers now breed regularly on Coll. Autumn passage is noticeable on the islands with many migrants overwintering.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, only 1-4 birds at sites. Max count of 9 at Arduaine Gardens *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Feb.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. A min of 54 Ters during a full survey of Aros Park Mull Apr-Jun. First fledged birds noted on 10 May at Cullipool, Luing Mid-Argyll.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Most reports of 1-6 birds. Max counts of 20 at Scalasaig *Colonsay* on 26 Sep and 12+ at Laphroaig *Islay* on 27 Sep.

EUROPEAN PIED FLYCATCHER* Ficedula hypoleuca

RED LIST A scarce summer visitor and passage migrant breeding very locally in oak woods in parts of the mainland and possibly Mull. An increase in the breeding population in the 1990s-2000s was attributable to the Argyll Bird Club nest-box scheme but numbers have since

declined; possibly due to Pine Marten predation of boxes, with no confirmed breeding records in recent years. Rare but near-annual on passage on the islands, especially Tiree.

Spring/breeding First report was a male in song at Ballymeanoch, N of Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Apr where it remained in song until 20 May. A male was at Aros Park, Tobermory *Mull* on 16 Apr. A male was at Castle Lachlan *Cowal* from 6-25 May. A male was nr Carradale *Cowal* on 10 May and a male was at Lephenstrath, nr Southend *Kintyre* on 1-4 Jun. *A good show of reports this spring*.

Autumn Four different single 1cy birds were at Balephuil *Tiree* on; 16 Aug, 19 Aug, 27-28 Aug and on 20 Sep. A 1cy was at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 27 Sep.

RED-BREASTED FLYCATCHER* Ficedula parva

A rare passage migrant: Thirteen records; on Islay in Nov 1974 and Oct 1975, Colonsay and Gigha in 2010, two singles on Tiree in Oct 2012, two in Jun and two Sep/Oct on Tiree in 2014, singles on Tiree in Oct 2016, Sep 2017 and Oct 2019.

Autumn A fem/2cy male was at Balephuil Tiree on 12 Jun [J Bowler, J Hunter]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

BLACK REDSTART* Phoenicurus ochuros

RED LIST A less than annual passage migrant: most records have been in spring (late Mar to May) or late autumn (Oct to mid-Nov).

Winter/spring Fem/imm types were at Kinnabus, The Oa Islay on 17 Apr and at Balinoe Tiree on 1 Jun.

Autumn/winter Fem/imm types were at Totronald *Coll* on 3 Nov and at the Finlaggan visitor centre *Islay* on 13 Nov.

COMMON REDSTART Phoenicurus phoenicurus

AMBER LIST A summer visitor: locally common in open woodland. It is a scarce passage migrant on: Coll, Colonsay, Islay and Tiree.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from only (Cowal/Mid-Argyll/Mull). First reports were singles at St Catherine's Cowal on 13 Apr and Crinan Ferry Mid-Argyll on 18 Apr. Most arrivals from 21 Apr onwards. Most 'reports of birds' from Mid-Argyll (8), Cowal (8) and Mull (4). A pr with fledged young at Barsloisnoch Mid-Argyll on 10 Jun and 6 (family) were at Fearnoch, Taynuilt Mid-Argyll on 20 Jun.

Autumn A male at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 20 Sep was the only autumn report.

WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra

RED LIST A sparse but widespread, summer visitor.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree*). First arrival of singles at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 14 Apr (with 7 there on 18 Apr), at Arduaine *Mid-Argyll* and Stronafian *Cowal* on 21 Apr, at Machrihanish airbase *Kintyre* on 23 Apr and 3 at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Apr. More widespread arrivals after 25 Apr. Most reports from 'sites' in *Mid-Argyll* (17), *Cowal* (6) and *Mull* (6).

Breeding/summer On *Islay* 17 Ters were at RSPB Loch Gruinart. In *Mid-Argyll* 9-10 Ters at the Moine Mhor area in May and in *Cowal* 6+ Ters in the Stronafian/Craigendive area. Fledged birds noted in *Mid-Argyll* from early Jun.

Autumn Reports decreased during Aug, and only a few reports of juvs on *Islay* at the end of Aug with 4 juvs still at Craigens, Gruinart in early Sep. Last report of 1 at The Oa *Islay* on 11 Oct.

EUROPEAN STONECHAT Saxicola torquatus

A widespread resident, but some leave breeding areas during winter. Numbers can decline dramatically after severe winters.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds from numerous widespread sites and a max count of 8 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Feb. Prs noted from mid-Mar.

Summer/breeding On Tiree 15 Ters at 12 sites in Apr-May. On Islay 15 Ters at RSPB Loch Gruinart. In Kintyre 6 Ters at Machrihanish airfield in May-Jun. In Mid-Argyll 10+ Ters at the Moine Mhor area in Apr. First fledged young noted at Dalvore, Moine Mhor Mid-Argyll on 1 May. Max count of 10 nr Craignure Mull on 21 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-6 birds from numerous widespread sites and a max count of 8 at Craigens *Islay* on 28 Aug. Reports from only 3 sites in Dec out-with *Tiree*.

NORTHERN WHEATEAR *Oenanthe oenanthe*

A common summer visitor; and passage migrant.

Spring Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*) Strong arrivals last week of Mar. First reports from *Mull* where 3 at Loch na Keal on 21 Mar, then 3 at Danna Island *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Mar, 3 nr Machrihanish airbase site *Kintyre* on 23 Mar and 1 at Keillbeg *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Mar. Max counts noted were 8 at Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 26 Mar, 30 on 11 Apr, 49 on 24 Apr and 80 on 3 May.

Summer/breeding Widespread breeding mainly on the islands (*Islay/Tiree*) in low numbers. First fledglings at Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 30 May and on *Tiree* on 24 Jun.

Autumn Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Most reports from *Tiree* where an influx of 'Greenland' birds, and *Kintyre* where a max of 30 nr Machrihanish airbase site on 8 Aug. Elsewhere, only 1-3 birds noted at sites. Last report was of 4 singles across *Tiree* on 1 Oct.

'GREENLAND' WHEATEAR Oenanthe. o. leucorhoa

A scarce passage migrant: probably under-recorded.

Spring Only 1-3 birds at sites on (*Islay, Kintyre, Mid-Argyll/Tiree*) between 16 Apr - 6 May. *Autumn* First bird noted on *Tiree* on 14 Aug and an obvious influx from 27 Aug and 60+ counted across *Tiree* on 28 Aug, also good numbers in Sep with up to 15 noted from sites across *Tiree*. A 'significant' passage noted from the N coast of *Coll* on 30 Sep, however no counts given.

WHITE-THROATED DIPPER Cinclus cinclus

AMBER LIST A widespread resident breeder but scarce on Islay and generally absent from: Coll, Colonsay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from only (Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll). Noted at 36 sites in total, mostly1-2 birds, however 3 on one occasion. Under reported from most areas. Breeding Birds noted singing in Jan and at nest sites from Mar. Food being taken to a nest in Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll on 23 Apr and fledged young being fed at Millhouse Cowal on 22 May. Autumn/winter Reports from only (Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll). Noted at 18 sites and of 1-2 birds. Under reported from most areas.

HOUSE SPARROW Passer domesticus

RED LIST A resident breeding bird commonly associated with human habitation. Distribution is rather localised in sparsely inhabited areas. Larger flocks gather in late summer and autumn where traditional agriculture persists.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Largest counts included; 40 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 31 Jan, 40 at Bruichladdich *Islay* on 3 Feb and 30 at Strachur *Cowal* on 3 Jan.

Summer/breeding First fledged birds noted at Bridgend Mid-Argyll on 16 Apr. Several flocks of 40-90 around Tiree, 55 at Ferryfield, Connel North Argyll on 6 Aug, 40 at Bridgend Mid-Argyll

on 5 Jun and 40 at Dunaverty Bay *Kintyre* on 12 Jul. Counts elsewhere generally of less than 20 birds.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Largest counts mainly on *Tiree* where many flocks of 40-90 birds and a max of 120 at Ruaig on 7 Oct. 100 were at Port Gerrard, Glenbarr *Kintyre* on 30 Sep and 70 at Strath, Laggan *Kintyre* on 30 Sep.

EURASIAN TREE SPARROW* Passer montanus

RED LIST Nowadays mostly a very scarce migrant but after a gap of nearly 30 years breeding was recorded on Islay in 2009.

Spring One made occasional appearances in a garden at Cullipool, Luing Mid-Argyll on 19 Feb - 27 May.

Autumn Singles were at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 24 Oct and at Bowmore Islay on 27 Oct.

DUNNOCK Prunella modularis

AMBER LIST A widespread resident breeder although nowhere numerous. It is scarce on Coll and Jura and does not breed on Tiree. Recent observations would suggest that birds are quite frequent in pre-thicket/thicket conifer plantations as well as in more traditional habitats. Increased numbers in autumn presumably relate to migrants.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds noted. Most reports from Cowal, Mid-Argyll and Mull.

Summer/breeding Singing birds noted from early Mar. First fledglings noted at Bridgend Mid-Argyll on 5 May. First confirmed breeding on Tiree where a pr fledged 2 young in Jun. Present on Eilean Mor, McCormaig Is, Sound of Jura in Jun. At Aros Park Mull a full survey gave 13-16 Ters.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas, with most reports from *Cowal, Islay, Mid-Argyll* and *Mull* generally of 1-5 birds.

WESTERN YELLOW WAGTAIL* Motacilla flava

RED LIST A scarce passage migrant: birds of the Blue-headed race M. f. flava occur from time to time, and there have been at least two records of the Grey-headed race M. f. thunbergi (in 1985 and 2005).

Autumn A 1cy bird of 'undetermined race' was at the north hide RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 20 Oct [E & E Prince]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

GREY WAGTAIL Motacilla cinerea

RED LIST Widespread resident breeding species, although does not breed on Tiree and Coll; some emigration in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Tiree*). Most sightings of just 1-2 birds however 4 were at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 6 May. Most reports from different 'sites' in *Mid-Argyll* (19) and *Mull* (14).

Summer/breeding Limited data received. Some in prs noted from Feb-Mar. Fledged family groups at four locations between Cairnbaan and Crinan (Crinan Canal) *Mid-Argyll* on 6 June. A fledged family at Aros Park *Mull* on 28 May where one pr found on a full park survey in May-Jun. Several reports of single breeding prs from sites in *Cowal, Kintyre, Mid-Argyll* and *Mull*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/North Argyll*). Most reports from different 'sites' on *Mull* (15), *Mid-Argyll* (10), *Kintyre* (7) and *Islay* (6). Generally, only 1-2 birds noted however 3 were at Kilmartin gravel pits *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Sep and 3 at Colonsay Hotel *Colonsay* on 24 Sep. On *Tiree* singles at Balephuil and Hynish on 6 Sep and at Loch a' Phuill on 18 Sep.

PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla alba yarrellii

A widespread and common breeder: absent from many areas in winter. Returning birds generally arrive in late Feb to early Mar and depart Aug-Oct.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, counts in single figures however 16 (mostly ad males) at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Mar and 15 at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 7 Apr. Higher counts of birds going to reed bed roosts of 110 at Loch na Cuilce, Dervaig *Mull* end Mar-early Apr and 65 at Balephuil *Tiree* in early Apr.

Summer/breeding Prs noted as widespread on *Tiree* in May. Brood/6 at Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* on 6 May. Ten 'families' with fledged young between Cairnbaan and Crinan (along Crinan Canal) *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Jun. Higher counts of 35 at Carnain *Islay* on 18 Jul and 22 at Tayinloan *Kintyre* on 2 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 80 at Sandaig Tiree on 31 Aug, 55 at Gott Tiree on 21 Aug, 42 at Tayinloan Kintyre on 15 Sep and 25 at Kiloran Colonsay on 5 Sep.

'WHITE' WAGTAIL Motacila alba alba

A passage migrant, usually recorded in spring and extent of autumn passage obscured by identification difficulties. May have bred.

Spring Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). First arrivals; 3 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 4 Apr, with peak of 25 there on 13 Apr, first on *Tiree* with 4 on 6 Apr and peaks of 45 at Baugh on 21 Apr and 42 at Sandaig on 2 May, also 20+ at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 14 Apr rising to 50 on 16 Apr. Only 1-4 birds at sites in May-Jun and a report of 1 at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 19 Jul.

Autumn First report of 2 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 8 Aug where 81 >S in Aug and peak counts of 25 there on 24 Aug and 147 >S in Sep with peak count of 30 there on 18 Sep. Peak counts of 50 at Strath Farm, The Laggan *Kintyre* on 24 Aug and 26 there on 6 Sep. On *Islay* a peak count of 20 at Carnain on 5 Sep. On *Colonsay* 16 were at Traigh nan Barc on 6 Sep. On *Tiree* 20 at Hynish to Balemartine on 20 Sep and last reports on *Tiree* and for Argyll of 18 from across 4 sites there on 26 Sep.

MEADOW PIPIT Anthus pratensis

AMBER LIST An abundant breeding species: most leave higher ground and some islands in winter, and significant flocks occur on passage. Those wintering in Argyll occur mainly in coastal and low-lying localities. Often the main host species of Common Cuckoo.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Generally, only small nos during Jan to early Feb however widespread groups of up to 30 birds on *Tiree* in Jan. Numbers increased and passage flocks noted from late Feb to early Apr, with max 60 (one field) at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 11 Mar, 55 at Meningie *Tiree* on 24 Mar, 50 at Loch Scammadale *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Mar and 50 at Kames *Cowal* on 12 Apr.

Summer/breeding Good numbers and widespread. Birds noted on eggs from mid-Apr. Large numbers of active nests on *Tiree* during May with many fledglings noted from early Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Increase in numbers noted from early Jul with many flocks of 20-50 birds and max counts of 200 at Machrihanish *Kintyre* in early Sep, 120 at Loch Uisg *Mull* on 2 Jul, 80 at Kiloran dunes *Colonsay* on 3 Sep and groups of up to 60 around *Tiree* in Sep. Numbers reduced during Oct and only groups of up to 10 during in Nov-Dec.

TREE PIPIT Anthus trivialis

RED LIST A summer visitor breeding commonly on the mainland: also widespread on Jura and Mull, but very scarce on Islay.

Spring/summer/breeding Reports from only (Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull). First reports from Balliscate, Tobermory Mull on 12 Apr, Glen Lean Cowal on 13 Apr and Duntrune Mid-Argyll on 13 Apr. Higher counts of 5 nr Salen Mull on 7 May and 4 at Rhudle BBS transect Mid-Argyll on 7 Jun. Sightings well down across Argyll on previous years presumably due to Covid-19 restrictions in May. Only three reports in Jul and last report was of one killed by a car at Loch Awe Mid-Argyll on 1 Aug.

EURASIAN ROCK PIPIT Anthus petrosus petrosus

A common resident breeding species on coasts, sea lochs and islands with some emigration and passage in autumn: scarce passage and winter visitor elsewhere.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 37 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 8 Mar, 15 at Calgary *Mull* on 21 Jan and 8 at Ardskenish *Colonsay* on 9 Jan. Elsewhere, counts generally low with only 1-5 birds reported at sites. One was at the top of Beinn Hough *Tiree* (>100m) on 23 Jan. **Summer/breeding** Limited breeding data. Fledged birds noted at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* from 2 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 24 at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Dec, 18 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 7 Nov, 15 at Clachan *Tiree* on 28 Nov and 13 at Rhunahaorine Point *Kintyre* on 11 Dec. Elsewhere, counts of 1-10 birds reported at sites.

COMMON CHAFFINCH Fringilla coelebs

An abundant resident breeder: except on Coll (breeds only in very small numbers) and Tiree. Foraging flocks gather out-with the breeding season when numbers are augmented by winter visitors.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max counts of 100+ nr Dervaig Mull on 8 Jan, 80 at Grogport Kintyre on 11 Jan, 75 Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll on 10 Feb, 58 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 2 Feb and 40 at Blackmill Bay, Luing Mid-Argyll on 2 Feb. Elsewhere, counts of 1-20 birds. Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. 50-60 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park Mull Apr-Jun. First fledged young noted in Mid-Argyll on 17 May at Keills, Loch na Cille and on 23

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max counts of 500 at Sunderland Farm Islay in Oct, 100+ at Loch Spelve Mull on 4 Sep, 100 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 7-18 Sep, 100 at Loch Skerrols Islay on 24 Dec, 100 at Eilean Traighe, Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 19 Dec, 70 at the Laggan Kintyre on 25 Sep and 70 at Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll on 20 Oct. Elsewhere, counts of 1-55 birds.

BRAMBLING Fringilla montifringilla

May at Tayvallich.

An uncommon winter visitor in varying numbers: there have been a few summer records.

Winter/spring A less than average showing. Single birds nr Dervaig Mull on 3 Jan, at Barnluasgan Mid-Argyll on 5 Jan, at Port Righ Kintyre on 14 Jan, at Caol Ila Islay on 25 Feb and 6 at Glen Orchy North Argyll on 13 Mar.

Autumn/winter Generally low numbers with only 1-3 birds noted at 23 sites. No reports from (Coll/Colonsay/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll). First report of 1 at Balephuil Tiree on 3 Oct. Higher counts of 3 birds at Hynish Tiree on 10 Oct, Sunderland Farm Islay on 10 Nov and at Port Righ Kintyre on 16 Nov.

HAWFINCH* Coccothraustes coccothraustes
RED LIST A rare visitor: 39 records between 1953 and 2019.

Spring One (unsexed) was at Loch Melldalloch *Cowal* on 30 Mar [L Maw], a male was at Tobermory *Mull* on 16 Apr [J Clutterbuck], a fem was at Arinagour *Coll* on 18-23 Apr [P White], a fem was at Slockavullin *Mid-Argyll* on 23-24 Apr [C & H Maddox], a male was at Salen *Mull* on 9 & 21 May [J & M Murphy] and a male was near South Hall, S of Colintraive *Cowal* on 15-16 Jun [G John, G Clark, N Hammatt]. All six records were accepted by the ABRC.

A well above average show of records and ties in with strong spring passage elsewhere in Scotland.

EURASIAN BULLFINCH Pyrrhula pyrrhula

AMBER LIST A widely but thinly distributed resident. Scarce or absent on most of the islands apart from Islay and Mull. Flocks occur in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree). Max counts of 7 at Connel Mid-Argyll on 27 Feb, 5 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 23 Jan, 4 at Tighnabruaich Cowal on 14 Jan, 4 at Stonefield Castle Mid-Argyll on 19 Feb and 4 at Duntrune Mid-Argyll. Elsewhere, counts of 1-3 birds from sites in Mid-Argyll (19), Cowal (11), Islay (4), Mull (4), Kintyre (3) and North Argyll (2).

Summer/breeding Limited data received. Prs noted and breeding mainly from (*Mid-Argyll/Cowal/Mull/Kintyre*). 8 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park *Mull* Apr-Jun. Fledged young noted in *Mid-Argyll* from early Jun and *Cowal* on 19 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree*). Most reports in; Sep (17), Aug (9), Oct & Nov (3) and Dec (1). Max counts of 26 nr Strachur *Cowal* on 4 Aug, 10 nr Bunnahabhainn *Islay* on 14 Nov and 8 at Fennachrochan, Lismore *North Argyll* on 9 Sep. Elsewhere, counts of 1-6 birds.

COMMON ROSEFINCH* Erythrina erythrina

A scarce to rare visitor which may have bred: 29 records between 1989 and 2019, mostly in May and Jun however more frequent reports of juveniles in the autumn recently.

Spring/summer A 2cy male, occasionally in song, was at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 19 May [D Wood]. An adult male was seen in two gardens at Salen *Mull* on 23 Jun [J Murphy, F Pollard].

Autumn A juv (1cy) was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 14 Sep [J Bowler]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

EUROPEAN GREENFINCH Chloris chloris

A locally common resident and partial migrant: with fewer breeding on the islands than on the mainland. Small groups are widespread outside the breeding season.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Counts of 1-6 birds at sites in; Cowal (9), Islay (4), Kintyre (4), Mid-Argyll (14), Mull (7), North Argyll (2) and Tiree (3). Max counts of 16+ at Dervaig Mull on 8 Jan, 16 at Tayinloan jetty Kintyre on 15 Jan and 10 at Machrihanish Kintyre on 14 Apr.

Summer/breeding Limited data received. Juvenile birds noted in Kintyre and Mull from early Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Colonsay/Jura). Counts of 1-6 birds at sites in; Coll (1) Cowal (5), Islay (4), Kintyre (3), Mid-Argyll (14), Mull (4), North Argyll (2) and Tiree (8). Max counts of 22 at Balliemore, Kerrera Mid-Argyll on 19 Nov, 14 at Port Righ Kintyre on 18 Dec, 11 at Vaul Tiree on 10 Sep and 9 at Gruline Mull on 2 Oct.

TWITE Linaria flavirostris

RED LIST A local resident, mainly in coastal areas on the mainland and islands; winter flocks may comprise resident and migrant birds.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Cowal/Jura*). All higher counts were on The Oa *Islay* where a peak of 155 on 15 Jan. Elsewhere on *Islay* higher counts of 40 at Sanaigmore on 2 Feb and 40 at Ardnave in Feb-Mar. On *Tiree* max counts of 55 at Hynish on 25 Jan and 50 at Crossapol on 22 Jan, with scattered flocks of 20-25 around the island Jan-Mar. Counts of only 1-9 from five sites on mainland Argyll.

Summer/breeding Prs noted and heard singing at sites in (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll/Tiree) from Apr. At least 6 prs at RSPB Oa reserve Islay and 16 birds in song at Carnan Mor Tiree on 8 May. First fledglings noted on Tiree from 14 Jun. Max post breeding counts of 200 at Aros, Laggan Kintyre on 15 Jul, 100 at Finlaggan Islay on 21 Jul and 70 at The Reef Tiree on 5 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura). Max counts included; 250 at The Reef Tiree on 9 Oct, 242 at Kinnabus, The Oa Islay on 26 Nov, 150 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 18 Oct, 55 at Port Mor Colonsay on 1 Sep, 50 at Ardnave Islay on 12 Oct, 30 at Blackmill Bay, Luing Mid-Argyll on 29 Aug, 25 at New Danna Mid-Argyll on 4 Oct and 20 at Port na Luing Coll on 13 Oct.

COMMON LINNET Linaria cannabina

RED LIST A sparsely distributed partial migrant, breeding mainly on Islay, Tiree, and in Kintyre. Flocks occur locally in some areas in autumn with most reports from Colonsay, Islay and Kintyre.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll). Max counts of 90 at Machrihanish airbase site Kintyre on 24 Apr, 56 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 4 Feb and 20 at Balephuil Tiree on 17 May. Most reports from different 'sites' in Mid-Argyll (6), Tiree (4). Greatly under reported this spring.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data however birds present in all areas during the summer and noted as widespread on *Tiree* in May. Fledged birds noted on *Tiree* from 21 May. A survey at Machrihanish airfield *Kintyre* gave 30 Ters in May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura). Max counts from each region; 100 at Kiloran dunes Colonsay on 5 Sep, 400 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa Islay on 12 Aug, 295 at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay on 23 Oct and 250 nr Rockside Islay on 23 Oct, 50 at Machrihanish airbase site Kintyre on 8 Aug, 80 at Achafolla, Luing Mid-Argyll on 30 Aug, 6 at Gribun Mull on 8 Sep and on Tiree 275 at The Reef on 10 Sep, 220 at Meningie on 30 Sep and 120 at Hough on 23 Aug. Most birds had moved away from Argyll by Dec.

COMMON REDPOLL Acanthis flammea

Includes Mealy Redpoll C. f. flammea & Greenland Redpoll C. f. rostrata (latter now sometimes known as North-western Redpoll, which includes islandica). A scarce passage migrant: and irregular winter visitor. Mealy has bred on Tiree and also suspected of breeding on other islands.

Winter/spring First arrival of 1 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 29 Mar with a peak there of 9 on 10 Apr. Reports from three other *Tiree* sites during Apr-Jun. A few reports of single birds from *Kintyre* and *Mull* in May.

Summer/breeding All reports from *Tiree*. At least 4 prs nesting; at Balephuil / Carnan Mor, Balephetrish, Heylipol and The Glebe in May- Jun. Fledged young noted from 15 Jun. Max count of 8 at The Glebe, Scarinish on 29 Jul.

Autumn/winter Present on *Tiree* until 28 Oct and a max site count of 25 at Balephuil on 18-30 Sep.

LESSER REDPOLL Acanthis cabaret

RED LIST A locally common partial migrant, breeding locally: numbers fluctuate from year to year. Post breeding flocks gather from July and most birds move south for the winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). A few more reports in Jan-Feb than usual, with max counts of 15 at Arduaine *Mid-Argyll* on 31 Mar and 12 at Kilmory Woodland, Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Jan. One was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 26 Mar.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. Prs noted from suitable areas across Argyll with flight songs noted from early Apr. On *Islay* 12 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart. On *Mull* 4-9 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park in Apr-Jun. Juvs noted from early Jul. Higher post breeding counts included; 120 at Corran, West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre* on 17 Jul, 40 at Lower Fernoch, Loch Awe *Mid-Argyll* on 31 Jul, 20+ at Machrihanish airbase site *Kintyre* on 17 Jun and 20 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max counts of 80 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 19 Sep, 45 at Kames *Cowal* on 6 Aug, 42 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 17 Aug, 22 at Portnahaven *Islay* on 6 Sep and 20 at Catchean, Fionnphort *Mull* on 3 Oct. Fewer reports during Oct and last report was of 30 at Machrihanish airbase site *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Nov.

COMMON CROSSBILL Loxia curvirostra

An irruptive species: large numbers breed in good cone years, but few stay when cones are scarce.

Winter/spring No reports from (Coll/Colonsay/Kintyre/Tiree). Max counts of 18 at Loch Coille-Bharr Mid-Argyll on 3 Jan and 13 at Finlaggan Islay on 5 Mar. Elsewhere, counts of only 1-9 birds.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data received. Birds gathering nesting material at Ardkinglass Woodland *Cowal* on 3 Mar. A juv with ad fem at Kilmahumaig, Crinan Wood *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Apr. Max counts of 25 nr Dervaig *Mull* on 19 May and 11 at Inverchaolin Glen, nr Clachaig *Cowal* on 25 May. One flew south at Balephuil *Tiree* on 9 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll). Low counts of only 1-8 birds. No reports in Oct or Dec.

TWO-BARRED CROSSBILL* Loxia leaucoptera

A scarce migrant to Scotland often following autumn irruptions from Finland and NW Russia. A vagrant with one record, a female at Balephuil, Tiree on 10 Aug 2018.

Autumn An adult (2cy+) male was at Ardrioch Farm, Dervaig *Mull* on 24-28 Aug [D Mitchell *et al*]. Record was accepted by the BBRC.

This bird was observed well by many visiting birdwatchers at close range as it fed at peanut feeders.

EUROPEAN GOLDFINCH Carduelis carduelis

A widely distributed resident with recent breeding on Coll, Colonsay and sporadically on Tiree. Flocks occur in autumn.

Winter/spring No reports from (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Max counts of 100 at Machrihanish airfield Kintyre during Jan-early Mar, 87 at Kames Cowal on 18 Jan, 65 at Port Righ Kintyre on 4 Feb and 36 at Kilchoman Islay on 22 Jan. Elsewhere, counts of 1-30 mainly from sites in; Mid-Argyll (26), Cowal (18), Mull (7) and Islay (6).

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. Nine Ters on a full survey of Aros Park Mull in Apr-Jun. First fledged juvs noted at Keills Mid-Argyll on 2 Jun and Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 5 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Flocks sizes increased from early Aug when 80 at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 6 Aug and widespread larger flocks during Sep-Oct then fewer reports during Nov-Dec. Max counts included several flocks of 100+ and many flocks of 30-50 counted around the roads of the Rhinns of *Islay* on 6 Sep, 85 at Ulva Lagoon *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Sep, 70 at Lossit House *Kintyre* on 26 Sep, 60 at Killean, Lismore *North Argyll* on 9 Sep and 60 over central Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Oct. On *Tiree* first single of autumn noted on 8 Sep. Good nos noted during Oct to mid-Nov with a peak count of 32 at Balephetrish on 30 Oct and then single figures from late Nov to the year end.

EURASIAN SISKIN Spinus spinus

A locally common partial migrant: present in all areas apart from Coll and Tiree where it is an occasional visitor. Numbers fluctuate from year to year depending on cone crops.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Most reports from different 'sites' in; Mid-Argyll (23), Cowal (16) and Mull (15). Max counts of; 60 from each Mid-Argyll location of Barnluasgan on 5 Jan, Ardenshellach, nr Ardmaddy on 11 Jan and Cairnbaan on 20 Feb. Also, Mid-Argyll flocks of 40 at Stonefield Castle on 19 Jan and 23 at Ardrishaig on 11 Jan. Elsewhere, counts of 1-20 birds. Generally, birds returning to breeding areas during Mar. On Tiree, 7 spring migrants between 24 Apr and 11 Jun.

Summer/breeding Limited breeding data. 4-12 Ters on a full survey of Aros Park *Mull* in Apr-Jun. A max post breeding flock count of 60 at Asknish, Loch Gair *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jul. First fledged juvs noted at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Generally, only small nos noted (<10). Most birds appear to have moved out-with Argyll by the end of Sep. Only reports in

Oct were from *Tiree* with up to 3 remaining until 15 Oct and 15 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Oct. Only two reports of singles in Nov and no reports in Dec.

LAPLAND BUNTING* Calcarius lapponicus

AMBER LIST A scarce passage migrant: recorded most frequently in autumn.

Spring A summer male was with Skylarks on the Coullabus to Loch Indaal track *Islay* on 9 Mar. *Autumn/winter* Singles were at Sandaig *Tiree* on 5 Sep, at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 6-9 Sep, at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 6 Sep, at Crossapol *Coll* on 18 Sep, at Balnahard *Colonsay* on 27 Sep, at Loch Kinnabus *Islay* on 16 Oct, 3 & 7 Dec and at Loch Tarbert *Jura* on 30 Oct.

SNOW BUNTING *Plectrophenax nivalis*

RED LIST Occurring annually in varying numbers (on passage and in winter): along the coast and in the hills and has probably bred in North Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from sites in *Islay* (1), *Kintyre* (1), *Jura* (1), *Mid-Argyll* (1) and *Mull* (1). Max counts of 5 at Beinn an Oir *Jura* on 12 Mar and 3 at Derryguaig *Mull* on 13 Mar, with 1-2 birds noted elsewhere.

Autumn/winter Reports from different 'sites' in *Islay* (4), *Kintyre* (1), *Mull* (2) and *Tiree* (5). First arrival of 1 at Carnain *Islay* on 27 Oct. In total only 12 reports and a max count of 7 at Ardnave *Islay* on 5 Nov, elsewhere only 1-2 birds.

YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella

RED LIST A localised resident which is absent from Coll and Tiree and appears to be declining elsewhere. Currently, most birds breed near the coast. All records are welcome.

Winter/spring Reports from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). Max count of 7 at Kildalton *Islay* on 5 Feb. Elsewhere, counts of only 1-4 birds at 7 sites.

Summer/breeding Reports of 1-3 birds from different 'sites' in Islay (1), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (9) and Mull (3), North Argyll (2).

Autumn/winter Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Max counts of 20 at Lergychoniemore, nr Craobh Haven *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Nov, 15 at Caol Ila *Islay* on 10 Oct and 12 at Gartmain *Islay* on 2 Nov. Elsewhere, counts of 1-7 birds at 12 sites.

PINE BUNTING* Emberiza leucocephalos

No previous records of this Siberian bunting.

Autumn A 1cy male was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 29 Nov. [J Bowler, J Hunter]. This bird had a metal ring on the right leg and it transpired a bird fitting this description was ringed at Ardheslaig, Loch Torridon, Highland on 23 Nov. Record is subject to acceptance by the BBRC.

BLACK-HEADED BUNTING* Emberiza melanocephala

A vagrant: Eight records; all of singles, during May to Jul, the last record being on Colonsay in Jun 2005.

Autumn A 1cy was seen briefly and photographed at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 28 Oct [J. Aitchison, D. Brown, J. Wilkinson]. Record was accepted by the BBRC.

COMMON REED BUNTING *Emberiza schoeniclus*

AMBER LIST A locally distributed resident breeder: while nowhere abundant, small flocks sometimes gather outwith the breeding season.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas and generally widespread with mostly 1-4 birds at sites. Max counts of 10 at Middleton *Tiree* on 24 Feb and 9 at Saligo *Islay* on 2 Feb.

Summer/breeding Singing males noted from 5 Mar in *Cowal*. On *Islay* 34 Ters at RSPB Loch Gruinart. In *Mid-Argyll* 8 Ters at the Moine Mhor and 4 Ters nearby at Dalvore in May. On *Tiree* 15 scattered prs noted across the island. First fledged juvs on *Tiree* from 15 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas and generally widespread in small nos of 1-8 birds at sites. Max counts of 45 at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Nov, 20 at Machrihanish airbase site *Kintyre* on 28 Nov, 12 at RSPB Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 2 Oct, 12 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 1 Dec and 10 at Ard Luing, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Dec.

Escapes and Introductions

This section includes species which are not on the British list or whose occurrence in the UK is EXCLUSIVELY within Categories B, D or E. Other species, whose occurrence in Argyll arises partly or wholly from introduced birds which may not or do not form self-sustaining breeding populations, include White-fronted Goose, Snow Goose, Barnacle Goose, Mandarin Duck, Red Kite, Red-legged Partridge, Grey Partridge and Rock Dove (Feral Pigeon). These are dealt with in the main systematic list.

BLACK SWAN Cygnus astratus

Summer/autumn One was at St Catherine's Cowal on 15 Apr.

RUDDY SHELDUCK Tadorna ferruginea

Winter/spring A pair were at Clochkeil, Machrihanish Kintyre on 10 Jan - 5 Feb and one was at Loch Crinan and the Add Estuary Mid-Argyll on 14-15 May. Presumably the same pair that visited the Oa Islay at the end of 2019.

Ruddy Shelduck is currently in Categories B, D, and E of the British List but is potentially also occurring in Britain as a vagrant from established naturalised populations on the near continent and must therefore be treated as a candidate for Category C5 (vagrant naturalised species from outside Britain). The British Ornithologists' Union's Records Committee (BOURC) are now gathering records of Ruddy Shelduck in Britain to aid the review and to help determine whether a change of category for this species is justified.

Getting Involved

Argyll Bird Club The ABC is a registered charity with membership open to all. The club aims to promote an interest in birds in Argyll. We are a friendly club for anybody interested in wild birds, living in, or visiting, Argyll, irrespective of their level of knowledge, experience or skill. Visitors are more than welcome to our two annual indoor meetings which are all-day events held on a Saturday in spring and autumn. The club produces a quarterly magazine, 'The Eider' and also has a website with sections on 'Recent Sightings' with photographs, News with details of upcoming meetings and trips, 'Publications' and 'Surveys'. Volunteers are always welcome to help with committee matters, bird recording and the website and to contribute to *The Eider*.

Scottish Ornithologists Club The SOC exists to promote the study, enjoyment and conservation of wild birds and their habitats across Scotland and is a birdwatching club with 15 local branches across the country and a growing membership of over 3,000. Like-minded individuals with a passion for birds, nature and conservation are brought together through a programme of talks, outings, conferences and via the Club's quarterly members' journal, *Scottish Birds*. The SOC acts as the umbrella organisation for bird recording in Scotland, managing the network of recording birds in Scotland, or the Local Recorders' Network and the Scottish Birds Records Committee, the latter of which maintains the official Scottish List on behalf of the Club. The database of information Local Recorders collect is an extremely important archive of local bird information – a critical tool for their future conservation.

British Trust for Ornithology Through the efforts of volunteers participating in BTO surveys, the bird populations of the British Isles have been monitored more effectively and for longer than those of most other parts of the world. This has produced a uniquely rich and detailed body of scientific work. This will help us to understand the complex challenges facing wild birds at a time of great change in the environment. Volunteer surveyors, members and staff work in partnership to provide unbiased information about birds and their habitats.

In Argyll we have many volunteers who participate in the following surveys and you can get involved by contacting the bird recorder or any of the BTO representatives given on page 2:

BirdTrack is an exciting project, through a partnership between the BTO, the RSPB, Birdwatch Ireland, the Scottish Ornithologists' Club and the Welsh Ornithological Society, that looks at migration movements and distributions of birds throughout Britain and Ireland. BirdTrack provides facilities for observers to store and manage their own personal records as well as using these to support species conservation at local, regional, national, and international scales.

Breeding Bird Survey (BBS) is the main scheme for monitoring the population changes of the UK's common breeding birds. It is a national volunteer project aimed at keeping track of changes in the breeding populations of widespread bird species in the UK. Wild bird populations are an important indicator of the health of the countryside, and knowing to what extent bird populations are increasing or decreasing is fundamental to bird conservation.

The Wetland Bird Survey (WeBS) monitors non-breeding waterbirds in the UK. The principal aims of WeBS are to identify population sizes, determine trends in numbers and distribution, and identify important sites for waterbirds.


