

# The Thirty Sixth ARGYLL BIRD REPORT With Systematic List for the year 2024

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
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#### Introduction

Welcome to the 2024 (36th) Argyll Bird Report and thank you to everyone who kindly contributed to nearly 79,000 records over the year, making this report possible. With 236 species recorded during the year across Argyll, 2024 was an average year, not reaching the record number of species recorded in 2022 and four fewer species than 2023.

As with many other sparsely populated areas of Scotland, vast parts of the county are not frequently visited compared to say Central Scotland, which means some observations may go undetected. The area offers opportunities for new discoveries, presenting a positive challenge and interest for any keen birder. (The pie-chart below provides details of the geographical distribution of the records within the Argyll recording area and should be considered when reading the species accounts). The increase in records from areas with fewer previous records, such as Coll and Cowal, is noted, but records from Jura remain low.



2024 saw an unprecedented influx of Great Shearwaters from late August until early November, along with record numbers of Great White Egrets and Hobbies. One new species for Argyll, Pallid Swift, was found on Islay in November, and to the credit of all involved, the record has been accepted by BBRC. Another potential new species, Ross's Goose, found in Kintyre in December, is still under consideration by the BBRC. Notably, very low numbers of Glaucous and Iceland Gulls were reported, and we speculate is possibly linked to Bird Flu (HPAI).


Several rare species and sub-species were only recorded only once during 2024: Grey-bellied Brant (1st for Argyll), Red-breasted Goose, Todd's Canada Goose, Ross's Goose\* (1st for Argyll), Lesser Scaup\*, Nightjar, Pallid Swift (1st for Argyll), Coot, Buff-breasted Sandpiper,

Spotted Redshank, Sabine's Gull, Bonaparte's Gull, Gull-billed Tern\* (5th for Argyll), Balearic Shearwater, Glossy Ibis, Cattle Egret, Goshawk, Bee-eater, Green Woodpecker, Lesser Grey Shrike\* (5th for Argyll), Short-toed Lark (4th for Argyll), Blyth's Reed Warbler (4th for Argyll), Reed Warbler, Barred Warbler, Rosy Starling, Red-breasted Flycatcher and Yellow Wagtail. (\* records still subject to acceptance). Conversely, a few annual or near-annual species usually noted were not recorded in 2024 e.g. Tundra & Taiga Bean Goose, Red-necked Grebe, Honey-buzzard, Spotted Crake, Common Crane, Long-tailed Skua, Ring-billed Gull and Hawfinch.

The systematic list follows the latest Scottish List (BOU/IOC 2021). For simplicity, common or vernacular species names are used in this report, as they are the terms most birdwatchers in Argyll are familiar with. Details of where to find species within the new ordering of the list can be found in the contents list.

In 2024, the first confirmed breeding record of Hobby in Argyll was noted in Kintyre, with the presence of a fledged juvenile in August at a date before dispersal takes place. It is also good to report stable populations of Corncrake and Red-necked Phalaropes, two of our rare but important breeding species. However, the declining trend of roding/breeding Woodcock continues, with no birds reported on Colonsay, where they have been present for over a century.

2024 marks the first inclusion of records from Trektellen; these valuable contributions from the Migration Count website are welcomed. This year, eBird provided the largest source of records, followed closely by BirdTrack (see pie-chart below). However, records submitted through the ABC recording spreadsheet, from RSPB staff, and from structured surveys such as WeBs and BBS remain particularly valuable.



Including evidence of breeding whenever possible is always helpful, though only about 1% of records between 1 May and 31 July noted breeding status. The usefulness of some records is limited by lack of precise location data, with almost 25% of records not including the number of birds, merely noting their presence. (A further 27% of records indicate a single bird at a location, which may reflect an under-count of those present). While such records have some value in recording species range, observers are encouraged to provide precise locations and counts, which are more beneficial for conservation as they enable better tracking of abundance.

With the next bird atlas likely on the horizon, we have retained changes to the species texts. Species monitored by the Rare Breeding Birds Panel (RBBP) are now identified in the species headers.

We also wish to thank the BTO Regional Representatives (Ewan Miles, Nigel Scriven & David Wood) for sourcing results from the 40 Breeding Bird Survey transects completed in Argyll in 2024. The increase in monitored sites (from 34 in 2023) is welcomed, and we thank all survey participants. These records have allowed highlights from the BBS to be included, providing an indication of the occurrence and changes in common birds (particularly passerines) from a structured survey. We also thank all RSPB staff based in Argyll for their work and contribution of records, helping to provide a comprehensive picture of many of Argyll's important species.

# **Bird Recording in Argyll**

#### Submitting your bird records

The Argyll bird recorders maintain the Argyll bird database on behalf of the Scottish Ornithologists' Club and the Argyll Bird Club and in recent years have been receiving more than 60,000 records per year. We welcome all bird records, however please look at the guidance sheet on the Argyll Bird Club website under <a href="Bird Recording">Bird Recording</a>— Argyll Bird Club which gives threshold guidelines on what to report. The recorders are happy to input casual reports, however when larger volumes of records are submitted, we recommend that these are sent in Excel spread sheet format compatible with the Argyll bird database. We can send you a template or for regular record providers we can send an automated input form. Please email <a href="mailto:abcrecorder@outlook.com">abcrecorder@outlook.com</a> for more details. Records sent to the BTO's BirdTrack and WeBS can be accessed by the recorders as well as records sent to Birdguides and eBird.

#### Rare birds

Details and photographs of all rare bird sightings should be sent in (preferably emailed) as soon as possible after the sighting to **Jim Dickson**, 11 Pipers Road, Cairnbaan, Lochgilphead, Argyll PA31 8UF. These will be judged locally by the Argyll Bird Records Committee (ABRC) whose members are listed on p. 3, sent on to the *Scottish Birds* Records Committee (SBRC), or passed to the *British Birds* Rarities Committee (BBRC), depending on the species/level of rarity.

The list below, made up of the ABRC list of Argyll rarities and the SBRC list of Scottish rarities (those marked #), details rare species whose occurrence in Argyll needs to be fully documented i.e. details of the circumstances surrounding the sighting and a detailed description of the bird and if possible, photographs and field notes.

Records of rarities in the systematic list are accompanied by the names of the observers, starting with the finder(s)/identifier(s), (or, in the absence of this information, the person who first reported the bird to the recorder), followed by the observer(s) who submitted details of the record, if different.

## Sighting Highlights of 2024

~ January ~

Wintering birds from 2023 of note included: an adult **RED-BREASTED GOOSE** until 4 Apr and two CACKLING GEESE until 9 Mar on Islay in the Gruinart area, a SNOW GOOSE at Miodar Tiree until 19 Feb, an AMERICAN WIGEON at Loch Gorm Islay again on 17 Jan and single juv GLAUCOUS GULLS on Islay until 29 May and on Tiree until 17 Mar. A SPOTTED **REDSHANK** was at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 1 Jan. A **RED KITE** flew over Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 3 Jan. A juv ICELAND GULL was at the Holy Loch Cowal on 4-9 Jan and a juv was at Sorobaidh Bay Tiree on 20 Jan. A WAXWING was at Ford Mid-Argyll on 4 Jan and six were noted on Kerrera Mid-Argyll on 29 Jan. Single MEDITERRANEAN GULLS were noted at Salen Mull on 9 Jan and nr Otter Ferry Cowal on 12 Jan. A LEACH'S PETREL was at Loch Spelve Mull on 13 Jan. A male SURF & two VELVET SCOTERS were noted with other scoters at Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 10 Jan. A male GREEN-WINGED TEAL was at Loch Gruinart Islay on 18 Jan. GREAT CRESTED GREBE nos peaked at five in Loch Long Cowal on 18 Jan. A **RED KITE** was noted nr Craignish *Mid-Argyll* on 25 Jan and two at Rest & Be Thankful *Cowal* on 27 Jan. A 3cy LITTLE GULL was at Sorobaidh Bay Tiree on 26 Jan. A male RING-**NECKED DUCK** presumed returning bird from previous winter, was at Glen Lonan *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Jan. A LITTLE AUK off Port Ann, flew up Loch Fyne Mid-Argyll and a LAPLAND BUNTING was noted at Slum Tiree both on 29 Jan.

The male RING-NECKED DUCK was re-found at Glenfeochan *Mid-Argyll* on 3-7 Feb and seen again later in Mar. A LAPLAND BUNTING was at Killinallan *Islay* on 6 Feb. Three GREEN SANDPIPER were at Linndhu, nr Tobermory *Mull* on 18 Feb. A 'RUSSIAN' WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE was at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 21 Feb & again on 8 Mar. A presumed returning 'TODD'S' CANADA GOOSE was at East Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 27 Feb.

An adult LITTLE GULL was at Loch Bhasapol *Tiree* between 4-28 Mar, also a 2cy was at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 15-21 and another 2cy there 24 Mar. A presumed 'GREY-BELLIED' BRANT GOOSE was at Vaul *Tiree* between 9-27 Mar. A male GREEN-WINGED TEAL was at Loch Iliter, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 11 Mar. Six WAXWING were at Ardrishaig *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Mar. An adult GOSHAWK was on Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Mar. A STOCK DOVE was at Gruline *Mull* on 21 Mar. A RED KITE was on Seil Is. *Mid-Argyll* on 31 Mar.

A **STOCK DOVE** was at Ardtur *North Argyll* on 1 Apr. A **HOOPOE** was at Arinagour *Coll* on 2 Apr. Three **DOTTEREL** were on Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Apr. A fem **AMERICAN WIGEON** was at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 5-6 Apr. A **RED KITE** was nr Tobermory *Mull*

A PECTORAL SANDPIPER was on Oronsay, *Colonsay* on 28 Apr. A male GARGANEY remained at Bunessan *Mull* from 28 Apr -1 May. A DOTTEREL was on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 29 Apr.

A WOOD SANDPIPER was at Cornabus Islay on 6-7 May, two were at Loch Tulla North Argyll from 15 May and one was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 9 & 31 May. A HOOPOE was at Crannich Mull on 8 May. An imm POMARINE SKUA at sea seen from Tiree-Barra ferry N of *Tiree* on 14 Aug, also a good count of 46 STORM PETREL. A GREEN SANDPIPER was at Loch Kinnabus, Oa *Islay* on 15 Aug. A MUTE SWAN family with two 'polish' morph cygnets remained at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* 21 Aug-7 Oct. A juv HOBBY was at Glenbarr *Kintyre* on 24 Aug. A BLACK REDSTART was at Knock *Mull* on 26 Aug. Single 1cy MEDITERRANEAN GULLS were at Scallastle *Mull* and at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* both on 27

Aug. A count of 5,000 MANX SHEARWATER off SE of *Tiree* on 28 Aug. A MARSH HARRIER was at Loch Gorm *Islay* on 28 Aug. An influx of GREAT SHEARWATER records began with 33 SE of *Tiree* & NW *Mull* 30 Aug. A CORY'S SHEARWATER was off Milton *Tiree*, also off there an adult & imm POMARINE SKUA all on 30 Aug. A GREEN SANDPIPER was at The Reef *Tiree* on 30 Aug.

GREAT SHEARWATER - two were off Hynish *Tiree* on 2 Sep then a gap until next report of 10 off S *Coll* on 30 Sep. SOOTY SHEARWATER 12 were off Hynish *Tiree* on 2 Sep then higher counts of 67 flew past Hynish on 16 Sep and 50 off Gunna Sound *Tiree* on 30 Sep. A returning adult BONAPARTE'S GULL from 2023, was noted again at Garmony *Mull* on 2-4 Sep. A RED KITE was at Easter Ellister *Islay* on 3 Sep. Two juv LITTLE STINT were at Carnain *Islay* on 2<sup>nd</sup> increasing to four on 3 Sep. An adult LESSER GREY SHRKE was nr Craignure *Mull* on 7 Sep. Single LESSER WHITETHROAT were at Balephuil *Tiree* on 7-8 & 12-18 Sep and at The Manse, Scarinish *Tiree* on 9 Sep. Two fem/2cy AMERICAN GOLDEN PLOVER were at Middleton *Tiree* on 9 Sep, both remaining on the island until 22 Sep and one until 6 Oct. A GREY PHALAROPE was at Machrihanish *Kintyre* on 10 Sep. MANX SHEARWATER nos peaked at 28,350 in 1 hr off Hynish *Tiree* on 10 Sep. An Argyll record site count of 14 LITTLE EGRET together at Kennacraig *Kintyre* on 10 Sep. A LEACH'S PETREL was off Aird *Tiree* on 11 Sep. A SHORT-TOED LARK was at Cornabus *Islay* on 10-14 Sep. An ICELAND GULL was at Saligo *Islay* on 13 Sep. A MEDITERRANEAN GULL was at

Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 14 Sep then two there on 28 Sep. A total of six **LEACH'S PETREL**, an imm **POMARINE SKUA** and two **GREY PHALAROPE** passed Hynish *Tiree* on 14 Sep. A 1cy **BARRED WARBLER** was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 18 Sep. Two **RED KITE** were at Add Estuary *Mid Argyll* on 19 Sep. A juv **BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER** was at Ruaig *Tiree* on 20-26 Sep. YELLOW-BROWED WARBLER saw a daily peak of 5-6 on *Tiree on* 3 Oct, three on Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Oct, one W side of Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 Oct, one at Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Oct and one Loch Kinnabus *Islay* on 25 Oct. 'SIBERIAN' CHIFFCHAFF singles were on *Tiree* at Balephuil on 3-7 and Kilmoaluaig on 6-7 Oct, and at Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 7 Oct. Single GREY PHALAROPE were off Eilean Musdile, Lismore *North Argyll* on 3<sup>rd</sup> and inland at Torloisk Rd *Mull* on 21 Oct. RED KITE singles were noted from several locations across *Mull* in Oct. A 1cy CATTLE EGRET was at The Glebe, Scarinish *Tiree* on 4 Oct. A juv SABINE'S GULL was off Hynish *Tiree* on 5 Oct. An AMERICAN GOLDEN PLOVER was still present

on Tiree to 6 Oct. A TURTLE DOVE was at Portnahaven Islay on 7 Oct. Two GREAT WHITE EGRET were Loch Riddon Cowal on 7 Oct and one was at head of Loch Fyne Mid-Argyll/Cowal on 28-29 Oct. An adult RING-NECKED DUCK was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 7 - 10 Oct, joined by a 1cy female on 16 Oct and both stayed until 11 Nov, also an adult male was at Loch Skerrols Islay on 10 - 21 Oct. The first SNOW BUNTING of the autumn was of one at Oronsay Colonsay on 9 Oct. A 1cy RING OUZEL was at Balephuil *Tiree* between 8-12 Oct. A 1cy LITTLE GULL was seen from the Mull ferry on 10 Oct and one was off NE Coll on 28 Oct. A POMARINE SKUA was seen from the Mull ferry on 10 Oct and one was off NE Coll on 30 Oct. The adult RED-BREASTED GOOSE returned, from last winter, to Gruinart Islay on 12 Oct. GREAT SHEARWATER nos increased dramatically, with high counts of 1,000+ off Coll on 12 Oct, 600 from the Oban-Barra ferry, again off S Coll on 14 Oct. A CORY'S SHEARWATER was off Aird Tiree on 12 Oct. Two GREAT CRESTED GREBE were at West Loch Tarbert Kintyre/Mid-Argyll on 14 Oct. Two RED KITE were at Dalvore, Moine Mhor Mid-Argyll on 14 Oct. A CACKLING GOOSE was at Gruinart Islay on 16 Oct. A LAPLAND BUNTING was at Sandaig Tiree on 17 Oct. A male POCHARD was at Loch Gorm Islay on 19 Oct, then three males there on 24-30 Oct. A 1cy fem LESSER SCAUP was at Loch Skerrols Islay on 20-23 Oct. A 'RUSSIAN' WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE was at Loch Gruinart Islay on 21 Oct. A CURLEW SANDPIPER was at Balinoe Tiree on 23 Oct. A LESSER WHITETHROAT was at Baile Mor, Iona Mull on 25 Oct.

Two **VELVET SCOTER** were at Salen Bay *Mull* on 1-10 Nov. A 3cy **MEDITERRANEAN GULL** was at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 2 Nov. **SNOW BUNTING** nos peaked at 18 at Ardnave Point *Islay* on 3 Nov. **GREAT SHEARWATER** nos increased, with higher counts of 765 between *Coll* and *Tiree* on 2 Nov, 600 between *Coll* and *Tiree* on 3 Nov and a peak of 5,700 around Hawes Bank N of *Coll* on 4 Nov. **SOOTY SHEARWATER** nos peaked at *ca* 300 around Hawes Bank N *Coll* on 4 Nov. A 1cy **LITTLE GULL** was off Arinagour *Coll* on 3 Nov. Single

**'SIBERIAN' CHIFFCHAFF** were at The Glebe *Tiree* on 3 Nov and at Balephuil *Tiree* on 9-11 Nov. Three late MANX SHEARWATER were at Hawes Bank N Coll on 4 Nov. A male POCHARD was at Campbeltown Loch Kintyre on 4 Nov. A GREY PHALAROPE was off Tobermory in the Sound of Mull on 7 Nov. A juv PALLID SWIFT was at Coullabus Islay on 9 Nov. A **GREAT WHITE EGRET** was at the Add Est. *Mid-Argyll* on 9 Nov and then nearby at Loch Gilp on 12 Nov, also two were at Loch Craignish/Beag Mid-Argyll on 19 Nov. A male **POCHARD** remained at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* all month. A returning male **RING-NECKED DUCK** from last winter, was at Loch Scammadale *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Dec, then at Loch

Glenfeochan *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Dec. A **GREAT WHITE EGRET** was at Loch Kinnabus *Islay* on 3 Dec. An adult **ROSS'S GOOSE** was found at Glen Lussa, Peninver *Kintyre* on 5 Dec and remained in S *Kintyre* into 2025. A 1cy/fem **COMMON ROSEFINCH** was at Lephenstrath Bridge *Kintyre* on 8-13 Dec. A **COOT** was at Loch Riaghain *Tiree* on 9-10 Dec. A juv **GLAUCOUS GULL** was at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 10 Dec. Two **VELVET SCOTER** were at Rhunahaorine Point *Kintyre* on 12 Dec. **<u>Birds of Conservation Concern.</u>** (BoCC 5) was published in British Birds (December 2021 Vol.114) and the updated species status has been applied to this report.

**RED LIST** is the highest conservation priority with species needing urgent action. **AMBER LIST** is the next most critical group followed by Green (not given here) species that don't fall into the Red or Amber category.

### **Systematic List for 2024**

The following systematic list includes entries for 236 Category A and C species recorded in Argyll during 2023 (*cf.* average 225 species during the years 1993- 2023). One new species (Pallid Swift) was added to the list in 2024 with another (Ross's Goose) still under consideration by the BBRC and would take the Argyll list to 374 species if accepted.

All records are listed where 20 reports or fewer and marked with \*. Observer's names are given for description rarities accepted by rare bird committees (ABRC, SBRC, BBRC).

The species sequence, vernacular and scientific names have now been changed to follow the latest Scottish List (BOU/IOC v10.2, 2021) as provided on the current SOC website.

#### **BRENT GOOSE** Branta bernicla

AMBER LIST A passage migrant, in varying numbers, few remain in winter. Most birds seen in Argyll are of the Pale-bellied race B. b. hrota. Birds of the Dark-bellied race B. b. bernicla have occurred, mainly on Islay and Tiree, with less than 20 records. There has been one record of the Black Brant B. b. nigricans on Islay in winter 1989/90.

'PALE-BELLIED' BRENT GOOSE (B. b. hrota)

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll). During Jan-Mar most reports from Islay where max. of 34 at Loch Indaal on 5 Jan, elsewhere 5 at Lephenstrath Kintyre on 1 Jan, singles at the Holy Loch Cowal on 10-12 Feb, on Mull at Fidden on 2 Feb and Iona on 19 Mar and on Jura 17 were at Glas Eilean on 3 Mar and 35 at Craighouse on 27 Mar. On 3 Apr 7 were still present at Glas Eilean Jura and 15 remained at Loch Indaal Islay until 16 Apr. During spring passage 17 at Gott Bay Tiree on 7 Apr, with 26 there on 19 Apr. On 20 Apr, 35 >N at Port Mor Colonsay and 49 were (at 2 sites) on Tiree. Elsewhere, 1-2 birds between 21 Apr and 13 May when the last single was at Loch Indaal Islay.

Autumn/winter Reports from (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). First arrivals were early with 3 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 23 Aug and 13 there on 24 Aug. Main passage through Argyll was on 9-10 Sep when 254 were at Loch Gruinart Islay, and 74 >S Frenchman's Rocks Islay on 10 Sep. Thereafter numbers lower but some remaining at Bridgend Merse, Loch Indaal Islay until year end with 71 on 4 Nov and 24 on 24 Dec. Notable sightings elsewhere, 7 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 7 Sep, 15 at Caliach Pt Mull on 9 Sep, 8 at Hynish Tiree on 26 Sep and 5 at Minard, Loch Fyne Mid-Argyll on 21 Oct. Otherwise counts of 1-5.

#### 'GREY-BELLIED' BRANT\* (Branta, bernicla spp?)

This form has been proposed, although no formal subspecies description has been made as yet, for a population of birds breeding in western/central Arctic Canada (mainly Melville Island), and wintering on Puget Sound on the American west coast around the U.S./Canada border. These birds are intermediate in appearance between Black Brant B. b. nigricans and Palebellied Brent B. b. hrota, having brown upperparts and grey underparts which give less of a contrast with the white flank patch. It has also been proposed that, rather than being a separate subspecies, it is actually a result of interbreeding between these two forms, given that this population exhibits mixed characters.

**Winter/spring** A first-winter (2cy) was tentatively identified as this 'type' at Upper Vaul *Tiree* on 9-10 Mar & Ruaig on 11 Mar [J. Dickson]. Likely the same bird had been seen in these areas with a similarly plumaged bird between 16 Oct 2023 & 31 Mar [J. Bowler, D. Daunt]. *This type is not currently assessed by the BBRC*.

#### **RED-BREASTED GOOSE\*** Branta ruficollis

A vagrant. Three records. All adults on Islay with first one seen on 27th Oct 2001, another adult on from Oct 2012 into Apr 2013 and another from 5 Oct 2021 remained to 22 Mar 2022.

**Winter/spring** Returning adult (first noted 2021) in the Loch Gruinart area *Islay* from 2023 to 4 Apr.

Autumn/winter Returning adult in the Loch Gruinart area Islay from 11 Oct to year end [T. de Clermont et al.]. Record was accepted by the BBRC as a returning bird.

#### **CANADA GOOSE** Branta canadensis

The resident population on Colonsay was introduced in 1934. Regular breeding has taken place since 1992 in Mid-Argyll in increasing numbers, with increasingly frequent breeding attempts

elsewhere. A transatlantic origin seems probable for at least some of the medium-sized and small individuals seen in winter goose flocks on Islay and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max. counts received of 330 at Dunadd Mid-Argyll on 24 Jan, 240 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 12 Feb, 210 at Toberonochy, Luing Mid-Argyll on 22 Feb, 161 at Gorsten Mull on 8 Mar, 150 at Ardnaclach, Appin North Argyll on 7 Jan & 10 Feb, 124 at Ardentallen Pt Mid-Argyll on 15 Jan and 104 on Gigha Kintyre on 2 Mar. Elsewhere, counts inc., 78 on Colonsay on 12 Jan, 31 at Feolin Fm Jura on 23 May, 8 at Kenovay Tiree on 19 Apr and a pair on Coll.

Summer/breeding Noted on 17.5% of BBS transects (7/40) (cf. 21% in 2023). Most breeding reports from Mid-Argyll at 4+ sites, inc. 20 ads with 43 yng at Danna/Loch na Cille on 26 May and ca. 15 prs Crinan Moss. Breeding or prs also noted from; Colonsay with 18 broods totalling 74 young in May and Jun and at sites in Jura (1), Kintyre (2) and Mull (3). Two broods were noted on the Treshnish Is. Mull. First broods noted at East Loch Fada Colonsay on 30 Apr, Scallastle Mull on 7 May and Port na Luing Coll on 9 May. 185 noted at Lussa Loch Kintyre on 21 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll). Max. area counts received of 138 at Garvard Colonsay on 27 Nov, 250 at Mid Ardyne Cowal on 27 Nov, 6 at Loch Indaal Islay on 25 Oct – 7 Nov, 50+ at the Laggan Kintyre on 18 Nov, 410 at the Barsloisnoch Mid-Argyll on 24 Nov, 200 at Gorsten Mull on 16 Nov, 320 at Loch Laich North Argyll on 13 Aug and 10 at Ruaig Tiree on 20 Aug.

#### TODD'S CANADA GOOSE\* Branta c. interior

A rare visitor. Todd's Canada B. c. interior race is considered by the BBRC. The race interior breeds NE Canada from Hudson Bay to Baffin Island and NW Greenland wintering in SE USA. There is however some overlap in breeding ranges with other Canada types and variability in size and plumage of races, therefore separation is not always possible.

*Winter/spring* In *Kintyre* a returning bird, first noted in Dec 2022 and previously accepted by the BBRC, was again in the Laggan/Machrihanish airfield area N of Campbeltown on 27 Feb [T. Lowe].

#### **BARNACLE GOOSE** Branta leucopsis

AMBER LIST Approximately two thirds of the Greenland population winter in Argyll, mostly on Islay with smaller numbers elsewhere. Coll, Colonsay, Islay, and Tiree are sites of international importance for wintering birds of the Greenland population of this species. A few birds occasionally summer and a few introduced birds have bred on the Rinns of Islay.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Jura/North Argyll). Max. Argyll total count (per NatureScot / International goose counts) of 37,141 in Mar (cf. 36,218 in 2023). Max. area counts of 27,648 on Islay on 12-13 Mar, 5,944 on Tiree on 26 & 28 Mar, 1,407 on Coll on 15 Feb, 2,248 on Oronsay & Colonsay on 12 Mar and in Mid-Argyll, 548 at Danna on 9 Mar. Elsewhere, 130 at Toberonochy, Luing Mid-Argyll on 16 Mar and 259 on Iona Mull on 19 Mar. Most birds had departed by mid-Apr.

 ${\it Breeding/summer}$  A small number (1-5) were reported from  $({\it Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Mull/North Argyll/Tiree})$  through until the end of Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura/North Argyll). First arrivals on 17 Sep of 2 at RSPB Loch Gruinart and 5 at Eallabus (both Islay) and 2 at Ruaig Tiree. NatureScot / International Goose Count Argyll totals for Dec not fully received. Max. counts of 29,880 on Islay on 26-27 Nov, 5,739 on Tiree on 10-11 Dec (cf. 4,698 in 2023), 6,000 on Oronsay Colonsay on

15 Oct and 300 at Port na Luing *Coll* on 13 Dec. Elsewhere, on *Mull* 99 on Iona and 150 at Gribun on 25 Oct, and in *Mid-Argyll* 372 on Luing on 5 Dec and 295 at Danna on 4 Dec.

#### CACKLING GOOSE\* Branta hutchinsii

A rare visitor. A transatlantic origin seems probable for most of these hutchinsii birds being from the Canadian High Arctic. The first accepted Argyll record was in 1984 and many subsequent records are still under consideration by the BBRC.

*Winter/spring* On *Islay* 2 were at RSPB Loch Gruinart, Bridgend & Ballygrant on 14-16 Jan and 9 Mar. [D. Beadle, M. Hellicar, J. Morris *et al.*]. Presumed same 2 that were last seen at Coull Farm on 24 Oct 2023.

**Autumn/winter** A small dark individual was seen at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 16 Oct [per Birdguides] and again at Cornabus & The Oa area on 15 Nov until year end [E. Burrell, D. Dinsley *et al.*]. Records are subject to acceptance by the BBRC.

#### ROSS'S GOOSE\* Anser rossii

A vagrant. No previous Argyll records. Breeds in the North American Arctic tundra with most wintering in California. Numbers dropped to 2-3,000 individuals in the 1950's but currently number 2-3 million birds with a subsequent increase in European records. Previously only included on Category E (introductions or escapees from captivity) but following a review by BOURC in 2021 following an emerging pattern of occurrence the first accepted British record to Category A was in 1970. Since then, a further 17 birds have been accepted up to 2022 – roughly one bird every two years.

*Winter* An adult (3cy+) was discovered in an under watched area of south *Kintyre* at Glen Lussa, north of Peninver on 5-6 & 10 Dec [J. Dickson, D. Jardine. A. Paterson] and subsequently noted near Machrihanish airfield *Kintyre* on 13 Dec. It was initially thought to be the same bird as one in Ayrshire (Sep-Dec) some 40 miles due east, however found to be a different bird due to date comparisons. *Record is subject to acceptance by the BBRC*.

#### **SNOW GOOSE\*** Anser caerulescens

A rare visitor. The small introduced population on Coll breeds on a small off-shore island and is now very sedentary and decreasing. Stragglers among wintering goose flocks of other species are probably often genuine vagrants.

All year The resident flock on Coll remains. A count of only 5 birds during the year.

**Winter** An adult white morph, likely a 'Greater' Snow Goose (first seen 13 Dec 2023) remained at Caoles *Tiree* and noted on 1-9 & 25-29 Jan, 2 & 19 Feb and was seen nearby at Miodar on 12 Feb [J. Bowler *et al*].

#### **GREYLAG GOOSE** Anser anser

AMBER LIST A resident: with an increasing breeding population. Some may be native birds that have colonised from the Outer Hebrides, while birds of introduced origin breed in Mid-Argyll. Now that it is no longer possible to distinguish between them, WeBS refers to them as 'British/Irish' and identifies Tiree as a site of national importance. Migratory flocks are also reported from most areas.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. NatureScot / International goose counts in Mar gave an Argyll total of 5,562 and highest counts were on *Tiree* with 2,303 and in *Kintyre* with 1,401. Additional high counts of 3,429 total count *Tiree* on 11-12 Jan, 918 on *Islay* on 12-13 Mar, 687 on *Coll* on 15 Feb, 396 on Gigha *Kintyre* on 2 Mar, 335 at Killellan, Ardyne *Cowal* on 18 Jan and 260 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Feb.

*Summer/breeding* Noted on 45% of BBS transects (18/40) (*cf.* 35% in 2023). Breeding reports from all areas except (*Coll/Cowal/North Argyll*) but details patchy. Nesting noted from early-Apr. First b/7 noted at Machrins *Colonsay* on 26 Apr, then b/4 Blackmill Bay, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 11 May, but not until 15 May on *Tiree* at Balevullin pools. On *Tiree* a late summer count of 3,244 on 26-27 Aug (of which 36.7% of a sample were juvs) (mean brood = 2.74, n=303) (*cf.* 3,350 in 2023). On *Colonsay* (excluding Oronsay) 54 broods with 215 yng reported in May & Jun. Seven broods totalling 22 yng noted at Knock *Mull* on 9 Jun and a single brood was noted on Treshnish Is. *Mull*. At Ulva Lagoons/Loch na Cille *Mid-Argyll* 28 ads with 48 goslings on 23 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. NatureScot / International Goose Count Argyll totals for Dec not fully received. Max. counts of 3,361 on *Tiree* (all island) on 10 & 11 Dec, 1,598 on *Islay* on 26-27 Nov, and 600 at mouth of River Ba *Mull* on 15 Oct. Elsewhere, higher counts inc., 273 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 18 Sep, 250 at Mid Ardyne *Cowal* on 27 Nov and 232 at Barsloisnoch *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Sep.

#### **PINK-FOOTED GOOSE** Anser brachyrhynchus

AMBER LIST There are variable numbers on passage, with occasional large flocks, but relatively few overwinter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Small nos of 1-17 birds wintered in (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll/Tiree). In Mid-Argyll 10-17 were around Barsloisnoch from 1 Jan – 29 Mar, increasing to 24 on 12 Apr, and 11 were at Cornaigmore Tiree on 20 Feb. Return passage flocks >NW from 13 Mar when 50 over Port Righ Kintyre and heaviest passage noted between 17-27 Apr. Most reported from (Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull) where most skeins were of 45-100 birds, but none reported on Islay. Higher counts inc., 490 on Mull on 17 Apr, ca. 200 at Lochgilphead/Barsloisnoch Mid-Argyll on 20 Apr and 150 at Duart Castle Mull on 8 May, following which 1-2 birds reported until 25 May.

Summer Single birds reported in Jun and Aug from Mull, Lismore North Argyll and Tiree.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. First arrivals were 200 noted at Loch Gruinart Islay and 355 over Dervaig Mull and 10 over Oban Mid-Argyll on 11 Sep with 850+ over Mull and 135 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 12 Sep. On 24 Sep, on Mull 627 went over Caliach Pt and 300 over Iona, while on Islay 369 were at Loch Gruinart and 120 at Cornabus, and 120 were over Tiree. On 26 Sep 850 were over Tiree and 305 were over Gallanach Coll, with numbers declining after 27 Sep. A slow movement thereafter until 70 over Feolin Ferry Jura, 122 over Whitehouse Kintyre and 455 over West Tiree on 8 Oct. Passage was completed at the end of Oct and then 1-7 birds noted from (Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree) in Nov & Dec with 7 at Machrihanish Links Kintyre on 6 Dec the largest group reported.

#### WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE Anser albifrons

RED LIST Both the nominate European and the Greenland races have occurred in Argyll. The Greenland race A. a. flavirostris winters in a small number of traditional haunts and is also a passage migrant. Argyll holds about 50% of the world population of this race in winter and all the locations where they occur regularly are sites of international importance in the UK.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura/Mull). NatureScot/International Goose Counts in Mar gave an Argyll total count of 8,112 (8.1 % decline on 2023), with a count of 4,926 on Islay. In Kintyre 1,776 were at the Laggan, 239 at Rhunahaorine, 80 at Clachan and 65 on Gigha in Mar, 746 were on Tiree on 26 & 28 Mar, 128 on Coll on 15 Feb, 88 in Mid-Argyll in Mar and 102 on Colonsay on 12 Jan. In addition, 19 were at Fidden Mull in Jan, 14 at Loch a Cnhuic Bhric on Jura in Mar, and in North Argyll 63 were on Lismore in Mar and 29 at Benderloch in Jan.

Autumn/winter First arrivals were on 4 Oct when 8 at Loch Gruinart Islay, followed by 188 >SW over Tiree on 8 Oct, when numbers at Loch Gruinart Islay increased from 75 on 8 Oct to 900 on 10 Oct, when 118 at Drumlemble Kintyre. NatureScot / International Goose Count Argyll totals for Dec not fully received. Max. counts of 4,183 on Islay on 26-27 Nov, 605 on Tiree on 10 -11 Dec and in Kintyre 355 at Rhunahaorine on 12 Dec and 124 at Clachan on 18 Nov, but no counts from The Laggan. Elsewhere, 90 were on Gunna Coll on 9 Dec, 125 on Colonsay on 27 Nov, 69 (incomplete count) at Danna/Ulva Lagoons Mid-Argyll on 8 Dec and 1-3 at sites in (Mull/North Argyll). A poor breeding season reported with low juv %: Kintyre (5.9) and Tiree (4.5).

#### 'RUSSIAN' WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE\* A. a. albifrons

A scarce/rare visitor. Breeds in the far north of Russia and winters further south and west in Europe and Asia.

*Winter/spring* A presumed returning adult was again in the Loch Gruinart area *Islay* on 21 Feb, 5 & 8 Mar [J. Farooqui, T. de Clermont *et al*]. An adult was at Balephetrish *Tiree* on 20 May [J. Bowler].

**Autumn/winter** A presumed returning adult was again in the Loch Gruinart area *Islay* on 22 Oct [C. McKay]. Two were at Loch na Cille, nr Danna *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Nov [RAFOS group]. *All records of new birds were accepted by the ABRC*.

#### MUTE SWAN Cygnus olor

A widespread and fairly common breeding species on the mainland and Tiree: scarcer on the other large islands. Flocks gather at favoured localities throughout the year, especially during moult but in decreasing numbers in autumn and winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay). Max. counts of 57 on Tiree on 12 Jan, where max. site count of 32 at Loch a' Phuill on 12 Jan. High counts inc., 29 at Loch a' Phearsain Mid-Argyll on 1 Jan, 20 at Machrihanish Kintyre on 18 Mar, 9 at Add Est Mid-Argyll on 20 Mar and 9 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 10 May. Elsewhere, counts of up to 7 birds, with most counts of 1-4 birds.

**Breeding/summer** Confirmed breeding reports from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*) but limited data received. On *Tiree* 12 prs at 8 sites; 5 prs failed and 7 successful with first brood (b/6) noted on 24 May. Overall, a fairly good breeding season with 24 cygnets fledging. On *Islay* 3 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart and 1 pr at RSPB Oa Reserve. Elsewhere, pairs at sites in *Kintyre* (1) and *Mid-Argyll* (3).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay*). Max. counts of 64 (inc. 21 fledged young) on *Tiree* on 19 Aug, 59 on 23 Sep and 61 on 9 Dec. Elsewhere, 26 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on

30 Oct - 6 Nov, 30 at Ulva Lagoons Mid-Argyll on 13 Oct and 20 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 9 - 11 Nov, which included 2 'polish morph' cygnets (in b/3) which were present from 21 Aug - 16 Nov.

#### WHOOPER SWAN Cygnus cygnus

AMBER LIST RBBP A common passage migrant: smaller numbers wintering. Loch a' Phuill (Tiree) is a site of national importance for wintering birds. A few birds summer in most years and breeding has been recorded.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Most wintering birds were on *Tiree* where highest site count of 140 at Loch a' Phuill on 12 Jan. A total island count of 154 on 11-12 Jan included 21 (17.5%) cygnets, but only 18 remained on 27 Mar. On *Islay* highest count was 29 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 26 Feb and in *Kintyre* 14 were at Drumlemble on 12 Feb. Northward passage noted at Port Righ *Kintyre* with 31 on 20 Mar, 80 on 26 Mar, 40 on 24 Apr and 60 on 26 Apr. Elsewhere, counts generally of birds stopping off to rest or flying over, with; 82 at Sanaigmore *Islay* on 24 Mar, 50 at Fidden on 4 Mar and 50 at Loch Assapol on 27 Mar (both *Mull*), 31 over Beinn Oronsay *Colonsay* on 26 Mar and 22 over Lismore *North Argyll* on 6 Mar. Elsewhere, several flocks of up to 30 birds >N mostly between mid-Mar and mid-Apr.

**Summer/breeding** No reports of breeding. Summering birds included, up to 4 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* from May-Sep and singles elsewhere on the island, 1-2 during May-Aug in (*Colonsay/Jura /Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*).

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First arrivals noted were on 21 Sep when 2 were at Loch a' Phuil *Tiree*, followed by 33 at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* on 24 Sep, then small arrivals across Argyll until larger arrival in early Oct and main passage in late Oct. On *Islay* highest counts received were 207 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 25 Oct when 340 over the island, on *Tiree* with 361 across 4 sites on 10 Oct (with 12% juv), on *Mull*, 134 at Loch na Keal on 25 Oct, also 80 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 25 Oct and 31 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Nov. Thereafter, on *Tiree* all-island count of 124 on 10-11 Dec, on *Islay* 76 at Loch Indaal on 7 Nov, and in *Kintyre*, 44 > SW over Lephenstrath on 15 Nov and 16 at Loch an Torr *Mull* on 15 Nov. Elsewhere, counts of up to 20 birds.

#### SHELDUCK Tadorna tadorna

AMBER LIST A widespread, but not very numerous, breeding species around sandy coasts. The majority are absent from mid-Aug to late Oct when they migrate to moulting grounds.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas, with most from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*). Max. counts on *Islay* of 193 at Loch Gruinart on 8 Mar. Elsewhere, 41 at Gorsten *Mull* on 8 Mar, 32 (at two sites) on *Tiree* on 26 Feb, 20 at Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Mar, and 20 at Machrihanish Water *Kintyre* on 13 Feb.

*Summer/breeding* Breeding reports from all areas except (*North Argyll*). On *Tiree* prs scattered around coast and a few inland in May and 9 prs found on *Colonsay*. First broods noted; b/10 at Port Mor *Colonsay* on 25 May, b/5 at Milton *Tiree* on 28 May, at Portnahaven *Islay* on 1 Jun, in *Mid-Argyll* at the Add Est. on 5 Jun and on *Coll* a b/2 was at Bagh an Traileach on 6 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll*). Only 1-3 birds at a few sites late Aug-early Nov, when birds started to return from moult migration. Thereafter, max. counts of 101 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 13 Dec, 13 at Loch Caolisport on 16 Nov and 8 at Ardpatrick on 18 Nov (both *Mid-Argyll*), otherwise, 1-5 birds.

#### MANDARIN DUCK Aix galericulata

An introduced species which has bred regularly, at Loch Eck (Cowal), in recent years. The present size of the Argyll population (whose origin is unknown) suggests that it may well now be self-sustaining.

*Winter/spring* Reports from (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll*). In *Cowal* 5 were at Dornoch Pt., Loch Eck on 18 Jan, and 4 at Camusdhu, Loch Eck on 19 Jan, followed by 1 at Kilmun on 17 Apr. In *Mid-Argyll* 3 were at Loch Ederline on 24 Mar and 1 at the River Awe on 9 May.

Summer/breeding No reports.

Autumn/winter No reports.

#### **GARGANEY\*** Spatula querquedula

AMBER LIST RBBP A scarce/rare spring visitor to Islay and Tiree and has bred in Kintyre in 1994, on Islay in 1997 and on Coll in 2004.

*Spring* A male was at Loch an t-Suidhe, Bunessan *Mull* on 28 Apr -1 May, 2 males were at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 1 May, a male there on 15 May and a male was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 18 May.

#### SHOVELER Spatula clypeata

AMBER LIST RBBP A scarce and localised breeding species restricted to Islay and Tiree. It is more numerous as a passage migrant and winter visitor, also largely restricted to Islay and Tiree.

**Winter/spring** Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay/Tiree*). On *Islay* a max. of 47 were at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 8 Mar. On *Tiree* 16 were at Loch a' Phuill on 10-15 Jan. Elsewhere, a pr was on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 6 May.

**Breeding** On Islay 20 prs were at RSPB Loch Gruinart. A good season on Tiree with 12-15 prs across 10 sites and at least 4 broods seen.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from only (*Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*). Max. counts of 123 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 20 Sep declining to 38 on 13 Dec, and 19 on *Tiree* on 9 Dec. Two were at the Laggan on 11 Nov and one at Lussa Loch on 6 Nov (both *Kintyre*).

#### **GADWALL** Mareca strepera

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular passage migrant and winter visitor with most recent records from: Islay, Kintyre, Mid-Argyll, and Tiree. Breeds sporadically on Islay and Tiree.

*Winter/spring* Reports from (*Islay/Tiree*). On *Islay* 1 was at Kilnaughton Bay on 12 Jan, then 2 there on 15 Jan, and 1 was at Kinnabus on 7 Apr. At Loch Gruinart 1 was present in Feb increasing to 2 on 29 Mar and peaking at 5 on 10 May. On *Tiree*, a male was at Loch a' Phuill from 26 Feb – 29 Mar.

**Breeding** On *Tiree* 4-6 prs at 6 sites, but only one brood seen on 10 Jun, but none on *Islay*. **Autumn/winter** Reports from only (*Islay/Mid-Argyll/Tiree*). On *Islay*, a male was at Loch Gruinart from 12-31 Oct, with a pair noted on 25 Oct, and a single on 17 Nov and 13 & 24 Dec. Four were at Loch an Eilein on 12 Oct and 2 at Loch Bhasapol on 19 Aug (both *Tiree*). Two at Carn Mor, Loch Sween *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Nov.

**WIGEON** Mareca penelope

AMBER LIST RBBP A scarce and local breeding species: common passage migrant and winter visitor to all areas.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max. counts of 700 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 12 Jan, 214 on *Tiree* on 12 Jan, 189 at Lussa Loch *Kintyre* on 11 Mar, 150 at The Laggan *Kintyre* on 8 Feb, 113 at the Add Est. *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Feb and 106 at Loch Don *Mull* on 8 Mar. 48 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 15 Jan. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 50 birds.

**Breeding** Probable breeding with prs noted at sites on each of *Islay* (1), where one pr at RSPB Loch Gruinart and two prs on *Tiree*. Possible breeding at one site in *North Argyll*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). First autumn arrivals with 2 at the Kilmun Cowal on 25 Jun, followed by 5 at Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 10 Jul and 7 at Lussa Loch Kintyre on 21 Jul. Max. counts inc., 680 at Bridgend Bay Islay on 30 Oct, 624 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 16 Nov, 444 at Lussa Loch Kintyre on 22 Sep, 305 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 30 Oct, 148 at the Add Est. Mid-Argyll on 17 Nov, 168 on Tiree WeBS sites on 11 Nov and 117 at Aros Est Mull on 20 Dec. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 100 birds.

#### **AMERICAN WIGEON\*** Mareca americana

#### A rare visitor: 23 or more records.

*Winter/spring* An adult male was at Loch Gorm *Islay* seen from the Ballinaby side on 17 Jan and presumed to be returning bird from last winter [D. Beadle, M. Hellicar, J. Morris]. A 2cy+ fem (probably adult) was at the Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* on 5-6 Apr [J. Dickson, D. Jardine, F. Cavanagh]. A 2cy male was a Cornabus *Islay* on 14-31 May [E. Burrell *et al*]. *All records were accepted by the ABRC*.

#### MALLARD Anas platyrhynchos

#### A common breeding, passage and wintering species

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 193 at *Tiree* WeBS sites on 12 Jan, 153 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 9 Feb, 84 at Loch Gorm *Islay* on 3 Jan, 77 at Lussa Loch *Kintyre* on 11 Mar, 60 at Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jan, 54 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 12 Mar and 44 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 15 Jan.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted on 30% of squares (12/40) (cf. 24% in 2023). Reports from all areas. On *Islay* 45 prs were at RSPB Loch Gruinart and 6 prs at RSPB Oa Reserve. Broods noted at 17 locations between 20 Apr and 5 Jul in all areas except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*)

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 163 at Loch Indaal on 27 Oct, 139 at Loch Gruinart on 13 Dec (both Islay), 121 on Tiree WeBS counts on 11 Nov, 118 Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 8 Aug, 110 at Ballachuan Loch, Seil Mid-Argyll on 18 Oct, 82 at Lussa Loch Kintyre on 22 Sep and 75 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 16 Nov. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of up to 50 birds.

#### PINTAIL Anas acuta

# AMBER LIST RBBP A very scarce breeding species on Tiree and a scarce passage migrant and winter visitor. Regular only on Islay and Tiree.

**Winter/spring** Reports from only (*Islay/Tiree*). Most reports from *Islay* and max. counts of 110 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 14 Jan, then 115 on 9 Feb, and 113 on 8 Mar and 2 at Cornabus on 4 May. On *Tiree* a male at Loch a' Phuill on 10-20 Jan and a fem at Loch an Eilein on 12 Feb. Forming prs on *Tiree* during Mar.

**Breeding** Up to 4 prs at 4 sites on *Tiree*, with one brood seen on 16 Jun, but none on *Islay*. **Autumn/winter** Reports from only (*Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Most birds were at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* with counts of 10 on 26 Sep, 69 on 7 Nov, 77 on 18 Nov and 99 on 13 Dec. On *Tiree* 6 >S Hough Bay on 8 Oct, 8 at Loch an Eilein on 11 Oct, 2 at Loch Bhasapol on 11 Nov and 1-3 birds at Loch a' Phuill on 10 Oct to 11 Dec. Elsewhere, a male was at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Nov and 1 at Garmony *Mull* on 8 Nov.

#### **TEAL** Anas crecca

AMBER LIST A widespread but uncommon breeding species: common passage migrant and winter visitor.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 742 at Gruinart Floods *Islay* on 9 Feb, 442 on *Tiree* WeBS counts on 12 Jan with max. single site count of 305 at Loch a' Phuill on 12 Jan., 200 at Lussa Loch *Kintyre* on 24 Mar, 185 at South Oronsay *Colonsay* on 12 Feb and 89 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 18 Jan. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of 1 -50 birds.

**Breeding** Breeding reports mainly from (*Islay/Tiree*). At least 33 prs across wetland sites on *Tiree*. On *Islay* 10 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart and 1 pr at RSPB The Oa. Other scattered breeding season records from sites in (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Jura*). Max. counts of 1,120 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 31 Oct, 445 on *Tiree* on 9 Dec and 117 at the Add Est. *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Oct. Elsewhere, many counts across Argyll of 1-50 birds.

#### **GREEN-WINGED TEAL\*** Anas carolinensis

A rare visitor: 33 or more records since 1980, mostly on Islay or Tiree. Some records may well involve returning individuals.

*Winter/spring* A male was at Bun-an Uillt, Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 18 Jan [D Beadle, M. Hellicar, J. Morris]. A male was at Loch Illiter, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 11 Mar [S. Dalrymple].

**Autumn/winter** Two males were at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 18 Nov and one there on 13 & 30 Dec [J. How]. All records were accepted by the ABRC.

#### **POCHARD\*** Aythya ferina

**RED LIST** An increasingly scarce winter visitor and passage migrant, in small numbers, particularly to: Tiree, Islay, and a few Mid-Argyll lochs. There has been no confirmed breeding in recent years.

Winter/spring No records.

**Autumn/winter** On *Tiree* a fem/imm was at Loch a' Phuill on 7 Oct, 3 mm were there on 5 Nov increasing to 5 mm on 11 Nov and one male remained until end of year. On *Islay* a male was at Loch Gorm on 19 Oct, increasing to 3 mm on 24-30 Oct. In *Kintyre* a male was in Campbeltown Loch on 4 Nov.

#### RING-NECKED DUCK\* Aythya collaris

RBBP A scarce but increasing winter visitor. 39+ previous records.

*Winter/spring* A returning male was at Glenfeochan, Kilmore *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Feb [D. Jardine, J. Waldie] & Luachrach Loch, Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 3 & 26 Mar [T. de Clermont, J. Waldie].

**Autumn/winter** An adult male was at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 7 Oct-11 Nov [T. de Clermont, J Dickson, S. Gibson, J. Bowler] and was joined by a 1cy fem on 16 Oct-11 Nov [J. Bowler]. The returning male was at Loch Scammadale *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Dec [R. Lightfoot] and again at Glenfeochan, Kilmore *Mid-Argyll* on 18-28 Dec [D. Jardine]. *All records were accepted by the ABRC*.

#### **TUFTED DUCK** Aythya fuligula

A widespread winter visitor: most numerous on Islay and Tiree. Breeds in small numbers on: Colonsay, Islay, Mull, and Tiree with scattered pairs found throughout mainland Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from (Colonsay/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). Highest nos were on Tiree where a count of 69 at Loch Bhasapol on 14 Apr. On Islay max. counts of 25 from Loch Finlaggan on 18 Jan and 15 at Loch Skerrols on 2 Jan. In Mid-Argyll max. counts of 9 at Kilchurn Castle, Loch Awe on 14 Feb and 7 at Loch Glenfeochan on 3 & 4 Feb. Max. counts on Colonsay (4) and Mull (7).

**Breeding** On *Tiree* 15 prs at 6 sites with 10+ broods (53+ yng) noted. No breeding reports from elsewhere, but 1-7 birds noted in Jun & Jul in (*Cowal/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull*).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from (*Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max. counts of 75 at *Tiree* WeBS sites on 11 Nov with site max. of 70 at Loch a' Phuill on 6 Nov, 54 at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 29 Oct, 18 at Loch Gorm *Islay* on 2 Nov, 12 at Loch Leathan on 12 Dec and possibly the same 12 at Loch Ceann a' Chroin on 15 Dec (both *Mid-Argyll*) and 10 at Loch Poit na h-I *Mull* on 17 Oct. Elsewhere, counts of 1-11 birds.

#### **SCAUP\*** Aythya marila

**RED LIST** RBBP A winter visitor and passage migrant, becoming scarcer. Most winter reports at Loch Indaal, Islay but rare and irregular elsewhere.

Winter/spring On Islay a max. count of 8 at Loch Indaal during Jan dropping to 1 in Feb. On Mull a fem was at Loch Poit na h-I (Pottie) on 10 Feb. On Tiree a male was at Loch a' Phuill on 15 Jan and a new male there on 12-16 Feb.

**Autumn/winter** In Cowal a fem was at the Holy Loch on 22 Oct. On Islay 2 were at Loch Indaal on 13 Oct, also seen at Loch Skerrols on 20 Oct, a max. of 5 at Loch Indaal on 3-4 Nov and a fem which lingered on Loch Skerrols until 25 Dec. In Mid-Argyll a fem was at Glenfeochan, Kilmore on 5 Oct. On Mull 3 were at Loch na Keal on 7 Oct. On Tiree a 1cy fem was at Loch Bhasapol on

13 Sep then at Loch a' Phuill on 19-21 Sep, at Loch Bhasapol on 7 Oct, then Loch a' Phuill on 11 Nov and an adult male was at Loch a' Phuill on 8 Oct to 11 Nov.

#### **LESSER SCAUP\*** Aythya affinis

A rare visitor: Nine records of 14 birds. Islay in Nov 1998, Loch Leathan, Mid-Argyll in Dec 2005, Loch a' Phuill, Tiree in Nov 2006, Loch Skerrols, Islay in Jan 2009, Loch a' Phuill, Tiree in Nov 2015, a group of five at Loch Skerrols Islay in Nov-Dec 2021 rising to six birds by Feb 2022, Loch Bhasapol, Tiree in Nov 2022 and a male at St Mary's Loch Mid-Argyll in Mar 2023.

Autumn/winter A 1cy female was at Loch Skerrols Islay on 20 Oct-23 Oct [N. McMahon, P. Roberts et al]. Record under consideration by the BBRC.

#### **EIDER** Somateria mollissima

AMBER LIST A resident breeding bird: common on all suitable coasts, especially on the Clyde. The Firth of Clyde is a site of national importance for Eiders. Large flocks of moulting drakes and first-year birds gather at some sites during Jun to Sep.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 278 at Scallastle Bay *Mull* on 19 Mar, 247 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Jan, 246 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 10 Jan, 161 at Poll Gorm *Colonsay* on 22 Apr, 128 at Blairmore Fm, Loch Long *Cowal* on 13 May and 120 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 7 Jan. Elsewhere, counts of up to 100 birds.

Breeding Breeding reports from (Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). First broods noted at Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 23 May and on 1 Jun at Traigh Bhagh Tiree. On Colonsay and Oronsay 28 fems found with 48 yng and at least 6 breeding fems on Lunga, Treshnish Is. Mull. Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 375 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 12 Dec, 185 at Ormsary, Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 22 Sep, 150 at Loch Indaal Islay on 13 Oct, 88 at Loch Craignish Mid-Argyll on 28 Sep, 85 at Traigh Bhagh Tiree on 23 Sep, 80 at Eilean Traighe, West Loch Tarbert, Mid-Argyll on 29 Oct, 53 at Campbeltown Loch Kintyre on 17 Nov and 52 at Blairmore Fm, Loch Long Cowal on 3 Oct. Elsewhere, counts of 1-50 birds.

#### **SURF SCOTER\*** *Melanitta perspicillata*

A rare visitor: 25+ records, occasionally involving several birds.

Winter/spring An adult male was at Rhunahaorine Point Kintyre on 10 Jan [J. Dickson. D. Jardine]. A 2cy male was at Calgary Bay Mull on 9-29 May [A. Ash et al] All records were accepted by the ABRC.

#### **VELVET SCOTER\*** Melanitta fusca

**RED LIST** Scarce but regular at the Sound of Gigha and Loch Indaal, Islay. The wintering population in the Sound of Gigha is now much reduced from the population in the 1970s when over 50 were present.

Winter/spring Two at Rhunahaorine Point Kintyre on 10 Jan and one there the following day were the only birds reported

Summer A male was again at Easter Ellister Islay between 31 May & 3 Jul. Presumably the long stayer of once captive origin nearby.

*Winter* Two fem/1cy were in Salen Bay *Mull* from 1-10 Nov, followed by 2 fem/1cy off Rhunahaorine Pt. *Kintyre* on 18 Nov followed by a male and fem/1cy there on 12 Dec.

#### **COMMON SCOTER** Melanitta nigra

AMBER LIST RBBP Present throughout the year at Loch Indaal, Islay and in the Sound of Gigha, Kintyre - a scarce winter visitor elsewhere and very rare breeding reports.

*Winter/spring* Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max. counts by region of 1 off SE *Colonsay* on 22 Apr, 200 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 20 Jan, 89 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 10 Jan, 29 at Loch Caolisport, Ormsary *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Mar, 8 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 29 Jan, and 14 at Hough Bay *Tiree* on 12 Mar.

**Breeding/summer** Two on Loch Gorm *Islay* on 12 May, the site of successful breeding in 2021, was the only suggestion of breeding. A summering group of 7 was at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Jul and 6 were at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 17 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from (*Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull//Tiree*). Max. counts by region, of 1 on *Colonsay* on 28 Sep, 250 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 13 Oct, 110 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 12 Dec, 22 at Ormsary, Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Dec, 4 at Scallastle Bay on 8 Nov and 4 at Feith Bhan on 8 Nov (both *Mull*) and unusually, 1 inland at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* from 11 Oct – 4 Nov.

#### LONG-TAILED DUCK Clangula hyemalis

**RED LIST** An uncommon winter visitor, most frequent in Sound of Gigha (Kintyre), Coll, Islay, and Tiree. Usually marine but occasionally seen on inland lochs. Occasional summer records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Colonsay/Cowal/North Argyll). Most reports from (Islay, Kintyre and Tiree). Max. counts of 25 at Loch Indaal Islay on 24 - 27 Feb, 21 at Hough Bay Tiree on 12 Jan, 15 at Laggan Bay Islay on 8 Apr, and 13 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 10 Jan. Elsewhere, 3 were at Feall Bay Coll on 11 Apr and 3 at Java Pt, Craignure Mull on 13-14 Jan. The last birds were 9 at Kintra Islay on 21 Apr.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from (*Islay/Jura/Kintyre/Tiree*). First returning birds were 12 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 13 Oct. Max. counts of 22 at Hough Bay *Tiree* on 30 Dec, 11 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 12 Dec, 7 at Laggan Bay *Islay* on 9 Nov and singles at Craighouse *Jura* on 19 Oct and at Loch Eatharna *Coll* on 3 Nov.





#### **GOLDENEYE** Bucephala clangula

**RED LIST** RBBP A common winter visitor. Birds are regularly present in all areas from early Oct to late Apr with occasional summer records.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Max. area counts of 83 at Eilean Traighe, Ormsary Mid-Argyll on 19 Jan, 55 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 9 Mar, 37 at Loch Creran North Argyll on 4 Jan, 19 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 12 Jan, 11 at Machrihanish SBO on 3 Jan, 11 at Lussa Loch on 10 Feb and 11 West Loch Tarbert on 10 Jan (all Kintyre), and 9 at Loch Poit na h'I Mull on 10 Feb. Last birds in spring were 2 at Carse Mid-Argyll on 11 May. Other widespread counts of 1-8 birds.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). First of autumn was a fem/imm at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 9 Oct. Max. area counts of 64 at Eilean Traighe, Ormsary Mid-Argyll on 27 Dec, 34 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 26 Dec, 15 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 18 Dec, 9 at Loch Creran North Argyll on 14 Dec, 8 at Ardnave Loch Islay on 8 Dec, but only 5 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 4 Nov. The decline in numbers in recent years has continued.



# **GOOSANDER** Mergus merganser

A scarce breeding species mainly in Cowal, Mid-Argyll, Mull and N Argyll. The population is more widespread in winter but in small numbers.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree). Most reports from sites in; Mull (26) and Mid-Argyll (8). Max. counts of 9 Ardkinglas Cowal on 18 Jan, 8 at Ormsary Mid-Argyll on 12 Apr and 7 at the Add Est. Mid-Argyll on 3 May. On Islay two were at Loch Skerrols on 22 Feb, with one remaining on 4 Mar and 1 at Loch Kinnabus on 2 Apr. Elsewhere, most counts were of 1-4 birds.

**Summer/breeding** Reports of prs from sites in (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). A fem with b/3 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 28 July was the only brood reported. Post breeding flocks of 18 at Hunter's Quay *Cowal* on 16 Jul and 11 at Croig *Mull* on 9 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree). Most reports of 1-6 birds with max. area counts of 44 at Eilean Traighe, Ormsary Mid-Argyll on 23 Dec, 14 at Cairndow Cowal on 24 Oct, 11 at West Ardhu Mull on 26 Sep, 19 at West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 22 Sep and 4 at Loch Gruinart Islay from 1-9 Sep.

#### **RED-BREASTED MERGANSER** Mergus serrator

AMBER LIST RBBP A common resident breeder. Large moulting flocks gather, particularly in Loch Indaal, Islay and Sound of Gigha, Kintyre during late summer. The Sound of Gigha, Kintyre is a site of national importance for wintering birds. Small numbers are found on fresh water.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 50 at West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 25 Feb, 47 at Loch na Keal Mull on 14 Mar, 30 at Bowmore Islay on 24 Feb, 30 at Loch Craignish

*Mid-Argyll* on 15 Jan and 23 at Loch Don *Mull* on 18 Feb. Elsewhere, counts of up to 20, however most groups were fewer than 10.

**Breeding** Breeding around much of the Argyll coastline, but limited data received. On *Tiree* 14 prs at 6 sites in May with 4+ broods noted there from 8 Jul. Elsewhere, broods noted on *Mull* at Loch Don, Knock and Kilfinichen, in *Mid-Argyll* at Add Estuary (2), at Arinagour *Coll* and Lussa Bay *Jura*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay*). Max. counts of 234 (post breeding moult flock) at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 16 Jul and 93 there on 18 Nov, 85 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 4 Nov, 77 at Loch Craignish *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Nov, 57 at Duart Bay *Mull* on 2 Sep and 48 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Sep. Elsewhere, counts of up to 40.

## **RED GROUSE** Lagopus lagopus scotica

A sparsely distributed, resident, breeding bird. All reports required.

All year Reports from moorland areas in (Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll). Few reports in total from across Argyll, all of 1-2 birds, except of 4 at the Ensay Burn Mull on 23 Sep, 4 at RSPB Oa Reserve Islay on 22 Nov and 3 at Barr Glen Kintyre on 29 & 30 Jan and 8 Apr. Two broods (b/8 & b/6) were noted on Kerrera Mid-Argyll on 1 Aug.

## **PTARMIGAN\*** Lagopus muta

RED LIST A localised resident breeding bird, generally above 800m in north and east Argyll, and on Mull where the population is estimated to be 25-50 birds. All records required.

All year On Mull 2 were at Maol nan Damh, Ben More on 1 Apr. In North Argyll singles, unless stated, were at; Drochaid Ghlas on 29 Mar, 2 at Ben Cruachan on 4 May, Beinn Udlaidh on 6

May, Stob a' Choire Odhair on 18 Jun, Beinn Eunaich and Beinn a' Chochuill on 11 Jul, Ben Cruachan on 19 Oct, Sron nan Cabar on 29 Oct and Meall na Eun on 30 Oct and 2 were found on Cruach nan Cuillean *Cowal* on 23 Apr. *Under recorded and often dependent on reports from hill walkers*

# BLACK GROUSE Lyrurus tetrix

**RED LIST** A scarce, localised, resident breeder. Numbers still likely to be declining at a slower rate after a steep decline. Very thinly distributed in all mainland areas: with a few on Islay and Jura. All records required.

*Winter/spring/breeding* Most reports of only 1-4 birds from sites in; *Islay* (1), *Mid-Argyll* (6) and *North Argyll* (2). Max. counts of 8 at Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Jan and 8 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 11 Feb. Noted at Culbuie *Islay* on 16 Feb.

**Autumn/winter** Only three reports; in *Mid-Argyll* 6 males were at Dalvore on 20 Oct and 7 males at Dunbeg on 27 Oct, and in *North Argyll* 6 males at Loch Tulla on 17 Nov.

## PHEASANT Phasianus colchicus

May be abundant, in those parts of Argyll, where birds are released for shooting. Reports from Jura and North Argyll are rare.

All year Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura/North Argyll), however generally under reported. Max. counts reported of 200 on Luing Mid-Argyll on 19 Mar and 50 inc. 'tenebrosus' type birds at Ormsary Mid-Argyll on 27 Dec. BBS: noted on 22.5% of squares (7/40) (cf. 18% in 2023) with max. BBS counts of 6 at Carraig Fhada Islay and 4 at Rhudle Mid-Argyll. Broods

reported at Scalasaig (b/5) *Colonsay* on 12 Jun and Gruinart (b/2) *Islay* on 22 Aug and also at Calgary *Mull*. Only two records from *Tiree*; single males at Balemartine on 1 Apr and Balephuil on 7 Apr.

## **QUAIL\*** Coturnix coturnix

AMBER LIST A rare and irregular summer visitor, mainly to Kintyre and the islands.

Spring/summer Single males calling at Escart Farm, nr Claonaig Kintyre on 6 Jun and at Greenhill, Sandaig Tiree on 15 & 22 Jun.

## **RED-LEGGED PARTRIDGE** Alectoris rufa

Birds (some hybrids with Chukar A. chukar) have been introduced to several areas. Although this species is in Category C of the British list, populations in Argyll do not appear to be self-sustaining.

All year Reports from six areas in (Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll). Most reports of just 1-4 birds, with 8 on Luing Mid-Argyll on 13 Jan, the only larger count.

## **EUROPEAN NIGHTJAR** Caprimulgus europaeus

AMBER LIST A rare and irregular summer visitor and passage migrant: has bred in the past in Kintyre and Cowal. Last accepted records were at Glen Forsa, Mull on 3 Aug 2010 and Lochdon, Mull on 1 Jun 2022.

*Spring/summer* A bird was heard churring in an area of cleared and newly planted woodland in south *Kintyre* late evening on 12 Jun and was sound recorded as part of the ABC Nightjar project started in 2024 and funded by the ABC and SOC. (*See list of rejected, pending etc. records on page 130*)

## **SWIFT** Apus apus

**RED LIST** A summer visitor, breeding locally on the mainland. Wandering birds and passage migrants may occur anywhere.

Spring/summer Reports from all areas. Following a very early bird at Tobermory Mull on 15 Apr, first birds were 2 at Glen Lonan Mid-Argyll on 30 Apr and 2 at Oban Mid-Argyll on the same day. Followed by singles at Barsloisnoch Mid-Argyll on 3 May and Lephenstrath Kintyre on 7 May and most arrivals shortly afterwards. Reports from sites in each area were; Coll (2), Colonsay (2), Cowal (7), Islay (2), Jura (1), Kintyre (3), Mid-Argyll (16), Mull (7), North Argyll (1) and Tiree (4). Outwith known nesting areas, notable counts of 20 on Coll on 15 Jul, 17 Oronsay Colonsay on 13 Jul, 6 at Ardnadrochit Mull on 14 Jul and 5 at Benderloch North Argyll on 25 May. A single at Keils on 22 Jul was only the eighth record for Jura.

**Breeding** Provision of nest boxes appears to be assisting this species. In *Mid-Argyll* 2 prs bred at the Kilmichael Glassary boxes which failed on first clutch but second broods fledged on the late dates of 29 Aug and 3 Sep, but no nesting details from Taynuilt or the Mid-Argyll hospital, Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll*. Breeding season counts in *Mid-*Argyll; 30 at Oban on 5 Aug, 10 at Portsonachan 2 Jun, 6 at Lochgilphead on 15 May & 12 Jul, 6 at Kilmelford on 28 May, 2 at Inveraray on 11 Jul and 1 at Kilmartin on 14 Jul. In *Cowal*, 11 were at Carrick Castle on 22 May, 4 at Kirn on 23 Jul, 3 in Dunoon on 27 May and 2 at Sandbank on 24 May and 6 were at Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 13 Jul.

**Autumn** Most birds had departed by mid Aug after which 4 were at Campbeltown *Kintyre* on 24 Aug, 1+ at Kilmun Cowal on 25 Aug, 3 in Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Aug, 8 > S at Cairnbaan *Mid-*

*Argyll* in a big movement of hirundines on 29 Aug and 3 > S at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 1 Sep the last reported.

# PALLID SWIFT\* Apus pallidus

A rare visitor to Scotland from the Mediterranean region with no previously accepted records in Argyll.

**Autumn** One was seen flying over Coullabus *Islay* on 9 Nov and present for several hours [F. & P. Cavanagh, J. New, P. Roberts *et al.*]. *Record accepted by the BBRC and becomes the first Argyll record.* 

#### **CUCKOO** Cuculus canorus

**RED LIST** A common summer visitor that is more frequent and widespread on the mainland: less numerous on the outer islands.

*Spring* Reports from all areas. The first arrivals reported in each area were Knock Scalbert *Kintyre* on 2 Apr, Kilmichael Glen *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Apr, Kinnabus *Islay* on 7 Apr, Bunnesan *Mull* on 10 Apr, Strathlachlan *Cowal* on 17 Apr and Milbuie *Colonsay* on 20 Apr. Thereafter, more widespread reports from 21 Apr onwards.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 65% of squares (26/40) (cf. 59% in 2023). Calling birds reported from sites in; Coll (4), Colonsay (8), Cowal (17), Islay (20), Jura (9), Kintyre (5), Mid-Argyll (36), Mull (86), North Argyll (11) and Tiree (7). Some 'larger sites' had numerous reports e.g. 6 at Rhudle

*Mid-Argyll* on 17 May and 6 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 21 May, also 7 calling males at RSPB Gruinart and 6 males calling at RSPB Oa Reserve (both *Islay*) and 1 calling male on Oronsay *Colonsay* and 19 calling males on *Colonsay*.

**Autumn** Most adults had departed by late Jun. Numbers of reports received by month; Jun (36), Jul (4) and Aug (0). The last birds reported were at Glen Forsa *Mull* on 18 Jul and Sorisdale *Coll* on 19 Jul.

#### **ROCK DOVE** Columba livia

A resident breeder except in Cowal: concentrated on the islands and in Kintyre. Large flocks often gather on arable fields out-with the breeding season. The genetic integrity of most populations is now in doubt because of interbreeding with feral pigeons. Those on the islands being probably nearest 'pure' Rock Dove.

*Winter/spring* Reports received from all areas. Max. counts of 140 at Sgeir Carnach, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Jan, 75 at the RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay* on 15 Feb, 50 at Loch nan Gillean *Islay* on 23 Feb, 40 at Cornaigmore *Coll* on 10 Apr and widespread groups of up to 40 on *Tiree* in Jan.

*Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 22.5% of squares (9/40) (*cf.* 18% in 2023), with max. count of 35 at Crossapol Point *Tiree*. Eight prs noted at RSPB The Oa *Islay* and 9 nests found at the Blow Hole, Lunga, Treshnish Is. *Mull*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Colonsay). Max. counts 405 at Carrabus Islay on 29 Oct, 365 at two sites on Tiree on 9 Sep, 270 at Airigh Ghlas on 21 Nov and 270 at Ballinaby

on 8 Oct (both *Islay*), 220 at Sgeir Carnach, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 30 Sep and 89 at mouth of River Ba *Mull* on 25 Oct.

## **FERAL PIGEON**

Feral Pigeons are recorded from most areas, although less so from the island regions where Rock Doves predominate, and higher numbers are found in towns but there is little information on population size.

Higher counts mainly from the larger towns in Argyll with max. counts of 50 in Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 18 May. Other flocks in Dunoon *Cowal*, North Connel *North Argyll* where 68 on 23 Oct and on *Mull* where 20 at Loch Don on 2 Sep & 19 Oct. A flock at Islandadd Bridge, Add Estuary *Mid-Argyll* had increased to a max. 106 on 27 Oct.

#### STOCK DOVE\* Columba oenas

AMBER LIST A very scarce and decreasing local resident. Only regularly reported from Cowal and Mid-Argyll in recent years. All records required please.

*Spring* One was at Craigens *Islay* on 11 Mar, two were at Knock *Mull* on 21 Mar, one at Ardtur, Appin *North Argyll* on 1 Apr, one on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 22 Apr and one at Loch Spelve area *Mull* on 19 Jun.

# WOOD PIGEON Columba palumbus

AMBER LIST A common resident breeding species: less numerous on Mull, scarce on Coll, and rare on Tiree. Large flocks which form on the mainland in winter may include immigrants.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas (except Jura). Good numbers in Mid-Argyll where 160 at Kintarbert Lodge on 27 Jan and 70 at Duntrune on 1 Jan. Elsewhere, max. counts of 60 at Loch a' Gheoidh, Sunderland Islay on 3 Jan, 30 at West Tarbert Kintyre on 10 Jan and 10 at Cruach Ardura Mull on 10 Feb. Three were at Cliad Coll on 5 May, 2 at Scalasaig Colonsay on 9 May and a max. of 9 at Balephuil Tiree on 15 May.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 40% of squares (16/40) (*cf.* 29% in 2023), with max. counts of 6 at Rhudle and 5 at Dalvore (both *Mid-Argyll*). Limited data received, but singing birds reported at Carse House and Barnakill (both *Mid-Argyll*) and 9 prs RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Fewer large counts with max. of 110 at Coullabus *Islay* on 1 Sep, 100 Cattadale *Islay* on 1 Nov, 80 at Rubh' an Dobhrain *Mull* on 19 Dec and 50 at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 11 Oct. Elsewhere, counts of 1-20.

# TURTLE DOVE\* Streptopelia turtur

**RED LIST** RBBP A scarce but almost annual passage migrant. Most frequently recorded during May and Jun.

Spring Singles were at Tarbert Jura on 17 May and at Connel Mid-Argyll 25 May.

Autumn Singles were near Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 20 Sep and at Portnahaven Islay on 7 Oct.

## **COLLARED DOVE** Streptopelia decaocto

A widespread but sparsely distributed species throughout Argyll usually associated with human settlement. It is resident at many locations however is mainly a late spring migrant or summer visitor to some islands.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas. Relatively few reports with max. counts of 37 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Jan, 24 at Salen *Mull* on 1 May, 13 at Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jan, 10 at the Woollen Mill *Islay* on 2 Jan and 10 at Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Jan. Two remained at Crossapol *Tiree* throughout Jan and 5 were there in Feb.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 15% of squares (6/40) (*cf.* 6% in 2023), with max. count of 7 at Crossapol Point *Tiree*. Noted in all areas in Jun & Jul. On *Tiree* 4 prs noted at Loch an Eilein, 2 prs at Crossapol and 2 prs at Ruaig and 4 prs were noted in Arinagour *Coll*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Max. counts of 43 at Cullipool, Luing on 6 Oct and 23 at Toberonochy, Luing on 5 Dec (both *Mid-Argyll*) on *Islay* 21 were at Bowmore and 10 at Imeraval on 2 Nov.

#### **WATER RAIL** Rallus aquaticus

AMBER LIST A secretive and under-recorded resident: occurs at low density on the mainland but in larger numbers on the outer islands. Immigration is thought to occur in winter.

**Winter/spring** Reports from most areas except (*Cowal/Jura*), with 1-2 in most of 16 sites, with max. counts of 7 at East Loch Fada *Colonsay* on 3 Apr and 6 at Ardantrive reedbed, Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 9 Jan. Three at Canal Loch *Coll* on 11 Apr, with a single also noted on Gigha *Kintyre* on 2 Mar.

Summer/breeding Birds heard calling in suitable breeding areas from sites in Coll (1), Colonsay (2), Islay (2), Mid-Argyll (1), Mull (2) and Tiree (5). On Islay at least 4 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart. Fledged yng seen or heard at the Reef and Loch Bhasapol Tiree. Up to 6 were on Lunga, Treshnish Is. Mull in late Jun. Under recorded.

Autumn/winter Reports at 12 sites in all areas except (Coll/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll). Max. count of 5 at Ardantrive, Kerrera Mid-Argyll on 14 Oct and 4 at Dervaig Mull on 17 Dec, with other reports of 1-2 birds, incl. one in Cairnbaan garden Mid-Argyll from 15 Nov -22 Dec.

#### **CORN CRAKE** Crex crex

**RED LIST** RBBP A localised summer visitor, now breeding mainly on: Coll, Colonsay, Iona (Mull), Islay and Tiree. Following recent conservation activities, a long-term decline in numbers has been reversed, although numbers have been fluctuating recently.

*Spring* Reports from (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree*). First arrivals were at Conisby *Islay* on 6 Apr, Iona *Mull* on 9 Apr, Friesland *Coll* on 17 Apr, Balephuil (3) *Tiree* on 20 Apr, and Oronsay and Kiloran (both *Colonsay*) on 22 Apr. Most arrivals were during early May.

**Summer/breeding** Calling male counts: *Tiree* (296), *Coll* (61), *Islay* (21), *Colonsay/Oronsay* (14), and Iona *Mull* (21). An Argyll total of 413, *cf.* totals of 429 in 2023, 397 in 2022, 383 in 2021, 416 in 2020, and an Argyll peak of 702 in 2014 (*per* RSPB).

**Autumn/winter** A late brood was noted at Ruaig *Tiree* on 2 Sep when a single was also at Salum *Tiree* on 2 Sep. One was on Iona, *Mull* on 3 Sep and the last noted on *Oronsay* Colonsay on 7 Sep.

## **MOORHEN** Gallinula chloropus

AMBER LIST A localised, sparsely distributed, resident breeding species: most numerous on Islay and in Mid-Argyll.

*Winter/spring* Reports from 28 sites except (*Jura/Kintyre*). Most reports of 1-2 birds and max. counts of 4 at Kilcheran Loch, Lismore *North Argyll* on 6 Jan, 4 on *Cowal* on 28 Mar, 4 at Gruinart Floods *Islay* on 10 May, 3 at Ballyhogh Loch *Coll* on 12 Apr and 3 at Balnagown Loch, Lismore *North Argyll* on 6 Jan.

Summer/breeding Breeding reports from (Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll/Tiree). On Islay 4 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart. In Mid-Argyll breeding noted at Ardencaple, Seil and young were reported at Loch an t'Suidhe Mull. In North Argyll a pr with young at Balnagown Loch, Lismore on 24 Aug and a juv was at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 12 Sep.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura/Kintyre). All reports of 1-2 birds from sites in Coll (3), Colonsay (1), Islay (5), Mid-Argyll (2), North Argyll (1) and Tiree (1). Max. count of 4 on the Ulva Lagoons Mid-Argyll on 19 Aug. Generally, under recorded in some mainland regions.

#### **COOT\*** Fulica atra

A former scarce and irregular breeder and an uncommon winter visitor.

Winter A 1cy was at Loch Rhiaghain Tiree on 9-10 Dec and remained to the year end.

## **LITTLE GREBE** Tachybaptus ruficollis

A local breeder in small numbers: widespread in sheltered coastal waters in winter with concentrations at Loch Etive, North Argyll and at Loch Sween, Mid-Argyll.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Most reports from sites in (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). Max. counts of 10 at Loch Creran *North Argyll* on 11 Mar and 7 at Loch Craignish *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Jan. Many coastal sites held 1-5 birds.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 2.5% of squares (1/40) (*cf.* 2.9% in 2023). Limited breeding data, present on many suitable lochs, but no broods reported. 1 pr bred at RSPB Loch Gruinart Reserve *Islay*. **Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max. counts of 23 at Loch Peallach *Mull* on 8 Aug, 14 at Loch Creran *North Argyll* on 14 Dec, 11 at West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre* on 18 Nov, 11 at Loch Craignish on 14 Nov and 9 at Knipoch, Loch Feochan on 14 Sep (both *Mid-Argyll*). Elsewhere, counts of 1-8.

# **GREAT CRESTED GREBE\*** Podiceps cristatus

An uncommon winter and passage visitor with 1-8 records annually since 1984 and recorded in all months except Jun.

*Winter/spring* One was at Loch Leathan *Mid-Argyll* on 9 Jan, 2 were off Strone Point on 14 Jan, 5 off Blairmore, Loch Long *Cowal* on 18 Jan, 1 off Hunter's Quay *Cowal* on 5 Feb, 2 off Ardentinny *Cowal* on 8 Feb, 2 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 15 Feb and 1 off Uiskentuie, Loch Indaal *Islay* on 15 Feb.

Autumn/winter Two were at West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 14 Oct.

## **SLAVONIAN GREBE** *Podiceps auritus*

**RED LIST** RBBP A regular winter and passage visitor to sea lochs and sounds: occasionally on inland waters. The Sound of Gigha, Loch na Keal, Mull and Loch Indaal, Islay are sites of national importance for wintering birds.

Winter/spring Reports from (Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll). Max. counts in each region of 20 at Loch Indaal Islay on 24 Feb, 18 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 10 Jan, 11 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 10 Jan and 21 at Loch na Keal Mull on 29 Jan & 14 Mar, 2 at Ardmuckinish Bay North Argyll on 3 Jan. A single was at Blairmore Farm, Loch Long Cowal on 14 Jan. The last noted in spring was at Loch na Keal Mull on 28 Apr.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). First arrival was of 1 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Sep. Max. counts in each region of 26 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 13 Oct, 31 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 12 Dec, 8 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Dec, 12 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 9 Dec and a single on *Tiree* at Loch Bhasapol on 11 Nov.

## **OYSTERCATCHER** Haematopus ostralegus

AMBER LIST A widespread and common breeding species: in all recording areas. Flocks congregate at favoured locations outside the breeding season and numbers often rise noticeably during spring and autumn passage.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 440 (across five sites) on *Tiree* on 19 Feb, 237 at the Holy Loch *Cowal* on 15 Jan, 215 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Jan, 214 at Loch Gruinart on 8 Mar and 124 at Loch Indaal on 22 May (both *Islay*), 190 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 6 Feb and 100 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 10 Apr.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 30% of squares (12/40) (cf. 29% in 2023), with max. counts of 31 at Crossapol Point Tiree and 30 at Port Mor Colonsay. On Islay 37 prs at RSPB Oa Reserve and 9 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart. On Coll 88 prs at RSPB Totronald reserve and on Tiree first chicks noted on 24 May at Loch a' Phuill. On Mull 19 prs noted on the Treshnish Is., and 21 prs on Oronsay Colonsay.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 336 at Campbeltown Loch Kintyre on 17 Nov, 293 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 17 Nov, 211 at Loch Gruinart on 13 Dec and 203 at Loch Indaal on 1 Nov (both Islay), 168 at Port Ann Mid-Argyll on 10 Oct, 129 at Blairmore, Loch Long Cowal on 3 Oct, 119 at Scallastle Bay Mull on 22 Sep and 110 on Oronsay Colonsay on 28 Aug.

## **LAPWING** Vanellus vanellus

**RED LIST** A localised breeder and widespread wintering species: numbers highest on Tiree and Islay.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Highest nos on *Tiree* and *Islay*. Max. counts of 2,315 on *Tiree* all island counts on 19-20 Feb, 1,200 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 3 Jan, 320 at Machrihanish Water *Kintyre* on 30 Jan, 160 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 21 Feb, 126 at Smaull

*Islay* on 20 Feb and 102 at Fidden *Mull* on 10 Feb. In other areas, max. counts of 82 at Breachacha Castle *Coll* on 12 Feb, 48 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 9 Feb, 46 at Lagganulva *Mull* on 7 Feb, 43 at Tobernochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Feb and 3 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 12 May.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 20% of squares (8/40) (cf. 18% in 2023), with max. counts of 28 at Crossapol Point Tiree and 12 at Oronsay Colonsay, Cliad Coll and Fidden Mull. On Tiree 44 prs in the wetland compartments on The Reef and first chick noted on 4 May. On Coll 97 prs on Totronald reserve. On Colonsay (exc. Oronsay) 29 prs and 50 prs at RSPB Oronsay (cf. 25 & 41 prs in 2023). On Islay 151 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart (cf. 149 prs in 2023), 3 prs at RSPB Oa Reserve (cf. 1 pr in 2023) and prs at Machir Bay and Ballinaby. In Mid-Argyll at least 2 prs at Add Est./Moine Mhor and 1 pr at Torbhlaren. On Mull prs reported at Kinlochspelve (3), Loch Buie (2), Croggan (1+) and McKinnon's Cave (1).

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura/North Argyll). Max. counts of 2,470 on Tiree all island counts on 10 - 11 Dec, 940 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 30 Oct and 172 at Loch Indaal the same day (both Islay), 132 at Breachacha Bay Coll on 13 Dec, 140 on Colonsay on 1 Oct, 97 at Rhunahaorine Kintyre on 10 Dec and 66 at Cornabus Islay on 11 Dec. Elsewhere, counts of up to 55 birds.

# GOLDEN PLOVER Pluvialis apricaria

AMBER LIST A moderate but probably decreasing number breed on moorland in several parts of Argyll. Large numbers are present at traditional sites by the coast in winter, also during spring and autumn passage, especially on Islay, Tiree, and Mull.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura*). Mid-winter numbers lower on *Tiree* with only 1,360 there on 11-12 Jan during a cold spell but increasing to 5,750 at The Reef *Tiree* on 17 Apr. On *Islay* 1,500 at RSPB Loch Gruinart on 3 Jan declining to 300 on 8 Mar, on *Colonsay* 500 on Oronsay on 19 Apr. 160 were at Machrihanish Water *Kintyre* on 30 Jan, 130 at Fidden *Mull* on 28 Apr, 111 at Totronald *Coll* on 26 Apr and 91 at Aird Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Jan. Elsewhere, counts were of 1-90 birds.

Summer/breeding Casual reports, and under recorded, in likely upland breeding areas, with reports from sites in Mid-Argyll (2), Mull (1) and North Argyll (1).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/North Argyll*). Birds were arriving back in Jul e.g. 22 at Sandaig *Tiree* on 1 Jul and 40+ at Ardmeanach *Mull* on 22 Jul. Max. counts of 2,180 on *Tiree* all island count on 10-11 Dec, 1,720 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 30 Oct, 125 at Achnahard *Mull* on 12 Dec and 120 on *Colonsay* on 1 Oct. Elsewhere, counts of 1 - 35 birds.

#### AMERICAN GOLDEN PLOVER\* Pluvialis dominica

A rare autumn visitor. 36+ records, all 2001-2022 and mostly from Tiree.

**Autumn** Two 2cy+ birds were found at Middleton *Tiree* on 9 Sep and subsequently in other west Tiree locations, with one bird remaining until 22 Sep and the other bird last seen on 6 Oct [J. Bowler *et al*]. *Both records were accepted by the ABRC*.

## **GREY PLOVER** Pluvialis squatarola

AMBER LIST An uncommon passage migrant, recorded most frequently in Kintyre and on the islands: also, a winter visitor in small numbers, mostly on Islay and Tiree.

**Winter/spring** Most reports from *Islay* where 14 at Loch Gruinart on 4 Jan, with 10 there on 5 Mar, 3 at Gartbreck on 7 Jan, 2 Salum *Tiree* on 13 Mar, elsewhere a single at Loch a' Phuil *Tiree* on 24 May.

Autumn/winter First reports; 2 at Loch Guinart Islay on 30 Aug. Max. and higher counts; 27 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 13 Dec. Elsewhere, 2 at Gartbreck Islay on 30 Oct, 1 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 10 Sep, 2 at Danna Mid-Argyll on 8 Nov & 4 Dec, and a single at Gott Bay Tiree on 7 Nov.

#### RINGED PLOVER Charadrius hiaticula

**RED LIST** A widespread and fairly common breeding species: present throughout the year. Flocks congregate at favoured locations outside the breeding season and especially on passage.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Winter max. counts of 660 across 4 sites on *Tiree* on 29 Jan with max. of 260 at Sorobaidh Bay, 70 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 12 Feb, 60 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 3 Jan and 39 at Rhunahaorine Pt *Kintyre* on 10 Jan. Modest spring passage from mid-Apr - late May: on *Islay* max. count of 177 at Loch Gruinart on 15 Apr and on *Tiree* 425 (across 3 sites) on 15 May and max. site count of 190 at Ruaig on 15 May. Elsewhere, 60 at Loch Don *Mull* on 19 May, 50 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 7 Apr and 40 at Cliad Bay *Coll* on 10 Apr and 40 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 27 May.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 12.5% of squares (5/40) (*cf.* 9% in 2023), with max. counts of 34 at Killinallan Point *Islay* and 31 at Crossapol Point *Tiree*. Probable breeding found in all areas. On *Islay* 4 prs at RSPB Oa Reserve and 1 pr at RSPB Smaull reserve and on *Coll* 14 prs on RSPB Totronald reserve. First yng noted on 21 May at Crossapol *Tiree*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. Return passage increased from early Aug. Max. counts of 605 (across 2 sites) on *Tiree* on 23 Sep, 340 at Ardnadrochit *Mull* on 8 Nov, 300 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 24 Aug, 150 at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 4 Nov, 134 at Rhunahaorine Pt

Kintyre on 23 Aug, 73 at Fidden Mull on 17 Nov and 70 at Kilbride Bay Cowal on 21 Sep. Elsewhere, counts of up to 80 birds.

## **DOTTEREL\*** Charadrius morinellus

**RED LIST** RBBP A scarce migrant, mostly seen in late Apr and May. There are occasional breeding records in North Argyll.

*Spring* Three were Rhuba na Lice, Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Apr, 1 was at Beinn a' Bhuiridh (E) *North Argyll* on 25 Apr and 1 was at Druim Mor, Oronsay *Colonsay* on 29 Apr.

## **WHIMBREL** Numenius phaeopus

**RED LIST** RBBP A regular passage migrant: usually in small numbers and mainly on the islands. More frequent in spring (Apr-May) than in autumn (Jul-Oct) and is recorded regularly in summer but rarely in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Reports of wintering birds: a single at Machrihanish Links Kintyre on 30 Jan, 4 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 9 Feb and 1 at Loch Craignish Mid-Argyll on 7 Mar. First migrants; singles at Dervaig Mull on 7 Apr, at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll and Garmony Pt Mull on 8 Apr, at Salen Mull on 9 Apr and at Traigh Bhi Tiree on 11 Apr and 2 at Claddach Islay on 12 Apr, after which reports more widespread. Heaviest passage was in late Apr - early May when notable counts inc. 147 at Rockside Islay on 3 May, 55 on Tiree on 6 May, 51 at Killiechronan Mull on 29 Apr, 20 at Machrishanish SBO Kintyre on 21 Apr and 17 at Oronsay Colonsay on 25 Apr. Thereafter, most counts were fewer than 10, then 1-8 birds lingered into early Jul at sites in Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). First return passage on 8 Jul when 28 at Machir Bay Islay, then singles at Ardnave Loch Islay on 13 Jul, at Calgary Mull on 19 Jul and 3 at Port Righ Kintyre on 21 Jul. Numbers generally low with 12 at Loch a' Phuill

*Tiree* on 28 Aug, 8 > S at Frenchman's Rocks on 22 Aug and 7 at Loch Gruinart on 19 Aug (both *Islay*) and 5 at Treshnish *Mull* on 29 Sep. In Sep & Oct all other reports of 1-5 birds with late singles at Loch Don *Mull* on 22 Oct and Loch Laich *North Argyll* on 28 Oct and a wintering bird at Salen *Mull* on 6 Nov.

# EURASIAN CURLEW Numenius arquata

**RED LIST** An increasingly rare breeding species in suitable habitat: more numerous on passage and in winter. All breeding records of this declining species are welcome.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 171 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 9 Feb, 167 at the Holy *Cowal* on 12 Feb, 150 at An Carn, Oronsay *Colonsay* on 1 Jan, 123 at Killiechronan *Mull* on 7 Feb, 105 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 18 Feb, 86 at Mid Ardyne *Cowal* on 18 Feb and 65 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 9 Feb and 55 at Balinoe *Tiree* on 12 Jan. Elsewhere, counts of 1-50 birds and most counts of 1-15. Most birds had departed wintering areas by mid-Mar.

**Summer/breeding** Limited data and under reported from upland areas. On *Islay* 17 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart, 4 prs at RSPB Oa Reserve and 1 nest found at Cornabus, but no other breeding reports, however birds in suitable upland areas of *Mull* in late Apr -May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Return passage from mid-Jul e.g. 88 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 21 Jul, building to 152 on 27 Jul and 110 at Sanda Is Kintyre on 27 Jul and 45 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 3 Aug. Max. counts of 239 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 20 Sep, 160 on Tiree (at two sites) on 4 Oct, 137 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 10 Aug, 97 at Campbeltown Loch Kintyre on 17 Nov, 70 at Mid Ardyne Cowal on 27 Nov, 66 at Loch Don Mull on 2 Sep, 65 at Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 21 Sep and 61 at Machir Bay Islay on 4 Nov. Elsewhere, counts of 1-50 birds but most counts of 1-15.

# BAR-TAILED GODWIT Limosa lapponica

AMBER LIST A mainly autumn migrant and winter visitor: the largest numbers occurring on Islay. Birds are also regular on Tiree and at a few other island and mainland sites.

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all areas except (Coll/Cowal/Jura). Max. counts of 970 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 2 Jan, 87 at two sites on Tiree on 26 Feb, 58 on Oronsay Colonsay on 21 Feb, 22 at Loch Don Mull on 23 Mar and 17 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 7 Jan. Elsewhere, counts of 1-12 birds. On passage, 84 passage birds were at Gott Bay Tiree on 31 May, 58 at Eilean nan Ron, Oronsay Colonsay on 12 Jun, and up to 100 birds remained during Jun on Islay and 70 at Gott Bay Tiree on 25 Jun and with 1-9 noted elsewhere.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Returning birds noted from early Jul when 41 (inc. 3 in sum. plum.) were at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 8 Jul, also at Loch Gruinart *Islay* where nos. rose to 204 on 15 Jul and 20 >S at the Cairns of Coll *Coll* on 20 Jul. Max. counts of 436 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 Nov, 68 at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 6 Sep, 40 at An Carn, Oronsay *Colonsay* on 23 & 30 Oct, 32 at Scallastle Bay *Mull* on 22 Sep, 13 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* from 16 Nov and 12 at Loch Creran *North Argyll* on 14 Dec. Elsewhere, counts of 1-9 birds.

# BLACK-TAILED GODWIT Limosa limosa islandica

RED LIST RBBP A regular passage migrant, especially on Islay, Tiree and south Kintyre with occasional winter records. Most Argyll records have been presumed to relate to the Icelandic race L.l. islandica but at least one individual of the nominate race L.l. limosa has been identified (a bird leg flagged as a chick in The Netherlands and seen on Tiree in 2009).

Winter/spring/summer Reports from all areas except (Jura/Kintyre/North Argyll) during a strong passage. Wintering birds reported during Jan-Feb when 1-2 at Loch Gruinart Islay and 2 at Killiechronan Mull on 7 Feb. First arrival of migrants; 1 at Crossapol Tiree on 8 Mar, 2 at Breachacha Bay Coll on 11 Mar, then 15 at Gruinart Islay on 29 Mar and 36 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 30 Mar. Nos increased on Tiree in early Apr with a total of 83 on 11 Apr, rising to 190 on 18 Apr and then 1,499 on 19 Apr when 420 at Loch Riaghain and 385 at Vaul. Most had left by 23 Apr when only 49 were present. At RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay numbers rose from 64 on 14 Apr, to 155 on 17 Apr and peaked at 324 on 19 Apr, also on Islay 23 were at Cornabus on 21 Apr. Elsewhere, counts of 70 on Oronsay Colonsay on 22 Apr, 18 at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 30 Apr, 4 on Mull and 1 juv at Toward Pt Cowal on 23 Apr. Later 16 were at Heylipol Tiree on 6 May, 15 were at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 8 May and 13 at Loch Don Mull on 18 May, and other small groups seen on (Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree) where a few a few lingered into Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll) during a moderate passage. First arrivals of returning adults inc., 35 >SW at sea W of Coll on 20 Jul, 16 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 22 Jul followed by 53 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 7 Aug. Returning juvs. noted from 17 Aug with 2 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree. Max. counts of 71 on Tiree on 1 Sep inc. 55 juv. at Meningie, 50 at Uiskentuie Islay on 17 Aug and 16 at Caliach Pt Mull on 23 Aug. Elsewhere, area max. counts of 4 at Add Est. Mid-Argyll on 24 Aug, 1+ at the Holy Loch Cowal on 25 Sep and 1 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 19 Jul & 18 Aug. During Nov-Dec, singles were seen on Tiree at Balephetrish Bay on 4 Nov and at Loch a' Phuill between 9 – 13 Dec. On Islay up to 14 were seen at Loch Gruinart on 2-5 Nov, with 3 there on 18 Nov, but only one present on 30 Dec.

## **TURNSTONE** Arenaria interpres

AMBER LIST A common and widespread passage migrant and winter visitor: mainly from mid Jul to early Jun. Mid-summer records are not unusual.

*Winter/spring/summer* Reports from all areas except (*Jura*) of 1-30. Most high counts were from *Tiree* and max. counts there of 185 at Balephetrish Bay on 24 Jan, 125 at The Reef on 7 Feb, and 118 at Ruaig on 6 Mar. Elsewhere, 144 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 12 Feb, 61 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 14 Mar, 60 at Gartbreck *Islay* on 7 Jan, 47 at Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 20 Mar, 46 at Dunoon *Cowal* on 18 Jan and 32 at Oban Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 11 Feb.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Small nos., of summering birds were still present at some sites when returning birds were arriving. The first were noted at Loch Spelve Mull on 3 Jul. Max. counts of 200 on Tiree on 30 Sep, 133 at Campbeltown Kintyre on 17 Nov, 66 at Dunoon Cowal on 16 Sep, 65 at Ardnave Islay on 31 Oct, 53 at Scarisdale Pt. Mull on 9 Nov, 45 at Oronsay Colonsay on 16 Oct and 30 at Oban Bay Mid-Argyll on 1 Oct.

#### **KNOT** Calidris canutus

AMBER LIST An uncommon passage migrant: mostly in autumn, and mainly on Islay and south Kintyre. A few winter, mainly on Islay, and occasional birds occur in summer.

Winter/spring/summer Reports in winter from only (Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll). Low numbers at Loch Gruinart Islay where max. of 20 on 12 Jan. Elsewhere, 12 at The Strand Colonsay on 22 Mar, 5 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 7 Jan, 12 at Ceann Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 27 Jan and singles on Tiree at Gott Bay on 13 Feb and Balephetrish Bay on 25-29 Mar. 17 were at Traigh nam Barc Colonsay on 3 Apr and one was at Aros Est Mull on 14-16 Apr. Very small spring passage noted of birds on Kintyre and Tiree, inc. red adults, between 11-21 May, with max. of 10 at Gott Bay Tiree on 15 May and 6 at Traigh Bhagh Tiree on 20 May and singles at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 11 May, and at Loch a' Phuill and Ruaig (both Tiree) on 15 May. In summer, a few birds noted, with three at Loch Indaal Islay on 12 Jun and singles on Tiree at Loch a' Phuill on 11 Jun and Gott Bay on 1 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura/North Argyll). First returning birds noted in Jul when 4 were at Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 10 Jul. On 20 Jul, 8>S past the Cairns of Coll Coll and 15 were at Loch Gruinart Islay. Followed by passage from mid-Aug when 10 on Iona Mull on 15 Aug and 11 at Gruinart Floods Islay on 24 Aug. Area max. counts of 5 on Oronsay Colonsay on 23 Oct, 1 at Holy Loch Cowal on 15 Sep, 172 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 21 Oct, singles at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 5 & & Nov, singles at Loch Gilp on 16 Sep and Danna on 5 Oct (both Mid-Argyll), 4 at Killiechronan Mull on 18 Oct and singles at Triagh Bhi on 21 Sep and Gott Bay on 27 Sep (both Tiree). Birds had generally departed Argyll by late-Oct, with only 7 remaining at Loch Gruinart Islay on 18 Nov.

## **RUFF** Philomachus pugnax

RED LIST RBBP An uncommon passage migrant with most records in autumn.

**Spring** Few seen on passage, but on *Coll* one was at Breachacha on 7 May, and other reports from *Tiree* where the first were 2 at Balevullin on 29 Apr and 3 males at Loch a' Phuill on 31 May.

**Summer/breeding** Breeding activity was noted, locations withheld, with up to 12 different males and at least 1 female, with breeding thought very likely, but unsuccessful.

Autumn/winter Reports from only (Islay/Tiree). On Islay singles at Loch Indaal on 19 Aug, at Cornabus on 29 Aug, and 4 were at Gruinart Floods on 24 Aug and there was a late juv. there on 25-30 Oct. On Tiree single juvs. were at The Reef on 26 Aug, at Middleton on 27 Aug and Balevulin on 9 Sep, and numbers peaked with 3 at Middleton on 11 Sep and 3 at Loch a' Phuill on 13 Sep, with fewer until end of Sep with a last juv. male at Barrapol on 28 Oct.

# **CURLEW SANDPIPER\*** Calidris ferruginea

AMBER LIST A scarce but annual passage migrant. Most records in autumn.

Spring/summer Two were at Lochdon Mull on 16 May and 2 were at Druim Mor, Oronsay Colonsay on 23 May.

Autumn One was at Balinoe Tiree with Golden Plovers on 23 Oct. A less than average show this year.

#### SANDERLING Calidris alba

AMBER LIST A mainly passage migrant, most numerous in Islay, south Kintyre, and Tiree. Regular wintering is confined to Coll, Colonsay, Islay and Tiree. A few non-breeders occur on the islands in summer.

**Winter/spring/summer** Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). Good numbers wintering on *Tiree* with 480 found on 29 Jan and 460 on 12 Feb. Passage peaked on 11 Apr when 730 were at Balephetrish Bay, with numbers dropping by late May. Elsewhere, max. counts on *Islay* of 60 at Ardnave on 4 Jan, 142 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 12 Feb and 54 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 17 May. The last birds had moved through Argyll by mid-Jun, with larger numbers than usual e.g. 194 on *Tiree* on 9 Jun, 16 on Iona *Mull* on 10 Jun and 36 at Breachacha *Coll* on 10 Jun. Departing/arriving birds were difficult to separate but 3 were at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 25 Jun and 7 at Kirkapol *Tiree* on 30 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura) with first returning birds on Tiree on 1 Jul where max. counts of 303 on the four main beaches on 26 Aug and 305 there on 22 Oct. The

proportion of juvs. peaked at 29.4% on 23 Sep. On *Islay* 575 were at Loch Gruinart on 29 Aug and 140 at Eilean Nostaig on 24 Nov. Elsewhere, high counts of 69 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 18 Dec, 60 at An Carn, Oronsay *Colonsay* on 30 Oct, 46 at Ardalanish Bay *Mull* on 29 Aug and 30 at Feall Bay *Coll* on 30 Aug. On other areas, 15 were at Benderloch *North Argyll* on 28 Aug, 5 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Aug and 4 were at Kilbride Bay *Cowal* on 21 Sep.

## **DUNLIN** Calidris alpina

**RED LIST** A very localised breeding species mainly on Tiree. Numbers are highest on passage but large numbers winter on Islay and Tiree with smaller numbers elsewhere.

*Winter/spring/summer* Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Nos generally low outwith *Islay* and *Tiree*. Max. winter counts of 663 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 12 Jan and 290 at Sorobaidh Bay *Tiree* on 27 Jan. On *Tiree* passage peaked on 9 May when 450 were present across 3 sites and on *Islay* 1,285 were at Loch Gruinart on 12 May. Elsewhere, peak counts of 56 at Ardminish Bay, Gigha *Kintyre* on 2 Mar, 54 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 21 May, 46 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 30 Apr, 42 at Danna *Mid-Argyll* on 26 May and 40 at Loch Don *Mull* on 19 May. All other counts of 1-34 birds. Most had moved through by late May but on 9 Jun, 28 late birds were at Arnabost *Coll*, 80 on *Tiree* on 10 Jun and 15 on Iona *Mull* on 14 Jun.

**Breeding** On *Tiree* 25 singing males in the wetland compartments at The Reef. Singing males noted at 5 other sites in May and small numbers of fledged young at 3 sites in Jul. Birds were noted at 2 inland sites in *North Argyll* in early May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Return passage noted from 1 Jul when 34 were at Gott Bay Tiree, followed by 45 at Gruinart Islay on 22 Jul, then increasing in Aug when 320 at Gott Bay Tiree on 9 Aug, 480 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 24 Aug, and elsewhere 50 at Ulva Lagoons Mid-Argyll on 22 Aug, 42 at Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 18 Aug and 42 at Rhunahaorine Pt. Kintyre on 23 Aug. At Killinallan Islay 415 were present on 7 Nov and 92 were present across 2 sites on Tiree on 12 Dec. Elsewhere, 60 at Loch Don Mull on 19 Dec, was the only count over 50 birds.

#### **PURPLE SANDPIPER** Calidris maritima

**RED LIST** RBBP A widely, but sparsely, distributed winter migrant along rocky coasts from Sep to May.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). Max. counts of 55 at Balephetrish Bay *Tiree* on 26-29 Jan, 25 at Dunoon *Cowal* on 18 Jan, and 20 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 6 Jan & 6 Mar and 14 at Ardnave *Islay* on 4 Jan. Last report was of 12 at Treshnish Is *Mull* on 27 Apr.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/North Argyll*). First report of returning birds was of three at West Hynish *Tiree* on 4 Oct. Reports received from 11 sites in Oct-Dec with max. counts of 15 at Dunoon *Cowal* on 8 Nov and 14 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 5 Dec.

#### **LITTLE STINT\*** Calidris minuta

A scarce but annual passage migrant, with the majority of records in autumn.

Spring An adult was at An Fhaodhail Tiree on 12 Jun.

**Autumn** Two 1cy (juvs) were at Carnain, Loch Indaal *Islay* on 2 Sep increasing to 4 juvs there on 3 Sep and a juv was at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 21 Sep. A less than average show.

# **BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER\*** Tryngites subruficolus

RBBP A rare spring and scarce autumn visitor. At least 43 records of up to 57 birds since the first in 1971.

**Autumn** A 1cy (juv) was at Ruaig *Tiree* on 19 - 26 Sep [K. Gillon, J. Bowler, J. Dickson, N. Wall]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

## PECTORAL SANDPIPER\* Calidris melanotos

A scarce mainly autumn visitor. At least 74+ records.

Spring One was at Druim Mor, Oronsay Colonsay on 28 Apr [M. Vaughan].

**Autumn** One photographed in flight (unaged) was at Garvard *Colonsay* on 29 Sep [R. Ahmed]. Both records were accepted by the ABRC.

## WOODCOCK Scolopax rusticola

RED LIST A widespread, but probably under recorded breeder. Numbers are augmented in winter by immigrants from Scandinavia and other parts of Scotland. A small proportion of native birds leave for Ireland and possibly elsewhere. Roding birds are under recorded, and all records are welcome for this species, which is believed to have declined as a breeding species in Argyll, for the National Survey in 2023.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/North Argyll*). Generally, 1-2 birds from across 36 Argyll sites in Jan-Apr with max. counts: 9 at Bealach nan Sac *Cowal* on 11 Jan, 6 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 26 Feb and 5 at Quinish *Mull* on 17 Jan. Considerable numbers are still shot in winter in some areas, but no details are available.

Summer/breeding Limited data received, with reports from only 5 sites in Islay (1), Mid-Argyll (1) and Mull (3) of birds in May. On Colonsay during the BTO Woodcock Survey at Colonsay Ho. & woodland area no Woodcock were found, the first time since recording began.

Autumn/winter Only one report Jul – Sep; one Linndhu House Mull on 13 Aug. Thereafter, reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura/Kintyre/North Argyll) First report was of one at Loch Gruinart Islay on 20 Oct followed by one at Balephetrish Hill Tiree on 22 Oct, then other reports of other singles on Islay and Tiree in Oct. In Nov, only 14 reports across Argyll of 1-4 birds with max. counts of 5 at Garvard Colonsay on 17 Nov. In Dec only 6 reports: with 8 at Cornabus, Oa Islay on 30 Dec, 6 at Creag Mhor Islay on 26 Dec, 6 at Moine Mhor Mid-Argyll on 17 Dec and singles at Balephuil Tiree on 8, 14 & 26 Dec.

## **JACK SNIPE** Lymnocryptes minimus

A scarce autumn passage migrant and winter visitor, which is greatly under recorded: most records are from Islay, Mid-Argyll, and Tiree.

**Winter/spring** All reports of singles from sites in; *Islay* (2), *Kintyre* (1), *Mull* (1) and *Tiree* (3) except of 2 at Ballinaby *Islay* on 16 Jan and 3 at RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay* on 17 Jan. Most reports by month with 6 (6 birds) in Mar, then 4 in Jan and 3 in Feb. Last report of 1 at Calliach *Mull* on 17 Mar.

**Autumn/winter** Very few reports. Only singles noted at Tarbert *Jura* on 23 Sep, at Torra on 19 Oct, at Kinnabus on 24 Oct, at Loch Gruinart on 6 Nov and at Ardnave on 24 Nov (all *Islay*) and Cuin, Dervaig *Mull* on 20 Dec. *Under-reported; all records welcome*.

## **SNIPE** Gallinago gallinago

AMBER LIST A widespread and locally common breeding species: particularly on the outer islands. Higher numbers occur on passage and as winter visitors: mainly on the islands.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Jura). Max. counts of 23 at Cuin, Dervaig Mull on 4 Feb, 19 at Knock Mull on 11 Mar and 14 at Caliach Mull on 20 Feb & 12 Mar, 14 at Loch Finlaggan Islay on 15 Mar and 12 at Lussa Loch Kintyre on 11 Mar. Otherwise counts of 1-10 birds.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 25% of BBS squares (10/40) (cf. 35% in 2023), with max. count of 3 on Oronsay Colonsay. Singing/displaying counts; on Islay with 65 at RSPB Loch Gruinart and 8+ at RSPB Oa Reserve, 3 on RSPB Oronsay reserve Colonsay, on Tiree 77 at The Reef wetland compartments on 20 May and 15 Ters at Totronald Coll. Few other counts but reported from all areas except (Jura). First chicks noted on Tiree on 5 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*). Good nos on *Tiree* from early Sep with max. count of 80 at Hynish on 20 Sep and est. of 250+ on the island. Other high counts of 19 flying south off Calgary Pont *Coll* on 28 Aug and 14 at Gartbreck *Islay* on 30 Oct. Elsewhere, reports of up to 6 birds.

## **RED-NECKED PHALAROPE\*** Phalaropus lobatus

**RED LIST** RBBP A very rare breeding species and irregular passage migrant.

*Spring/breeding* Birds were noted at confidential breeding sites between 15 May and end Jul. 14 breeding males present at 6 sites, which reared at least 13 broods. Also noted, a colour-ringed individual ringed as a chick on Fetlar, Shetland in 2022 (also present on Fetlar in 2023),

## **GREY PHALAROPE\*** Phalaropus fulicarius

Irregular passage migrant particularly associated with autumn gales. Rare in winter and spring.

**Autumn** In *Kintyre* 1 was at the Machrihanish SBO on 10 Sep. On *Tiree* 2 >W off Aird on 11 Sep and 2 >SW off Hynish on 14 Sep. One was at sea off Eilean Musdile, Lismore *North Argyll* on 3 Oct. On *Mull* 1 was by the roadside nr Achleck on 21 Oct and 1 was at the Sound of Mull off Tobermory on 7 Nov.

## **COMMON SANDPIPER** Actitis hypoleucos

AMBER LIST A widespread and common breeding summer visitor and spring and autumn passage migrant in small numbers: occasional mid-winter records.

Winter No records.

*Spring* Reports from all areas. First arrivals 1-2 weeks earlier than 2023, with singles at Craighouse *Jura* on 21 Mar, mouth of River Ba *Mull* on 31 Mar, Croggan *Mull* on 3 Apr, Ormsary and Loch Feochan (both *Mid-Argyll*) on 7 Apr, Keil, Southend *Kintyre* on 10 Apr, Finart Bay *Cowal* on 11 Apr, and Laggan Bay *Islay* on 12 Apr. Reports widespread by late Apr. Max. counts of 10 at Loch Ba on 9 May, 12 at Gorsten on 8 May and 10 at Fidden on 25 May (all *Mull*) and 11 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 25 May and 8 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 12 May.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 22.5% of squares (9/40), (cf. 21% in 2023), with max. count of 6 at Carraig Fhada Islay. Limited data. On Islay 25 prs were at RSPB Oa Reserve. On Tiree 17+ prs in May-Jul, 14 AOTs found on Colonsay, and 2 prs at Kilmartin gravel pit Mid-Argyll on 23 Jun. Max. counts of 20 at Loch Spelve Mull on 10 Jun and 12 on return passage at the Add Est. Mid-Argyll on 18 Jul and 9 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 13 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from (Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull). Max. count of 8 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 4 Aug. Generally, 1-3 birds at other sites, with 17 reports in Aug and 6 in Sep, with the last, a single, at Salen Mull on 27 Oct.

## GREEN SANDPIPER\* Tringa ochropus

AMBER LIST RBBP A scarce, but almost annual passage migrant, with majority of records in autumn.

Winter/spring Three reported near Linn Dhu House, nr Tobermory Mull on 18 Feb. Autumn One was at Loch Kinnabus, Oa Islay on 15 Aug and 1 at The Reef Tiree on 30 Aug.

## **REDSHANK** Tringa totanus

AMBER LIST A localised breeder, mainly on the islands: widespread passage migrant and wintering species.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Widespread at coastal sites, usually of 1-20 birds. Max. winter counts of 134 at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 8 Mar, 52 at the Holy Loch (*Cowal*) on 15 Jan, 35 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 6 Jan and 28 at Loch Laich *North Argyll* on 26 Mar. Little spring passage noted in Apr with 28 at Laggan Bay *Mull* on 14 Apr, 25 at Loch Riaghain *Tiree* on 19 Apr and 28 at Traigh Bhagh *Tiree* on 22 Apr the only notable groups.

*Summer/breeding* Limited breeding data received. On *Islay* 114 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart and 13 prs at RSPB Smaull. On *Tiree* 46 prs at The Reef wetland compartments on 12 Jun, and on *Coll* 43 prs on RSPB Totronald reserve. On *Colonsay* there were 9 Ters (exc. Oronsay) and 23 prs on Oronsay *Colonsay*. There were 4 Ters. at Crinan Moss *Mid-Argyll*. The first hatched young were noted at Balinaby *Islay* on 15 May and on *Tiree* on 24 May.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll*). Autumn passage light with 30 at the Add Est/Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Aug and 30 at Clachan Mor *Tiree* on 9 Sep the largest flocks noted. Max. winter counts of 112 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 29 Oct and 47 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 29 Dec. Elsewhere, 32 Campbeltown Loch *Kintyre* on 17 Nov, 30 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Nov and 24 at West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre* on 18 Nov. Widespread counts of up to 24 birds.

# WOOD SANDPIPER\* Tringa glareola

AMBER LIST RBBP A scarce passage migrant and rare-irregular breeder: recorded in 22 of the 30 years 1980-2009, and majority of records in late spring.

*Spring* One was Cornabus, Oa *Islay* on 6-7 May. One was at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 15 May and 2 there on 31 May. Singles were at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 9 & 31 May.

#### SPOTTED REDSHANK\*

AMBER LIST A scarce passage migrant, almost annual in autumn.

Winter One was at the east side of Loch Gruinart Islay on 1 Jan [P. Edwards]. Record was accepted by the ABRC. (see list of rejected, pending etc records on page 130)

#### **GREENSHANK** Tringa nebularia

AMBER LIST RBBP A scarce breeding species: only in Mull and North Argyll in recent years. A widespread migrant: more numerous in autumn than spring and regular winter records in some localities.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Most reports from sites in; *Mull* (35), *Mid-Argyll* (13) and *North Argyll* (8) and generally of 1-3 birds. Max. counts of 13 at mouth of River Forsa on 14 Jan, 10 at Gorsten on 18 Feb (both *Mull*), 9 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* in 8 Mar and 7 at Loch Feochan *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Mar.

**Summer/breeding** Breeds in small nos in (Mull/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll). Birds noted back in breeding areas and display from late-Apr. Only casual reports of birds received from single sites in Mid-Argyll and North Argyll.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll) and most reports from sites in; Mull (20), Mid-Argyll (14), and Islay (11). First returning bird noted at Loch Kinnabus Islay on 1 Ju1, then next at Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 10 Jul then more widespread from late-Jul with generally, 1-5 birds at sites and max. counts of 13 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 7 Nov, 15 at Loch Cuin, Dervaig Mull on 26 Sep and 11 at Loch Don Mull on 19 Oct. One was at Tarbert Jura on 23 Sep. On the mainland, max. counts were 7 at West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 18 Nov, 6 at Loch Riddon Cowal on 9 Nov, 6 at Loch Feochan Mid-Argyll on 11 Oct and 5 at Loch Creran North Argyll on 19 Oct.

## **KITTIWAKE** Rissa tridactyla

**RED LIST** Normally a strictly marine species. The main breeding area is on Colonsay, with other colonies on Islay, Treshnish Isles and Tiree. Formerly scarce in winter and very scarce inland. Breeding Kittiwakes are a feature of North Colonsay & Western Cliffs SPA.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura). Max. counts of 650 at Hough Bay Tiree on 1 Mar, 250 feeding between Mull and Coll on 18 Jan, 210 >N in 30 min. Port Mor Colonsay on 25 Apr and 180 at Lunga, Treshnish Is. Mull on 25 Apr.

Summer/breeding Breeding data from (Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree). An improved breeding season: On Colonsay at the Dun Tealtaig annual sample cliff there was a count of 40 AON (cf. 33 in 2023). At RSPB Oa Reserve Islay 136 AONs (cf. 131 in 2023), on Mull 724 AONs on Lunga, Treshnish Is. (cf. 521 in 2023) at end Jun and at Ceann a' Mhara Tiree 655 AONs on 14 Jun (cf.

686 in 2023) where 940 large chicks on 12 Jul (mean = 1.53 chicks/nest n = 612). No count from Sanda *Kintyre*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Max. counts of 1,800 off Milton *Tiree* on 11 Nov, 1,000 off Arinagour *Coll* on 3 Nov, 398 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 7 Dec, 500 at Port na Callich on 22 Aug and 350 at Scallastle Bay on 27 Aug (both *Mull*), 100 at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 21 Oct and still 250 between *Tiree* and *Mull* on 19 Dec.

## SABINE'S GULL\* Xema sabini

A scarce and irregular passage migrant mainly in autumn.

**Autumn** A juv (1cy) >SW off Hynish Tiree on 5 Oct [J. Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC. Note: A 1cy was present at fish cages opposite Salen Bay, Sound of Mull on the Morvern Highland Region side on 28 Aug to 4 Sep.

# BONAPARTE'S GULL\* Chroicocephalus philadelphia A vagrant: 13-14 records. Almost annual in recent years.

**Autumn** A returning adult, first seen on Mull in 2022 & 2023 was at Scallastle Bay Mull on 2-4 Sep [T. de Clermont et al]. Record was accepted by the BBRC as a returning bird.

## **BLACK-HEADED GULL** Chroicocephalus ridibundus

AMBER LIST A patchily distributed resident breeder: reduced or absent at some sites due to mink predation and scarce in many areas in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Max. counts inc., 350 at Killiechronan Mull on 5 & 6 Feb, 147 at Largiemore Cowal on 12 Feb, 130 at Gott Bay Tiree on 25 Mar, 126 at

Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 12 Jan, 112 at Eilean Traighe, Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Jan and 90 at Kames fish farm, Loch Melford *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Jan.

**Summer/breeding** Birds late back at breeding sites on *Tiree* with few settled on 22 Apr: a total found there in May of 307 AONs at 12 sites (*cf.* 171 in 2023) but few fledged young seen; first fledged birds from 20 Jun and first juvs. *Mid-Argyll* noted on 7 Jul at Loch Crinan. On *Islay* 9 AONs at RSPB Loch Gruinart. No other breeding information received.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Max. counts inc., 1,650 in Loch Fyne, off Inverneill Mid-Argyll/Cowal on 26 Dec, 264 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 16 Nov, 200 at Lady Rock Mull on 3 Oct, 167 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 20 Sep, 98 at Loch na Keal Mull on 30 Oct and 68 at Blairmore Farm, Loch Long Cowal on 3 Oct.

# **LITTLE GULL\*** Hydrocoloeus minutus

An annual visitor, most frequently in autumn and winter but may be encountered at any time of the year.

Winter/spring On Tiree a second-winter (3cy) was at Sorobaidh Bay on 26 Jan and an adult was at Loch Bhasapol on 4-6 & 28 Mar. On Mull a first-winter (2cy) was at Killiechronan on 15 Mar, Knock on 21 & 24 Mar and perhaps a different 2cy at Port an t-Salainn, Loch na Keal Mull on 24 Mar.

**Autumn/winter** A 1cy was at sea off S *Coll* on 28 Oct and presumably the same bird in with feeding Kittiwakes there on 3 Nov, seen off Milton *Tiree* on 3 Nov and again at sea off S *Coll* on 5 Nov. An adult was seen feeding off Inverneill *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Dec.

## MEDITERRANEAN GULL\* Ichthyaetus melanocephalus

**AMBER LIST RBBP** A scarce visitor mainly in autumn and winter more regular since about 2005.

Winter/spring One (age not given) was at the Sound of Mull off Salen Mull on 9 Jan and one (age not given) was at Largiemore, N of Otter Ferry Cowal on 12 Jan.

**Autumn/winter** In *Mid-Argyll* an adult was at Loch Gilp on 15 Jul, a 1cy there on 27 Aug & 15 Sep, two 1cy's on 28 Sep, one, prob 3cy/ad, with dark brown legs on 2 Nov and another adult there on 24 Nov. On *Mull* a 1cy was at Scallastle Bay on 27 Aug.

#### **COMMON GULL** Larus canus

AMBER LIST A widespread and common resident breeding species but reduced or absent at some sites due to predation by mink.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 1,105 at six sites on *Tiree* on 19 Feb, inc. 350 at Gott Bay and also 450 at Balinoe *Tiree* on 13 Feb, 445 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Feb, 400 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 3 Jan, 400 at Knockan *Mull* on 19 Mar and 300 at High Peninver *Kintyre* on 11 Jan. Elsewhere, other counts inc., 245 at Rhunahaorine on 10 Jan and 240 at Brunerican Bay on 10 Mar (both *Kintyre*), 235 at Dervaig *Mull* on 10 Mar, 150 at Loch Laich *North Argyll* on 3 Mar and 85 at Mid Ardyne *Cowal* on 7 Jan.

Summer/breeding On Tiree 384 AONs (cf. 518 in 2023) found at 14 sites, but a poor season with only 68 fledging from 7 colonies (cf. 207+ in 2023) and first fledged birds on 25 Jun. On Islay 32 AONs at RSPB Smaull, 3 AONs at RSPB Loch Gruinart and 4 AONs at RSPB Oa Reserve. In Mid-Argyll at the Egg Shed, Ardrishaig the colony increased to 120 birds (cf. 32 AONs in 2023). Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 550 at Ardnave Islay on 24 Dec and 470 at Ruaig Tiree on 12 Aug. Elsewhere, high counts inc., 320 at Carnain Islay on 28 Oct, 300 at

Duart Bay *Mull* on 3 Nov, 200 at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 21 Oct, 164 at Mid Ardyne *Cowal* on 10 Sep and 98 at Eilean Glas, Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 18 Aug.

## GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL Larus marinus

AMBER LIST A common resident. Breeding widely but in small numbers on small islands along the coast.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Max. counts inc., 168 at Lingerton, Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Jan, 44 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 4 Jan, 36 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 18 Jan, 30 at Fionnphort *Mull* on 24 May and 25 at S Oronsay *Colonsay* on 23 Jan.

**Summer/breeding** Limited breeding data. Confirmed breeding only reported on (*Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). At Treshnish Is. *Mull* colony visits; Lunga (6 AOT) and Sgeir an Chaisteil (6 AOT), Sgeir an Eirionnaich (60 ad & many chicks), Sgeir an Fheòir (2 AOT) and Fladda (8 ads). On *Islay*, 3 AONs on RSPB Oa Reserve and in *Mid-Argyll*, 4 AONs noted at Glas Eilean, Loch Fyne. On *Tiree*, 22 AON noted across 7 sites and two vacant sites and first fledglings noted on 5 Jul at Loch a' Phuill.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max. counts inc., 250 on Oronsay Colonsay on 26 Sep during grey seal pupping, 125 at Lingerton, Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 28 Sep, 108 at 2 sites on Tiree on 10 Dec, 57 at Lagganulva Mull on 24 Aug, 41 at Ardnave Loch Islay on 28 Oct and 40 at the mouth of the River Forsa Mull on 8 Dec.

GLAUCOUS GULL\* Larus hyperboreus

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular winter visitor, most frequent Jan-Mar and a few summer records.

*Winter/spring* On *Islay* a 2cy at Loch Indaal from 2023 until 29 May and a 2cy was at Machir Bay on 3 Jan. In *Mid-Argyll* a report of one (age not given) in Oban Bay on 24 May. On *Mull* one

(age not given) was at Tobermory on 13 May. On *Tiree* a juv. from 2023 was at Sorobaidh Bay on 10 Jan and various locations until 17 Mar, this or another juv >W past Vaul on 24 Jan. An adult was at Sorobaidh Bay on 27 Feb and a 2cy was at Loch Bhasapol on 15 May.

**Autumn/winter** A juv. was at Sorobaidh Bay Tiree on 10 Dec. Approx. 8 birds over the year, perhaps our lowest number in many years.

## ICELAND GULL\* Larus glaucoides glaucoides

AMBER LIST A scarce but regular winter visitor: most frequent Jan-Mar, with numbers varying widely from year to year. A few summer records.

*Winter/spring* In *Cowal* a juv was at The Holy Loch on 4-11 Jan. On *Mull* a juv was at the Sound of Mull opposite Salen on the Morvern (Highland) side on 8-10 Jan and an adult there on 2-4 Feb and unknown if these ventured across the Sound into Argyll waters. On *Tiree* a juv was at Sorobaidh Bay on 29 Jan.

**Autumn/winter** On *Islay* single juvs (1cy) were at Saligo Bay on 13 Sep, Loch Kinnabus, The Oa on 15 Nov and perhaps same at Laggan Bay on 17 Dec. *Only 4-5 birds over the year which is perhaps our lowest number recorded.* 

## **HERRING GULL** Larus argentatus

**RED LIST** A widespread and abundant resident breeding species that forms large flocks outside the breeding season. Recently several large colonies have been abandoned, and very few now breed inland.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Additional counts through WinGS, with max. of 1,120 at Lingerton *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Jan, 911 at Holy Loch *Cowal* on 16 Jan, 340 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 10 Jan, 325 at Kilnaughton Bay *Islay* on 12 Jan, 286 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 12 Feb, 270 at Strath Fm, The Laggan *Kintyre* on 26 Jan, 260 at Loch Charrastaoin *Tiree* on 26 Jan, 200 at Lagganulva *Mull* on 15 Mar and 200 at Toberonochy, Luing on 22 Feb and 200 at Ormsary on 7 Jan (both *Mid-Argyll*).

**Summer/breeding** Limited breeding data. On *Islay* at RSPB Oa Reserve 8 AONs and only 1 AON at RSPB Smaull. At Treshnish Is. *Mull* 3 AOTs on Lunga and 1 AOT on Sgeir a' Chaisteil. At least 38 AONs on *Tiree* across four sites in May, although one other site vacant and 53 prs noted at 3 other sites earlier in the spring.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 1,580 at Lingerton, Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll on 23 Sep, 235 at Blairmore Fm, Loch Long Cowal on 3 Oct, 226 at Eilean Glas, Loch Crinan Mid-Argyll on 18 Aug, 212 at 3 sites on Tiree on 10 Dec and 170 at Loch Laich North Argyll on 14 Dec.

#### LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL Larus fuscus

AMBER LIST A widespread breeding species. Generally present from Mar to Sep. Some colonies are much affected by mink predation. A few remain in winter. Seabirds Count only found 236 pairs in natural sites in Argyll and Bute but did not publish an estimate of the number of urban nesting pairs for Argyll & Bute.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*) and from sites by month of; Jan (4), Feb (11) and Mar (40). Generally, a scarce bird in winter. In Jan, 1-2 noted in *Cowal* and *Mid-Argyll*, and 9 ads were back at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* on 19 Feb. Arrivals in several areas from mid-Feb, with first 2 on *Tiree* on 7 Feb however most arrivals in mid Mar. Higher counts noted inc., 136 at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* on 29 May inc. 2 *intermedius* type birds and 57 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 27 May.

**Summer/breeding** Limited and incomplete breeding data. On *Tiree* 44 AONs across 4 sites in May (43 in 2023) and none at a further 3 sites. 2+ prs noted at Glas Eilean, Loch Fyne *Mid-Argyll* on 7 May. First fledged young on *Tiree* noted on 12 Jul. Notable mid-summer sightings include 45 at Loch na Cuilce *Mull* on 22 Jun, 40 at Breachacha *Coll* on 10 Jun and 35 feeding at sea of Calgary Pt *Coll* on 20 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. Nos declined from mid-Aug, with passage noted; 54 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 9 Sep and 28 at Loch a' Phuill and 26 at Heylipol (both *Tiree*) on 19 Aug. Reports only from 5 sites in Nov and 3 in Dec, when singles reported at 2 sites in *Islay* and one in *Kintyre*.

#### **GULL-BILLED TERN\*** Gelochelidon nilotica

A vagrant: Four records; all on Tiree, in Sep 2008, Apr 2010, May 2019 and May 2021.

*Spring* An adult was at Loch na Lathaich, Bunessan *Mull* on 31 May-3 Jun [J. Smallman]. *Record under consideration by the BBRC*.

#### **SANDWICH TERN** Thalasseus sandvicensis

AMBER LIST A regular passage migrant but very rare, and irregular, breeding species.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll). First arrivals; 2 at Port Charlotte Islay on 2 Apr, 1 at Ardpatrick Mid-Argyll on 3 Apr, 1 at Carrabus Islay on 5 Apr, 1 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 6 Apr, with 6 there on 7 Apr, 2 at Bowmore Islay on 6 Apr and 12 Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 6 Apr. Higher counts mainly from Kintyre inc., 20 at Machrihanish SBO on 27 May and 8 at Carradale Bay on 24 May Apr, and 8 at Toward pt Cowal

on 22 Apr. Elsewhere, 4 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 13 Apr and 4 at Ardalanish Bay *Mull* on 22 May, otherwise counts of 1-2 birds.

**Summer/breeding** No confirmed breeding reports. In summer, 1-2 birds noted from (*Coll/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*), but no juvs noted until 18 Jul at Eilean Glas, Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll*. Max. counts of 9 at Ardminish Bay, Gigha *Kintyre* on 26 Jul, 7 at The Green *Tiree* on 26 Jul, and one was seen off *Coll* on 23 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from only (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). Counts included: 101 at Toward Pt *Cowal* on 12 Aug, with 43 there on 23 Aug, 55 on 8 Sep and 3 on 14 Sep. Elsewhere, singles at Duart Pt *Mull* on 17 Aug, the Oa *Islay* on 22 Aug, 4 around *Tiree* on 2 Sep, 2 at Carradale Bay *Kintyre* on 3 Sep, an ad at Gott Bay *Tiree* on 12 Sep, followed by the last report of 2 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 15 Sep.

## **LITTLE TERN** Sternula albifrons

AMBER LIST RBBP A scarce summer visitor with regular breeding restricted to Coll, Islay, and Tiree. Scarce passage migrant and irregular breeder elsewhere.

*Spring/summer* Reports from only (*Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Tiree*). First report was of 1 at Balemartine *Tiree* on 15 Apr. The first on *Islay* was at Kilchoman on 12 May.

**Breeding** On Islay 2 AONs at RSPB Loch Gruinart, while on *Tiree* a co-ordinated count on 20 Jun found 79 ads at 34 AONs at 9 sites, but a poor breeding season with only 13 fledged young found; apparently none on Gunna *Coll*, however 10 AONs were found during survey on *Coll*, although the colony failed later. On Eilean nan Ron, Oronsay *Colonsay* a single pair reared 1 young.

**Autumn** The last noted were 15 at Eilean Deadh-bhreac *Coll* on 13 Jul, 7 at Aird *Tiree* on 18 Jul and 12 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 25 Jul. A c/r bird at Gott Bay *Tiree* had been ringed as a chick in Co. Wicklow on 7 July 2014.

#### **COMMON TERN** Sterna hirundo

AMBER LIST A locally common summer visitor: considerably more numerous than Arctic Tern close to the mainland, but often less so on outer isles. Many colonies are severely affected by mink predation and often unproductive where no trapping is undertaken. Seabirds Count reported that the population in Argyll & Bute had declined by 62% since Seabird 2000, largely as a result in the collapse of the colony at the Glas Eileanan SPA.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura*). First area reports were of singles at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 7 Apr and Ardalanish Bay *Mull* on 9 Apr, then 2 at The Strand *Colonsay* and 3 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 1 May, becoming more widespread in the following week. Max. count of 17 at Fishnish Bay *Mull* on 30 May and 11 at Eilean Musdile, Lismore *North Argyll* on 24 May.

**Summer/breeding** Breeds on offshore islands for which little data. 2 prs nested amongst gull colony at Heanish *Tiree* but no young reared. A pr at Linne Mhuirich *Mid-Argyll* reared 2 yng and fledged young seen at Arinagour *Coll* on 23 Jul. Max. counts of 30 at A' Chroic *Coll* on 19 Jun and 17 at Staffa *Mull* on 2 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*), with few after mid-Aug. Later max. counts of 40 at Glas Eileanan, Sound of Mull on 3 Aug and 20 at Scallastle Bay on27 Aug (both *Mull*). The last birds were a single at Balephuil *Tiree* and 2 at Scallastle Bay *Mull* on 22 Sep.

# ARCTIC TERN Sterna paradisaea

AMBER LIST A summer visitor and localised breeding species particularly on: Coll, Colonsay, Islay, Jura, Mull, and Tiree. Many colonies are severely affected by mink predation and are often unproductive where no trapping is undertaken. Seabirds Count found 1,549 pairs in Argyll & Bute (a decline of 17% since Seabird 2000).

*Spring* Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/North Argyll*). First reports; an early bird at Vaul *Tiree* on 8 Apr, followed by singles at Balure of Shian *North Argyll* on 12 Apr and Balephuil *Tiree* on 21 Apr, then 4 at Port Charlotte *Islay* on 22 Apr and 2 at West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre/Mid-Argyll* on 23 Apr.

*Summer/breeding* On *Tiree* 125 young fledged from 240 AON at 17 sites around the island, with fledged young noted from 1 Jul. 50 ind. noted on *Coll* on 4 Jul with good fledging reported, 45 pr bred on Eilean nan Ron, Oronsay *Colonsay* and 264 nests (with 750-800 ind.) at Sgeirean na Guisach, Treshnish Is *Mull*. On *Islay* 5 AON on RSPB Gruinart Reserve. 120 noted at Eilean Musdile, Lismore *North Argyll* on 23 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura/Kintyre/North Argyll). Still quite a few birds around in late-Aug; 221 (192 juvs.) at Gott and Sorobaidh Bays Tiree on 23 Aug and 100 at Airne na Sgeire Coll on 31 Aug, but only small nos after mid-Sep, with the last, singles, on Colonsay on 28 Sep and off Hynish Tiree on 6 Oct.

#### GREAT SKUA Stercorarius skua

AMBER LIST Previously an uncommon passage migrant and summer visitor which was an increasing summer visitor, but numbers now reduced as result of HPAI. It breeds or holds territory in very small numbers on Coll, Treshnish Isles Mull, Tiree, Colonsay, Islay and Staffa.

Winter/spring No reports in winter. Spring reports from (Coll/Colonsay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). First reports of 1 at Salum Tiree on 8 Apr, 2 on Oronsay Colonsay on 11 Apr, and singles at Staffa

Mull on 19 May and off Insh Is. Mid-Argyll on 19 May. Max. count of 5 at Lunga, Treshnish Is Mull on 11 & 12 May (cf. a max. of 10 in 2023).

**Summer/breeding** Limited data. At RSPB Oronsay *Colonsay* 3 AOT but no young reared, and also 1 Ter on *Colonsay*. On Treshnish Is *Mull*, 1 AOT on Lunga and 1 AOT on Fladda. No AOTs on *Tiree*. No breeding reports from (*Coll/Islay*). 10 were noted at sea west of *Coll* on 20 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from (*Coll/Islay/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Passage birds noted from 13 Aug when 1 at The Oa *Islay*. Birds remained scarce, fewer than 2023, with max. counts of 11 at Lunga, Treshnish Is *Mull* on 18 Aug and 6 around *Tiree* on 31 Aug. Last reports were of 3 off Hynish on 6 Oct and 3 >W in 1 hr at Aird on 12 Oct (both *Tiree*).

## **POMARINE SKUA\*** Stercorarius pomarinus

A scarce but regular passage migrant. Mainly seen in autumn but has been recorded in all months.

*Spring/summer* One was reported from the Oban to Craignure ferry *Mid-Argyll/Mull* on 8 Jun. *Autumn/winter* One >S past Caliach Point *Mull* on 8 Jul, an imm >SW off Hynish *Tiree* on 14 Sep, one was reported from Oban to Craignure ferry *Mid-Argyll/Mull* on 10 Oct, a sub-adult was off The Cairns of Coll *Coll* on 30 Oct and an imm was off Milton *Tiree* on 11 Oct.

# **ARCTIC SKUA** Stercorarius parasiticus

RED LIST RBBP Previously the most common skua in Argyll with small numbers regularly seen in summer near large seabird colonies, this species has become scarce. The small breeding colonies on Jura and Coll have been in serious decline in recent years. Passage birds can be widespread in spring and especially autumn, but variable in numbers from year to year.

*Spring/summer* The first reported were 3 at Caliach *Mull* on 21 Apr, then a further 2 birds off W *Mull* on 9 May and 1 at Lunga, Treshnish Is. *Mull* on 12 May. Thereafter, 1-5 reported regularly in May from the Treshnish Is. and off Calgary & Caliach Point *Mull*, and around *Coll* and *Tiree*. One was at Carsaig Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 18 May.

**Breeding** On *Coll* no breeding census, but 2 ads present in May, up to 4 ads in early Jun and 5 on 23 Jul. A pr held Ter on *Tiree* from May - Jul. No reports from *Jura*, but singles, at least two different birds, were seen on 8 different dates in Jun on *Colonsay*.

Autumn/winter Sightings increased from mid-Aug with 5 off the Cairns of Coll Coll and 3 off Caliach Pt Mull on 17 Aug, singles of Ardmore Is on 21 Aug and The Oa on 22 Aug (both Islay), 6 off Caliach Pt Mull on 1 Sep, 1-2 seen daily at Loch Gruinart Islay between 8-11 Sep & 27 Sep, 1 on Colonsay on 28 Sep, 4 off Milton on 4 Oct and 4 off Hynish on 6 Oct (both Tiree), with other sightings around Coll/Mull/Tiree of 1-2 birds until the last singles off Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 1 Nov and juvs off Nevada Pt Coll on 3 Nov and off Milton Tiree on 4 Nov.

## LITTLE AUK\* Alle alle

A scarce and irregular winter visitor. Usually seen during sea-watches or after severe gales.

*Winter/spring* Only two reports of singles, seen from Port Ann > NE up Loch Fyne between Glas Eilean & Otter Ferry *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Jan and at Caolas *Tiree* on 12 Apr.

Autumn/winter A long-dead bird found at Ardnoe Point Mid-Argyll on 27 Sep.

#### **COMMON GUILLEMOT** Uria aalge

AMBER LIST A highly colonial, and locally abundant, breeding species. Adults with small young appear on the sea far from colonies in late summer. Large numbers of passage migrants

may be seen from headlands and smaller numbers are regular in sea lochs and bays in winter. Breeding Common Guillemots are a feature of North Colonsay & Western Cliffs SPA.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas with generally low counts from shore of 1 -10 birds, but 800 feeding off NE *Coll* on 26 Feb, 500 from Oban-*Colonsay* ferry on 19 Apr, 300 off Caliach Pt *Mull* on 7 Apr, and 200 off Port Righ *Kintyre* on 24 Jan. Birds appearing back at nesting cliffs from early Apr.

Summer/breeding Breeding data from Colonsay, Islay, Mull and Tiree, with most colonies reporting a decline in numbers, except on Tiree. On Colonsay at the Dun Tealtaig annual sample cliff there was a count of 105.2 ind. (n=5 counts) (cf. 118.4 in 2023). No counts from Sanda Is. Kintyre. On Islay 127 ads on cliffs at RSPB Oa Reserve in Jun (cf. 150 in 2023). At Treshnish Is. Mull breeding on Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil with a combined total of 13,828 ads. (cf. 14,762 in 2023) (TIARG). At Ceann a' Mhara Tiree a max. of 3,806 on 14 Jun (cf. max. of 3,125 in 2023) (per J. Bowler RSPB).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*); few large counts and max. counts of 400 between *Mull - Tiree* on 9 Aug, 205 from the *Tiree* to Barra ferry on 14 Aug and 162 past Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 11 Oct, and, then generally low counts of 1-80 birds until the end of the year.

#### RAZORBILL Alca torda

AMBER LIST A locally common breeding species, although much less numerous and with smaller colonies than Common Guillemot. Large numbers of passage migrants may be seen from headlands with smaller numbers regular in sea lochs in winter.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Generally, counts of 1-12 birds noted. Max. counts away from breeding colonies of 300 feeding off NE *Coll* on 26 Feb, 200 between *Tiree & Mull* on 18 Jan and 200 off Port Righ *Kintyre* on 24 Jan.

**Summer/breeding** Breeding reports from (*Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree*). On *Colonsay* at Uragaig annual sample study area 46 birds (n=5) there in Jun (*cf.* 46 in 2023). On *Islay* at RSPB Oa Reserve a count of 88 ads in Jun and 16 ads at RSPB Smaull. No population count from Sanda Is. *Kintyre*.

On *Mull* at Treshnish Is. a total of 1,204 birds on Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil at end of Jun (*cf.* 914 in 2023). At Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* max. count of 363 on 12 Jul, many with mid-sized chicks. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). Fewer high counts this year with 500 off Milton *Tiree* on 3 & 18 Nov the max. noted, with 200 still between *Tiree* & *Mull* on 19 Dec. At Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* 100+ were noted on 11 Oct and 73 there on 19 Oct. Small numbers remained at sea throughout the Argyll area with 40 noted from the Oban-*Colonsay* ferry on 27 Nov and 200 between *Tiree* and *Mull* on 19 Dec.

# BLACK GUILLEMOT Cepphus grylle

AMBER LIST A widespread, resident breeding species: on coasts, islands, and in sea lochs. Black Guillemot is a protected feature of Clyde Sea Sill MPA.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura*). Max. counts included 49 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 21 Jan, 22 at Loch Creran *North Argyll* on 11 Mar, 15 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 21 Jan and 15 at Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Apr.

Summer/breeding Sea counts ideally in Apr are a good indication of breeding nos. (also see counts above). 14 in dawn count at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 11 Apr, 20 at Staffa and 25 at Lunga, Treshnish is. (both *Mull*) on 20 May and 20 at Oban Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 24 May. No survey at RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay*, but 34 at Bunnahabhain *Islay* on 20 Jul, 30 on *Coll* on 15 Jul, 144 at Sanda *Kintyre* on 23 Apr and 50 at Kilmun *Cowal* on 25 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Counts from most coastal sites, usually of 1-10 birds, and max. counts of 71 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 18 Sep, 41 N of *Tiree* on 14 Aug and 12 at Loch Creran *North Argyll* on 19 Oct.

#### **PUFFIN** Fratercula arctica

**RED LIST** A very localised breeding species with main colonies on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles: only very occasionally recorded in winter.

Winter/spring One off NE Coll on 26 Feb was the only early report, with 100+ reported back at Treshnish Is. Mull on 1 Apr. Birds noted more frequently from 12 Apr off (Coll/Mull/Tiree) and larger counts inc., 220 on Staffa Mull on 27 Apr and 300 Lunga, Treshnish Is. Mull on 2 May, rising to 2,500 on 24 May. Three at the Oa on 20 Apr was the only report from Islay, small numbers also reported from (Colonsay/Cowal/Jura/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll) e.g. 3 off St Catherine's Cowal on 13 May.

Summer/breeding Limited data: present, with no count at Sanda Is. Kintyre. None were seen during surveys at Ceann a' Mhara Tiree on 16 May and 14 Jun. At Treshnish Is. Mull an est. of 6,452 AOBs on Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil (cf. 5,057 in 2023) (TIARG). At Staffa Mull 300 ind. noted on 9 & 11 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** Most reports were of 1-2 birds off (*Coll/Islay/Mull/Tiree*) however still 2,000 at Lunga, Treshnish Is. *Mull* on 1 Aug. Last reports were of 2 >SW at Hynish *Tiree* on 27 Aug, 8 off *Coll* on 28 Aug and one off Salen *Mull* on 10 Sep.

#### **RED-THROATED DIVER** Gavia stellata

RBBP A scarce widely distributed breeder (on moorland lochs), winter visitor, and passage migrant.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 28 at Loch Scridain (inner) Mull on 11 Jan, 22 at Loch Caolisport Mid-Argyll on 10 Jan, 20 at Loch Indaal Islay on 24 Feb, 14 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 29 Jan, 12 at Rubha na Cille Mid-Argyll on 18 May, 12 at Carradale Bay Kintyre on 21 Apr and 10 at Urvaig Tiree on 29 Jan.

Summer/breeding Reports from likely breeding areas in (Coll/Islay/Jura/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull) but under recorded as confirmed breeding only noted at 1 site.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Max. counts of 38 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 13 Oct, 32 off Oronsay *Colonsay* on 6 Oct, 28 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 18 Nov, 23 at Balephetrish Bay *Tiree* on 2 Oct and 21 off Inverneill *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Dec.

## BLACK-THROATED DIVER Gavia arctica

AMBER LIST RBBP A very scarce breeder in Mid and North Argyll: scarce in winter but more numerous on passage. Breeding was confirmed at 13 sites between 1985-2017. The Sound of Gigha, Kintyre and Kilfinan Bay, Cowal are sites of national importance for wintering birds.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura*). Few large counts with max. of 26 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Jan. Records of note elsewhere inc., 6 at Port Righ on 24 Jan and 6 at Carradale Bay on 4 May (both *Kintyre*), 5 at Loch Buie on 6 & 15 Jan and 5 at Traigh na Cille on 4 May (both *Mull*).

**Breeding** Evidence of likely breeding from 1+ site in *Mid-Argyll* and 1+ site in *North Argyll*. **Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Max. counts of 16 at West Loch Tarbert *Kintyre/Mid-Argyll* on 18 Nov, 12 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 18 Sep, 8 at Loch Caolisport on 27 Dec and 8 off Ardrishaig on 18 Nov (both *Mid-Argyll*), 6 at Mishnish Lochs *Mull* on 10 Aug and 6 at Carradale *Kintyre* on 14 Nov. Most counts of 1-5 birds, inc. singles at Kilmun on 6 Sep and Kilbride Bay on 21 Sep (both *Cowal*).

#### **GREAT NORTHERN DIVER** Gavia immer

AMBER LIST RBBP A numerous winter and passage visitor. Birds in breeding plumage are regularly recorded from Apr to mid-Jun. Pre-migratory gatherings occur off some coasts in late Apr and early May and a few immatures summer. The Sound of Gigha and the seas around Tiree and Coll have been designated as SPAs and Loch na Keal on Mull, Loch Indaal on Islay, West Loch Tarbert in Kintyre and Lochs Beg & Scridain on Mull are sites of national importance.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Most significant counts from the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre*, the *Mull* sea lochs and the *Tiree* coast. Max. counts on *Mull* with 108 at Loch na Keal on 8 Apr and 104 on 24 Mar, 69 at Loch Scridain on 15 Jan, and 44 in the Sound of Mull on 15 Jan. Elsewhere, higher counts from other sites; 97 at the Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 10 Jan, 87 at Loch Caolisport *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Jan, 55 off Crossapol *Tiree* on 7 Jan, 32 off SE *Colonsay* on 28 Apr, and 15 at Loch Indaal on 24 Feb and 15 at Claggain Bay on 12 May (both *Islay*).

**Summer** Reports from all areas Jun - Aug except (*Cowal/Colonsay/IslayNorth Argyll*). Reports of 1-4 birds from coastal sites, with 10 at Sorobaidh Bay on 7 Jul and 7 at Traigh Bhagh on 12 Jun (both *Tiree*).

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Cowal/North Argyll). Still 1-4 birds at several sites in early Sep, with 15 at Skipness Kintyre on 18 Sep and nos increased across sites during Oct. Max. counts of 91 at Loch na Keal Mull on 9 & 14 Dec, 64 at the Sound of Gigha Kintyre on 12 Dec, 60 at West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 29 Oct, 55 at Loch Scridain & Loch Beg Mull on 11 Nov, 31 at Loch Buie Mull on 14 Dec, 24 off Tiree on 14 Dec and 11 at Claggain Bay Islay on 25 Oct.

## **STORM PETREL** Hydrobates pelagicus

AMBER LIST A summer visitor. The main breeding colonies are on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles with a few pairs on Soa and Staffa. Breeding birds first come ashore in late May or Jun. Most sightings away from breeding colonies are during Jul-Sep, when non-breeders wander extensively. Breeding European Storm-petrel is a feature of Treshnish Isles SPA; these islands support 27% of the Great Britain population and between 1.9-2.3% of the Atlantic (north-eastern) population as estimated by Seabirds Count.

**Summer/autumn** Reported between 12 May and 6 Oct from (Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre /Jura/Mull/Tiree). First report was 1 at Lunga, Treshnish Is Mull on 12 May. A persistent feeding

group of *ca*. 200 was found off Caliach Pt *Mull* on 14-15 Jun, with 60 still there on 2 Jul. On a pelagic off W *Coll ca*. 100 were attracted to chum on 20 Jul and 46 were noted from *Tiree* – Barra ferry on 14 Aug and 50 on this crossing on 28 Aug. On *Tiree* 23 >SW in 1 hr at Hynish on 27 Aug, with regular reports of small numbers around (*Coll/Mull/Tiree*). Elsewhere, 10 feeding at sea off Westport *Kintyre* on 27 Jul and 7 off *Jura* on 22 Jul and counts of 1-3 from *Islay* and ferries to *Colonsay* and *Islay*. Last reports of 3 >SW at West Hynish *Tiree* on 14 Sep, and singles off Iona *Mull* on 15 Sep and off Hynish *Tiree* on 6 Oct.

**Breeding** A predated bird was found on Sanda Is. *Kintyre* inc. on 27 Jul. No census was conducted on Treshnish Is. *Mull* but birds present, and limited ringing carried out with 458 birds caught inc. 74 retraps (*TIARG*).

LEACH'S PETREL\* Oceanodroma leucorhoa

**RED LIST** A scarce, but regular, autumn passage migrant off western headlands, particularly after strong westerlies. There are occasional reports in spring and summer.

Winter One was reported at Balure, Loch Spelve Mull on 13 Jan.

Summer One at sea S of Kerrera Mid-Argyll on 22 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** On *Tiree* 1 >W off Aird on 11 Sep, 3 >SW off Hynish and another 3 >SW there later, both on 14 Sep.

# **FULMAR** Fulmarus glacialis

AMBER LIST A common but localised breeding species in all areas apart from Cowal and North Argyll. Large numbers occur on passage off western headlands.

**Winter** No records in Jan, with small nos. ashore on warmer days in Feb-Mar on *Tiree* near breeding colonies and a max. count of 400 at Ceann a' Mhara cliffs on 22 Feb. Reports of 1-5 from (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mull*).

Spring/breeding Breeding reports received from (Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree). At Treshnish Is. Mull 193 AOS were found at Lunga and Sgeir a' Chaisteil. Elsewhere, 655 AOS at Ceann a' Mhara Tiree on 14 Jun (111% up on 2023), in Kintyre no count at Sanda Is, 58 AOS at RSPB Oa Islay in Jun, 28 AOS at RSPB Smaull Islay and 126 AOS at Uragaig sample cliff Colonsay in Jun (8% down on 2023). On Coll 33 AOS noted at Totronald.

**Autumn/winter** Only records were from (*Coll/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*). Max. counts; 200 back at cliffs at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 11 Nov, 64 >W in 1 hr at Aird *Tiree* on 10 Sep and 50 still at Lunga, Treshnish Is *Mull* on 1 Aug. Elsewhere, max. counts of 19 at the Oa on 17 Dec and 15 at Frenchman's Rocks on 10 Sep (both *Islay*).

**CORY'S SHEARWATER\*** Calonectris borealis

A rare passage migrant. Nine records, mostly in Aug or Sep. Last reports were off Tiree in Aug 2005 & Islay in 2023.

**Autumn** Singles were off Milton *Tiree* with other shearwaters on 30 Aug & 12 Oct [J. Bowler]. Records are under consideration by the SBRC. (see list of rejected, pending etc records on page 130).

# **SOOTY SHEARWATER\*** Ardenna grisea

A passage migrant. Almost exclusively recorded Jul-Oct. Sometimes seen in large numbers from western headlands, islands and on ferry crossings during Aug-Sep.

Autumn Higher numbers than average this autumn with summary of higher counts: Around Coll;18 on 30 Aug, 100 off Cairns of Coll on 14 Oct, 40 there on 17 Oct, 20 on 28 Oct, 300 at Hawes Bank (off NW Coll) on 4 Nov and 263 there on 12 Nov with last report of 2 on 7 Nov. Off Islay; 2 past Frenchman's Rock's on 22 Aug. Off NW Mull; first 4 between Mull & Coll on 7 Aug, 100+ off Treshnish Is. on 29 Aug, also 100 off Lunga, as seen from Tiree, on 30 Sep. Off Tiree; 11 off Gunna Sound on 28 Aug, 140 off Milton on 30 Aug, 67 > SW Hynish on 16 Sep, 50 off Gunna Sound on 30 Sep, 40-50 off Hough Bay on 3 Oct, 10 off Milton on 4 Oct, 7 off Hynish on 6 Oct and the last 2 off Milton on 3 Nov.

# **GREAT SHEARWATER\*** Ardenna gravis

A rare passage migrant: Mostly in autumn with last reports from Sep 2007.

**Autumn** A massive influx recorded in waters around *Coll*, *Tiree* and off NW *Mull* towards Ardnamurchan, Highland. Significant numbers occurred in British waters and to a lesser extent in Scottish waters from late summer to mid-Nov. Argyll reports were first noted on 30 Aug and last group was seen on 12 Nov and peaked at around 6,000 birds on 4 Nov around Hawes Bank off N *Coll*, however presumably some remained longer as no further 'at sea' recording.

A summary of the main counts received: First reports were 33+ at sea from the Sea Life Mull (SLM) vessel, between *Coll* & Treshnish Is *Mull* and 27 from Milton *Tiree* [J. Bowler] on 30 Aug.

A gap in sightings after 1 Sep then 10+ off Gunna Sound *Coll* on 30 Sep, 1,000+ between NE *Coll* & Rum, Highland on 12 Oct, 600+ there on 14 Oct, 1,000+ there on 31 Oct, 600 between *Coll* and Gunna Sound on 3 Nov, 5,700+ in total from S Gunna Sound *Tiree* & around Hawes Bank, N *Coll* on 4 Nov and last report of 815+ around Hawes Bank N *Coll* on 12 Nov. *All reports have been accepted by the ABRC. Many thanks to the many fortunate observers that sent in reports and include:* [SLM crew and volunteers, J. Bowler, T. de Clermont, C. Davies, J. Dickson, S. Gibson, R. Grove, J. Hall, J. Harris, K. ## MANX SHEARWATER Puffinus puffinus

AMBER LIST Breeding colonies have been confirmed only on Sanda Islands and Treshnish Isles. Large numbers are seen on passage, especially during Aug-Sep. The Treshnish Isles supported 0.3% of the Great Britain population as estimated by Seabirds Count.

*Spring/summer* Reports from all areas except (*Cowal/North Argyll*). First reports were of 2 in the outer Sound of Mull *Mull* on 9 Mar, then 1 off Langamull *Mull* on 20 Mar. Four were off Port Ellen *Islay* on 29 Mar, 1 off Milton *Tiree* on 2 Apr and 1 between *Islay* and *Colonsay* on 3 Apr. Thereafter many records from *Coll/Mull/Tiree*, elsewhere, 5,000 reported from Islay ferry on 15 Jun and 1,200 off the Garvellachs *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Jun.

**Breeding** At Treshnish Is. *Mull* small groups of birds were seen offshore at Lunga and during the day (up to 20 ind.). Nesting birds were heard returning to their burrows. 10 ads were ringed there (TIARG), and 3 nestlings were ringed on Sanda *Kintyre*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/North Argyll*). Higher counts inc.; a remarkable passage of 28,350 >W in 1 hr off Aird *Tiree* on 10 Sep, with 3,100 >W there in 1 hr on 11 Sep. 4,000 – 5,000 were feeding off Milton *Tiree* on 28 Aug and 1,500 were still off Hynish *Tiree* on 29 Sep. Elsewhere, *ca* 3,500 were off Caliach Pt *Mull* on 22 Aug, 816 >S in 2 hrs at Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 22 Aug and 200 off Iona *Mull* on 3 Oct. Small numbers remained with other shearwaters into late Oct/Nov and the last report was of 2 at sea off Caliach Pt *Mull* on the late date of 12 Nov.

## **BALEARIC SHEARWATER\*** Puffinus mauretanicus

**RED LIST** A scarce passage migrant (Aug-Dec) since 1992 but in very small numbers. Usually seen with Manx Shearwaters.

**Autumn** One in a raft of 500 Manx Shearwaters off SE *Tiree* on 8 Aug [J. Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

## **NORTHERN GANNET** Morus bassanus

AMBER LIST Most Gannets in Argyll waters probably come from Ailsa Craig (30 km east of Mull of Kintyre) and St Kilda (190 km northwest of Tiree). Gannets are common inshore in Argyll waters from Apr to Oct, often seen high up sea lochs and some birds travel inland to cross between Campbeltown Loch and Machrihanish. They are also reported in small numbers Nov to Mar.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Smalls nos. of ads noted off *Coll, Kintyre, Mid-Argyll* and *Tiree* in Jan-Feb with a max. of 20 off Milton *Tiree* on 2 Jan. More reports in Mar with higher numbers off *Kintyre*; 22 off Machrihanish SBO on 10 Mar and 30 at Carskey Bay on 18 Mar. Thereafter numbers remained modest, with max. counts of 48 off Cove Point *Kintyre* on 5 May and 40 off Hynish *Tiree* on 28 May.

**Summer** Good numbers were seen through Jun & Jul, with similar nos to 2023 with max. counts of 200 from Oban – *Colonsay* ferry on 30 Jun and 200 off Keils *Jura* on 30 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Max. counts of 260 >W in 1 hr off Aird *Tiree* on 10 Sep, 234 past Frenchman's Rocks *Islay* on 15 Sep, 185 >SW in 1 hr off Hynish *Tiree* on 27 Aug, 100 at Port na Caliach *Mull* on 22 Aug and 100 at Port Righ, Carradale *Kintyre* on 12 Oct. Reports decreased after mid-Nov and only three reports in during Dec, from *Kintyre*, *Tiree* and 3 off Frenchman's Rock *Islay* on 31 Dec.

## **CORMORANT** Phalacrocorax carbo

Breeds in: Colonsay, Cowal, Jura, Kintyre (including Gigha), Mid-Argyll, Mull, and North Argyll, with around 230 pairs in recent years. Less numerous than Shag, but numbers have increased recently. Small numbers occur on some inland waters.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Most counts of 1-5 birds. Max. counts; 20 at Connel *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Mar, 18 at Craigens, Gruinart *Islay* on 11 Mar, 12 at Ardnave Loch *Islay* on 4 Jan, 12 at Strath of Appin *North Argyll* on 26 May, 10 at Balephetrish Bay on 6 Mar, 10 at Hough Bay on 12 Mar (both *Tiree*) and 10 at Barrnacarry Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 11 May.

Summer/breeding 28 AONs on Glas Eilean, Loch Fyne Mid-Argyll on 26 Jun and 2 AONs Pigs Paradise Colonsay were the only breeding records received.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. Most counts of 1-6 birds. Max. area counts inc. 24 between Craignure & Duart *Mull* on 22 Aug, 20 at Loch Indaal *Islay* on 17 Oct, 20 at West Tarbert *Kintyre* on 18 Nov, 19 at Loch Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 15 Nov and 10 at Blairmore Farm, Loch Long *Cowal* on 3 Oct.

## **SHAG** Phalacrocorax aristotelis

RED LIST A common resident, breeding on the mainland coast, outer isles and on islands in sea lochs. The colony on Fladda, Treshnish Isles, Mull is the largest in the UK. Widespread in winter and spring but very rare inland.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 700 at Calaich *Mull* on 21 Apr, 400 at Gunna Sound *Tiree* on 17 Apr, 360 at Soa *Tiree* on 26 Feb and 102 at Ardnave Pt *Islay* on 5 Feb. *Summer/breeding* Breeding counts inc., on *Islay*, 1 AON at RSPB Smaull Reserve and 25 AONs at RSPB Oa Reserve, 32 AONs on Oronsay *Colonsay* in Jun. On *Colonsay* 44 AONs at Uragaig and 26 AONs at Pigs Paradise sample site (*cf.* 23 in 2023). In *Kintyre*, no count at Sanda Is. 72 AONs at Ceann a' Mhara *Tiree* on 16 May (on 12 Jul mean brood = 1.71 (n=17)), declining to 63 AONs on 12 Jul and 12 AON at Happy Valley *Tiree* (J. Bowler, RSPB). 59 AONs noted at Totronald *Coll*. On Treshnish Is. *Mull* a significant decline in numbers with 126 AONs found on Lunga & Sgeir a Chaisteil (*cf.* 490 in 2023), with breeding also confirmed on Fladda (no count) and Sgeir an Eirionnaich. In *Mid-Argyll* 10 AONs at Glas Eilean Loch Fyne on 26 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. Max. counts inc. 602 at Eag na Moile *Coll* on 17 Aug, 600 on Iona *Mull* on 21 Sep, 500 at Traigh Bhi on 21 Sep and 450 in Gunna Sound on 14 Aug (both *Tiree*), 177 at Ardnave Pt *Islay* on 3 Nov and 128 at Sound of Gigha *Kintyre* on 18 Nov.

# **GLOSSY IBIS** Plegadis falcinellus

A vagrant: Fifteen records of up to 23 birds since 1901; the most recent being; one at Loch Sween, Mid-Argyll on 25 to 26 Sep 2009, Colonsay from 27 Dec 2013 to 5 Feb 2014, Tiree on 13 Jan 2014, and a remarkable influx of up to 8 birds from 21 Dec 2017, with birds reported from Islay (1), Mull (6) and Tiree (1) into 2018, one Tiree on 19 Apr 2018, one on Islay on 11-15 Sep 2020 and two on Luing then at Ardfern Mid-Argyll in Oct 2023.

**Winter/spring** One was at Ard Luing, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Apr [P. Malcolm, C. Davies, K. Rogers *et al*] also rumours of it perhaps being around for some time (weeks?) before and after this date and could even relate to it being one of two birds present on Luing the previous Oct. *Report for 12 Apr was accepted by the ABRC*.

## **GREY HERON** Ardea cinerea

A widespread resident: breeding in all areas except Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Jura). Most reports from sites in; Mid-Argyll (15) and Mull (8). Max. counts of 16 at Loch na Keal Mull on 29 Jan, 15 at Loch Craignish Mid-Argyll on 15 Jan, 11 at S Oronsay Colonsay on 31 Jan and 10 at Scallastle Mull on 14 Jan.

Summer/breeding Data received from sites in; Coll (2), Colonsay (5), Islay (1), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (4) and North Argyll (2). Sites with more than 10 AON's inc. 23 at Ardachy, Loch Etive North Argyll, 16 at Ardtur, Appin North Argyll and 20 at Ballachuan, Seil Mid-Argyll. On Colonsay a total of 15 AONs at five sites and 9 AONs at RSPB Gruinart Islay. Post breeding counts of 8 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 7 Jun and 9 at Loch Craignish Mid-Argyll on 13 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura). Max. counts of 19 at Campbeltown Loch Kintyre on 17 Nov, 18 at Scallastle Bay Mull on 22 Sep. 16 at Loch Creran North Argyll on 19 Oct and 15 at Loch Craignish Mid-Argyll on 19 Nov. Counts of 9-10 birds at sites in Islay (1), Mid-Argyll (1) and North Argyll (2).

## **CATTLE EGRET\*** Bubulcus ibis

RBBP A rare visitor. Big increase in numbers and expanding breeding range in England and more occurrences in Scotland. Seven records. One on Islay in Oct 2009, one on Mull on 27 Oct 2011 with the same bird on Tiree on 17-25 Nov 2011, one on Mull at Calgary on 10 Oct-13 Nov 2018, one at Dalvore, Mid-Argyll on 22 Oct 2020, one near Stewarton Kintyre on 13 Apr 2022 and one at Balvicar Mid-Argyll on 12-13 Oct 2023.

Autumn One was at The Glebe, Scarinish Tiree on 4 Oct [J. Bowler, T. de Clermont, J. Dickson et al]. Record was accepted by the SBRC. Follows a recent pattern of occurrences in late autumn.

# **GREAT WHITE EGRET\*** Ardea alba

RBBP A rare visitor. 19 or 20 records between 1986 and 2023. This species is increasing as a breeding species in the Netherlands and France, and also in England since 2012.

*Spring* A 2cy+ was at Fairy Isles, Loch Sween *Mid-Argyll* on 16-17 May [T. Girling] and a 2cy+ was at South Pier, Isle of Gigha *Kintyre* on 7 Jun [T. Salmeron, C. Cross].

**Autumn** All reports of birds in non-breeding plumage: On *Islay* a flock of 13 >NNE between Ardnave and Nave Is. on 20 Sep [C. & J. McKay], 2 were at RSPB Loch Gruinart Floods *Islay* on 21 Sep [L. Kingston, P. Roberts]. In *Mid-Argyll* 1 was at Blackmill Bay, Luing on 21 Sep [R. Lightfoot], 1 was at Clachan Bridge, Seil on 28 Sep [S. Fenwick] and this or another reported at

Loch Craignish on 28 Sep, 1 was at Craobh Haven on 5 Oct [M. Hampton], 1 was at the Add Estuary on 9 Nov [A. Paton] and later at Loch Gilp on 11 Nov [L. Sweeney] and 2 at Loch Beag nr Loch Craignish on 19 Nov [P. Price]. In *Cowal* 2 were at Ardachuple, Loch Riddon on 6 Oct [S. Kelly] and 1 was at Cairndow on 28 Oct then Inverfyne/Clachan on 29 Oct [D. Jardine, J. Dickson]. Last report was 1 at Loch Kinnabus, The Oa *Islay* on 3 Dec [D. Dinsley]. It appears likely that the *Mid-Argyll & Cowal* records may all relate to just two mobile birds. *All* reports were *accepted by the ABRC*.

# LITTLE EGRET Egretta garzetta

A scarce but increasing visitor. No records prior to 1958 but regular and a marked increase in last decade, mostly from autumn to spring. It has been seen more frequently in Argyll since breeding colonies have become established in England and Ireland.

Winter/spring Reported from sites in: Cowal (6), Islay (7), Kintyre (6), Mid-Argyll (12), North Argyll (2) and on Tiree. Area max. total counts on same day; Cowal (4) Islay (6) Kintyre (3) Mid-Argyll (5), North Argyll (2) and Tiree (2). Total numbers uncertain as birds frequently move around the region, however perhaps 16-20 birds present. Most sites only recorded 1-2 birds however max. counts of 6 at Loch Gruinart Islay between 17 Feb - 5 Apr and 5 at Achnamara Mid-Argyll on 5 May, with 4 nearby in Mid-Argyll at both the Add Estuary between 10 Feb - 12 Apr and at Ulva Lagoons on 31 Mar. Away from core areas 1 was at sites on Tiree between 10 Jan-22 Apr with 2 together present on 20 Mar.

**Summer** No evidence of breeding and sightings reduced during Apr. In Jun three reports of singles from sites in *Mid-Argyll* (3) and *Cowal* (1). First report of a juv was 1 at Loch Gilp *Mid-Argyll* with 2 ads on 14 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reported from sites in: Colonsay (2), Cowal (5), Islay (6), Kintyre (12), Mid-Argyll (7), Mull (4), North Argyll (3) and Tiree (1). Area max. total counts on same day; Colonsay (1), Cowal (9), Islay (13), Kintyre (14), Mid-Argyll (14), Mull (2), North Argyll (4) and Tiree (2). Total numbers uncertain however at least 35 present and possibly as many as 45-50 birds involved. Max. counts of 14 at Kennacraig, West Loch Tarbert Kintyre on 10 Sep, 14 at Ardfern, Loch Craignish Mid-Argyll on 14 Nov, 13 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 30 Oct and 9 at the Holy Loch Cowal on 15 Sep. Away from core areas 2 were at Craignure Mull on 23 Jul then singles at several sites on Mull with perhaps only 2 birds involved 30 Sept - 17 Dec and singles were on Tiree on 17-22 Oct and 24-27 Nov with both birds moribund on the later dates.

#### **OSPREY** Pandion haliaetus

AMBER LIST RBBP A summer migrant, breeding in small but increasing numbers. Occurs more widely on passage.

*Spring/summer* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Tiree*). First arrivals slightly later with singles in Ford *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Mar, then Craobh Haven *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Mar and in *Cowal* on 29 Mar, becoming more widespread in mainland Argyll from early Apr.

**Breeding** Of the 39 sites checked, nesting attempted at 17 sites and a single bird was present at another. The outcome was unknown at 3 sites, 7 sites failed, at which 2, interaction with Whitetailed Eagles may have been a factor, and. 7 prs were successful with 12 large young raised (ARSG). On *Islay* 1-2 birds noted 16 Apr - 17 Sep and on *Mull* 1-2 birds noted 12 Apr - 6 Sep but no evidence of breeding (ARSG). One was at Eilean an Easbuig *Jura* on 11 Jul.

**Autumn** Most birds had departed by late Aug to early Sep. At least one lingered in the Add Est. / Loch Gilp area *Mid-Argyll* in late Sep with occasional sightings to 9 Nov.

# **GOLDEN EAGLE** Aquila chrysaetos

RBBP A scarce, but widespread, resident breeding species, thought to be in the region of 120 to 130 pairs. Immatures tend to wander and may be recorded in areas where breeding does not occur.

**All year** Reports from all areas. All reports of 1-3 birds, except two reports of five birds and five reports of four birds together on *Mull*. An ad. was at Ben Hynish *Tiree* on 1 & 26 Apr.

**Breeding** Of the 89 sites checked, 77 sites were occupied by pairs or single birds. A total of 21 large young were found in 71 sites where the outcome of breeding was known to the large young stage, 13+ of which fledged (ARSG).

# **GOSHAWK** Accipiter gentilis

RBBP A sporadic visitor of uncertain status which may be establishing a breeding population.

Spring An adult was at Tir an Oig Quarry, Luing Mid-Argyll on 19 Mar [D. Jardine]. Record was accepted by the ABRC. (see list of rejected, pending etc records on page 130).

# **SPARROWHAWK** Accipiter nisus

AMBER LIST A sparse but widespread breeding species.

**All year** Reports from all areas. Fewer sightings noted during Jun and Jul, while nesting and many more in Sep & Oct. Sightings all of 1-2 birds.

**Breeding** Thought to be in the region of 500 to 1,000 prs. Of the 15 sites checked, 8 had prs and egg-laying was confirmed at 6 sites; two young fledged at one site and 3+ at another, the outcome was not established at the others (ARSG).

# MARSH HARRIER\* Circus aeruginosus

AMBER LIST RBBP A scarce, but recently more or less annual, passage migrant. Records in every year but one since 1986. Most records Apr-Jun.

*Spring* On *Tiree* an adult female was at Balephuil & flew to Balemartine on 9 Apr. *Autumn* On *Islay* a female was at Gruinart on 21 & 28 Jul and perhaps same bird at Loch Gorm on 28 Aug, and a male at Loch na Gabhar, nr Cornabus on 9 Aug.

# **HEN HARRIER** Circus cyaneus

**RED LIST** RBBP A sparse but widespread breeding species: Argyll holds around one quarter of the Scottish breeding population. Seen regularly: away from breeding areas, on migration, and in winter with reports from all recording areas.

**All year** Reports from all areas except (*North Argyll*). Fewer reports during Jul and Aug. Most reports from *Islay* then *Colonsay* and generally of 1-4 birds at sites. Max. counts of 5 at Loch Gorm *Islay* on 16 Aug and 5 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 26 Sep. A min. of 6 birds on *Tiree* in Oct. **Breeding** Thought to be over 100 prs. During breeding season 41 sites were checked, 18 were occupied by pairs (plus 4 sites with single birds), 15 prs laid eggs and 28+ large / fledged young were found (*cf.* 71+ fledged in 2023 and 9+ in 2022) (ARSG).

## **RED KITE\*** Milvus milvus

A re-introduction programme in Scotland since 1996 has involved releases in Highland, central, north-east and south-west Scotland. Genuine vagrants have occurred in the past, but most recent Argyll records involve these re-established birds.

Winter/spring Singles were at Lephenstrath Bridge Kintyre on 3 Jan, at Salachary, nr head of L. Craignish Mid-Argyll on 25 Jan, 2 at The Rest & Be Thankful Cowal on 27 Jan, at Ballachuan,

Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 31 Mar, at Tobermory *Mull* on 6 Apr, at Whitehouse *Kintyre* on 20 May, at The Oa *Islay* on 21 May, and at Carsaig *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Jun.

Autumn/winter Singles were at Easter Ellister Islay on 3 Sep, 2 at the Add Est/Moine Mhor Mid-Argyll on 19 Sep, at Brackley Kintyre on 25 Sep, at Dervaig and nearby Mull between 3-9 Oct, and perhaps same at Loch Scridan and nearby Mull between 22 Oct - 23 Nov, and 2 (ad & 1cy) were at Barsloisnoch & Moine Mhor Mid-Argyll on 14 Oct.

## WHITE-TAILED EAGLE Haliaeetus albicilla

AMBER LIST RBBP A rare but increasing resident breeder in Argyll: wandering immatures (and sometimes adults) occur widely.

All year Reports from all areas. Most reports from (Mull/Mid-Argyll/Islay). Max. counts of 12 at Coullabus Islay on 12 Oct, 7 at Loch na Keal Mull on 8 Aug, 6 on Jura on 12 Oct, 6 on Tiree on 4 Apr and 6 at Ulva Ferry Mull on 2 Jul & 5 Sep.

**Breeding** Monitoring effort declined with limited information from *Mull*. 32 occupied Ters found, where 22 prs laid eggs and 18 prs fledged a min of 22 young (outcome unknown at one nest). Overall breeding performance improved slightly to 0.92 chicks reared per occupied territory (where outcome known) (*cf.* 0.67 in 2023). Monitoring in 2024 was based more on the younger expanding population in (*Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*) and does not include details from several established pairs on *Mull* (ARSG).

## **BUZZARD** Buteo buteo

A resident breeding bird: common in all areas and the most abundant raptor in Argyll, thought to be between 1,500 to 2,000 pairs.

All year Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds at sites, with fewer larger counts; notably 8 on Lismore North Argyll on 6 Jan, 8 on Luing Mid-Argyll on 13 Jan, 7 at Beinn Hough Tiree on 4 Mar and 7 at Bunnahabhainn Islay on 16 Sep.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 22.5% of BBS squares (9/40) (*cf.* 32% in 2023). Reports from all areas. Of the 80 sites checked, 33 sites were occupied with breeding proven at 19; three sites failed, 10 were successful and fledged a min of 14 young and the outcome was unknown at the remainder (ARSG).

## BARN OWL Tyto alba

A patchily distributed breeding species: probably most numerous in Kintyre. It is widespread on Cowal, Islay, and Mull but only a rare visitor to Coll, Colonsay and Tiree. All records are requested.

All year Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/North Argyll). Most reports from (Islay, Kintyre, Mull and Mid-Argyll). Reports mainly of 1-2 birds at sites in all months with more reports during Jan-Mar and Sep-Nov. Three were at Bridgend Bay Islay on 28 Dec. Singles on Tiree at Balephuil on 12 Jan, at Hough in mid-Feb, and on Jura at Keills on 22 July and N Craighouse on 18 Sep. Three birds were caught during winter ringing in Jan-Mar in Kintyre N of Campbeltown, and one in Scammadale (Mid-Argyll) (ARSG). During Sep-Dec, 3 were caught N of Campbeltown in Kintyre (ARSG).

**Breeding** Breeding performance declined in 2024 following a crash in the vole population. Of the 91 sites checked (*cf.* 93 in 2023) only 44% were occupied (*cf.* 71% in 2023) and the mean young per successful nest fell to 2.05 (*cf.* 4.13 in 2023) (ARSG).

## LONG-EARED OWL Asio otus

RBBP A very scarce resident breeding bird and winter visitor: almost certainly under recorded. All records are requested.

Winter/spring Only two reports; singles at Balvicar, Seil Mid-Argyll on 9 Apr and Bagh Crossapol Mull on 26 Apr. Winter ringing caught one bird during Jan-Mar in Kintyre N of Campbeltown (ARSG).

*Summer/breeding* On *Colonsay* none were found in 6 sites checked. Fledged young / breeding was noted on Kerrera *Mid-Argyll*.

**Autumn/winter** On *Tiree* singles were at Balephuil on 23 & 25 Jul and at the Glebe on 22 Oct. Singles at Loch Skerrols on 26 Jun and at Claddach on 16 Aug (both *Islay*) were the only other reports. One was caught in winter ringing during Sep-Dec in *Kintyre* N of Campbeltown in Sep-Dec (ARSG).

## **SHORT-EARED OWL** Asio flammeus

AMBER LIST RBBP A widely but thinly distributed breeder and winter visitor. Numbers fluctuate and distribution varies with the abundance of small rodents, especially field voles (Microtus agrestis).

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/North Argyll). Most reports of 1-2 birds came from sites on Mull (5) and max. counts of 10 on Mull on 21 Apr, 4 at Creag a' Chromain Mull on 10 May, 4 at Ardmenish Jura on 29 Mar and 3 at Barr Glen Kintyre on 5 Mar. Winter ringing in Kintyre N of Campbeltown caught two during Jan-Mar (ARSG).

**Summer/breeding** An 'average' year, nine sites were checked: three occupied sites were found (*Colonsay/Cowal/Islay/Jura/Mull*). At least one young fledged giving 1.00+ young/successful nest (*cf. 3.33* in 2023); one site failed and the outcome was unknown at the other site (ARSG).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from (*Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*) with max. count of 2 at Aros Moss *Kintyre* on 26 Nov. One was caught during winter owl ringing N of Campbeltown *Kintyre* in Sep-Dec (ARSG).

## TAWNY OWL Strix aluco

AMBER LIST A widespread and common resident breeding bird: absent from Coll and with only single records for Colonsay and Tiree.

All year Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/North Argyll/Tiree). All reports of 1-2 birds, except 3 at Sgriob-ruadh Mull on 13 May.

**Breeding** While occupancy did not decline in response to the falling vole population, there was a reduction in productivity. Of the 45 sites checked 14 sites were occupied by prs (31%, *cf.* 29% in 2023). The mean young per successful nest was 1.67 (*cf.* 2.17 in 2023) (ARSG).

# **HOOPOE\*** Upupa epops

RBBP A scarce passage migrant, with most records in spring.

*Spring* One was in paddocks behind Coll Medical Practice, Arinagour *Coll* on 2 Apr and one was in a garden at Crannich, W of Aros *Mull* on 8 May.

#### **KINGFISHER** Alcedo atthis

A scarce but regular visitor with most records in autumn and winter at a few regular mainland locations. Likely breeds at several suitable locations across Argyll. The last proven breeding record was in Cowal in 2018.

Winter/spring Reports of singles from sites in: Cowal (4), Islay (3), Kintyre (2), Mid-Argyll (3), Mull (6) and North Argyll (1). Most frequent sightings came from the Holy Loch Cowal, around Head of Loch Indaal and River Sorn Islay and at Loch Gilp Mid-Argyll.

**Summer/breeding** During Apr, May & Jun single birds were noted in suitable breeding areas at Upper Glen Massan *Cowal*, Bridgend and Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* and at Dervaig *Mull* where two were noted in Jun and a male was with 2 juvs there on 30 Jun which appears to be the first breeding record for *Mull* and perhaps the Hebrides.

Autumn/winter Reports of singles from sites in; Cowal (3), Islay (3), Kintyre (3), Mid-Argyll (9) Mull (14) and North Argyll (1). Most reports in Cowal were from around the Holy Loch area however one was at Ardyne SW Cowal. On Islay 2 were at Bridgend on 19 Oct and 5 Nov, and on Mull 2 were at Dervaig on 24 Aug and 2 Oct.

# **BEE-EATER\*** *Merops apiaster*

A rare migrant: Seven or eight records since the first in 1981. Latest records being: two birds on Mull on 24 to 26 Apr 2010, one in Glen Aros Mull on 27 May 2014 and up to four on Islay on 26 Jun and 1 Jul 2015.

Spring An adult flew south over Carnan Mor, Balephuil Tiree on 3 Jun [J. Bowler]. Record was accepted by the SBRC.

# GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER Dendrocopos major

A resident breeder: widespread on the mainland and Mull, and colonising Islay.

Winter/spring Reports from sites in; Cowal (18), Islay (6), Jura (2), Kintyre (3), Mid-Argyll (35), Mull (27), North Argyll (10). All reports of 1-2 birds, except 3 at Inverawe Ho. Mid-Argyll on 5 Jan. Drumming heard in mild weather on 5 Jan, but more generally from late Feb.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 20% of squares (8/40) (cf. 21% in 2023), with max. count of 3 at Rhudle (Mid-Argyll). First fledged young noted at Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll on 15 Jun and at Bridgend Mid-Argyll on 18 Jun. Breeding activity also reported at Arrochar Cowal, Lephenstrath Kintyre, Kerrera Mid-Argyll and Benderloch North Argyll. Breeding under reported.

Autumn/winter Reports by sites from; Cowal (3), Islay (2), Mid-Argyll (13), Mull (13) and North Argyll (3) mainly of 1-2 birds, but 4 at Airds, Taynuilt Mid-Argyll on 3 Sep. In very mild weather one was drumming at Bonawe Furnace, Taynuilt Mid-Argyll on 28 Dec.

## GREEN WOODPECKER\* Picus viridis

Scarce/rare reports from Cowal in recent years as well as in Mid-Argyll, Mull and N Argyll. Breeding may have occurred in Kintyre in 1998. All records required.

*Spring/Summer* A single record of a bird heard at Glenan, nr Portavadie *Cowal* on 27 May. **2023:** A report of one at Corranmore, nr Ardfern *Mid-Argyll* sometime in Feb/Mar.

## **KESTREL** Falco tinnunculus

AMBER LIST A widespread, but declining, breeding bird, thought to be fewer than 100 pairs. There is emigration from some areas in autumn and immigration to others.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). All reports of 1-2 birds from sites in Colonsay (4), Cowal (4), Islay (5), Kintyre (4), Mid-Argyll (15), Mull (32), North Argyll (2) and Tiree (6). Five seen on Lismore North Argyll on 6 Jan, 3 were on Luing Mid-Argyll on 13 Jan, 3 at Cruachan Treshnish on 15 Apr and 3 at Calgary on 25 May (both Mull)

**Summer/breeding** Excluding *Kintyre*, where no breeding reports were received, 14 sites were checked of which 4 were occupied by pairs and a min of 4 large young reared, but the outcome was not established at two sites. (ARSG).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. All counts of 1-2 birds, except 3 at Luib Fin *Mull* on 23 Oct.

## **MERLIN** Falco columbarius

**RED LIST** RBBP Breeds very locally on open moorland and bogs, thought to be fewer than 20 pairs: more widely distributed on passage and in winter on low coastal ground and farmland.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll). Most reports of wintering individuals Jan to early May. Most reports (sites) were from; Tiree (21), Mull (11), Islay (5) with other sites in Mid-Argyll (4), Colonsay (3) and Kintyre (2). Two were on Tiree until Apr and last on 30 Jun, then none until 4 Sep.

**Summer/breeding** Two breeding attempts were found; a pair in *Mid-Argyll* fledged at least two young and a pair in *North Argyll* reached the large young stage but the fledging outcome was not established (ARSG).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*). Most reports were of singles, however at least 4 across *Tiree* in Oct and 3 at The Oa *Islay* on 13 Oct. Most reports were from late Sep to early Nov then fewer later in the year. Reports by region (sites); *Tiree* (18), *Islay* (16), *Mull* (11), *Colonsay* (3), *Kintyre* (2), *Mid-Argyll* (2), *Cowal* (1) and *Coll* (1).

## **EURASIAN HOBBY\*** Falco subbuteo

RBBP A rare visitor. Mostly in spring and autumn.

*Spring/summer* A 2cy+ was at Lephenstrath Bridge *Kintyre* on 24 May [A. & N. Hand], a first-summer (2cy) was at Arinagour *Coll* on 25 Jun [B. Jones, G. Smith], a first-summer (2cy) was at Dalvore, Moine Mhor NNR *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Jul [J. Boyd] and a recently-fledged juv was at Glenbarr *Kintyre* on 24 Aug [L. Donnelly], providing evidence of the first confirmed breeding in Argyll. *A higher than average number of reports. All records were accepted by the ABRC*.

## **PEREGRINE** Falco peregrinus

RBBP A widespread but scarce breeding species in all areas of Argyll, with about 70 occupied territories in 2005. There have been indications of a decline in numbers breeding away from coastal areas. Found throughout the year in most areas.

All year Reports from all areas and in all months. Generally, 1-2 birds at sites across Argyll and most reports from Islay. Max. count away from nest sites of 4 at Dhiseig Mull on 5 Sep and 3 at Creag Mhor Islay on 27 Jul.

**Breeding** 16 sites were checked, 6 of which were occupied (one with only a male present). Eggs were laid at least four of these, which were successful raising a min of 6 young (ARSG).

## LESSER GREY SHRIKE Lanius minor

A vagrant. Four records. Singles on Mull on 5 Sep 1974, Coll on 26 Oct-2 Nov 1988, Tiree on 6 Aug 2008 and Islay 9-26 Oct 2023.

**Autumn** An adult was at Upper Achnacroish, nr Craignure *Mull* on 7 Sep [C. Austick]. This belated report was subsequently identified from a phone video recording. *Record under consideration by the BBRC*.

## **GOLDEN ORIOLE\*** Oriolus oriolus

**RED LIST** RBBP A rare and irregular passage migrant, mainly in spring.

*Spring* A male was heard and sound recorded at Fearnoch, W of Taynuilt *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Apr [G. Smith] and a female-type was seen at Closeburn, nr Grogport *Kintyre* on 27 Jun [A. Gull].

# **JAY** Garrulus glandarius

A widely distributed (but scarce) woodland resident on most of the mainland: rarely reported from the islands.

Winter/spring Reports, generally of 1-2 birds. from sites in; Cowal (8), Kintyre (5), Mid-Argyll (14), Mull (9) and North Argyll (4). Max. count of 8 at Loch Stornoway Mid-Argyll on 27 Jan. Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 5% of squares (2/40) (cf. 18% on 2023). All reports from mainland Argyll and Mull with generally 1-2 birds at sites. b/3 noted at Loch Craiglin on 8 Jul and b/2 at Cairnbaan on 30 Jul (both Mid-Argyll).

Autumn/winter Reports of generally 1-3 birds from sites in; Cowal (6), Kintyre (20), Mid-Argyll (13), Mull (10) and North Argyll (4). Max. counts of 9 at Rubh' an Domhrain on 2 Oct and 4 at Loch Don on 22 Oct (both Mull).

# MAGPIE Pica pica

A local breeder restricted to Cowal. Elsewhere, has been a scarce and sporadic visitor (mainly in spring): in recent years appearing to be becoming more widespread.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll//Jura/Tiree). Cowal had most reports (52) sites, then Mull (12), Kintyre (9), Mid-Argyll (9), Islay (2), Colonsay (1) and North Argyll (1). On Cowal where more established and widespread than elsewhere in Argyll, 15 were at Dunoon Hospital area on 7 Mar. The reports of a singles on Islay on 10-11 May and on Mull during 15 Feb -17 May refer to wandering individuals. On Colonsay a bird released there in 2021 was regularly seen in Scalasaig.

**Summer/breeding** Not recorded in any BBS squares. There were no reports of breeding outwith *Cowal*.

Autumn/winter Reports from sites in; Colonsay (1), Cowal (6), Islay (1), Jura (1), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (2) and Mull (2). Outwith Cowal all reports were of singles, except for 2 at Scalasaig Colonsay on 11 Dec.

# **CHOUGH** Pyrrhocorax pyrrhocorax

RBBP The Argyll islands hold the entire Scottish population. Islay is the stronghold, with smaller numbers on Oronsay and Colonsay. All records away from Islay are appreciated.

**Winter/spring** Reports from (*Colonsay/Islay/Mull/Tiree*). Max. counts; on *Islay* 40 were at Kilnave on 11 Mar, 20 at Machir Bay on 12 May and 10 at Machrie Hotel on 1 Jan. On *Colonsay* 6 were on Oronsay on 7 Feb. A single bird seen at Ruaig *Tiree* on 24 Jan was possibly the bird seen there in 2023 and may have been the bird seen at Calgary Bay *Mull* on 3 May.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 12.5% of squares (5/40) (cf. 9% in 2023). On *Islay* 40 pairs made breeding attempts; 31 were successful and 9 failed. These 31 pairs fledged a minimum of 89 young (2.8/yng per successful nest, 2.2/yng per breeding attempt). 6 other young pairs were prospecting, but did not lay eggs. (*Data provided by Eric Bignal*). On *Colonsay* 5 breeding pairs were found, with three nests fledging 8 young, one failed and the outcome was uncertain at the final nest, but may have reared 4 young. (*Data provided by David Jardine*).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from only (*Colonsay/Islay*). Max. counts received; on *Islay* 35 at Ardnave on 31 Oct & 17 Nov, 33 at Sanaigmore on 29 Oct, 18 at Lossit on 28 Jul, 18 at the Oa on 10 Aug and 10 at Machir Bay on 29 Oct. On *Colonsay* 9 were on Oronsay on 15 Aug.

#### **JACKDAW** Corvus monedula

A resident breeder, common throughout much of mainland Argyll: scarce on Mull and does not breed on Coll or Tiree. Breeding colonies are often located in towns and villages.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Higher counts received included; 1,000 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 17 Jan, 118 at Barsloisnoch on 12 Apr and 80 at Toberonochy, Luing on 13 Jan (both Mid-Argyll). Under reported.

*Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 5% of BBS squares (2/40) (*cf.* 12% in 2023), with max. count of 15 at Killinallan Point *Islay*. Fledged yng noted Port Charlotte *Islay* on 26 Jun and birds nest building in Bridgend *Mid-Argyll* on 11 Dec during mild weather. *Under reported*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura/Tiree*). Higher counts included; 340+ at Gruinart Wood *Islay* on 15 Oct, 200 Kilmartin on 11 Sep, 100 at Lochgilphead on 22 Dec and 100 at Toberonochy, Luing on 5 Dec (all *Mid-Argyll*).

# **ROOK** Corvus frugilegus

AMBER LIST A resident breeder, common throughout much of Argyll, but scarce on Mull and does not breed on: Colonsay, Coll or Tiree. There can be a post breeding influx of juveniles to some islands, e.g. Mull and Tiree.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Very under reported and few high counts received. Max. count of 200 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 1 Jan, 97 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Jan, and 30 at Fidden *Mull* on 20 Feb. At least 5 were at Heylipol Dunes *Tiree* during Jan – Mar and 2 were on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 11-13 Apr.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 5% of squares (2/40) (cf. 3% in 2023). Activity at nesting sites from late Feb. On *Islay* 138 AON at RSPB Loch Gruinart and ca 35 AON in Port Charlotte. In *Kintyre* 5 AONs at Escart Fm. and 9 AONs at North Connel *North Argyll*. On 3 Jun 22 were at Clachan, Lismore *North Argyll* and 65 were at North Craigs *Kintyre* on 29 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura*). Max. counts of 400+ at Loch Gruinart on 15 Oct and 116 Uisge na Criche mouth on 29 Sep (both *Islay*), 64 at Toberonochy, Luing on 5 Dec and 57 Scammadale on 9 Dec (both *Mid-Argyll*), and 30 on Iona on 3 Oct and also 30 at Ardfenaig on 3 Oct (both *Mull*). On *Tiree*, 1 was at Crossapol on 11 Nov.

## **CARRION CROW** Corvus corone

A sedentary resident: mainly in east Cowal and parts of Mid-Argyll, in a variety of mainly low ground habitats. It hybridises readily with Hooded Crow where ranges overlap.

Winter/spring Most reports from usual strong-hold areas of Cowal (44 sites) with max. counts of 83 at Holy Loch on 18 Jan and 63 at Arrochar on 11 Jan. Elsewhere, 1-3 reported at sites in Colonsay (1), Islay (6), Kintyre (11), Mid-Argyll (29), Mull (12), and North Argyll (5), with max. counts in of 6 at Tobermory Mull on 5 May and 4 at Machrihanish Water Kintyre on 13 Feb.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 7.5% of squares (3/40) (cf. 15% in 2023). No breeding data received. Several birds noted paired with Hooded Crow.

Autumn/winter Most reports from sites in Cowal (19). Elsewhere, 1-2 reported at sites in Islay (13), Kintyre (4), Mid-Argyll (13), Mull (6), North Argyll (5) and Tiree (6), with max. counts of 10 at Arrochar Cowal on 15 Aug, 10 at Ganavan Mid-Argyll on 8 Oct, 9 at Broxwood, Sandbank Cowal on 8 Sep and 6 at Benderloch North Argyll on 11 Sep. On Tiree singles were at Heylipol dunes on 14 & 25 Aug, Hynish on 6 Oct, Balinoe on 2 & 17 Oct, Balemartine on 6 Oct, Sorobaidh Bay on 10 Dec with two at Balephuil on 12 Oct.

## **HOODED CROW** Corvus cornix

A widespread, and very common, resident breeding species.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Numbers reported generally low, with 1-10 birds from sites. Max. counts received of 150 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 10 Feb, 40 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 10 Jan, 34 at Loch an Eilein *Tiree* on 10 Jan. 31 at head of Loch na Keal *Mull* on 23 May, 30 at Loch Feochan *Mid-Argyll* on 23 May and 30 at Lochan a' Phuill *Mull* on 19 Mar.

*Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 52.5% of squares (21/40) (*cf.* 71% in 2023), with max. count of 39 at Oronsay *Colonsay* and 13 at Fidden *Mull*. On *Colonsay* 38+ Ters noted, with a further 25 on Oronsay *Colonsay*; on *Colonsay* 15 nests monitored, of which outcome of 4 unknown, 1 failed and 10 produced 21+ young. On *Islay* 11 prs recorded on transects at RSPB Oa Reserve and 5 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart. Non-breeding groups of 40 were at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 7 Jun and 32 at Add Est. *Mid-Argyll* on 30 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. Generally, most reports of 1-10 birds. Max. counts included: 44 at head of Loch Feochan *Mid-Argyll* on 30 Sep, 40 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 28 Sep & 24 Nov and 40 at Kilchoman *Islay* on 29 Oct.

## **HYBRID CROW** Corvus corone x cornix

Hybrids between Carrion and Hooded Crow are most prevalent where the ranges of the two species overlap. Any records are welcome as they will help to document the change in position of the hybrid zone, which is known to have moved north westwards.

All year Reports of small nos. from (Cowal/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll). Max. counts of 14 at Arrochar Cowal on 11 Jan and 4 at Barsloisnoch Mid-Argyll on 5 May. Elsewhere, counts of 1-3 reported, inc. 2 at Ballygown Mull on 3 Aug.

#### **RAVEN** Corvus corax

A common resident breeding species on both the mainland and islands: large flocks may occur, especially in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Notable decline in max. counts received: 54 at Crossapol Pt. *Tiree* on 26 Apr, 40 Laggan Bridge *Islay* on 22 Feb and 32 at Barr Glen *Kintyre* on 9 Apr. *Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 35% of squares (14/40) (cf. 38% in 2023). Prs and displaying birds noted from Jan. On *Colonsay* 10 Ters, which produced 17+ young from 5 successful nests,

1 failed, 4 outcome unknown. On *Tiree* 17 active nests noted. Elsewhere, another 34 Ters reported and at least 32 yng reared from 12 sites (ARSG).

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Generally, reports of 1-2 birds with several counts of up to 20. Max. counts included; 49 at Ardlarach *Islay* on 30 Oct, 50 at Hynish *Tiree* on 21 Sep, 40 at An Sgriodan *Mull* on 9 Aug, and 32 at Beinn Mhor, Oa *Islay* on 4 Sep.

WAXWING\* Bombycilla garrulous

An irruptive winter visitor in varying numbers, not seen every year but some large influxes have occurred recently.

Winter/spring In Mid-Argyll one was at Ford on 4 Jan, 6 were at Barnabuck, Kerrera on 29 Jan and 6 were at Ardrishaig on 22 Mar. On Mull one was at Tobermory on 15 Apr and on Colonsay one was at Kiloran on 24 May.

Autumn/winter No reports.

# **COAL TIT** Periparus ater

A widespread and abundant resident breeder: except on Coll and Tiree. Found almost exclusively in woodland, especially conifers.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally, 1-4 birds at sites. Higher counts of 10 at Inverliever on 1 Jan, 10 at Loch Barnluasgan on 7 Apr (both *Mid-Argyll*) and 10 at the Woollen Mill *Islay* on 4 Jan. One was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 24 Mar.

*Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 45% of squares (18/40) (*cf.* 44% in 2023), with max. counts of 8 at Kilmichael Forest, and Bellanoch (both *Mid-Argyll*) and at Meall na Caorach *Mull*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree). Generally, only 1-3 birds at sites. Max. counts of 35 at West Glen Cowal on 5 Sep, 10 at Tighnabruaich Cowal on 6 Sep and 10 at Grogport Kintyre on 9 Aug. A large cone crop in the Sitka Spruce forests meant that sightings in gardens were scarce in contrast to 2023, but this may also have reflected poor breeding season.

#### **BLUE TIT** Cyanistes caeruleus

A widespread and common resident breeder. An infrequent visitor to Coll and Tiree.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Tiree*). Most reports from *Mull* at 48 sites. Most reports of 1-6 birds with 15 at Tom Dubh *Cowal* on 11 May and 8 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll*.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 30% of squares (12/40) (*cf.* 35% in 2023), with max. counts of 11 at Tom Dubh, *Cowal* and 10 at Rhudle *Mid-Argyll*. A poor year in *Kintyre* nest box ringing study with only 11 chicks ringed (*cf.* 39 in 2023). A pr bred successfully in a garden nest-box at Arinagour *Coll*.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Tiree*). Generally, fewer reported with most of 1-3 birds and max. counts of 6 at Cairnbaan *Mid Argyll* on 28 Nov, West Glen *Cowal* on 5 Sep and at the head of Loch Creran *North Argyll* on 27 Sep, suggesting poor breeding season.

## **GREAT TIT** Parus major

A widespread and common resident breeder. Only an infrequent visitor to Coll and Tiree.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Tiree), with max. count of 8 at Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll most days in Jan. Most other counts were 6 or fewer.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 42.5% of BBS squares (17/40) (cf. 38% in 2023), with max. count of 10 at Tom Dubh *Cowal*. No confirmed breeding reports received. In *Kintyre* nest box ringing study 97 chicks were ringed in 16 boxes (cf. 95 in 2023). Max. counts were 6 at Corrynachenchy *Mull* on 21 Jul and 5 at Kiels *Jura* on 22 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Tiree*). All reports of fewer than 5 birds. Notably one was at Gallanach *Coll* on 25 Sep.

## **SKYLARK** Alauda arvensis

**RED LIST** A widespread breeding species, common in some areas. Many emigrate in winter, with remaining birds mainly in coastal and low-lying localities.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Most reports from sites in; Mull (72 cf. 64 in 2023), Mid-Argyll (30 cf. 18 in 2023), Islay (27 cf. 34 in 2023) and Kintyre (13 cf. 11 in 2023). In Jan only reports of singles from (Cowal/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree). More birds returned across Argyll during Feb, when noted from 21 sites. Higher area counts inc. 80 at Ruaig Tiree on 26 Feb, 80 at Ardnave Islay on 5 Mar, 75 at Cornaigmore Tiree on 13 Mar and 69 at Balvicar, Seil Mid-Argyll on 22 Feb.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 67.5% of squares (27/40) (cf. 70% in 2023), with max. counts of 34 at Airigh Mhic-'ille Mhoire Jura, 19 on Oronsay Colonsay and 18 at Beinn a' Chaolais Jura. Breeding season reports received from all areas. Little specific breeding data other than 128 Ters. found on transects at the RSPB Oa Reserve Islay and 39 prs in RSPB Oronsay Colonsay inbye fields.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll), but relatively few. Max. counts received: 400 at Clachan Mor Tiree on 2 Oct, 75 Carrabus Islay on 29 Oct, 43 at Lephenstrath Kintyre on 28 Sep and 40 on Iona Mull on 21 Sep. Most other reports were fewer than 10 birds and only 3 reports in Nov and 4 reports in Dec, when 5 were at Airigh Ghlas Islay on 2-23 Dec.

SHORT-TOED LARK\* Calandrella brachydactyla

A vagrant: Three records; one on Tiree in Aug 2008, another Tiree in Oct 2010 and one on Oronsay, Colonsay in Oct 2011.

**Autumn** One was at Cornabus Islay on 10-14 Sep [E. Burrell, D. Dinsley et al]. Record was accepted by the SBRC and becomes the first record for Islay.

# **SAND MARTIN** Riparia riparia

AMBER LIST A summer visitor. Localised breeding species and passage migrant. All breeding records required.

**Spring** Reports from all areas. First arrivals were 3 at Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 22 Mar, 2 at Pennygown and 2 at Loch Don on 23 Mar (both *Mull*), and 1 at Loch Trallaig and 2 at Loch Leathan (both *Mid-Argyll*) on 29 Mar then more widespread thereafter. Highest counts inc., 110

at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 2 Jun, 58 at Coire Sgamadail *Mull* on 1 Apr, 48 at Killinallan Pt. *Islay* on 11 May and 40 at the Kyles of Bute viewpoint *Cowal* on 6 May.

Summer/breeding Noted in 25% of BBS squares (10/40) (cf. 15% in 2023). Limited data on breeding colonies received. At Langa Quarry Kintyre 224 adults ringed, but only 14 juvs. following a mass failure of first broods. On Colonsay 14 AONs at Kiloran Dunes, 11 AONs at Port a' Chapuill and 11 AONs on Oronsay, in Mid-Argyll 6 AONs at Arda Reidh, and on Tiree 28 AONs on The Reef and 60 birds at Loch a' Phuill on 18 May.

**Autumn** Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay/Cowal/Jura/Mid-Argyll/North Argyll*). Most birds had departed by late Aug. Highest counts: 170 at Creag Mhor *Islay* on 23 Aug and 60 at Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 7 Aug, with remaining counts of 10 birds or fewer. The last reported were 3 at Loch na Cuilce *Mull* on 5 Sep.

## **SWALLOW** Hirundo rustica

A widespread, common, summer visitor and passage migrant.

*Spring* Reports from all areas. First arrivals were singles at Loch a' Bharain *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Mar, then Glen Aros *Mull* on 2 Apr, Lochgilphead *Mid-Argyll* on 3 Apr, Bushmill, Gruinart *Islay* on 4 Apr, Kinnabus and Kilnaughton Bay (two)(both *Islay*) on 6 Apr, Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 6 Apr and Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 6 Apr. Counts of generally fewer than 10 birds and a max. noted of 30 at Claddich *Islay* on 8 Apr.

**Summer/breeding** Noted in 30% of BBS squares (12/40) (cf. 29% in 2023). Limited breeding data received. 8 prs noted on RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay* (cf. 16 prs in 2023). On *Tiree* the first fledged juvs were noted on 6 Jul and last on 12 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Jura). Max. counts were lower than 2023; 120 at Craigens, Gruinart Islay on 2 Sep, 105 at Loch na Cuilce Mull on 2 Sep, 42 at Lephenstrath Kintyre on 25 Aug and 40 at Balephuil Tiree on 9 Aug. Thereafter, fewer seen in Oct with 24 heading south at Lephenstrath Kintyre on 15 Oct the highest count. Only one report in Nov, of 3 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre on 6 Nov.

# **HOUSE MARTIN** Delichon urbicum

**RED LIST** A common summer visitor on the mainland, less numerous on the islands with only a handful of recently recorded breeding attempts on Tiree.

*Spring* Reports from all areas except (*Coll*). First early reports were of singles at Colintraive *Cowal* on 3 Apr, at Loch a' Chumhainn on 7 Apr, Sgriob-Rhuaid on 7 Apr and Croggan, Loch Spelve on 7 Apr (all *Mull*), and Cornabus *Islay* on 7 Apr. Thereafter small numbers were seen in the islands with 3 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 26 Apr the first on the mainland before many arrived in early May. Highest count received were of 15 at Carsaig House *Mull* on 19 May and 10 at Feolin Farm *Jura* on 23 May.

*Summer/breeding* Noted in 7.5% of the BBS squares (3/40) (*cf.* 0% in 2023). Very limited breeding data received. AONs were only noted at Garra Ealabus, Loch Gruinart *Islay*. 9 juveniles noted Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 4 Aug. Max. count of 30 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 21 Jul and 30 at Keils *Jura* on 22 July.

**Autumn** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree*). Max. counts of 190 heading south at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 1 Sep and 100 there on 19 Aug. Elsewhere 75 were at Craigens, Gruinart *Islay* on 2 Sep, and 40 at Colintraive *Cowal* on 31 Aug. Most birds had departed by early Sep, but a late passage was noted at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* when 47 flew south on 3 Oct and 57 on 4 Oct and the last report was of 1 at the RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay* on 8 Oct,

# LONG-TAILED TIT Aegithalos caudatus

A widespread and fairly common resident. Scarce on Colonsay and a rare visitor to Coll and Tiree.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Islay/Jura/Kintyre/Tiree*). Most counts of 1-2 birds and max. counts of 9 at Cairnbaan on 4 Feb and 6 at the River Lochy on 29 May (both *Mid-Argyll*).

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 5% of squares (2/40) (cf. 12% in 2023), with max. count of 3 at Tobar Beag *Mull*. Otherwise, limited data, with no confirmed breeding reported. 22 noted at Carradale *Kintyre* on 18 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Tiree). Most counts of 1-10 from sites in Mull (13), Mid-Argyll (13), North Argyll (4), Cowal (4), Islay (4), Jura (2), Colonsay (1) and Kintyre (1). Max. counts of 30 at Kildalton Islay on 16 Sep, 13 at Port Righ, Carradale Kintyre on 17 Sep, 12 at Ellabus Islay on 29 Oct and 12 at Craighouse Jura on 18 Sep.

# WOOD WARBLER Phylloscopus sibilatrix

**RED LIST** A scarce but widely distributed summer visitor to mature broadleaved woodlands. Infrequent on Islay and Jura and only occurs as a rare passage migrant on Coll and Tiree.

*Spring/summer* Reports from only (*Cowal/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*). First report was of a singing bird at Ardrishaig *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Apr, followed by birds at Taynish *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Apr, at West Ardhu on 1 May and Pennyghael on 3 May (both *Mull*).

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 5% of squares (2/40) (cf. 6% in 2023). Singing males reported from sites in; Cowal (3), Mid-Argyll (13), Mull (16) and North Argyll (5). 11 noted at Ardura Community Forest Mull on 27 May.

Autumn Singles at Linndhu House on 25 Jul and Dun Urgadul on 8 Aug (both Mull) were last noted

# YELLOW-BROWED WARBLER\* Phylloscopus inornatus

RBBP A scarce autumn migrant from east of the Urals. At least 135 birds between 1954 and 2023, the majority on Tiree. A record 37 birds occurred in 2020.

Autumn A total of 19 birds between 21 Sep and 25 Oct. On Islay singles were at W Loch Gruinart on 7 Oct [C. McKay] and at Loch Kinnabus, The Oa on 25 Oct [D. Wood, D. Dinsley], in Mid-Argyll 3 were at Slaterich, Kerrera on 5 Oct [A. McGregor], on Mull one was at Dervaig on 23 Sep and on Tiree up to 13 included a total of 7 different birds at Balephuil between 21 Sep & 14 Oct, also singles at The Glebe, Scarinish on 30 Sep-9 Oct, at Balemartine on 3 Oct, at Vaul Haven on 3 Oct, at Vaul Seaside on 3 Oct, a presumed bird at Hough Bay on 3 Oct and at Balinoe campsite on 7 Oct [J. Bowler, T. de Clermont, J. Dickson, S. Gibson]. All records were accepted by the ABRC. (see list of rejected, pending etc records on page 130).

# WILLOW WARBLER Phylloscopus trochilus AMBER LIST A widespread and abundant summer visitor.

*Spring* Reports from all areas. First arrival was 1 at Bonawe *North Argyll* on 19 Mar, followed by singles at Ardrishaig *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Mar, at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 30 Mar, at Mealldalloch Lodges and at Brox Wood, Sandbank (both *Cowal*) and two at Sunadale *Kintyre* on 31 Mar, with

more widespread arrivals from 7 Apr. Higher counts inc. 36 at Aros Cottage on 18 May and 35 at Craignure on 13 May (both *Mull*) and 35 at Druimyeon More, Gigha *Kintyre* on 23 Apr.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 77.5% of squares (31/40) (cf. 73% in 2023), with higher counts of 26 at Kilmichael Forest BBS Mid-Argyll, 22 at Glen Aros chapel Mull, 21 at Bellanoch Mid-Argyll, 20 at Mid Loch Fada Colonsay, 17 at Kilbridemore Burn Cowal and 17 at Dalvore Mid-Argyll. 76 prs noted RSPB Oa Reserve. On Tiree 13 prs across 6 sites in Jun, at least 11 of which fledged yng. 3 prs RSPB Oronsay in-bye fields Colonsay. First fledged yng on Tiree from 16 Jun. Autumn/winter Number of reports decreased, and birds departed by late Aug and in Sep reports from only (Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree) with 7 at Carradale on 19 Sep the max. count. Late birds were on Tiree at Melness on 1 Oct and a juv at Balephuil on 1-7 Oct.

# CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita

A summer visitor and local breeding species, occasionally recorded in winter. More frequent on passage on some of the islands.

Winter/spring Two at Carse House, Knapdale Mid-Argyll on 19 Feb were the only wintering birds noted. Reports from all areas in spring except (Jura). Most reports from sites in; Mid-Argyll (37), Mull (28) and Cowal (19). First spring arrivals of singles at Ardrishaig Mid-Argyll and Tighnabruaich Cowal on 18 Mar, Lephenstrath Kintyre on 19 Mar, on Mull on 19 Mar, Kinnabus, at the Oa Islay and Bellanoch Mid-Argyll on 20 Mar. More widespread arrivals thereafter. All counts of 1-3 birds, except on 12 May when 4 at Achnaba Mid-Argyll.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 12.5% of squares (5/40) (cf. 9% in 2023), with max. count of 2 at Bellanoch *Mid-Argyll*. Otherwise, limited breeding data. On *Colonsay* 3 Ters. noted.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Mull*) and most local birds had departed by mid-Sep. Birds in late Oct when singles at Creag Mhor *Islay* on 28 Oct and at Caolas *Tiree* on 28 Oct. In Nov, 1-2 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 1-2 & 5-11 Nov, 1 at Milton *Tiree* on 3 Nov and the last 2 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 11 Nov.

# **'SIBERIAN' CHIFFCHAFF\*** Phylloscopus collybita tristis

A rare visitor. An eastern race of Chiffchaff. Less than annual, occurs usually in late autumn or winter.

**Autumn** On *Tiree* singles were at Balephuil on 3-7 Oct and 9-11 Nov, Kilmoluaig on 6-7 Oct and at The Glebe on 3 Nov. On *Islay* one was at Kinnabus, Oa on 7 Oct.

# **SEDGE WARBLER** Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

AMBER LIST A locally common summer visitor, breeding in suitable habitats.

*Spring* Reports from all areas except (*North Argyll*). First arrivals of singles at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 24 Apr, at Durry Loch, The Laggan *Kintyre* and on *Mull* on 25 Apr, at Port Mor *Colonsay* on 26 Apr and at Inverliever Lodge *Mid-Argyll* and Balephuil *Tiree* on 29 Apr. Most reports from sites in; *Mull* (28) and *Mid-Argyll* (12) and *Islay* (10).

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 20% of squares (8/40) (*cf.* 18% in 2023), with highest counts of 6 on Oronsay and 5 at Mid Loch Fada (both *Colonsay*). On *Islay* noted as widespread & present at RSPB Loch Gruinart and 35 found prs at RSPB Oa Reserve, 9 prs Oronsay in-bye fields *Colonsay*. Numerous Ters across *Tiree* from 8 May and 4+ Ters from roads at Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll*. Few counts or breeding data received from elsewhere. First fledglings on *Tiree* noted from 6 Jul.

**Autumn** A scattering of records in late Aug from *Tiree*, also 2 at Coshandrochit *Mid-Argyll* on 22 Aug, 1 at Loch Gruinart *Islay* on 25 Aug and 1 at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 30 Aug. In Sep, reports only from Balephuil *Tiree* where 2 present to 1-8 Sep and another single on 12-13 Sep.

# **BLYTH'S REED WARBLER\*** Acrocephalus dumetorum

A vagrant: Three records; one at Carnan Mor, Tiree on 3 Jun 2008, one at Balephuil, Tiree in Sep 2011 and one at Totamore, Coll on 31 May 2021.

Spring A 2cy+ male was in song at Balephuil Tiree on 25-26 May [J. Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

# **COMMON REED WARBLER\*** Acrocehalus scripaceus

A rare visitor in spring and summer: Seventeen records; 15 from the islands (of which 10 from Tiree) and two from Aros Moss, Kintyre.

Autumn One was at Balephuil Tiree on 25 Sep [J. Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

## GRASSHOPPER WARBLER Locustella naevia

**RED LIST** A summer visitor. Breeding locally in open habitats with dense ground vegetation, including young conifer plantations. Numbers fluctuate from year to year.

*Spring/summer* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Cowal/Jura/North Argyll*). First arrivals by region of 'reeling' birds at Ardfern and Moine Mhor (both *Mid-Argyll*) on early date of 8 Apr, at Kilbridemore *Cowal* on 13 Apr, at 3 sites on *Islay* on 20 Apr, at Balephuil *Tiree* on 21 Apr and at

Kiloran *Colonsay* on 22 Apr, thereafter widespread. Most reports from sites in; *Mid-Argyll* (13) and *Islay* (10).

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 20% of squares (8/40) (cf. 21% in 2023), with max. count of 3 at Meall nan Eun, the Oa *Islay*. Seven Ters. found on *Colonsay*. On *Islay* 17 Ters. at RSPB Oa Reserve, 20 Ters. at RSPB Loch Gruinart, and 2 Ters. at RSPB Smaull. 4 Ters. in forest restock at Bridgend *Mid-Argyll*.

**Autumn** Reports decreased during Jul and reports mostly of singles from (*Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree*), although 2 still reeling at Balephuil *Tiree* on 31 Jul with 1 there on 1 Aug, and last was noted on 2 Aug at Inverneill Forest *Mid-Argyll*.

## **BLACKCAP** Sylvia atricapilla

A common summer visitor and regular passage migrant especially in autumn. An increasing number winter in Argyll.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. No winter reports. First arrivals of a single at Bonawe North Argyll on 19 Mar, at Ardentinny Cowal on 24 Mar, then none until 31 Mar when one in Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll, followed by singles on 1 Apr at Ledaig North Argyll, at Balephuil Tiree, at Traighuaine Mid-Argyll and at Tobermory Mull on 3 Apr and Lephenstrath Bridge Kintyre on 5 Apr, then more widespread after 7 Apr.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 27.5% of squares (11/40) (cf. 26% in 2023), with max. counts of 7 at Loch Frisa *Mull* and 6 at Bellanoch *Mid-Argyll*. Widespread reports of males in song across Argyll with most in mainland areas particularly *Mid-Argyll* and *Mull*. On *Colonsay* 11 Ters. recorded, 7 Ters. RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay*. Three fledged juv found at Coshandrochaid *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Aug.

Autumn/winter Reports from areas by month; Sep (7), Oct (18), Nov (8) and Dec (2). Max. counts of 3 birds (m & 2 ff) at Balephuil *Tiree* on 3 Oct and 3 (2 mm & f) there on 17 Oct. In

Nov, at least 6 were on *Tiree*, 2 at Tobermory *Mull* on 11 Nov and a single at Port Righ *Kintyre*. In Dec, singles were at Balephuil *Tiree* on 11 Dec and Caol Ila *Islay* on 18 Dec.

# GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

A scarce but increasing summer visitor. Breeding in woodland and scrub habitats.

Spring/summer Arrival was later than 2023 with the first on 28 Apr at Taynish NNR Mid-Argyll and near Campbeltown Kintyre, followed by birds at Ardachy, Loch Etive North Argyll and Glendaruel Cowal on 1 May and Tobermory Mull on 3 May. Reports from increased number of sites in; Cowal (5), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (25), Mull (13), North Argyll (5) and Tiree (2). Migrants were on Tiree at Balephuil on 20 May and Balemartine on 2 Jun.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 10% of squares (4/40) (cf. 6% in 2023), with 6 noted at Tom Dubh Cowal. No confirmed breeding records and no reports in Aug.

**Autumn** On *Tiree* 2 were at Balephuil on 1 Sep, with 1 remaining to 6 Sep, followed by another single there on 18 Sep. The last bird was 1 on *Colonsay* on 30 Sep.

#### BARRED WARBLER\* Curruca nisoria

A rare passage migrant. 22 previous records. All have been in autumn and the majority on Tiree.

Autumn A 1cy was at Balephuil Tiree on 18 Sep [J. Bowler]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

## LESSER WHITETHROAT\* Curruca curruca

A rare/scarce passage migrant in both spring and autumn. Most recent records have been from the islands.

*Spring* On *Tiree* single males in subdued song were at The Glebe, Scarinish on 29 May and at Balephuil on 3 Jun.

**Autumn** One *Tiree* singles were at Balephuil on 7-8 & 12-18 Sep and at The Manse, Scarinish on 9 Sep. Also, a report of one (race not assigned) at Baile Mor, Iona *Mull* on 25 Oct.

## WHITETHROAT Curruca communis

AMBER LIST A summer visitor with numbers fluctuating from year to year: breeding is most widespread in low lying areas, particularly in coastal scrub.

*Spring/summer* Reports from all areas. The first arrivals were at Gruinart *Islay* on 21 Apr, Bagh Chrossapol *Mull* and Dunlossit *Islay* on 26 Apr, on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 28 Apr, at Inverliever Lodge *Mid-Argyll* on 29 Apr and Cove Point *Kintyre* on 1 May, then more widespread arrivals from early May. Reports from sites in; *Coll* (2), *Colonsay* (4), *Cowal* (5), *Islay* (14), *Jura* (7), *Kintyre* (9), *Mid-Argyll* (36), *Mull* (73), *North Argyll* (5) and *Tiree* (2).

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 32.5% of squares (13/40) (*cf.* 35% in 2023), with max. counts of 9 at Carraig Fhada *Islay*, 7 at Lochan Sholum *Islay* and 6 at Mid Loch Fada *Colonsay*. On *Colonsay* 32 Ters. recorded, with another on Oronsay. On *Islay* 17 Ters. at RSPB Loch Gruinart, 10 Ters at RSPB Smaull reserve and 22 prs at RSPB Oa reserve. 2 Ters. noted at Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll*. *Autumn* Reports decreased during Aug and all birds had departed by early Sep, except for one at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 16 Sep and on *Tiree*, one at Balevullin on 12 Sep and one at the Glebe on 13 -21 Sep, except on 20 Sep when 2 were present.

**GOLDCREST** Regulus regulus

A common resident breeding species. Augmented by passage migrants.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally, 1-2 birds from sites. Max. counts of 14 at Aros Cottage *Mull* on 18 May and 10 at Sutherland's Grove *North Argyll* on 31 May. Good spring passage on *Tiree* from 4 Mar - 21 Apr inc. 25 around 4 sites on 4 Apr.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 25% of squares (10/40) (*cf.* 38% in 2023), and lower max. counts than 2023 of 7 at Meall na Caorach *Mull* and 7 at Kilmichael Forest *Mid-Argyll*. 5 prs at RSPB Loch Gruinart *Islay*, where fledglings seen 10 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*) with counts of generally 1-2 birds. Max. count of 6 at Eallabus *Islay* on 29 Oct and 6 at Crinan *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Oct. Light migration on *Tiree* with the first 1 at The Glebe on 13 Sep; only 6 birds in Sep, 6 in Oct, and 2 in Nov when the last noted was at Balephuil on 10 Nov.

# **WREN** Troglodytes troglodytes

AMBER LIST A common resident breeder in all areas. Numbers often decline following hard winters, additional birds winter on the islands.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds at sites. Max. counts of 10+ at sites in *Colonsay* (1), *Cowal* (1), *Islay* (1), *Mid-Argyll* (2), and *Mull* (1). Seven roosted in an old Swallow nest at Kintra *Mull* on 1 Mar. Birds noted singing from mid-Mar.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 72.5% of squares (29/40) (cf. 76% in 2023), with max. counts of 20 at Kilmichael Forest Mid-Argyll, 18 at Carraig Fhada Islay, 15 at Bellanoch Mid-Argyll, 15 at Kilbridemore Burn Cowal and 15 at Mid Loch Fada Colonsay. Now becoming widespread on Tiree where 41+ Ters. at 19 sites and first fledged b/4+ on 11 Jun. 73 Ters. at RSPB Oa reserve and 8 prs RSPB Oronsay in-bye fields Colonsay. 2 Ters. at Barnakill Mid-Argyll, and fledged yng noted on Sanda Kintyre on 27 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds noted at most sites, with max. counts of 14 on Iona *Mull* on 21 Sep and 10 at Grogport *Kintyre* on 9 Aug.

## **NUTHATCH** Sitta europaea

Now becoming an established breeder in mainland Argyll and Mull. A survey in 2021 found around 150 pairs. Still scarce in Kintyre and the island regions.

**Winter/spring** Reports from (sites) in *Cowal* (13), *Kintyre* (1), *Mid-Argyll* (31), *Mull* (1) and *North Argyll* (3). All reports of 1-2, except 4 at Kilchoan *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Feb and 1 Mar, but involving 5 different birds. One at Carradale *Kintyre* on 2 May was notable.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 5% of squares (2/40) (cf 9% in 2023), inc. 3 at Rhudle *Mid-Argyll*. Confirmed breeding from Asknish and Cruachan Power Stn. (both *Mid-Argyll*). All reports of 1-2 birds, except 7 at Cruachan Power Stn. *Mid-Argyll* on 4 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from (sites) Cowal (8), Mid-Argyll (14), Mull (3), North Argyll (3). All sightings of 1-3 birds, with notable sightings of singles on Iona Mull on 4 Oct, and at Kilcheran, Lismore North Argyll on 11 Dec. Results of 2021 survey at: 2021 Argyll Bird Club Nuthatch Survey Results – Argyll Bird Club.

# TREECREEPER Certhia familiaris britannica

A widespread and fairly common resident: rare on Tiree and Coll.

Winter/spring Reports from sites in Colonsay (1), Cowal (16), Islay (3), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (11), Mull (14) and North Argyll (4). All reports of 1-2 birds except 3 at Dervaig Mull on 5 Jan. Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 10% of squares (4/40) (cf. 24% in 2023), with max. count of 3 at Bellanoch Mid-Argyll. 1 pr at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay, otherwise, no breeding data received.

Autumn/winter Reports sites in Cowal (4), Islay (6), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (10), Mull (11) and North Argyll (5). All reports of 1-2 birds except 3 at Dun Corr-bhile, Inveraray Mid-Argyll on 21 Sep. Generally under reported.

#### ROSY STARLING\* Pastor roseus

A rare summer and autumn visitor. More frequent in recent years with peak of 19 birds in 2021. rare summer and autumn visitor. More frequent in recent years with peak of 19 birds in 2021. Summer An adult male was in Tayinloan Kintyre on 29-31 May [L. Gilchrist, Z. Weir et al]. Record was accepted by the ABRC.

# **STARLING** Sturnus vulgaris

**RED LIST** A common resident on Coll, Colonsay, Islay, part of Kintyre, and Tiree, less common on most of the mainland. Flocks containing juveniles appear in many parts in late summer and numbers are boosted by immigration in winter from north-west Europe.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Largest flocks noted in (*Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mull/Tiree*). 1,200 were noted across *Tiree* on 17 Jan with 1,000 at Balephetrish Bay on 12 & 19 Feb, and in *Kintyre* 900 were at Machrihanish Water on 30 Jan. On *Islay* 500 were at Loch Muichart, Oa on 20 Feb and 100 at Craigens, Gruinart on 11 Mar. On *Colonsay*, 600 were on Oronsay on 12 Feb and 130 at Ardskenish on 23 Apr, and on *Mull* 250 were at Fidden on 10 Feb. Elsewhere, counts were below 100 birds.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 25% of squares (10/40) (cf. 24% in 2023), with max. counts of 150 at Crossapol Pt. *Tiree*, 36 at Fidden *Mull* and 13 on Port Mor *Colonsay*. Limited data supplied. First fledged juvs at Moss and Balephuil *Tiree* on 2 Jun with many more the following day, some 5 days later than usual. Flocks of juvs built up in numbers from mid-Jun with 190 at The Reef *Tiree* on 6 Jul, 120 at the Ensay Burn mouth *Mull* on 16 Jul, 70 on Iona *Mull* on 31 Jul and 68 at Kilnaughton Bay *Islay* on 6 Jun.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Many flocks on *Tiree* of 400-900, with an estimated total of 2,300 on 16 Sep and max. counts of 1,400 at Heylipol on 16 Nov, 1,200 at Loch

an Eilein on 12 Nov, and 1,100 at The Reef on 23 Aug. Elsewhere, 310 at Eilean Nostaig *Islay* on 23 Sep, 300 on Iona *Mull* on 3 Oct, 300 at Cattadale, Southend *Kintyre* on 10 Dec, 210 at Ulva Lagoons *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Oct and many counts up to 100.

#### **SONG THRUSH** Turdus philomelos

AMBER LIST A widespread and common resident breeding species with some locally bred birds departing in the autumn. There is a noticeable autumn passage, with other birds arriving for the winter.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Generally, reports usually of 1-6 birds. Max. counts of 22 at Langamull *Mull* on 20 Mar, 18 on Kerrera *Mid-Argyll* on 9 Jan and 12 at Druimachro, Gigha *Kintyre* on 2 Mar.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 62.5% of squares (25/40) (*cf.* 62% in 2023), with max. counts of 10 at Kilbridemore Burn *Cowal*, 7 at Eas a Chosain, Inveraray *Mid-Argyll* and 6 at Glen Aros chapel *Mull*. 7 prs found on transects on the RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay* and 30+ Ters. on *Tiree* in May.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Generally, just 1-2 birds noted at sites. Higher counts inc. 20 at Garmony *Mull* on 5 Sep, 20 at Tormisdale *Islay* on 25 Dec and 10 at Balephuil *Tiree* during a Redwing influx on 25 Oct. One was heard singing at Bonawe Furnace *Mid-Argyll* in mild weather on 28 Dec.

#### MISTLE THRUSH Turdus viscivorus

**RED LIST** A widespread but thinly distributed resident breeding species. On Coll and Tiree it is only an occasional visitor. Flocks are sometimes seen on passage.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Tiree). Generally, sightings of 1-4 birds, however 6 at Coille bhreac-liath North Argyll on 31 Mar, 6 at Ormsary Mid-Argyll on 27 Jan and

5 at Kilmichael Glen *Mid-Argyll* on 2 Jan. Most reports from sites in *Mull* (39) and *Mid-Argyll* (22).

*Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 17.5% of squares (7/40) (*cf* 29% in 2023), with max. of 2 at Tobar Beag *Mull*, otherwise limited data submitted. Fledged brood noted at Sanaigmore *Islay* on 20 Jun. Post-breeding flocks of 11 noted at Bloody Bay Garmony *Mull* on 21 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Kintyre/Tiree*). Generally, sightings of 1-6 birds. Most reports from sites in *Islay* (15), *Mid-Argyll* (8) and *Mull* (11). Fewer large flocks with max. counts of 24+ at Garmony *Mull* on 7 Aug, 12 at Cnoc Dhomhnuill, Luing on 6 Aug and 10 at Kilmartin gravel pit on 3 Nov (both *Mid-Argyll*).

#### **REDWING** Turdus iliacus

AMBER LIST RBBP A passage migrant and winter visitor. Abundant in autumn but relatively few remain during winter. Occasional individuals are recorded in late spring or summer. The species bred on Mull in 1991 but there have been no subsequent breeding records.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Generally widespread in low numbers of 1-35 birds. Most common around *Tiree* where 400-500 in flocks of up to 60 in Jan-Feb declining to 275 on 1 Mar and few after 13 Mar, until an influx of 90+ on 26 Mar. Elsewhere numbers lower; 70 at Ormsary *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Jan, 45 at Toward *Cowal* on 18 Jan, 40 at Ballinaby *Islay* on 2 Jan and 35 at Toberonochy, Luing *Mid-Argyll* on 13 Jan. The last spring record was 1 at Baugh *Tiree* on 6 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). First arrivals; 2 at Glengorm Castle Mull on 21 Sep, 2 at Tobermory Mull on 3 Oct, 1 at Port Righ Kintyre on 6 Oct, then 4 at Loch Arish Islay and 10+ on Tiree on 7 Oct. 212, a mixture of iliacus and coburnii, were on Tiree on 8 Oct, but larger numbers were noted until later when 600+ were at Fishnish Mull on 18 Oct, 200 at Loch Tulla North Argyll on 20 Oct, 952 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 25 Oct, 3,600, mainly iliacus passing through Tiree on 25 Oct, 1,000 at Lephenstrath Kintyre on 26 Oct, 1,200 on Mull on 31 Oct and 1,600 over Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll on 6 Nov after which passage declined rapidly. Around 400 in groups up to 50 were present on Tiree on 10 Dec, but elsewhere only 1-20 reported.

#### **BLACKBIRD** Turdus merula

A widespread breeding species: common and locally abundant resident. There is immigration in winter and noticeable autumn passage in some years with some remaining during winter.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Generally low counts of only 1-6 birds received. Max. counts of 25 at Feith Bhan *Mull* on 14 May and 10 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 2 Mar.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 67.5% of squares (27/40) (*cf.* 59% in 2023), with max. counts of 7 at Ardtun and 7 at Killiechronan (both *Mull*). Four pairs on transects at the RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay*. The first fledged birds were noted at Balephuil *Tiree* on 23 May.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). Generally, reports of only 1-6 birds. A small influx in early Nov e.g. 250 at Dun Urgadul, Tobermory Mull on 1 Nov, 50 on Oronsay Colonsay on 10 Nov, 25 at Aros Mull on 10 Nov and 12 together at Balephuil Tiree on 9 Nov. 15 at Vaul Tiree on 10 Dec was the only other modest count.

#### FIELDFARE Turdus pilaris

**RED LIST** RBBP A passage migrant and winter visitor. Abundant in autumn but relatively few remain in winter or passing through in spring.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll). Generally, reports in low numbers of 1-60 birds. Higher counts of groups inc., 200 at the Woolen Mill Islay on 22 Feb,

111 across *Tiree* at 5 sites on 28 Jan and 85 at Rhunahaorine *Kintyre* on 9 Feb. Last noted were singles at Giol, the Oa *Islay*, at Bealach nan Sac and Dunloskin Wood (both *Cowal*) on 21 Apr. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/North Argyll*). First arrivals were later than 2023; 2 at Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* and 3 at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 19 Oct, then 5 at Claonaig Bay *Kintyre* on 25 Oct and 25 at Barsloisnach *Mid-Argyll* on 26 Oct. A big movement took place on 31 Oct, when 1,500 were at Ardchonnel *Mid-Argyll* and 300 on *Mull*, and into early Nov., with 130 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 3 Nov, 100 at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 4 Nov and 120 at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 6 Nov. Thereafter numbers diminished with 50 at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 11 Dec the max, count in Dec.

#### **RING OUZEL\*** Turdus torquatus

**RED LIST** A summer visitor. Breeding very locally in upland areas but declining in numbers. More widespread, though still very scarce, on migration. All records required please.

*Spring/summer* Singles were on *Mull* at Scallastle Bay on 15 Jun and a fem at Calgary on 30 Jun. In *North Argyll* 2 were at Cruachan Reservoir on 4 Jun.

Autumn The only report was of a 1cy male at Carnan Mor/Balephuil Tiree on 8 -12 Oct.

#### **SPOTTED FLYCATCHER** Muscicapa striata

**RED LIST** A summer visitor breeding widely, but sparsely, in mature woodlands; particularly where there are gaps in the canopy or along edges. Regular passage migrant on the islands.

**Spring/summer** Reports from all areas. First reports were singles at Acharonich *Mull* on 20 Apr, at Ardchattan *North-Argyll* and Succoth Lodge *Mid-Argyll* on 3 May. More widespread reports from 10 May. Reports came from sites in *Coll* (1), *Colonsay* (1), *Cowal* (6), *Islay* (14), *Jura* (3),

Kintyre (6), Mid-Argyll (30), Mull (34), North Argyll (15) and Tiree (2). Five were at Balephuil Tiree on 26 May.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 7.5% of squares (3/40) (cf. 9% in 2023), with max. of 4 at Rhudle Mid-Argyll. More breeding reported, 2 Ters. at RSPB Loch Gruinart Islay. Confirmed breeding at Arinagour Coll, Portnahaven, Bushmill, Bun-an-Uillt and Bunnahabhain (all Islay), Lephenstrath (4 Ters.) Kintyre, Creagmhor Loch, Kilmartin, Kilmichael Glassary, Stroneskar (2 Ters.) and Tayness (2 Ters.) (all Mid-Argyll), Port Chill Bhaonain Mull, and Balnagown (Lismore) North Argyll.

**Autumn** Most local breeding birds had departed by late-Aug, with late birds reported at Port Chill Bhraonain *Mull* on 31 Aug, two at Airds, Taynuilt *Mid-Argyll* on 5 Sep, then singles on *Tiree* at the Glebe on 17-19 Sep, Balephuil on 19 Sep and the last at Kilkenneth *Tiree* on 19-23 Sep.

#### **ROBIN** Erithacus rubecula

A widespread and common resident breeder: a migrant only on Tiree. Small numbers now breed regularly on Coll. Autumn passage is noticeable on the islands with many migrants overwintering.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Generally, only 1-4 birds at sites. Max. counts of 21 singing males at Coilesson *Cowal* on 16 Mar, 10 at Inveraray *Mid-Argyll* on 17 Jan and 10 at Dun Urgadul *Mull* on 14 Sep. Last wintering bird seen on *Tiree* on 8 Apr.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 60% of squares (24/40) (cf. 50% in 2023), with max. counts of 15 at Kilmichael Forest Mid-Argyll, 11 at Kilbridemore Burn Cowal and 8 at Loch Tarsan Cowal. 12 prs recorded on transects at RSPB Oa Reserve. Successful breeding noted on Sanda Is and Gigha (both Kintyre), Tayvallich Mid-Argyll and Lismore North Argyll. None bred on Tiree. Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Most reports of 1-4 birds. Max. counts of 28 on Iona Mull on 21 Sep, 10 at West Glen Cowal on 5 Sep and 10 at head of Loch Creran North Argyll on 27

#### **RED-BREASTED FLYCATCHER\*** Ficedula parva

A rare passage migrant: Sixteen records; on Islay in Nov 1974 and Oct 1975, Colonsay and Gigha in 2010, two singles on Tiree in Oct 2012, two in Jun and two Sep/Oct on Tiree in 2014, singles on Tiree in Oct 2016, Sep 2017, Oct 2019, Jun 2020, May & Sep 2022.

*Spring* A fem/2cy was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 28 May [J. Bowler, J. Hunter]. *Record was accepted by the ABRC*.

#### PIED FLYCATCHER\* Ficedula hypoleuca

AMBER LIST A scarce summer visitor and passage migrant breeding very locally in oak woods in parts of the mainland and possibly Mull. Few confirmed breeding records in recent years. Rare but near-annual on passage on the islands, especially Tiree.

*Spring/breeding* One was at Gruline *Mull* on 5 May, followed by a male at Holy Loch NR *Cowal* on 17 May and a fem at Carnan Mor *Tiree* on 25 May. *No evidence of breeding*.

**Autumn** Singles were at Iona Abbey *Mull* on 6 Aug, a 1cy at Balephuil *Tiree* on 4 Sep and another 1cy at Vaul *Tiree* on 19 Sep.

#### **BLACK REDSTART\*** Phoenicurus ochuros

AMBER LIST RBBP A less than annual passage migrant. Most records have been in spring (late Mar to May) or late autumn (Oct to mid-Nov).

**Spring** A fem was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 27 Apr.

**Autumn** One was at Knock *Mull* on 26 Aug, and a m + f were at Bowmore harbour *Islay* on 9-10 Nov.

#### **REDSTART** Phoenicurus phoenicurus

AMBER LIST A summer visitor. Locally common in open woodland. It is a scarce passage migrant on Coll, Colonsay, Islay and Tiree.

Spring/summer Reports from only (Cowal/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll). First reports were singles at Achnacreebeg North Argyll on 16 Apr, at Dunadd on 19 Apr and Barsloisnach on 20 Apr (both Mid-Argyll), at Traigh na Cille, Dervaig Mull on 5 May and at the Kyles of Bute viewpoint Cowal on 6 May. Most reports from sites in; Cowal (4), Mid-Argyll (19), Mull (8) and North Argyll (5).

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 5% of squares (2/40) (cf. 9% in 2023), with max. of 4 at Rhudle Mid-Argyll.

Autumn The last report was of a 1cy male at Balephuil Tiree on 7 Sep.

#### WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra

**RED LIST** A sparse but widespread, summer visitor.

Spring/summer Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura). First arrivals were singles at Drimvore Mid-Argyll on 21 Apr, at Smaull Islay on 23 Apr, at Kinnabus Islay on 24 Apr, at Balemartine Tiree on 25 Apr and Loch Ba Mull on 26 Apr. More widespread arrivals after 1 May. Reports from sites in; Colonsay (1), Cowal (5), Islay (5), Kintyre (2), Mid-Argyll (12), Mull (33), North Argyll (2) and Tiree (2).

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 17.5% of squares (7/40) (*cf.* 24% in 2023), with max. counts of 6 at Glean Lean *Mull* and 5 at Lochan Sholum *Islay* and Lochan a' Tana *Jura*. On *Islay* 16 Ters. on RSPB Loch Gruinart, 8 Ters. on RSPB Smaull reserve and 19 Ters. at RSPB Oa reserve (*cf.* 24 in 2023). 1 Ter. found on *Colonsay* and a fledged b/2 at Langamull *Mull* on 14 Jun. In *Mid-Argyll* 4 Ters. noted at Moine Mhor and a fledged b/2 at Upper Gylen, Kerrera on 29 Jun.

**Autumn** Reports from (*Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull*) but decreased through Aug. Last reports were of 1 at Coshandrochaid on 22 Aug and 2 at Moine Mhor on 29 Aug (both *Mid-Argyll*) and 2 juvs. at Craigens, Gruinart *Islay* on 1 Sep.

#### **STONECHAT** Saxicola torquatus

A widespread resident, but some leave breeding areas during winter. Numbers can decline dramatically after severe winters.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds from numerous widespread sites and max. count of 6 at Allt na Traighe Gile on 24 Mar, at Creag a' Chromain on 10 May and at Grasspoint on 19 May (all *Mull*). Prs returned to many areas during Feb-Mar.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 17.5% of squares (15/40) (cf. 41% in 2023), with max. counts of 4 at Ardtun and Gleann Lean (both Mull). On Colonsay 23 Ters, and also 6 Ters. on Oronsay. On Islay, 36 Ters. at RSPB Gruinart, 15 Ters. at RSPB Smaull reserve and 20 Ters. at RSPB Oa reserve. On Tiree 18+ Ters. at 14 sites in Apr. Additional fledged broods notes at sites in Kintyre (2), Mid-Argyll (5) and Mull (1). First fledged young noted on 11 May at Toberonochy, Luing Mid-Argyll and on Tiree on 25 May.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll*). Generally, 1-8 birds from numerous widespread sites and max. counts of 21 at Tighnabruaich *Cowal* on 5 Sep and 16 on Iona *Mull* on 21 Sep.

#### WHEATEAR Oenanthe oenanthe

#### AMBER LIST A common summer visitor; and passage migrant.

*Spring* Reports from all areas. First reports slightly earlier than 2023, of singles at Loch Spelve *Mull* on 17 Mar, Carradale Bay *Kintyre*, and Gribun *Mull* on 18 Mar, Ardnave *Islay* and Langamull *Mull* on 20 Mar and Oronsay *Colonsay* on 24 Mar. There was an obvious arrival on 26-27 Mar, followed by widespread and increased nos. Max. counts noted; 20 at Loch na Keal *Mull* on 1 Apr and 15 at the mouth of the Ardow Burn *Mull* on 26 Apr.

*Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 32.5% of squares (13/40) (*cf.* 35% in 2023), with max. counts of 12 on Oronsay *Colonsay*, 9 at Crossapol Point *Tiree* and 8 at Beinn Chreagach, Ulva *Mull*. On *Islay* 29 prs at RSPB Oa Reserve. First fledglings noted on *Tiree* from 14 Jun (and more widespread there in Jul). Fledged young also noted at Portnahaven *Islay*, Lephenstrath and Sanda Is. (both *Kintyre*) and Port Chill Bhraonain *Mull*. An obvious influx of *ca.* 40 birds was noted on *Tiree* on 31 Jul.

**Autumn** Reports from all areas except (Coll/Jura/North Argyll). Only small nos noted with max. counts of 20 on Iona Mull on 3 Aug and 18 there on 26 Aug, and 12 at Machrihanish SBO Kintyre

on 5 Sep. Passage birds noted widely in late Sep and reports of 1-2 from 8 sites across (*Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Tiree*) in Oct, with 5 at Carradale Bay *Kintyre* on 1 Oct and the last report was of 1 at Peninver *Kintyre* on 25 Oct.

# 'GREENLAND' WHEATEAR Oenanthe. o. leucorhoa A scarce passage migrant. Probably under-recorded.

*Spring* The first birds were 8 on *Tiree* at 3 sites on 23 Apr, which preceded a fall on 26 Apr when 30+ were seen on the island and 8 at Uragaig *Colonsay*. Birds lingered and remained widespread on *Tiree* into early May when 15+ were in the Balinoe/Balephuil area on 7 May. Elsewhere, one was at Arduaine *Mid-Argyll* on 2 May.

**Autumn** First birds noted on *Tiree* from 12 Aug when 10 were at summit of Ben Hynish then small nos. through Aug, rising to 22 on 20 Sep with one at Sorobaidh Bay on 12 Oct the last there. Elsewhere, two were at Kilbride Bay *Cowal* on 21 Sep, singles at Loch Gruinart on 19 Sep, Cornabus and Upper Killeyan on 20 Sep and 5 at Eilean Nostaig on 23 Sep (all *Islay*) and 2 at Rhunahaorine / Gorinanane *Kintyre* on 19 Oct.

**DIPPER** Cinclus cinclus

AMBER LIST A widespread resident breeder but scarce on Islay and generally absent from: Coll, Colonsay and Tiree.

**Winter/spring** Reports of 1-2 birds from sites in; *Cowal* (10), *Islay* (3), *Kintyre* (3), *Mid-Argyll* (9), *Mull* (16) and *North Argyll* (6), with 3 at Benmore *Cowal* on 20 May the highest count. *Under reported from most areas*.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 2.5% of squares (1/40) (*cf.* 0% in 2023). Limited data. In *Kintyre*, ringing studies around the Campbeltown area found 3 broods and for the first time a second brood at one site, which failed. Occupied nests / fledged young noted at Dalmore, Southend and Lephenstrath (both *Kintyre*), the River Eachaig *Cowal*, Bridgend *Mid-Argyll*, on the Aros Rover *Mull* and at Loch Tulla *North Argyll*.

Autumn/winter Reports of 1-2 birds from sites in; Cowal (5), Islay (2), Mid-Argyll (7), Mull (12) and North Argyll (1). Under reported from most areas.

#### **TREE SPARROW\*** Passer montanus

**RED LIST** Nowadays mostly a very scarce migrant but after a gap of nearly 30 years breeding was recorded on Islay in 2009.

*Spring/summer* On *Islay* 2 were at Kinnabus, The Oa on 21-22 Apr and singles at The Monument, The Oa on 21 Jun and at Port Charlotte on 23 Jun. In *Kintyre* one was at a site in South Gigha on 13 Jul. On *Mull* one was at Bunessan on 26 Jun.

#### **HOUSE SPARROW** Passer domesticus

**RED LIST** A resident breeding bird commonly associated with human habitation. Distribution is rather localised in sparsely inhabited areas. Larger flocks gather in late summer and autumn where traditional agriculture persists.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas. Largest counts included 50 at Druimyeon More, Gigha *Kintyre* on 23 Apr, 45 at Oronsay Fm. *Colonsay* on 26 Jan, 40 at Kilmartin *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Jan, 30 at Balephuil *Tiree* in Feb -May, 25 at Iona *Mull* on 27 May and 22 at Inverliever Lodge *Mid-Argyll* on 1 Jan. Remaining counts fewer than 20, and birds usually recorded as 'present'.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 17.5% of squares (7/40) (cf. 12% in 2023), with max. counts of 27 on Oronsay *Colonsay* and 13 at Crossapol Pt. *Tiree*. 10 prs noted at RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay*. First fledged birds noted on 8 Jun at Balephuil *Tiree* and Lephenstrath *Kintyre*. Late broods noted at Bridgend *Mid-Argyll* on 12 Aug and at Balephuil *Tiree* on 28 Aug. Max. post-breeding counts of 80 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 15 Jul, 60 at Ruaig *Tiree* on 1 Jul and 40 at Iona *Mull* on 31 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll*). Max. counts on *Tiree* of 110 at Whitehouse on 26 Aug, 70 at Heylipol on 4 Oct and 55 at Ruaig *Tiree* on 16 Sep. On *Islay*, 80 at Bowmore on 2 Nov and 80 at Bruichladdich on 20 Dec and on *Mull*, 100 at Normann's Ruh on 10 Oct and 40 on Iona on 26 & 30 Aug. All other counts of 30 birds or fewer.

#### **DUNNOCK** Prunella modularis

AMBER LIST A widespread resident breeder although nowhere numerous. It is scarce on Coll and Jura and first bred on Tiree in 2020. Recent observations would suggest that birds are quite frequent in pre-thicket/thicket conifer plantations as well as in more traditional habitats. Increased numbers in autumn presumably relate to migrants.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas. Generally, 1-4 birds noted, but 8 at Tobermory on 9 May and 5 on Iona on 6 May (both *Mull*) and 5 at Dunstaffnage Bay *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Jan. Most reports from (*Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll*).

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 37.5% of squares (15/40) (cf. 29% in 2023), with max. counts of 6 at Mid Loch Fada Colonsay and 5 at Ardtun Mull. 10 prs noted at RSPB Oa Reserve Islay.

The only confirmed breeding reported was of fledged young on Lismore *North-Argyll* on 24 Aug. None reported from *Tiree* between 1 May and 23 Sep.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas, with most reports from (Cowal/Islay/Mull), generally of 1-4 birds, but 8 on Iona Mull on 21 Sep, 5 at Knipoch Mid-Argyll on 14 Sep and 5 at Balephuil Tiree on 25 Oct during a large Redwing influx.

#### YELLOW WAGTAIL\* Motacilla flava

RED LIST A scarce passage migrant. Blue-headed race M. f. flava occur from time to time, and there have been at least two records of the Grey-headed race M. f. thunbergi on Mull on 16 May 1985 and 3 males on Tiree on 20 May 2005. Some birds in autumn are often very difficult to assign to race. A pair of Blue-headed race M. f. flava bred in south Kintye Jul 2023 and fledged 2-3 young – first recorded breeding in Argyll for 100 years.

*Spring* A 2cy+ fem (prob *flava*) was at Balephetrish *Tiree* on 9 May [Clyde Ringing Group, J. Bowler]. *Record was accepted by the ABRC*.

#### GREY WAGTAIL Motacilla cinerea

AMBER LIST Widespread resident breeding species, although does not breed on Tiree and Coll; some emigration in winter.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Jura/Tiree*). Most reports from sites in; *Mull* (28), *Cowal* (12) and *Mid-Argyll* (12). Few reports in Jan (12) and Feb (5), then more widespread in Mar (43), Apr (43) and May (45). Most sightings of just 1-2 birds, however 4 were at Pennygown *Mull* on 22 May.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: singles noted in 10% of squares (4/40) (cf. 0% in 2023) with max. counts of 5 at the mouth of the River Forsa and 4 at Craignure (both *Mull*). In *Kintyre* study area 6 broods

found, which fledged 24 yng, with one nest predated. Fledged juvs noted at Linndhu Ho. *Mull* on 20 May, at Kilmartin Gravel Pits *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Jul, Bridge of Awe *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Jul and at Lephenstrath *Kintyre*, on 12 Jun, where a nest was predated by Hooded Crows on 12 May. *Autumn/winter* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). Most reports from sites in; *Islay* (11), *Mid-Argyll* (6) and *Mull* (21). Most reports were in; Aug (28), Sep (25) and Oct (1) with fewer in Nov (6) – Dec (4) as birds migrate to their wintering grounds. All counts were of 1-3. On *Tiree* singles were at Balephuil on 31 Aug and on 30 Oct.

#### PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla alba yarrellii

A widespread and common breeder: absent from many areas in winter. Returning birds generally arrive in late Feb to early Mar and depart Aug to Oct.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Most reports from coastal areas in winter and increasing towards spring. Reports by month; Jan (21), Feb (14), Mar (54), Apr (67) and May (129). Max. counts of 10 on seaweed at Rhunahaorine Pt. *Kintyre* on 10 Jan, 25 at Corran Ban, Ardnave *Islay* on 21 Apr and 20 at Ormsary *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Mar.

*Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 37.5% of squares (15/40) (cf. 41% in 2023), with max. counts of 14 at Oronsay *Colonsay* and 13 at Crossapol Pt. *Tiree*. Otherwise, limited breeding data, but widespread and first fledged young noted at Loch Seil *Mid-Argyll* on 29 May. Prs noted as widespread on *Tiree* in May, with first fledged there noted on 16 Jun. On *Islay* 5 prs noted on transects at RSPB Oa Reserve and 7 prs RSPB Oronsay in-bye fields *Colonsay*.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 43+ at Loch na Cuilce Mull on 5 Sep,

40 on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 1 Oct, 30+ at Ardalanish Bay *Mull* on 2 Oct, 28 at Ardnave *Islay* on 23 Sep and 24 at Carradale Pt *Kintyre* on 11 Aug. Elsewhere, many counts of 1-22 birds, inc. 17 leaving roost in Corryvreckan pub, Oban *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Aug.

#### 'WHITE' WAGTAIL Motacila alba alba

RBBP A passage migrant, usually recorded in spring and extent of autumn passage obscured by identification difficulties. May have bred.

*Spring* Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). First arrivals of singles at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 19 Mar, at Carse House *Mid-Argyll* on 20 Mar, then 4 at Ormsary *Mid-Argyll* on 24 Mar and singles at Gruinart Floods *Islay* on 29 Mar and Loch a' Phuill *Tiree* on 2 Apr. Few seen on passage with max. counts of 10 at Balephetrish Bay *Tiree* on 22 Apr, 8 at Machrihanish SBO *Kintyre* on 19 Apr, 8 at Baleromin Dhu on 24 Apr and 8 on Oronsay on 28 Apr (both *Colonsay*). A single at Tralee *North Argyll* on 9 May was the last noted.

Autumn Reports from only (Coll/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/Tiree). First reports were of 2 at Port Righ Kintyre on 31 Jul & 9 Aug, 1 at Loch a' Phuill Tiree on 11 Aug, 3 at Hynish Tiree on 12 Aug, then 1 at Barsloisnoch Mid-Argyll on 27 Aug. Numbers reported were low with max. counts of 17 at Loch Gruinart Islay on 5 Sep and 12 at Carradale Bay Kintyre on 2 Sep. Very few after mid-Sep with 2 at Cullipool, Luing Mid-Argyll on 6 Oct and 8 at Carradale Bay Kintyre on 7 Oct with 12 Pied Wagtails the last noted.

#### **MEADOW PIPIT** Anthus pratensis

AMBER LIST An abundant breeding species. Most leave higher ground and some islands in winter, and significant flocks occur on passage. Those wintering in Argyll occur mainly in coastal and low-lying localities.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Higher counts of: 50 at Lephinkill *Cowal* on 1 Jan, and on *Mull* of 40 at Lochan a' Phuill on 19 Mar, 50 at Gribun Sands on 2 Apr, 25 at Pennygown on 3 & 17 Apr and 30 at Lunga, Treshnish Is. on 12 May. Elsewhere, counts of 1-30 birds.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 85% of squares (34/40) (cf. 82% in 2023), with max. counts of 41 at Dalvore Mid-Argll, 40 at Crossapol Point Tiree, 30 at Oronsay Colonsay, 25 at Dun Bhlaran Mid-Argyll and 23 at Beinn a' Chaolais Jura. Good numbers and widespread. On RSPB Oa Reserve Islay 128 prs recorded and 62 prs on RSPB Oronsay in-bye fields Colonsay. Breeding confirmed in (Colonsay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Tiree).

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay*). Increase in numbers noted from early Aug with flocks of 20-50 birds, with max. counts of 120 at Balephuil on 22 Sep, 120 at Ruaig on 23 Sep, 100 at Barrapol on 12 Sep (all *Tiree*), 100 at mouth of River Forsa *Mull* on 17 Aug and 75 at Ardnave Loch *Islay* on 23 Sep. Numbers reduced during Oct and only groups of up to 12 during in Nov- Dec, except 50 at Rhunahaorine Pt *Kintyre* on 18 Nov.

#### **TREE PIPIT** Anthus trivialis

**RED LIST** A summer visitor breeding commonly on the mainland, also widespread on Jura and Mull, but very scarce on Islay.

Spring/summer Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay//Tiree). First reports of singles at Glen Lochy North Argyll on 2 Apr, at Barguillean Farm, Glen Lonan Mid-Argyll on 4 Apr, Salen Mull on 21 Apr, Barr Glen Kintyre on 10 Apr, Mishnish Lochs Mull on 16 Apr, Bealach nan Sac Cowal on 19 Apr, and, with a more general arrival from 20 Apr. Most reports from (sites) in Cowal (10), Kintyre (2) Mid-Argyll (27), Mull (36) and North Argyll (10). Additionally, singles were at Ardlussa Jura on 26 Apr and on Islay in early May at Kildalton, Lochan Sholum,

Callumkil and Loch nan Diol. Max. site counts of 6 at Rubha Ghall, Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 17 May and 5 at Knock *Mull* on 12 May.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 25% of squares (10/40) (cf. 29% in 2023), with max. counts of 8 at Rhudle *Mid-Argyll*, 5 at Tom Dubh *Cowal* and 5 at Glen Aros *Mull*.

**Autumn** Two were at Ardnadrochit *Mull* on 15 Aug, followed by singles at Coshandrochit *Mid*-Argyll on 17, 19 & 20 Aug, with one on Iona *Mull* on 7 Sep the last noted.

#### **ROCK PIPIT** Anthus petrosus petrosus

A common resident breeding species on coasts, sea lochs and islands with some emigration and passage in autumn: scarce passage and winter visitor elsewhere.

*Winter/spring* Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 36 at Loch Don *Mull* on 14 Jan, 22 at Corran Ban, Ardnave *Islay* on 21 Apr, 14 at Hough Bay *Tiree* on 1 Mar and 10 at Lunga, Treshnish Is *Mull* on 12 May. Elsewhere, counts of 1-9 birds, however most reports of 1-2.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 7.5% of squares (3/40) (cf. 12% in 2023), with max. counts of 4 at Carraig Fhada *Islay* and 2 at Port Mor *Colonsay*. Otherwise, limited breeding data. At RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay 35* prs recorded.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas. Max. counts of 15 at Port Righ on 23 Aug, 14 at Carradale Bay on 2 Dec and 10 at Grogport on 9 Aug (all *Kintyre*), and 12 at Cnoc an t-Suidhe on 12 Dec and 10 at Salen on 27 Oct (both *Mull*). Elsewhere, counts of fewer than 10 birds.

#### **CHAFFINCH** Fringilla coelebs

An abundant resident breeder: except on Coll (breeds only in very small numbers) and Tiree. Foraging flocks gather out with the breeding season when numbers are augmented by winter visitors.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas. Most reports from sites in; Cowal (55), Mid-Argyll (69) and Mull (96). Max. counts of 100+ at Lochbuie House on 19 Mar and 50+ at Pennyghael on 17 Mar (both Mull), 90 at Brox Wood, Sandbank Cowal on 25 Feb, 75 at Cairnbaan Mid-Argyll on 4 Feb and 50 at the Woollen Mill Islay on 24 Feb. Elsewhere, counts of fewer than 50 birds.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 65% of squares (26/40) (*cf.* 59% in 2023), with max. counts of 23 at Glen Aros chapel *Mull*, 21 at Dalvore and 19 at Kilmichael Forest (both *Mid-Argyll*) and 18 at Loch Tarsan *Cowal*. Otherwise, limited breeding data received.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas. Most reports from sites in; Mull (48), Islay (26) and Mid-Argyll (26). Lower max. counts suggesting poor breeding season; 180 at Loch Skerrols Islay on 4 Nov, 110 at a Cairnbaan garden Mid-Argyll on 18 Dec during a cold snap, 100+ at Normann's Ruh Mull on 10 Oct, 90 at Drimvore Mid-Argyll on 17 Sep, 80 at Port Righ Kintyre on 25 Nov and 55 in Kilmartin Mid-Argyll on 14 Dec. Elsewhere, counts of 1-50 birds.

#### **BRAMBLING** Fringilla montifringilla

RBBP An uncommon winter visitor in varying numbers: there have been a few summer records.

*Winter/spring* Only 10 reports: in Jan, singles were at Port Donain *Mull* on 14 Jan and at Inverliever Lodge *Mid-Argyll* on 28 Jan. In *Cowal*, 4 were at Largiemore on 12 Feb and 1+ at Kilmun on 14 Feb. Two were at Balure of Shian *North Argyll* on 8 Mar and a fem at Cairnbaan *Mid-Argyll* on 16 Mar. A small passage was noted with 2 at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 5-6 Apr, 2 at Port Righ *Kintyre* on 8 Apr, and singles at Inverliever Lodge *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Apr and at the Lodge *Coll* on 11 Apr.

Autumn/winter Very few records. A fem-type was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 17 Oct and a male was there on 29 Oct. Another single was at Blackrock, Loch Indaal *Islay* on 30 Oct. In Nov singles

were found at Balephuil *Tiree* on 4 Nov, Loch Skerrols *Islay* on 7 Nov, and at Killichronan on 13 Nov and Mishnish Lochs on 17 Nov (both *Mull*), while in Dec, 1 was at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 8 Dec and 5 at Quinish *Mull* on 15 Dec.

#### **BULLFINCH** Pyrrhula pyrrhula

AMBER LIST A widely but thinly distributed resident. Scarce or absent on most of the islands apart from Islay and Mull. Flocks occur in winter.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Tiree). Most reports from sites in; Cowal (18), Mid-Argyll (21) and Mull (24). Max. counts of 10 at Loch na Cuilce on 9 Apr, 6 at Meall an Inbhire on 20 Jan, 6 at Loch an Torr on 21 Jan and 6 at Quinish House on 18 Feb (all Mull), 6 at Mid-Letter Cowal on 16 Mar and 8 at Grogport Kintyre on 31 Mar. Counts elsewhere of 1-5 birds.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: singles or pairs noted in 15% of squares (6/40) (cf. 18% in 2023). 2 prs on RSPB Gruinart reserve *Islay*. Otherwise, limited data received; young noted being fed at Craignure *Mull* on 22 Aug.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Colonsay/Tiree*). Notable dip in records in Sep, when moulting; Aug (11), Sep (3), Oct (17), Nov (11) & Dec (14). Most reports from sites in; *Islay* (10) and *Mull* (16). Max. counts of 13 at Loch Allan *Islay* on 1 Nov and 11 at Mishnish Lochs *Mull* on 17 Nov. Elsewhere, counts of 1-7 birds.

#### **COMMON ROSEFINCH\*** Carpodacus erythrina

RBBP A scarce to rare visitor which may have bred. 38 records between 1989 and 2023, mostly in May and Jun however more frequent reports of juveniles in the autumn recently.

*Spring* An elusive non-singing bird in fem-type plumage was at Balephuil *Tiree* on 26 May and a fem/2cy male was at Gigalum Cottage, Gigha *Kintyre* on 31 May – remarkably a day earlier than one in the finder's garden in 2023 [K. Helm].

*Winter* A fem/1cy male was at Lephenstrath Bridge *Kintyre* from 8-13 Dec [A. & N. Hand, J. Dickson, D. Jardine]. *All records were accepted by the ABRC*.

#### **GREENFINCH** Chloris chloris

**RED LIST** A locally common resident and partial migrant, decreasing nationally due to bird-feeder diseases, with fewer breeding on the islands than on the mainland. Small groups are widespread outside the breeding season.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Colonsay). Remains a scarce bird with counts of 1-7 birds at sites in; Coll (5), Cowal (16), Islay (3), Jura (1), Kintyre (5), Mid-Argyll (25), Mull (29), North Argyll (14) and Tiree (5). Max. counts of 10 at Arrochar Cowal on 12 Apr and 10 at Lochan a' Phuill Mull on 19 Mar.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 10% of squares (4/40) (cf. 9% in 2023), with max. count of 3 at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll*. Limited data received. Fledged young noted in *Mid-Argyll* at Dalvore and Cairnbaan, and at The Glebe and Balephuil *Tiree*. 20 were noted at Loch Cliad *Coll* on 6 Jun.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Colonsay/Jura). Counts of 1-7 birds at sites in; Coll (1), Cowal (4), Islay (5), Kintyre (3), Mid-Argyll (4), Mull (11), North Argyll (1) and Tiree (6). Max. counts of 7 at Crannich Mull on 15 Sep and 6 at Balephuil Tiree on 15 Sep.

#### **TWITE** Linaria flavirostris

**RED LIST** A local resident, mainly in coastal areas on the mainland and islands; winter flocks may comprise resident and migrant birds.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Cowal/Jura). Few reports away from Islay and Tiree during Jan-Mar, but some reports from sites on Kintyre (5), Luing Mid-Argyll (1) and Mull (2) but birds generally returning elsewhere in Apr-May. Counts much lower than 2023 where on The Oa Islay where a peak of 57 on 9 Jan (cf. 485 in 2023). Elsewhere, higher counts of 93 at Gott Tiree on 26 Feb, 75 at Sunderland Farm Islay on 20 Feb and 40 at Ardlarach, Luing Mid-Argyll on 19 Mar. Noted at sites on Mull (19) with max. count of 50+ at Balmeanach, Gribun Mull on 11 Apr. Few reports from Colonsay, where max. of 10 at Pigs' Paradise on 25 Apr. In Kintyre 30 were at Achamhinish, Gigha Kintyre on 2 Mar and 1-2 at Machrihanish SBO and Carskey/Lephinstrath through to spring. Reports from 3 coastal sites in Mid-Argyll and one inland site in North Argyll, where 5 were at Cruachan Dam on 30 May.

Summer/breeding BBS: noted in 7.5% of squares (3/40) (cf. 18% in 2023), with max. counts of 4 at Crossapol Pt. Tiree and 4 at Oronsay Colonsay. Prs noted in (Coll/Colonsay/Islay/Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull/North Argyll/Tiree) from Apr with most reports from island areas. 14 prs recorded RSPB Oa Reserve Islay, 2+ pr RSPB Smaull reserve Islay and 1 pr on RSPB Oronsay in-bye fields Colonsay. First fledglings noted on Tiree from 20 Jun and following breeding season scattered family flocks of 15-20 around the island in Jul. Colour-ringed individuals noted on Colonsay in Apr & May were from Islay and Lancashire.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (Coll/Cowal/Jura). Most reports from Islay, Mull and Tiree. Reports by month; Aug (16), Sep (30), Oct (42), Nov (6) and Dec (1). Max. counts included; on Tiree, 235 at The Reef on 29 Oct and 120 at Barrapol on 28 Oct, and 140 at Culbuirg Fm, Iona Mull on 3 Oct, 100 at Upper Killeyan, Oa Islay on 19 Sep, 100 at Saligo Islay on 12 Oct and 90 on Oronsay Colonsay on 16 Oct. Elsewhere, in (Kintyre/Mid-Argyll/Mull) counts of 1-14.

#### LINNET Linaria cannabina

**RED LIST** A sparsely distributed partial migrant, breeding mainly on Islay, Tiree, and in Kintyre. Flocks occur locally in some areas in autumn with most reports from Colonsay, Islay and Kintyre.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). No records during Jan, and only 3 in Feb: 1 at Rhunahaorine Pt *Kintyre* on 9 Feb, 11 at Linndhu Ho *Mull* on 18 Feb and then 80 at Ardnave Loch *Islay* on 19 Feb, with more birds returning during Mar and more widespread through Apr. No large counts with max. counts of 25 at Pigs' Paradise on 25 Apr and 30 on Oronsay on 5 May (both *Colonsay*).

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 22.5% of BBS squares (9/40) (*cf.* 32% in 2023), with max. counts of 26 at Crossapol Point *Tiree*, 14 at Fidden *Mull*, 12 at Oronsay *Colonsay* and 10 at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll*. Otherwise, limited breeding data. 17 prs found at RSPB Oa reserve *Islay* and 8 prs on RSPB Oronsay in-bye fields *Colonsay*. Noted as widespread on *Tiree* in May, with first fledged birds noted on 9 Jun. Fledged yng / confirmed breeding also noted at Rubha na Faing, Port Charlotte and Loch Arish (all *Islay*), Ardminish, Gigha *Kintyre* and on Lismore *North Argyll*. A post-breeding flock of was 50 noted at Carradale Bay *Kintyre* on 7 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura*). Most reports from sites in; *Mull* (22), *Islay* (19) and *Tiree* (16). Reports by month; Aug (51), Sep (43), Oct (25), Nov (9) and Dec (0). Lower max. counts than 2023; 380 at The Reef *Tiree* on 24 Sep, 130 at Gruinart *Islay* on 25 Aug, 120 on Iona *Mull* on 21 Sep and 85 on Oronsay airfield *Colonsay* on 26 Sep. Otherwise, 1-50 birds, inc., 40 at Coshandrochaid on 22 Aug and 30 at Loch Scammadale on 14 Sep (both *Mid-Argyll*).

#### **COMMON REDPOLL** Acanthis flammea

RBBP Includes Mealy Redpoll C. f. flammea & Greenland Redpoll C. f. rostrata (latter now sometimes known as North-western Redpoll, which includes islandica). A scarce passage migrant and irregular winter visitor. Mealy now breeds annually on Tiree, and also suspected of breeding on other islands.

**Winter/spring** First arrival of 2 males at Balephuil *Tiree* on 21 Apr. Reports from six other *Tiree* sites during Apr-Jun. Also reported in *Colonsay* where 3 were at Uragaig on 23-26 Apr, in *Kintyre* where 4 were at Gigalum, Gigha on 26 Apr, in *Mid-Argyll* where singles at Cullipool, Luing on 29 Apr and Stonefield Castle Hotel on 3 May also on *Mull* where 20+ reported at Doire na Cuaille on 10 May.

*Summer/breeding* All reports from *Tiree*. At least 12 prs across 7 sites in May, 10 prs nesting in 7 sites in Jun and 5 prs with fledged yng at 2 sites in Jul. Fledged birds noted from 24 Jun - 13 Jul at Balephuil.

**Autumn/winter** Up to 12 at Balephuil/Carnan Mor *Tiree* during Aug, with 16 there on 17 Sep, 15 on 30 Sep and then 25 on 1 Oct. Two at Heylipol Church *Tiree* on 7 Oct were the last reported. The only other reports were of 2 at Craig Ben Lodge on 4 Aug and 7 at Garmony Point on 22 Aug (both *Mull*). 'Greenland' type birds '*rostrata*' were noted on *Tiree* at Balephuil, a single on 7 Sep, 4 on 15-18 Sep and 1 on 30 Sep, and 3 at Balemartine on 26 Sep, with the last a single at Balephuil on 1 Oct. *From 1 January 2025 former Redpoll species will be treated as a single species*.

#### LESSER REDPOLL Acanthis cabaret

**RED LIST** A locally common partial migrant, breeding locally: numbers fluctuate from year to year. Post breeding flocks gather from July and most birds move south for the winter.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas. Very few reported early in the year with reports in Jan (1), Feb (4) and Mar (2). Numbers remained low through spring with max. counts; 13 on *Mull* on 17 May, 8 at Tom Dubh *Cowal* on 11 May and 8 at Loch Tulla *North Argyll* on 12 May.

**Summer/breeding** BBS; noted in 25% of squares (10/40) (*cf.* 29% in 2023), with max. counts of 4 at Rhudle and 4 at Dalvore (both *Mid-Argyll*). Otherwise, limited breeding data. 11 prs in transects at the RSPB Oa reserve *Islay* and used nest found at Moine Mhor *Mid-Argyll*. Reports in summer from all areas except (*Tiree*). Max. counts of 12 at Lochawe Village *Mid-Argyll* on 23 Jul and 10 at Port na Saille *Mull* on 7 Jul.

Autumn/winter Reports from all areas except (North Argyll). Several flocks reported in autumn; 110 on Colonsay on 1 Oct, 100 at Crinan Harbour Mid-Argyll on 4 Oct and 70 at Craignure Mull on 4 Sep, but fewer in Nov & Dec, except on Mull, where 100 at Linndhu Ho on 15 Dec and 74 at Loch Ba on 13-14 Dec. From 1 January 2025 former Redpoll species will be treated as a single species.

#### CROSSBILL Loxia curvirostra

An irruptive species: large numbers breed in good cone years, but few stay when cones are scarce.

All year The low numbers in late 2023 continued into the early part of 2024, but a bumper spruce cone crop and an influx in May, led to increased sightings. Reports by month; Jan (2), Feb (3), Mar (3), Apr (7), May (34), Jun (24), Jul (19), Aug (15), Sep (19), Oct (14), Nov (7) and Dec (2). Reports by region (sites); Colonsay (4), Cowal (9), Islay (9), Jura (1), Kintyre (6), Mid-Argyll (31), Mull (49), North Argyll (5) and Tiree (1). Max. counts of 25+ at Loch Barnluasgan Mid-Argyll on 14 Jun, 17 at Victoria Bridge, Loch Tulla North Argyll on 15 May, 15 at Feorlin Mid-Argyll on 23 Oct, 15 at Tiroran on 3 Sep and 15 at Knock on 16 Jun (both Mull). On Tiree, 1>S at Balephuil on 16 Oct.

**Breeding** BBS: noted in 10% of squares (4/40) (*cf.* 15% in 2023), with max. of 6 at Bellanoch *Mid-Argyll*. The abundant cone crop led to early breeding with a fledged juv reported near Cladich *Mid-Argyll* on 10 Dec.

#### **GOLDFINCH** Carduelis carduelis

A widely distributed resident with recent breeding on Coll, Colonsay and sporadically on Tiree. Flocks occur in autumn.

*Winter/spring* Reported from all areas except (*Jura*). Few flocks noted with 25 on Iona *Mull* on 21 May, 15 at Pennyghael *Mull* on 27 May and 11 at Dunstaffnage *Mid-Argyll* on 7 Jan the largest reported counts. Most counts were of 10 or fewer. Most reports came from *Mull*.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 35% of squares (14/40) (cf. 29% in 2023), with max. counts of 7 at Rhudle *Mid-Argyll* and 6 at Ardtun *Mull*. Four prs found on RSPB Oa Reserve *Islay*. Otherwise, limited breeding data other than fledgings reported on Lismore *North Argyll* on 24 Aug and 4 pairs nesting at 3 sites on *Tiree* where no young seen until 14 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Colonsay*). Most reports from sites on (*Cowal/Islay/Mull*). Max. counts of 120 at Portnahaven on 2 Sep, 70 at Carnain, Loch Indaal and 120 at Cornabus on 21 Oct (all *Islay*), 100 at the Ardow Burn on 13 Sep and 45 on Iona on 21 Sep (both *Mull*) and 45 at Crinan Ferry *Mid-Argyll* on 27 Aug. Counts of up to 30 elsewhere. Birds still around in reasonable nos until year end inc. 22 at Hynish *Tiree* on 11 Dec.

#### **SISKIN** Spinus spinus

A locally common partial migrant: present in all areas apart from Coll and Tiree where it is an occasional visitor. Numbers fluctuate from year to year depending on cone crops.

Winter/spring Reports from all areas except (Coll). Most reports from sites in; Mull (42), Mid-Argyll (41), Cowal (11) and North Argyll (11). Larger counts later in the spring: 60 at Loch Tulla North Argyll on 12 May, 49 at Lephenstrath Kintyre on 25 May, 35 at Tighnabruaich Cowal on 24 Apr and 31 at Barcaldine North Argyll on 31 May. Elsewhere, most counts of 1-10, and singles at Balephuil Tiree on 24 Apr & 16 May and 2 there on 2 & 24 May and 1 Jun.

*Summer/breeding* BBS: noted in 52.5% of squares (21/40) (*cf.* 29% in 2023), with max. counts of 9 at Loch Frisa, 7 at Tobar Beag (both *Mull*) 7 at Rhudle and 7 at Kilmichael Forest (both *Mid-Argyll*). Otherwise, limited breeding data. First juvs noted at Lephenstrath *Kintyre* on 26 Apr.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Coll/Jura*). More remained in the autumn with reports in Aug (14), Sep (11), Oct (25), Nov (11) and Dec (5) with some larger counts; 55 at Glen Feochan on 11 Dec, 50 at Loch Barnluasgan on 3 Dec (both *Mid-Argyll*), 40 at Loch Skerrols on 20 Oct and 35 at Kildalton on 2 Nov (both *Islay*), and 30 at Craignure on 16 Nov and 30 at Linndhu House on 16 Dec (both *Mull*). Elsewhere, counts of 1-20 birds.

#### LAPLAND BUNTING\* Calcarius lapponicus

AMBER LIST A scarce passage migrant. Recorded most frequently in autumn.

Winter/spring One was at Killinallan Islay on 6 Feb.

**Autumn/winter** On *Tiree* singles flew over the Loch a' Phuill area calling on 23 Sep & 8 Oct and a fem/1cy was at Sandaig on 17 Oct.

#### **SNOW BUNTING** Plectrophenax nivalis

**RED LIST** RBBP Occurring annually in varying numbers (on passage and in winter) along the coast and in the hills and has probably bred in North Argyll.

**Winter/spring** Very few sightings. Only reports were singles at the Oa *Islay* on 15 Jan and 2 & 19 Feb, Lower Killeyan *Islay* on 30 Jan, at Balinoe *Tiree* on 27 Mar and Claddach *Islay* on 12 Apr.

**Autumn/winter** First arrivals were singles on Oronsay *Colonsay* on 9 Oct, Ardnave Pt *Islay* on 15 Oct, Kenovay *Tiree* on 19 Oct and Ardionra, Iona *Mull* on 20 Oct, followed by 5 at Ardnahoe *Islay* on 21 Oct and 10 at Ardnave Loch *Islay* on 22 Oct. A single was at Crackaig *Jura* on 26 Oct. Max. counts of 18 at Ardnave Pt *Islay* on 3 Nov. Elsewhere, 1-3 from sites in: *Colonsay* (1), *Islay* (5), *Mull* (1) and *Tiree* (2).

#### YELLOWHAMMER Emberiza citrinella

**RED LIST** A localised resident which is absent from Coll, Colonsay and Tiree and appears to be declining elsewhere. Currently, most birds breed near the coast. All records are welcome.

Winter/spring Reports from sites in: Islay (4), Jura (2), Kintyre (1), Mid-Argyll (11), Mull (24). Max. counts of 20 at Port Askaig Islay on 29 Mar, 15 at Ballitarsan Islay on 19 Feb, 15 at Loch Don Mull on 18 Mar, 12 at Leac na Ban, Knapdale Mid-Argyll on 20 Apr & 20 May and 8 at Glen Battrick Jura on 19 May. Elsewhere, counts of 1-4 birds.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: not noted in any squares (0/40) (cf. 3% in 2023). The only report of breeding was a singing male at Killiechoinich *Mid-Argyll*.

Autumn/winter Reports from sites in; Cowal (3), Islay (6), Jura (1), Mid-Argyll (3), Mull (10) and North Argyll (1). Max. counts of 12 on Jura on 19 Oct, 8 at Balinoe Mid-Argyll on 17 Oct and 6 at Gorsten Mull on 28 Oct. Elsewhere, reports of 1-5 birds, inc. 2 at Bealach nan Sac Cowal on 18 Oct.

#### **REED BUNTING** Emberiza schoeniclus

AMBER LIST A locally distributed resident breeder: while nowhere abundant, small flocks sometimes gather out-with the breeding season.

**Winter/spring** Reports from all areas and generally widespread with mostly 1-6 birds at sites. Max. counts of 14 at Killinallan on 1 Jan, 8 at Ardnave on 4 Jan (both *Islay*), 10 at Loch Scridain *Mull* on 18 Mar and 12 at Hynish *Tiree* on 12 Jan.

**Summer/breeding** BBS: noted in 22.5% of squares (9/40) (*cf.* 26% in 2023), with max. counts of 6 at Gleann Lean *Mull*, 5 at Port Mor *Colonsay* and 4 at Dalvore *Mid-Argyll*. On *Islay* 41 prs at RSPB Oa reserve, 42+ prs at RSPB Gruinart and 16+ prs at RSPB Smaull reserve. 2 prs in RSPB Oronsay in-bye fields and 29 Ters found on *Colonsay*. On *Tiree ca* 20 scattered prs noted across the island, with fledged juvs from 17 Jul.

**Autumn/winter** Reports from all areas except (*Jura/North Argyll*) and generally widespread in small nos of 1-8 birds at sites. Max. counts of 37 at Octovullin on 4 Nov, 35 at Airigh Ghlas on 2 Dec, 12 at Ardnave on 28 Oct (all *Islay*), 16 at Balephuil *Tiree* on 25 Oct and 11 at Oronsay *Colonsay* on 30 Oct.

### **Escapes and Introductions**

This section includes species which are not on the British list or whose occurrence in the UK is EXCLUSIVELY within Categories B, D or E. Other species, whose occurrence in Argyll arises partly or wholly from introduced birds which may not or do not form self-sustaining breeding populations, include White-fronted Goose, Snow Goose, Barnacle Goose, Mandarin Duck, Red Kite, Red-legged Partridge, Grey Partridge and Rock Dove (Feral Pigeon). These are dealt with in the main systematic list.

#### MUSCOVY DUCK Cairina moschata

Category E. Probably widespread in Argyll as farmyard birds, but often survive independently, but under-recorded.

*Spring/summer* Two were at Port Ramsay, Lismore *North Argyll* on 6 Jan, 2 strays were at Kiloran *Colonsay* on 20 Apr and 1 was at Loch Ederline *Mid-Argyll* on 21 Apr.

#### INDIAN PEAFOWL Pavo cristatus

Category E. Infrequent past reports from Cowal, Kintyre and Mid-Argyll.

One was at Achuaran, Lismore North Argyll on 15 Apr and noted at Strathcoil Mull in Jun.

### **Getting Involved**

Argyll Bird Club The ABC is a registered charity with membership open to all. The club aims to promote an interest in birds in Argyll. We are a friendly club for anybody interested in wild birds, living in, or visiting, Argyll, irrespective of their level of knowledge, experience or skill. Visitors are more than welcome to our two annual indoor meetings which are all-day events held on a Saturday in spring and autumn. The club produces a quarterly magazine, 'The Eider' and also has a website with sections on 'Recent Sightings' with photographs, News with details of upcoming meetings and trips, 'Publications' and 'Surveys'. Volunteers are always welcome to help with committee matters, bird recording and the website and to contribute to *The Eider*.

Scottish Ornithologists Club The SOC exists to promote the study, enjoyment and conservation of wild birds and their habitats across Scotland and is a birdwatching club with 15 local branches across the country and a growing membership of over 3,000. Like-minded individuals with a passion for birds, nature and conservation are brought together through a programme of talks, outings, conferences and via the Club's quarterly members' journal, *Scottish Birds*. The SOC acts as the umbrella organisation for bird recording in Scotland, managing the network of recording birds in Scotland, or the Local Recorders' Network and the Scottish Birds Records Committee, the latter of which maintains the official Scottish List on behalf of the Club. The database of information Local Recorders collect is an extremely important archive of local bird information — a critical tool for their future conservation.

<u>British Trust for Ornithology</u> Through the efforts of volunteers participating in BTO surveys, the bird populations of the British Isles have been monitored more effectively and for longer than those of most other parts of the world. This has produced a uniquely rich and detailed body of scientific work. This will help us to understand the complex challenges facing wild birds at a time of great change in the environment. Volunteer surveyors, members and staff work in partnership to provide unbiased information about birds and their habitats.

In Argyll we have many volunteers who participate in the following surveys, and you can get involved by contacting the bird recorder or any of the BTO representatives given on page 2:

**BirdTrack** is an exciting project, through a partnership between the BTO, the RSPB, Birdwatch Ireland, the Scottish Ornithologists' Club and the Welsh Ornithological Society, that looks at migration movements and distributions of birds throughout Britain and Ireland. BirdTrack provides facilities for observers to store and manage their own personal records as well as using these to support species conservation at local, regional, national, and international scales.

**Breeding Bird Survey (BBS)** is the main scheme for monitoring the population changes of the UK's common breeding birds. It is a national volunteer project aimed at keeping track of changes in the breeding populations of widespread bird species in the UK. Wild bird populations are an important indicator of the health of the countryside, and knowing to what extent bird populations are increasing or decreasing is fundamental to bird conservation.

The Wetland Bird Survey (WeBS) monitors non-breeding waterbirds in the UK. The principal aims of WeBS are to identify population sizes, determine trends in numbers and distribution, and identify important sites for waterbirds.


